Hard Choice

DANNY JOE BROWN, EPIC

Here's what I call a safe bet. You've got to have confidence in Danny Joe's voice with the tremendous success of the first two latched albums. The new triple lead backup here is hot, and it's nice to hear Danny with keyboards for a change. I see a discipline trend toward programmers adding albums with more concern about the familiarity of the artist than the strength of the songs to be aired. It's a pleasure to recommend an album with a familiar sound and a classic track. "Edge of Goodbye", the last tune on side one is an instant attention-getter. The piano/pipe intro is effective, the harmonies are super catchy, and the final quelling guitar number is tuned to the exact frequency of the southern rock lover. I'd sure as hell call the station if I heard it on the radio.

Chain Reaction

PETER D'ANDREA, VERMONTING ALL THE SIDES, BMG

In a dramatic shift of comeback power, Peter finished at Most Added with 36 reports overall. Also 21 in levels 1 and 21 and indicators. Programmers couldn't be more pleased with the new album. "The title track leads, followed closely by "You Will Yet" and "Big What I Say"... Reaction: Gene Dilliplina, WATV, "It could have been titled "where I should Be". It's definitely just that, "great rock and roll and we've come to expect from Peter"... Dave Denton, WMEZ, "Peter has exceeded the potential with Factor and surpassed our expectations. "All the sides are winners"... Mark Van Claven, WYNY, "Absolutely no initial posse problem. All has been familiar and the skeletons are back in the closet"... Suek Maxwell, WMB, "Listener reaction shows they are at home with the rock on his new album as we are"... Michael Scirely, WYLL, "The sound is refreshing and tight. His vocals and guitar work are reminiscent of his "Best" solo work in his "Mambo Die Day"... Mike Wute, WUPN, "Good hooks, great guitar work, and a minimum amount of admitted main title. The surprise return of the year"... Jim Pizzi, WYNA, "A rock album-out-the-window record. It'll manage to get lots of airplay calls to get a good "Five"... Other positives this week: Tom Dave Camp, "Right on target"; Cap Foley, "Fantastic"; Tom West, "Great acceptance"; Bill Grant, "ambitious artist of the year"; Ed Resnikoff, "Five stars"; Bobbie Adams, "Extremely positive reaction"; Frank Andriak, "Positive staff and public reaction"; John Logan, "One damn fine guitar player"; along with Art Phillips, Malcolm Gray, Robert Huber, Harry Sherman, and more.

THE MOODIES, STONE DISTANT VOYAGER, POLYDOR

As predicted, "The Voice" is spawning even with it. A early upper demo listener interest is growing. Comments: Ed Resnikoff, WYNY, "Already, amazing calls from the 25+ Moodies fans who don't believe their band is back. "Will be the comeback of the decade"... Mark Holmes, WDBY, "we've never had an album with such immediate response with my clients, sales, and airplay"... Dave Brown, WLAB-FM, "Great response to all cuts. In heavy for a week now"... Michael Knight, WYNY, "It has created quite a buzz on our phones. Listeners are calling with praise and approval and curiosity and questions about a possible tour"... Art Dilliplina, WYLL, "Resnikoff has been nothing short of phenomenal. Not just another old rock band releasing their fifth album. The Moodies are a current event in Colorado"... Bob Sisson, WYCN, "we're getting very positive response to "The Voice"... Bobbie Beam, WYNY, "Tons of curiosity callers already"... Bob Bennett, WRAF, "Good upper demo phone on "The Voice"... Here accolades: Harve Anderson, WDBY-FM, "Their multi-layered sound is a relief for the ears"... Mark Holston, WYFF, "great fan mail" made with enough rock and roll to keep the kids happy"... Ed Lipscomb, WCOZ, "The Voice" deserves play and their classics"... Caroline West, WYLL, "like a breath of fresh air"... Ira Gordon, WYNY, "A treat!"... Gene Goldstein, "The Voice" is a "kicker"... Bob Roman, "An album for all ages"... Look for a debut next week.

SILVER CONDOR, COLUMBIA

No question about it—Dre's guys will get a shot and a half. First week out we too in 31 reports for 36 Most Added and the waves are rolling. Saul Rayburn, WDBY, "Silver Condor is guaranteed the front page work. Sure, the fix is in but the music is top-drawl. The power is genuine, the sound is instantly familiar, yet new, and it has more hooks than a 747 fireman"... Frank Andriak, WYLL, "This must be the streamline yet full-onuff-pop radio has been longing for. It sure tops the other post-Bowie stuff by Carl Siffert"... Gene Scott, "An immediate out-of-the-box at WYLL with complete support from our airstaff"... Tom West, WYFF, "It looks to be developing very nicely. We'll go with "Survival" and hope this sucker breaks wide open"... Malcolm Gray, WYCN, "Sounds as good as anything Carl has ever done in the past"... Ed Dilliplina, WYLL, "Bill and everybody else are right about Silver Condor. "The "The Wake Up Survival" is a real master of a record. As the comments indicate, "Survival" is well out front at this early stage with "Angel Eyes", "Caroline", and "Voice For Brakes" next.

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

CHART MAULERS:

THE TUBES, "COMPLETION BACKWARD PRINCIPLE", CAPITOL

Another crushing week for the Tubes--as they register our biggest Back Page move of the week, 30-20. An equally strong Metro move, 32-20..."Talk To Ya Later" is roaring up the Song Index, 40-18...Increased play on WMMR, WYMS, WDM, WCCC, KFSI, WLIR, and KOMA...Could not look better from chart and radio confidence standpoint.

DAVE EDMUNDS, "TWANGIN'", ATCO

Nice to see this personal favorite on the move, up 29-24 for a Prime Move, and 28-24 Metro...Increases: KWFM, WBRU, KSJU, KLBJ, WRLM, WQBK, WJLP, and WVA...Also be aware of the nice move on the single, up 32-15 on the Song Index.

JOHNNY VAN ZANT, "ROUND TWO", POLYDOR

Just over 90% of last week's adds converted to regular play mentions, to give Johnny the week's highest debut at 31 Index and 32 Metro...14 adds this week (including WAAF, WLAV-FM, WLVA, WTXR) for 63 in the last two weeks..."Right Or Wrong" rolls up the Song Index, 93-35...Strongest early play on WSYR, KATY, and WMYF. As Tom Nast says, "Johnny continues to grow and grow. Sales are happening and phones are unbelievably huge"...KLAQ's Bob Roman offers, "Johnny Zant gives us a cooking exhibition of Southern fried boogie rock. "Right Or Wrong" stands out real nice...From KMOD's Charlie West, "Just as good, if not better, than the last one which was great"...WJIS-FM's Jim Pemberton feels, "'Round Two' is a knockout".

MARTY BALIN, "BALIN", EMI

We predicted a #36 debut--Marty hits the list at #34 (112 Metro)..."I Do Believe In You" leads at #78. Play increases on WPDH, WQDR, KSJU, KLBJ, and KOMA...Average play at 6.5 emphasis and 4 plays per day. Withdrawals on WJIS-FM, WYMX, WRKK, WQXM, WJMZ, and WRNO, we're now up to 60 adds...Comments: Belle, KJIM, "Marty works miracles. He uses the timed release kind, and sales are supportive of his efforts"...Bruce Goldsen, WRKI, "Marty's successful solo venture was well received in the Connecticut area and now we're playing both the single and 'I Do Believe'"...And from Charlie West, KMOD, "Showing strong early sales on the Balin and good phones, too".

ELTON JOHN, "THE FOX", GEPHEN

Elton steps up his pace on the emotional trail with a #43 Index debut--his highest chart position in the 4 1/2 years we've done the Report...#2 Most Added last week with 41 and #5 Most Added with 13 this week...Strongest early play on WQDR, WCOQ, WPDH, WPLR, and KMOD..."Breaking Down The Barriers" is new on the Song Index at #76...More radio action: Bob Roman, WYFZ, "Elton comes back with an album that is perfect for radio. No negatives and very good timing release"...Mary Pillinger, WYFZ, "Elton drew surprising sales considering we only played the LP as an extra for one week. 'The Fox' came in a #1 on the sales chart".

SQUEEZE, "EAST SIDE STORY", A&M

With "Tempted" out front at #82, Squeeze debuts on both charts this week--#46 Metro and #47 Index...Great new adds too: WCOZ, WEEN, WYFZ, WQDR, WZIR, and WJCN...Increased play on WPDH, WJLP, WBCN, WCCC, and WHFS...WCOZ's Bob Lipshutz tells us, "Isn't it rewarding when one of your favorite bands lives up to your expectations? I couldn't ask for a better album than this one. Irresistible melodies, mammoth hooks, riter, wit and rock and roll in a myriad of styles. It's less hard than past efforts, so much more assured"...Eddie Wazoo adds, "A rousing response to 'Tempted'. A very active record. If Little Davis Eyes want #1, so can 'Tempted'". Also a vote of confidence from Curt Gary: "My favorite song of the week is 'Tempted'. Lyrically and musically, one of the best grooves on the radio today."

WHITESNAKE, "COME AND GET IT", MIRAGE

New at #48 Metro and #50 Index, with another consistent add week, WRIF, KISS, WFBO, WAQX, and 7 more for #7 Most Added. Now at 40 adds in the last three weeks. When these adds convert next week, look for another prime move.

METRO MAULERS:

ADAM AND THE ANTS, "KINGS OF THE WILD FRONTIER", EPIC

Steady at #41 on the Index, but a big fat Metro underline 42-36...KLAQ's Bob Roman added the record weeks ago, and this week reports, "More kudos for Adam. The album is really picking up followers now and on the phones they are fabulous. Beyond that, sales are bubbling under the top 5"...WZZO's Lyn Corey is having similar success "extremely strong phone reaction on 'Annie'sie'"...Also still very active in Philly with #6 sales. "Antmusic" is up 74-59.

LES DUDEK, "GYPSY RIDE", COLUMBIA

A 46-40 Metro underline for Les, with play increases on KATT, KLOL, and KLBJ..."Deja Vu" steady at #17 with average play 9.3 plays per day and 5.3 emphasis.

BRAM TCHAIKOVSKY, "FUNLAND", ARISTA

KOME, WTUE, and WGIR-FM are new. A slight increase on the Back Page, 45-43, but a healthy gain in the top 30 mentions, 47-37...Play increases on WBRU, WRLM, WYFZ, and WLIR..."Shall We Dance" debuts at #83.

THE A'S, "WOMAN'S GOT THE POWER", ARISTA

I'm totally knocked out by "Woman's Got The Power", and not just because the band is from Philly. I think the track would work just about anywhere...Sky agrees, "Record of the week: 'Woman's Got The Power'. Philly craze. These guys are not A wimp. 2) L.A. skiny tie or C) Petyo band....Kid Leo continues, "I've been quoted as saying a necessary part of the Cleveland sound is rock and roll with soul. That's a perfect definition of the A's new album, in particular the title track. I mean, it brings back the days when I used to spit-shine my station and wear iridescent sharkskin pants! (You can't fool me Leo, you still wear 'em)...WJWR's Ray White says, "If I don't mention the A's new record, both Bram Tchaikovsky and Joe Bonadonna are going to throw me off the roof. Yes boys, you're right. 'Woman's Got The Power' is most definitely in the grooves. It's got a Phil Lynot, Rascal, Springsteen sound"...Finally, on the home front, Joe Bonadonna did the track with Kal on the Smash or Trash feature, and makes history, "For the first time ever, we received a 100% positive reaction. That song is very hot--they're in love!!!"

JOE VITALE, "PLANTATION HARBOR", ELEKTRA

Another 14 adds for Joe this week, for a total of 34 in the last two weeks...We will definitely see a debut next week--our prediction is #44....."Lady On the Rock" leads. A great quote from John Logan, "Joe hits you with his rhythm stick and has come up with one of the most pleasant rock albums in recent memory. Add two ounces of tasty material, pour in real strong guitar work from Joe, a touch of crazy garnish with R&R roots, and the recipe delivers a new tropical drink--'Plantation Harbor' punch"...More high praise from Dave Logan, WLAV-FM, "I'd like to raise a toast to Joe's album. Anyone from the Joe Walsh school of reality is okay by me. The licks from 'The Bomber' are as magnificent as anything on his album (hell, it's Joe's band). When fused together with the seamless Szymczyk production, the result is smooth as sailing with the boat weirdos"...Finally from Dave at WDVE, "Sounds like a good 25-34 record".

SPIDER, "BETWEEN THE LINES", DREAMLAND

KOME and WBCN lead the way this week, with 10 more for #6 Most Added...Now at 27 reports in two weeks, as WBLM's Jose Diaz sez it all, "An adventurous follow-up to their debut. It's somewhat different but still commercial rock and roll. 'Change' and 'Can't Live Long This Way' will be our leads. Amanda Blue has one of the more distinctive voices in rock".

20/20, "LOOK OUT", EPIC

"Yellow Pills" was the workhorse track from the debut. "Nuclear Boy" is the heir apparent from the new release. "Strange Side Of Love" is also active...#9 Most Added with 9 reports, heavy on the Indicators: KROQ, WQBK, KTIM, KZEL, and WPDH...Comments: Peyton Mays, KZEL, "20/20 packs more polish and less pop plablum than their first release"...Lin Brehmer, WQBK, "I'm quite impressed with the new album. A solid follow-up"...Ron Sorenson, KBLE, "Shows more maturity and definite style the first album only hinted at. Rich Podolar's squeaky clean production is certainly a plus, too".

THE PLASMATICS, "BEYOND THE VALLEY OF 1984", STIFF

WLIR, KBLE, WDEK, KZEL, and KFML are the new adds. The strong comments continue: Kid Leo, "Plasmatics are getting a lot of requests. It's an exciting piece of music to play, not only because of the way it sounds, but for what they are. It creates talk and that's always a good thing to have"...Peyton Mays notes, "By now it's shockingly apparent that the Plasmatics cannot be ignored. At the risk of sounding old and stodgy at my tender age, I can't say I like their sound or that I am captivated by their notorious stage show, but I sure as hell salute the awesome precision of the Stiff hype machine. They brought this band from a cult following to a cultural phenomenon"...Finally, WIOT's Buck McWilliams says, "If you're not playing something from the new album, you're missing out on the comedy event of the year. We played the intros to 'Fast Food Service', 'Sex Junkie', and 'Headbanger' and 'A Pig Is A Pig' this morning and got more calls than we did from Steve Dahl's 'Ayatollah'".

IRON MAIDEN, "KILLERS", CAPITOL

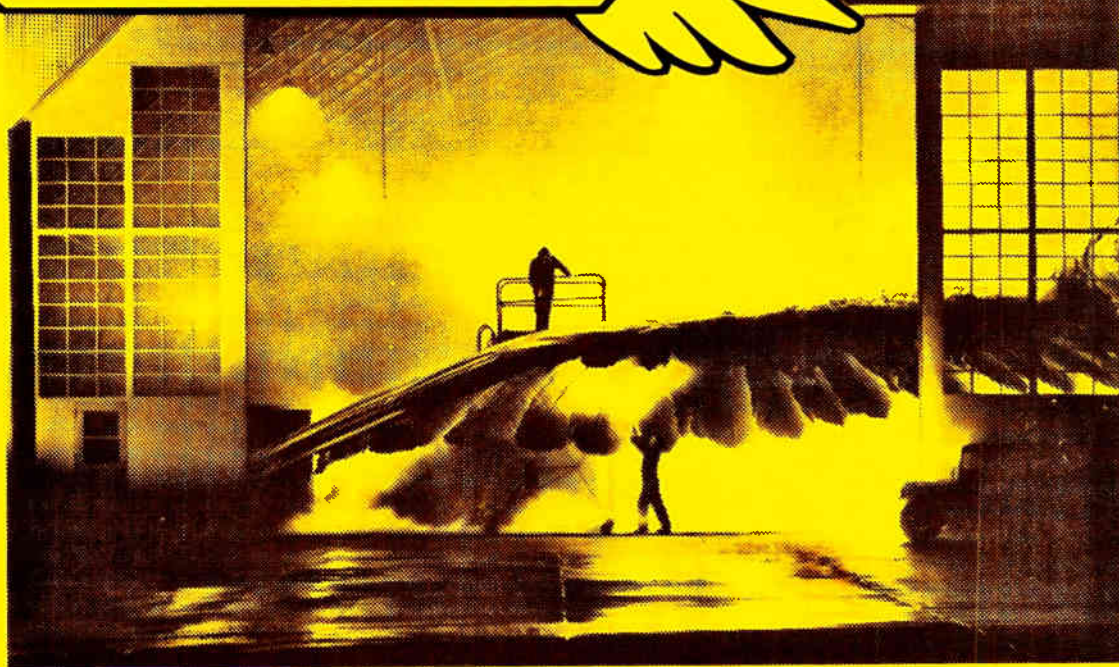
While the Tubes and Squier are blowing out, Capitol is methodically putting together a very strong case for adding the Iron Maiden...Last week we mentioned the strong buzz building in the DC area...This week WMYK's Bill Simmons tells us, "Something good finally started in Washington with this one. We tested 'Wrathchild' on our nightly test track and got a positive to negative ratio of 10 to 1. It's definitely better than 95% of the heavy metal out there now"...WTPA's Bill Grant reports "Impressive #10 debut sales"...I also understand the WLLZ test was equally positive. If it's new metal you want, give this record serious consideration.

YOKO ONO, "SEASONS OF GLASS", GEFEN/WARNER BROTHERS

This just rolled in at deadline, and on a few listens, I can't wait to see what radio thinks. I actually got off on her voice and writing on "Double Fantasy" and am intrigued by what I've heard on "Seasons". As hard as it is to relate to much of it, I feel the public will definitely want to hear it--and it deserves a test at least. We like "Goodbye Sadness", and "Nobody Sees Me Like You Do". New on WPLJ.

Question Of The Week

KSJO's Frank Andrick suggested this one: "Are you currently doing any call-out research? If so, what is your weekly sample size? How is the information valuable? If you're not doing call-outs, why not?"

KOME, DANA JANG: "Yea, we are doing call-out research, but not on music. We concentrate on lifestyle calls. No set weekly total, primarily just when necessary...I believe that calls using the phone as a tool to find out about people's music taste, playing portions of songs, or hooks down the line is not representative of the environment of people listening to the radio. Also asking about specific song titles, people may not be able to remember it by title or group name. Asking about group info is very difficult to qualify due to the fact that groups may have 1 or 2 great songs that people may have forgotten, but the image of the group may not be good."

WPLR, EDDIE WAZOO: "We don't do it because we don't feel any necessity to do it. All our individual jocks keep their ears to the ground and take an active interest in talking to the listeners. We possess an airstaff with some collectively very good ears."

WMJQ, OREST: "We have a very big sample size. The information is very useful because it reflects what the market likes and dislikes. As the market changes, so will the music on the station."

WDIZ, MIKE LYONS: "We're not doing it presently due to the lack of manpower, money, and facilities... We are calling local retail outlets for sales information"

KBLE, RON SORENSON: "No, it's a waste of valuable listening time."

WBRU, MICHAEL MACRONE: "We don't particularly believe random surveys are effective here. As far as we can tell, the most effective survey is an accurate survey of what is selling."

WQBK, LIN BREHMER: "Yes, we call a wide variety of local record stores, but we do not call listeners. We don't feel it's necessary."

WBLM, JOSE DIAZ: "Most simply, we don't feel the need for it. We do fairly well without it."

WRXL, ILYSE GOTTLIEB: "No, we're not doing any mainly because we don't have the staff to do it correctly. The closest thing we do to that is we test music with the advisory board. We also play a new song every night, and ask listeners to call in and voice their opinion."

WEBN, CURT GARY: "Sample size is approximately 500 to 1,000...It gives us another window to reality... It's like reading a good book every week."

KSJO, FRANK ANDRICK: "Yes, we do callout research of various types. Retail research for one to retail outlets and one stops to help determine sales patterns. We do a limited amount of callouts to homes for basic attitudes, burnout factors. The sample size is approximately 75 to 100...Personally, I find most of the information received usually just supports what we already know. However, I do like the security and feeling of having most bases covered (yea, right). It leads to 'paper chase'."

WLUP, SKY DANIELS: "Well, first of all we call about 150 per week in passive research. As we use the cassette recall method playing a sample from various selections. I think it's fairer than just total recall...I never lean towards any research method other than my ears. Gut feeling is and always will be my first and foremost source...Store reports are a laugh when the top album moves 1,000 pieces in a city of 7 million."

KLOL, MICHELE ROBINSON: "We don't right now, but we're starting to get ready for a whole new series of call-outs."

KTIM, BELLE: "Since we're not really concerned with our Arbitron standing in the market, we're not THAT research oriented. We are research oriented in the respect that we do call out retail reports to find out what's selling, since we are in such a unique area. But, that just supplements everything else we use to program the radio stations: input from the jocks, listeners, gut level feelings, information from the trades, and conversations with other programmers and promotion people."

WIOT, BUCK MCWILLIAMS: "Sample size is about 50 people per week. Mostly because, in a depressed economy like the one Toledo is in, it's our responsibility to find out not only what the people buy, but what they would buy if they had the money. More importantly, what they want to hear on the air that they can't afford to buy."

KDWB, DAVID HAMILTON: "We make between 700 and 800 calls per week. It's the most valid information we have. We wouldn't spend the kind of money we do if we didn't feel it was the major source of information."

WDVE, DAVE LANGE: "We do very little. Only to bring in general comments on people's perceptions of the station. We usually use open ended questions on how all the stations in the market are perceived... As far as music selection, I find it to be almost a waste of time. If you need to spend thousands of dollars a week to be told what the top 5 or maybe the top 10 bands are in your market, then you must be deaf, dumb, and blind."

KYYS, JOE MCCABE: "Very little call out. We don't feel the benefits outweigh the expense."

WLPX, BOBBIN BEAM: "We are doing call out research. The sample size is confidential. It's extremely valuable, but all I can reveal is name, rank, and serial number. But, we don't rely on it exclusively. It's just another piece of the puzzle."

WAQX, ED LEVINE: "I am still waiting to hire the people. It was enough of an effort to get the funds allocated. During the year I had three interns doing lifestyle call out research--not playing hooks down the line. The information was fairly valuable, but the problem I ran into is that interns don't work, if you're into serious research. Now I will have some people coming in who are paid."

WLRS, JOHN SIMON: "Yes, we are doing call outs. In the hundreds weekly...Information is at least as valuable as the trades in that it is immediate and localized."

KAZY, GREG GILLISPIE: "We do between 250-300 calls per week. Yes, we do find it useful, but not necessarily on a weekly basis. If you take several weeks together, the information becomes that much more valuable. I would say that as far as new music decisions go, I would place more credence in my feeling and belief in the record than I would in any call out or store research."

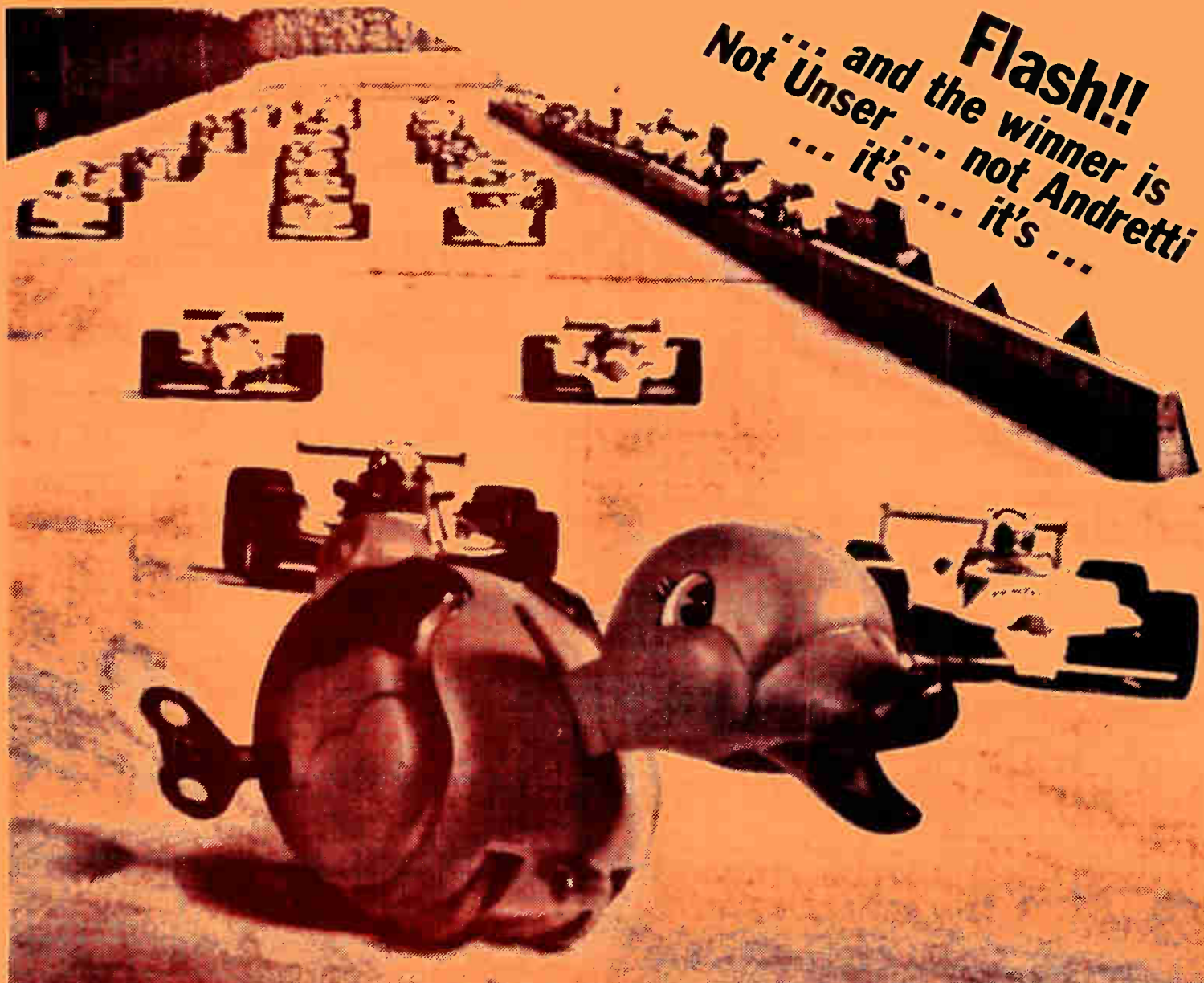
WCCC, PAUL PAYTON: "No. We don't do call out research primarily due to lack of staffing. However, I am not sure what ten seconds of a less than familiar track means to Joe Blow on the other end. Think back to the last time your friendly promo ace did that to you on the phone and how much resentment you felt (if any). I did."

KBPI, PHIL STRIDER: "Yes...I'll never tell...Yes, because it's always impressive to have a pile of statistics in front of you to pour through and highlight with different color highlighters (just like in college). Also, it makes it that much easier to support your predetermined conclusions."

WYFE, DICK BASCOM: "Yes, on a very limited basis...About 30 calls. We don't really have the research staff or funds to do a full-blown campaign. We utilize interns and they are few and far between...I use it more or less as an indicator, mostly on burn to find when to get off a record, not so much on new product."

WMMR, JOE BONADONNA: "Basically, yes. On a weekly basis. I wind up tracking records in stores throughout the area to give me a feel for what is moving and not moving. Other research is personal contact! With people on the street and asking them what they think. More of that than hard core research per se. As far as actually musical related all call outs, we don't do any. The ears of the jocks on this station are outstanding. They are not going to miss a track."

WMMS, KID LEO: "The only calls we do are our top 20 sales research...We have had immense success without call out research, and I don't see any reason to change."

KTXQ, DALLAS, TX M.D.-DRAKE HALL: "Love the Silver Condor. It's the best thing I've heard since Loverboy. At least there are some people in music who understand what radio needs. We're happy to oblige with an out-of-the-box add. The only problem is deciding on cuts, because the whole thing is strongola. Earl, you're a great guy, but work on the posing. I mean, this hands-on-the-hip with a touch of rouge shit will not cut it in the big city. Was David Bowie's hair really orange?...To Joe McCabe from Doctor Drake: Joe, I know your wife just had a baby, and it's tough to deal with premature middle age crisis, but truly Joe, and I mean this sincerely, it's okay to like those wimpoid artists you mentioned last week. Truly, it does reveal latent tendencies, but only in about 89% of said occurrences. The true test is--can you add the Moody Blues and still have more than a 2 share? Next week Dr. Drake discusses the tip sheet sincerity syndrome. Or if you're going to open your mouth, do it at home. No public laundry, thank you...But seriously, we are playing 'The Voice' and believe me, it won't be on the radio for 20,000 days...Thank God, Peter Frampton took off his pink satin pants (like these thematic intimations?), and started drinking Jack Daniels out of the bottle again. (Yea, I know it's a baby bottle, but you can't expect miracles overnight). His hair is still blonde, his eyes are still blue, and I think the electrolysis worked great, don't you? He is playing some mean guitar, which is a real uplifting experience for me. (Editor's note: 'lifts and separates', right Drake?) We are legitimately expecting good reaction..Marko, I hear you guys used to hang out in Key West at the Y--if you get my drift big fella...I recall how heavy Polydor worked Bram's follow-up, and how much they pissed people off. I think, consequently, many were shy of the Arista debut. Maybe we were all premature in our prejudice. The Lp rally is on par with the first, and maybe it will stick... For the next couple of weeks, I'll be doing the morning show. If you have record calls, get in touch with me before 1:00 Monday and Tuesday."

KROQ, LOS ANGELES, CA M.D.-LARRY GROVES: "The Frampton is definitely a lot stronger than his last record for us. We play a lot of 60's oldies, so the remake of 'Friday On My Mind' is perfect... Naughty Sweeties have a large local following, so we're using the live Ep...20/20 is local with good hooks. 'Nuclear Boy' leads...I think the Spider follow-up is better and could be the one to break them...Increased play on Split Enz. We added another cut, getting better rotation, and a few more calls...The record that's really happening here is the Plasmatics album. The phones are super intense. They want to hear it. People can't get enough. Best calls on 'Sex Junkie'...Don't know why more stations are not playing Adam and the Ants. We added the import single, and the phones are crazy for Adam too--everything we play...Also, strong calls on Missing Persons, X (strong local following), Waitresses (probably #1 request--incredible calls), Human Sexual Response, and Romeo Void...Also, we have hired Dusty Street from KWST to do 10PM till 2AM...Best time to call me: Wednesday after 11 my time."

KBPI, DENVER, CO M.D.-PHIL STRIDER: "Themselves including, one no sparing: absurdity of masters are Tubes the. Image their was at fun poke to left thing only the. Inside songs accessible, tasteful, and back the on layout photo 500 Fortune. Voila--unforgettable is 'Amnesia' and legs has 'Later Ya To Talk'. WMMR, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-JOE BONADONNA: "It's not often that I get a chance to scream about a record--it has to hit me very hard before I react to it--but the second album from the A's has just knocked me off my feet. They are a Philadelphia band that has got it this time around. I had a chance to hear a test pressing of the album and that's all I've been listening to since it came out. They're hitbound!! The title track of the album produced by Nick Garvey, 'Woman's Got The Power', could go all the way. We did 'Smash Or Trash' on Kal's show on Tuesday morning and for the first time on that feature, we received a 100% positive reaction to 'Woman's Got The Power'. The song's very, very hot!!... The album is deep too...Other Personal Faves: 'When The Rebel Comes Home' (also produced by Garvey), 'In America', and 'Electricity'. I really like 'Gemini Dream' on the Moodies; and, also the song 'The Voice'...New Musik's 'Straight Lines' Lp version is really outstanding--much better than the Ep... Over the weekend, WMMR did the 2nd annual Philadelphia 500, our May Poll Of Music, selecting the Top 500 songs from the audience. The #1 song this year: 'Hungry Heart' by Springsteen. The reaction to the weekend was incredible...Also over the weekend, we had the Old City block party--over two days the total crowd was 130,000. 50,000 Sunday and 80,000 the second day. Many local bands were performing live music: The A's, The Hooters, Sin City Band, Pedestrians, Front Street Runners, and Robert Hazzard And The Heroes. It was a wonderful party. Also during the party, I was put in a sensory deprivation tank and set the world record for continuous floating--That will go in the Guinness Book Of World Records. After floating for the record, I felt like I was on vacation for a month. Local TV covered the event. All-in-all, a big success. A great way to spend Memorial Day weekend...Local Retail: For the first time, the REO Speedwagon album knocked Steve Winwood for the #1 spot in sales in Philly--now #2 after staying at #1 for 4 months...The Van Halen is Top 10; Adam & The Ants is #6; Pretenders holding Top 5 since release...My current favorite is: The Tubes 'Completion Backward'. 'Talk To Ya Later' is pulling in phones...Still great reaction to 'Almost Saturday Night' as the Dave Edmunds is selling Top 20 in Philadelphia...Bram Tchaikovsky came by for an interview this past week--phone reaction to 'Shall We Dance' is great."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "I've been quoted as saying a necessary part of the Cleveland sound is rock and roll with soul--and that's a perfect definition of the A's new album. In particular, the title track. I mean, it brings back the days when I used to spit shine my Stetson and wear iridescent sharkskin pants...The Moody Blues--Rock's answer to the Moral Majority is back. In their heyday, they were more of a religion than a rock band. Now this is more of a comeback. 'Octave', out two years ago, was actually more of a detour than a comeback--but they are back on the right track now, and all those fans are crawling out of the pews...To reiterate my comment of last week, Frampton has definitely made a record to re-establish himself as a credible rock and roll artist, not a cover boy...Earl Slick, session man extraordinaire, has for many a year tried to find the right combination for his own outfit. I think he's got it right this time. The album is a solid debut. In some ways, it was reminiscent of Foreigner's debut...Syl Sylvain and David Johansen were the two creative thrusts behind a band that was way ahead of its time, the New York Dolls. If they were around today, they would certainly be a superstar act. Therefore, I think everybody should give high consideration to both of their records. They're distinctly different, yet both are definitely unabashed, unadulterated rock and roll. More on David' album next week, as we add the 12" now...The Plasmatics are getting a lot of requests. It's an exciting piece of music to play not only because of the way it sounds, but what they are. It creates talk and that's always a good thing to have."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record Of The Week: A's. 'Woman's Got The Power'. Philly freeze. These guys are not: A) wimp; B) L.A. skinny tie; C) retro band. If Bowie gave RCA a cut like this, Nipper would get a Hard on...We did the 'Crazy Train' last week and Ozzy was great. Thanks to: Chuck Schwartz, Bill Johnson, Flipside, and Sharon Arden...The April Wine/38 Special show was phenomenal last week. At the pre-show dinner, April Wine manager, Terry Flood, and I had our first taste of wild lion steak. Thanks to: Capitol's Jay Hart and Steve George...It was good seeing Mark Spector, as usual. But where was Marko? What? Nah, we all know his parents haven't visited him since Alcatraz closed... In our T.P. giveaway update, we went to the beach this weekend with tickets. Our van was mobbed and required police assistance to get out...Finally, notes from a lame duck. If I go anywhere at least it will be voluntarily, unlike what the Metromedia grapevine is feeding me about you. Start saving your pennies, pal. Any day now."

The import single is a killer and has already gotten immediate reaction. By the time you read this, I'll have seen Robert perform here in Lafayette. If the show lives up to the record, then we have a true contender on our hands. It looks like Mike Pillot has done it again."

WCOZ, BOSTON, MA M.D.-ROB LIPSHUTZ: "Isn't it rewarding when one of your favorite bands lives up to your expectations? I couldn't ask for a better album than 'East Side Story' from Squeeze. Irresistible melodies, mammoth hooks, humor, wit, and rock and roll in a myriad of styles. It's less manic than past efforts, so much more assured. 'Tempted' seems to have the most universal appeal, but consider the Beatish 'Is That Love' and the contagious 'Mumbo Jumbo'. A real performance from the band, thanks to Mr. Costello...What a relief to find a track as good as 'The Voice' from the Moody Blues, after that awful 12". 'The Voice' deserves play among the Moodies classics...Can't understand the reluctance towards Dave Edmunds' 'Almost Saturday Night'. It's as strong a recording as you will get...Attention record people: When calling WCOZ for tracking, please ask for my interns. They can handle it, I promise...Thanks to Stiff-staff Roy and Wendy, and the slic goons Arlene, Steve and maybe even Harvey, for enhancing my trip to NYC (a gooter multizite); and to Polygram for tickets to the most exciting concert in recent memory, The Jam. Can't wait for their Boston show, and guess who is co-promoting it?"

WEBN, CINCINNATI, OH M.D.-CURT GARY: "Frampton: Maybe it'll grow on me, but I was over Peter a long time ago and I'm not sure if this record is good enough to bring me back...The Moody Blues is a classic for them. I really think it has some great material on it. It might not be for everybody, but it's a really good album (except for the single)...The Muffs are a real fine band out of Columbus. They got with the times and changed their name from the Muff Brothers to The Muffs. They have a strong Midwest track record, and this is a real fine first effort...My favorite song of the week: 'Tempted' from Squeeze--lyrically and musically, one of the best grooves on the radio today...Best Calls For: Ozzy Osbourne and Shooting Star...Split Enz just starting to get some phones and positive response. Last week I was beginning to worry if the sound was too sophisticated...Considering: George Harrison (expected today); still listening to Marty Balin...Some things in the wings: Les Dudek and D.B. Cooper."

WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-DAVE BENSON: "Last week's projections are this week's adds: Peter Frampton and Moody Blues. The potential for lame music here is incredible. Luckily, both Lp's far exceed the potential wimp factor and surpass our expectations. Solid music all around...Extra tracks on: 38 Special, Ozzy Osbourne, and Santana...Sales are very soft again, but Van Halen is strong; with 38 Special doing well; and, Ozzy on the rise...Jim Steinman starting very slowly. The single may be the only hope for vegetable loaf...And now we bid bon voyage to an old friend whose travel agent just booked him a heavy guilt trip on Chicago's Titanic. We know he'll be able to buy lots of pretty souvenirs and eat at the best restaurants now, but we can't help but think that the travel plans were thrown together so hastily that there may be problems. Good bye, Willie...Also, on a separate voyage completely, good luck to: John Mrvos. Hope everything turns out the way you want it to. Don't forget to call home occasionally."

WABX, DETROIT, MI M.D.-STEVE KOSTAN: "As a good friend once said, 'It's great to be hard again.' Back from a brief medical time out, it looks like Detroit is being seduced and won over by Billy Squier. We show 'Don't Say No' #8 retail this week and small wonder!! This Lp delivers on all that was promised before with ABX heavily into: 'You Should Be High Love' and 'The Big Beat' off the last Summer. With 'In The Dark', 'The Stroke', and 'My Kind Of Lover', Billy Squier is my kind of rocker!!!! ..Watch for Marty Balin to build as one or two cuts emerge out of the five or six tough choices... Sometimes modern radio can be a bitch."

WLPX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "The Moody Blues--It seems like their time has come again, in terms of the audience returning in regard to vintage supergroups. This album is much stronger than 'Octave'. Although they have changed musically, this is a formula Moodys album, complete with the spoken poems and everything. A lot of curious callers already...I think the Walsh connection will only help Joe Vitale. Great guitar and catchy songs...Peter Frampton is trying to dump the wimp image of 'I'm In You' and 'Sgt. Pepper', but I'm not too sure the audience will forget his darker musical moments. The fact came to light when we played major pieces of the record on our New Album Preview last night. Hopefully, in time, Frampton's brightness on this new album, especially the title cut, will shine through his clouded image perception on the part of the audience...The Tubes 'Talk To Ya Later' sounds so good on the radio--sounds like a hit...Very Strongly Considering: Whitesnake for next week... Getting heavy phones on: Sherbs single, 'No Turning Back'. People should really think about dealing with it...Also major calls on: 'The Stroke'...Ditto, Phil Collins...Sales This Week: Phil Collins now up to #2, Van Halen #1, Tom Petty #3, Ozzy Osbourne #4, Styx #5, Joe Walsh #6, AC/DC 'Dirty Deeds' #7, Kim Carnes #8, and Rush #9...Other Highlights: Whitesnake #13, Jim Steinman #17, Franke & The Knockouts #19, and Billy Squier #20."

KOME, SAN JOSE, CA M.D.-DANA JANG: "I think Bram is a pretty good comeback album. 'Shall We Dance' has a good modern sound to it...I l-o-v-e the Frampton. I thought it was terrific on first listen I've been a fan since the Humble Pie days and was disappointed in recent years, but I think this is a fine return and the air staff agrees--they are all playing the record and they love it...Another good comeback from Elton. Side 1 is all very accessible for rock and roll radio stations (other than the single, that is)...David Lindley's appearances in the area have really reinforced interest in the record, especially for 'Mercury Blues'. Of course there was the Jackson Browne hook in the guest appearances, but Lindley closed a lot of the audience as represented both in phones and sales increases...Still a few phones from the Southern rock cult and light local sales on the Van Zant...A good little record from Silver Condor. Besides 'Survival', 'Angel Eyes' is emerging...Balin getting pretty steady sales--could be attributed to Top 40 play on 'Hearts' as well as his name value in the Bay area...Switching over to the 'Rock And Roll Dreams' track on the Steinman...Picking up increasing sales on the Tubes. Getting curiosity calls wanting to hear more on the album, but they have a fairly sizeable local cult...A few phones and light sales on Marshall Tucker...Sales at the top are: Petty, Starship, Van Halen, The Who, Styx, Steve Winwood and Santana...Also showing good sales on: April Wine, Gary U.S. Bonds, Phil Collins, Journey, Lennon, Greg Kihn, Loverboy, Police, Pretenders, 38 Special, Joe Walsh, Elton John (with a great first week)...Showing steady action for: Balin, Split Enz, Dave Edmunds, 'Secret Policeman's Ball', the Tubes...Picking up: Rick Springfield, and Adam & The Ants still holding pretty steady...Calls on: April Wine album; Gary U.S. Bonds single; picking up some for the Pretenders; Phil Collins 'In The Air' and 'I Missed'; Starship 'Stranger', 'Mary', 'Save Your Love', 'Stairway To Cleveland'; Greg Kihn album; Loverboy 'Kid is Hot' and 'Turn Me Loose'; new Petty; new Pretenders; REO Speedwagon; Rush's 'Tom Sawyer'; Santana 'Winning'; Styx; 38 Special 'Hold On Loosely'; new Van Halen; 'Things' by Joe Walsh; Split Enz...Getting some phones for: Adam & The Ants, Tom Johnston's 'Wastin Time', Ozzy Osbourne 'Mr. Crowley', Rick Springfield's 'Jessie's Girl', Billy Squiers 'The Stroke' and David Lindley's 'Mercury Blues'...Considering: Joe Vitale."

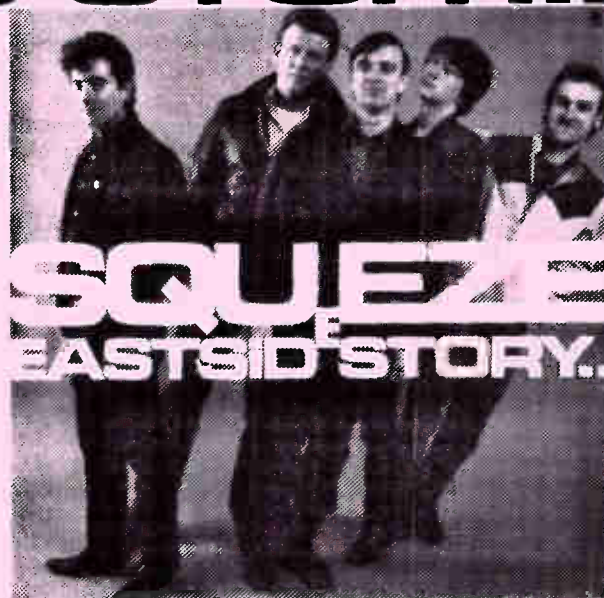

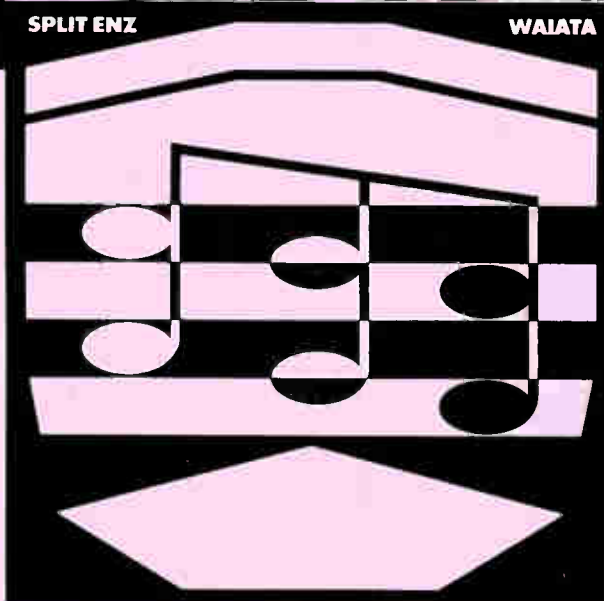

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-GREG GILLISPIE: "Cold Chisel is really doing well now. The album is now in hot rotation and phones are starting to ring for 'My Baby'. We're starting to get a nibble on sales too. Hopefully, they'll come our way this Summer...I guess Peter Frampton's new album could have been entitled 'Where I Should Be'. It's definitely just that. Great rock and roll that we've come to expect from Peter, although there is no real obvious hit single, which may be in his favor this time around. I like: the title track and 'You Kill Me'...Silver Condor has all the makings of the hot debut record for 1981...The Whitesnake is really starting to catch on in Colorado. We're getting some good phones at night for 'Come And Get It'...Last week I got to see Split Enz in concert. If they come your way, don't miss it. A great stage presentation including a light show unlike any you've ever seen...To Buck McWilliams at WIOT: Regarding your new music massacre of a couple of weeks ago: I think if you re-evaluate some of the new music you blew off and the ones that you kept, you'll find that you may have made a mistake. Having worked in Toledo previously, I know the marketplace is open for bands like Cold Chisel and Greg Kihn; whereas, some of the music that you decided to keep on hasn't shown much of a track record in that town. P.S. Why don't you play the new Isley Bros. record?...Jim Steinman is sounding good on the radio. I think 'Dreams' could be a hit, with overall good potential to come through. By the way, thanks for the call last week, Jim...A few calls for the Elton John...The Tubes sound great on the radio...Considering: Silver Condor...For the Memorial Day weekend we did a syndicated program called 'Rock And Roll Never Forgets', featuring 14 hours of live concert material, most of which had never been broadcast before. The show ran from Friday afternoon until Monday evening, including Triple A road and campground reports."

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE: "I can always tell when the nice weather hits the Northeast because Country Paul's comments shrink to a mere half page. With the beautiful weather, not a whole lot of new music to talk about...I'll leave the chatter about the return of the greats to others more excited about their music...Hey EMI folks, why wasn't 'Freeways' by Marty Balin put on the Lp? Making it the B side of the single is just throwing it away. Had it been on the album, our decision would have been much easier...To Joe McCabe in KC: The water is fine, come on in...Lots of Squeeze, Dregs, Joan Jett, Zappa, Billy Squier, Split Enz and Tubes floating around...If I don't mention the A's new record both Bram Tchaikovsky and Joe Bonadonna are going to throw me off the roof. Yes, boys, you're right -- 'Women's Got The Power' is most definitely in the grooves. It's got a Phil Lynott/Rascals/Springsteen sound...DeBella's 'screamer of the week' goes to one of our favorite bands, New Musik's 'This World Of Water'. Glad to see they are picking up believers around the country...My favorite import of the week has to be the new one from the Psychedelic Furs. The band and Lillywhite have come up with a tighter, more direct sound, capitalizing on their good points with less noddling around. Yes, maybe it's more commercial than their first, but who gives a shit as long as it's honest and sounds good. Already phones, too...Other hot imports include 'Way Of The West', Thin Lizzy Live, the Undertones, Sparks, and Dave Stewart...Sales breakouts this week: Squeeze, Moodies, 999, Tubes, Plasmatics, Whitesnake and Di Meola."

KSJO, SAN JOSE, CA R.D.-FRANK ANDRICK: "Sales steady on the established big guns front, with the Starship and Kim Carnes showing the most real progress. On the new stuff, it's good to see the Tubes retailing quite well with a lot of instore excitement going for them...Joe Walsh, Split Enz, and Tom Johnston also showing some retail muscle. Rick Springfield is finally breaking from the pack and requests and sales are up...Ditto for RCA-mate Robert Gordon, whose club dates have put his album on the sales map...Requests are nothing but huge on Tom Petty, Van Halen, Starship, Kim ('Bette') Carnes, Phil Collins, Loverboy. Dave Edmunds, Split Enz, 'Policeman's Ball', U-2, Marty Balin, Santana, and the Pretenders all drawing some calls...Of single note, the new Adam & The Ants single 'Stand And Deliver' is already causing a stir with limited airplay. As a portent of things to come, the Ants third album could be dangerous to stale radio...You saw and heard it first on FMOB! The Psyche Furs single. With CBS Loverboy-style work commitment, a group with a supposedly silly name like The Psychedelic Furs could go the distance. Besides, what was a Led Zeppelin, or a Jefferson Airship, or Pink Floyd before success made it sound good to most people. Check out 'Pretty And Pink', 'Mr. Jones', and 'Into You Like A Train'. The Furs exude an explicable scruffy charm that sold out the Old Waldorf last year with one album rocker in the area on the Lp. Guess who?...Thank someone the Moody Blues are back together. To be honest, I couldn't have handled another soft and drippy solo album by any of these guys. The band still delivers the goods, though. 'Voice' sounds like prime Moody Blues to me...With an easy air debut as the 6th most played, it really make me feel good to see the positive staff and public reaction to the new Frampton. Accent the word 'new', although it's more like he's running head long into his past. Let's face it. When the material was schlocky, it was easy to write the guy off. Not so anymore! 'Dig What I Say' and 'Let You Go' lead the way on KSJO airplay, followed by 'Breaking The Rules' and 'Friday'. Peter Frampton and David Kershenbaum have gone a long way with their best foot forward in reestablishing that all-important image and sound credibility factor. This Lp will further prove that age old adage of 'If it's in the grooves - it's in the grooves!' Does this mean it's cool to like the Framp again? (Oh, the games we play)...Silver Condor. This may just be the streamlined, yet tuff-enuff, pop radio's been looking for. In the past month, we've all seen some pretty respectable pop efforts languish making their small dent in the Lp chart, and the lucky one or two that pulled off the semi single. The combo of smooth slickness, polished bite, and hooks galore easily makes this Condor one slick bird. It sure tops any other post-Bowie by Earl Slick. If but 'For The Sake Of Survival' alone, play this album."

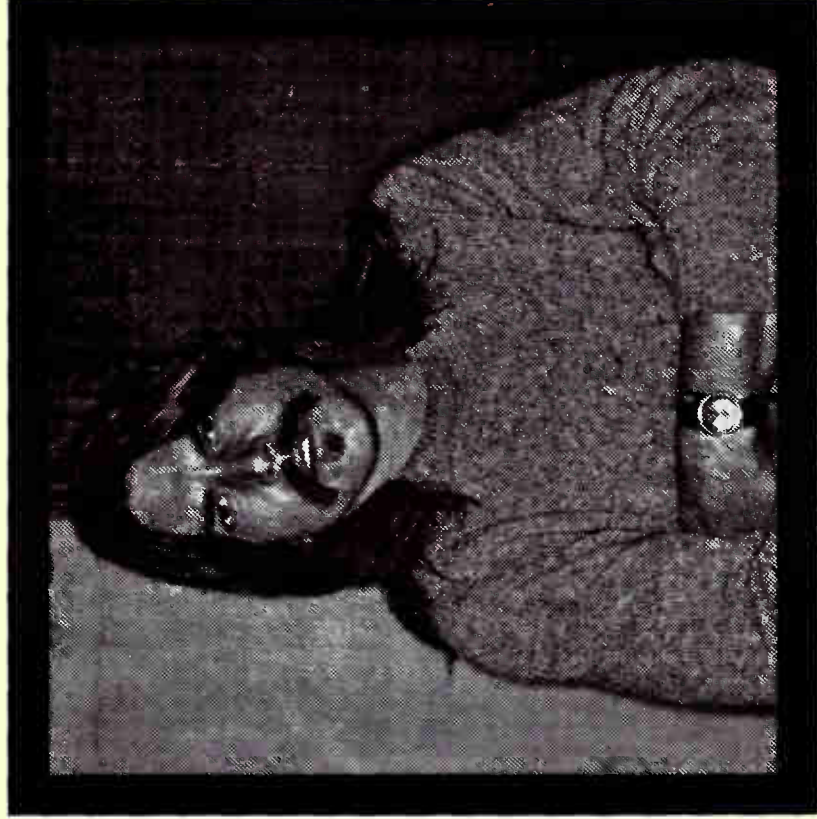

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-BELLE: "Dinner Friday night with Epic's David Newmark and Bay Area notables was complemented with a visit by Garland Jeffreys prior to his Waldorf engagement. What I found totally amazing was Garland's complete recall of the people at the table and their radio station affiliations, not to mention his understanding of station tactics and their position in the market. An artist who makes it his business to know his business (all aspects) prospers in a number of different ways: 1) Respect from the industry. 2) Comprehension of the systems in the industry for better relations for all concerned. This is an area that many artists ignore, and shouldn't. Is this not the communications business? The Garland Jeffreys show, incidently, was super. The Rumour opened and showed that they have staying power. The album has the same energetic feel as the stage show. Let the Rumour run rampant on your station...Marty Balin works miracles. He uses the timed release kind. And sales are supportive of his efforts...Others Equally As Strong: Kim Carnes and the Tazmanian Devils...Also some hot radio tracks from: Chaka Kahn, 'Any Old Sunday' and 'We Can Work It Out'...The Grace Jones Lp is holding up extremely well. 'Pull Up To The Bumper' and 'Walking In The Rain' have been well received...I just received news that I spaced out on my 10 year high school reunion that I've been planning to go to since January. A shoulder, please?"

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "I listened to the Undertones album over the weekend. I was really impressed. It's a nice even album to have around. They're currently shopping for a label in this country...The A's third effort sounds really nice...The English Beat, my favorite ska band, has a new one...We're looking for big things from the Psychedelic Furs...20/20 is starting to happen around here; as well as the Plasmatics...Three other favorites so far this year are: 999, Stiff Little Fingers, and Holly & The Italians...Romeo Void is getting increased airplay and sales every week...I'm looking forward to seeing John Cale live."

KZEL, EUGENE, OR M.D.-PEYTON MAYS: "This must be the week of rock and roll resurrection. It would seem that album rock's funeral for Peter Frampton and the Moody Blues were a bit premature. Frampton's back humping like a camel in heat with Summer backseat rock and roll that will relegate his teen dream image to back issues of 'Tiger Beat'...The Moodys have managed to keep pace with the times with a new rock wave breaking over their classic 'Coral Reef'. The older demos will remember and the younger ones will hear it all for the first time...20/20 packs more polish and less pop pablum than their first release. 'Strange Side Of Love', 'Girl Like You', and 'American Dream' should put them within national earshot...Earl Slick's Silver Condor is airborne this week, sporting a commercial luster that should shine in the Summertime...By now, it's shockingly apparent that the Plasmatics cannot be ignored. At the risk of sounding old and stodgy at my tender age, I can't say I like their sound or am captivated by their notorious stage show, but I sure as hell salute the awesome precision of the Stiff hype machine. They brought this band from a cult following to a culture phenomenon...The Manhattan Transfer is eclecticism at its best. This band is so perversely brilliant that their choice of material becomes less important than what they do with it. I recommend the single and Goldfinger recommends 'Spies In The Night'. (It has the Midas touch.)"

WFBO, INDIANAPOLIS, IN YVONNE SIMS: "I think everybody at the station would need a month to recover from May and the 500 activities. Our Q Kangaroo was in the 500 Parade and our racing t-shirts have been selling rapidly. Over the weekend, the Q95 Caravan went to Altime Valley, Wisconsin for a Molly Hatchet concert. Four couples joined me on the cruise. Thanks to: Pat Armstrong, Molly's manager, for the backstage passes and tickets...Our video giveaway has been very successful. 27 Sony Beta Max recorders have been given away. We have more during May. Our video concerts are this week...We did a live broadcast with John Cale. It went over very well. It was great! We packed a local club's front row seats, and put John into the homes of thousands...Next, we're going to give listeners (I don't get no respect) seats for Rodney Dangerfield's performance June 6th. 50 listeners will get R.D. red ties...Since its first spin on the turntable, Marty Balin left his mark on me. WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "You definitely can't deny Peter Frampton and his new effort. There are several good cuts. But, to us, 'Dig What I Say' stands out above the rest. The specific sound he gets with the guitar gives the song that extra umphppff...Also in this week is Split Enz. We've liked 'One Step Ahead' the best since the album came out. Now that everybody is starting to settle on that as the main track, I think this song could definitely do something...On Bram Tchaikovsky, I noticed Nationwide there's not too many people playing the track 'Modern Girl'. To us, it's definitely the best. Several speed changes in the song make it very interesting...Thanks to Columbia for the live Loverboy Ep. It'll definitely come in handy in this town, because Loverboy is not only the biggest debut around here so far this year, but the album will probably end up in the Top 5 (including everybody) at the end of the year."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "I think 'The Voice' is the standout track on the Moody Blues. Not a stupendous comeback, but definitely back on the right track for the band...Peter Frampton's album is right on target. It's just too bad he tried to stretch himself--this album should have been the one right after 'I'm In You'. We like the title track best...We'll use the title track on the Joe Vitale, too. Sounds like a good 25-34 record...Joe Walsh is becoming extremely active, especially with his upcoming appearance on the Entwistle album. This boy has been in the studio for awhile!!...Using the Southside mostly in the live option situation for 'The Fever' and 'Trapped Again', which are pretty big songs for this area...Considering: Marty Balin, Whitesnake, Silver Condor, and Johnny Van Zant...Good reaction from the air staff on the Tubes, and very good curiosity calls from the audience."

KGON, PORTLAND, OR M.D.-GLORIA JOHNSON: "Top 5 requests: Phil Collins, Van Halen, Krokus, Billy Squier, Moody Blues...Sales: REO #1 again, Loverboy, Tom Petty, Kim Carnes, Van Halen...Moody Blues debut #10 in sales. Also good sales on: Santana, Phil Collins, Joe Walsh, and Billy Squier...KGON did a promotion around the Nazareth/Krokus show last week. We gave away 25 pairs of tickets. One Grand Prize winner got dinner, a limo, and a backstage pass. Krokus kicked ass!!...Hated the Frampton on first listen, but it's getting better with every listen...Icehouse will be the debut of the year. I challenge you to find a weak cut. Faves up front: 'Icehouse', 'Can't Help Myself', 'Get Together', and 'The Wall'...Considering: Icehouse."

KLQL, HOUSTON, TX ASST. P.D.-MICHELE ROBINSON: "This week's big news is Houston's debut of Rock Line. I thoroughly enjoyed the entire 90 minutes, and our response has been real good. Gary and Kevin were obviously having a good time. We even had two callers from Houston! As Jon Scott said, the listeners really do come up with some great questions. For instance: Gary and Kevin is your hair real? What a treat. Global Satellite Network does all the work and we just punch up the show and put it on the air. Chris and I want to say thank you to everyone who made the show possible--and Jon Scott for his persistence...More news from the weekend. I saw two shows that were superb. Split Enz at the Agora. They put on a wonderful show. Great songs, well done, and they had the audience on their feet...Even better than that though (Sorry Jeb, yours was good!), Willie Nelson with Delbert McClinton. Comparable to seeing J. Geils in Boston or Styx in Chicago. But even better! Willie Nelson in Houston, TX. He puts on an excellent show, no matter what kind of music you like. Thanks to Norman for the tickets and for getting me up on stage."

WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-RON PHILLIPS: "We're out-of-the-box on Silver Condor. We got good response to the album feature and added 'Survival' and 'We're In Love' in a healthy medium rotation. Put some good promotion behind this record, and it'll soar like a condor...Initial interest in the Moody Blues has been positive. 'The Voice' stands out front. I also like 'Talking Out Of Turn', but it may be too long for programming...Sometimes it's a bit frustrating to really believe in a record and call local retailers who have never heard of it. Such is the case with Cold Chisel. Let's not drop the ball on this one...The Ghost Riders feels nice to my ears. As others have mentioned, it does have a Grateful Dead feel to it, but holds up on its own. Go for it, Roger!...'The Stroke' is hot on the phones, along with anything from the new Van Halen."

WILS-FM, LANSING, MI M.D.-JIM PEMBERTON: "Since I was out of town last week, I'll talk about the Peter Frampton record. It's good to have him back. The album is Fan-tastic. The title track blows me away...Elton's 'The Fox' is a great album, too. We're on a couple of tracks, with 'Barriers' leading...What's this I hear? The Motor City is NOT playing Billy Squier's 'The Stroke'? Where are you? I thought Detroit was the rock and roll capital of the world?...The Tubes is really moving up rapidly in sales--phones are incredible on 'Talk To Ya Later'...Jim Steinman's 'Rock And Roll Dreams Come Through' is getting excellent reaction on the phones--still early for sales...Johnny Van Zant's 'Round Two' IS a knockout. 'Right Or Wrong' is gonna be a smash...Considering: Joe Vitale, Marshall Tucker, Spider, Ghost Riders, and Iron Maiden...Need to see more sales on: Ozzy Osbourne, Krokus, Hawks, and Dave Edmunds."

KMOD, TULSA, OK M.D.-CHARLIE WEST: "The Moody Blues have definitely still got it. Very well produced. In the midst of all the rock and roll, it's like a breath of fresh air...Johnny Van Zant--Just as good, if not better than the last one, which was great...I've listened to Elton John several times, and it just keeps growing on me each time. I think it's terrific...Whitesnake consistently puts out good material and this one is no exception...Marshall Tucker managed to come up with new and innovative ideas while keeping with their familiar style. The new album is very, very good...On the Kim Carnes, 'Bette Davis Eyes' is a must...The Frampton is right on target. Peter is just in time to rock us through the Summer...Showing early sales on: Marty Balin--good phones...Frank Zappa phones and sales are good--Top 25...Considering: Ghost Riders and Billy & The Beaters...We can't keep the Billy Squier in stock here--sales are great."

KYYS (KY102), KANSAS CITY, MO M.D.-JOE MCCABE: "We're in the mid 70's revival period. It's interesting to note our three adds this week are: Peter Frampton, Elton John, and the Moody Blues. All, without doubt, historical names in album radio's evolution. Yet, these new albums carry a big image question-mark. But who cares, if the music they create fits. 'The Voice' by the Moody Blues is just a classic song made for radio. If all new product sounded this fresh and exciting, I'd gladly play 50 records...As for the two gentlemen on the rebound from supposed life in the wimp lane, objectively listen to Frampton's title cut and Elton's 'Barriers', and I think you'll agree that they deserve the exposure. Actually, I wish Elton still wore his duck suit, but that's another story...I could listen to the Tubes 'Talk To Ya Later' and Moodys 'The Voice' on a tape loop--and just listen to it over and over...Retail Movers: Nothing exciting...Considering: Silver Condor."

WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ: "Peter Frampton returns to rock radio in fine form. With cuts like 'Dig What I Say' and 'You Kill Me', Frampton has a fighting chance to regain some credibility...The standout cut on the Moody Blues album is 'Voice'. They haven't lost their magic on this song. The rest of the Lp is okay with the single running a close second...I'm tickled pink that we finally have an Lp from the Plasmatics that can be given steady radio airplay without fear of bleeding ears. 'Summer Nite' is a solid song. And 'Headbanger', if dayparted, is also valuable. I think Stiff has come through with a fine package to follow up all the media this group has been getting...I guess the vocals on Silver Condor could be a little smoother for my personal taste. But on first listen, they seem to have the goods, especially on 'For The Sake Of Survival'. Earl Slick has been kicking around for a few years now and this could be his most successful project to date...The cut for us on Joe Vitale is 'Lady On The Rock'. Looking forward to seeing Joe in town fairly soon as a member of the Joe Walsh Band...The new Spider record is an adventurous followup to their debut. It's somewhat different, but still commercial rock and roll. 'Change' and 'Can't Live Long This Way' will be our leads. Amanda Blue has one of the more distinctive voices in rock...We're starting to get a steady stream of calls for: 'In The Air Tonight'. Perhaps this will follow in the footsteps of 'I Missed Again', and Mr. Collins may firmly establish himself a solo career...The Billy Squier album is burning up the airwaves on 'The Stroke', which has been picked up by the audience--very much in an anthem manner...Ozzy Osbourne's 'Crazy Train' is on a collision course. There's no stopping this cut. The phones on this have been very significant...Sales Highlights: #4 Van Halen; #5 Tom Petty; Phil Collins 20-9; Kim Carnes 21-11; Gary U.S. Bonds 23-13; and, Joe Walsh 33-21...Boy, it seems like both Capitol and EMI/America are awfully hot these days with some good product that's performing well on the streets."

WRXL, RICHMOND, VA P.D.-ILYSE GOTTLIEB: "Why isn't anyone playing 'Letting You Go' by Tom Petty? We used it as an album track and our Top 40 competition picked it up as an Lp extra. Now the strongest phones are for that cut. If you missed it so far, check it out...The new Frampton blows me away. Glad to see him back to rock and roll...Congratulations and the very best of wishes to: Phil Quarteraro. We'll miss all the tall guy jokes, and my Mondays just won't be the same without you. I hope New York is ready for big Phil...The Moody Blues is far and above my favorite new release. I've been a Moodys fan for years, and 'Long Distance Voyager' continues the tradition...Hanging in there are: Santana, Steve Winwood, Phil Collins, and of course, AC/DC...Much to my surprise, the requests for 'Big Balls' have subsided, and 'TNT' and 'Dirty Deeds' are flooding our lines...The Producers moved to heavy airplay this week as requests and sales keep happening. Thanks to: Wynn Jackson for working the album and making sure I didn't miss it. I still can't understand why no one else seems to give a damn...Billy Squier is holding steady with good calls and strong retail--not quite Top 10...To Everyone In NYC and L.A.: I need artist IDs. Call me if you can help at 804-282-9731...'T' minus six days and counting the hours till the Arista contingent arrives in Richmond!"

WSYR, SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM NAST: "Recuperating from another wild Memorial Day weekend. Everybody from 94ROCK did it up in style. Our big event this weekend was a thing called Springfest '81, which was a 3-day outdoor festival which drew close to 10,000 people. Some of the bands were: Dakota, Orleans, and some local bands. The event was just phenomenal...Also over the weekend, we did another 1,800 people with Dakota on one of our bar parties. Whoever said that these parties were out must be high on something because again last Sunday night we did another 1,100 people without a band--just a hot sound system. We've been cookin'...The new Peter Frampton album has been getting great acceptance. Our listeners are very glad Frampton's rocking again. This album is the best I've heard from Peter since Camel...Iron Maiden is heavy metal at its best. From the first time we featured this album, we've gotten nothing but great phones...The Silver Condor record looks to be developing very nicely. We'll go with the cut 'For The Sake Of Survival', and hope this sucker breaks wide open...We're also using the Joe Vitale record this week. You can't go wrong with the lineup he's got on it...Johnny Van Zant continues to grow and grow and grow. Sales are happening and phones are unbelievably hot...I saw U-2 over the weekend. A very impressive show from these youngsters. The potential of this group is unbelievable...Jim Steinman and Tom Johnston are in trouble."

WPYX, ALBANY, NY M.D.-RON NENNI: "The Moody Blues certainly have a dedicated following always longing for new material. The phones reflect disappointment in the single. But faith was restored after hearing the 'Voice' and '22,000 Days', which I think is the most striking track on the record. It's the only record we're featuring this week, and we expect very favorable response...Last week the Johnny Van Zant Band album was our Lp of the week. Everybody is rooting for this one--it received a 9.3 out of a possible 10--not too shabby...To anybody reluctant to add Peter Frampton: An artist tries to convert image, radio goes along with it, but the audience doesn't want to put that much effort into it--but we'll expose it and give it a shot. We're using 'Kill Me' and the title tune...By the way, good luck to our former A&M buddy, Carl Holman, on the way to Cleveland. Thanks for all the support, especially when we were getting off the ground...Airplay Increases: Gary U.S. Bonds; and, 'My Baby' by Cold Chisel has got it all--don't ignore it, play it...Listening very closely to Silver Condor. 'For The Sake Of Survival' sounds really good...Also thinking seriously about Marty Balin...Sales Improvements: AC/DC 'Dirty Deeds' at #3, Van Halen at #6, PYX 106 Album, Santana, Tom Petty, and Steve Winwood all Top 10...Kim Carnes, Ozzy Osbourne, and Pretenders, 10-15...Gary U.S. Bonds at #19 shows steady movement...Billy Squier expected to be Top 15 very shortly--incredible phones, with 'The Stroke' #1 requested--initial sales...Joe Walsh and Squeeze show potential."

WLRS, LOUISVILLE, KY M.D.-JOHN SIMON: "We had a fantastic concert here with Van Halen this past Friday night. The crowd had the kind of energy I haven't seen for a long time. I think the band was blown away by this one, and I hope they remember us here in Louisville and come back soon. Three songs into the set, the crowd absolutely stopped them and wouldn't let them start again until they yelled for five minutes. People have been calling up and raving about it ever since...We're using 'The Voice' on the Moodies. The track is nice, but I don't understand it...I think the Frampton is Okay. I hear some of the older songs in the title cut...Best calls for: Billy Squier and the Van Halen concert."

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-BUCK MCWILLIAMS: "I got a kick awhile back when reading the worst reasons to add a record and the worst excuses not to. Soon after I became M.D., and much to my surprise, I began hearing those same lame excuses on why I should add a record. It's no laughing matter anymore when a rep names four albums, all low quality, and says, 'go ahead, pick one, I need an add from you this week'. This is the same company that took 3½ weeks to reservice me on one album that's been in heavy for the last 4 weeks. We had to pull it until the new album came in. Now, I may be out in left field, but is this any way to do business? Not at a station like ours that has a 15 share...Every jock at our station has input in the selection of adds, and we experiment ONLY with albums we believe in. This week we believe in: Marshall Tucker, Peter Frampton, Moody Blues, the Tubes, and the Look... Word on the Look is spreading from Detroit that this could be a hot band. After all, the Motorcity has a good track record for breeding fine rock bands...Even Peter Frampton is doing Bob Seger poses on the cover of his new Lp. By the way, listener reaction shows they are as happy with the rock on his new album as we are...If you're not playing something from the new Plasmatics album, you're missing out on the comedy event of the year! We played the intros to 'Fast Food Service', 'Sex Junkie', 'Head Banger', and 'A Pig Is A Pig' this morning, and got more calls than we did from Steve Dahl's 'Ayatollah'...To Tom at WOUR: Got your message - hope you put a Starr next to our Greg Kihn read last week...Top five sales: REO, AC/DC, Who, Van Halen, and Steve Winwood."

KZOK, SEATTLE, WA M.D.-MICHAEL KNIGHT: "The new Moody Blues release created quite a stir on our phones. Listeners calling in with praise, approval and curiosity. Also questions about a possible tour. We responded with a special highlighting their career. The Lp has a wealth of material, and the ability to bring all the old Moody Blues fans back to the store...It's great to hear from Peter Frampton on his return to the trenches. The band is refreshing and tight. His vocals and guitar are reminiscent of his first solo work in his Humble Pie days...Also KZOK welcomed Earl Slick into town today. Slick dropped by to talk about his new group Silver Condor. In the entourage was his Producer Mike Flicker and Jim McKeon. We like the first 3 cuts on side one: 'For The Sake Of Survival', 'Angel Eyes' and 'Saying Goodbye'. We did an interview, conducted by Larry Snider, and I gave the group a chance to hear their record for the first time on the air...Finally, the sun's out here in Seattle, so I'm gonna go play."

KLBJ, AUSTIN, TX M.D.-JOHN LOGAN: "The excitement here, of course, was the flash flood on Sunday night. I've never seen anything like it. 13 dead, 30 million dollars in damages, 600 homes affected, cars wrapped around telephone poles, and two whole city blocks of businesses wiped out. It happened so fast. One minute you saw water coming under the door, the next minute you're on top of your car in the garage hoping the water doesn't rise above the steering wheel. My family was only slightly affected. More from the rain than from the flood itself. But many saw their houses collapse, cars disappear and businesses ruined. You remember the power of nature real fast when it socks you up side the head like that. Thank God she doesn't do it often...With more listens, the Moody Blues album unfolds and yields more. 'Maiden Voyage' for the 80's. The Moodies keep a foot in the past and their nose to the wind. Fine tunes, the trademark sound, and presto - melodic and lush without wimp. A beautiful piece of work...Joe Vitale hits you with his rhythm stick and comes up with one of the most pleasant rock albums in recent memory. Add two ounces of tasty material, pour in real strong guitar work from Joe, a touch of crazy garnish with R&R roots, and the recipe delivers a new tropical drink--'Plantation Harbor' Punch...Spider has a smash single in 'It Didn't Take Long', and it shouldn't. 'Between The Lines' is in the grooves and shows off a very interesting female voice...Peter who? Frampton takes off the glitter and gets back to what he's always been, one damn fine guitar player. A bit more seasoned this time...Interesting to note there's a return to the basics in lots of music. It's refreshing to hear music again instead of trends."

WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "Moody Blues fans now stop using the past tense when talking about the great qualities of their band. On 'Long Distance Voyager' the world standard of excellence re-emerges. My first reaction to 'Gemini' was, 'It's the best thing ELO has done in years.' But now with the whole album here, my early fears are laid to rest. Requests are coming in fast and furious. Some requesting 'anything from the new Moody Blues except "Gemini"'. One masterpiece that certainly belongs on a Moody Blues album is 'Autumn', Justin Hayward's contribution to 'War Of The Worlds'. I would rather have had that on the album and 'Gemini' as an Ep a la Jim Steinman...Marty Balin and Kim Carnes are like giant magnets sucking people into record stores. The trend we like is that they appear to be generating traffic from people who scarcely set foot in stores in the last couple of years and lots of those people are buying both of those albums...Paul Yeskel dropped by, and there can be no doubt that we were treated to what will be one of the biggest records of the Summer: Blackfoot will curl your toes...We love the cover on Silver Condor as much as the music itself. And we're pleased at being a radio cornerstone of one of the most important debut albums of the last five years...I had a brief chance to say 'Hi' to Ray White at the Yankee/Indians game last week, and inside the park got a first hand look at what Steinbrenner was howling about. Worst Yankee performance I've ever seen. Then again, being a Red Sox fan, I can hardly gloat. Fenway Park has entered the Ice Age...Thanks to: Rick Springfield for calling to thank us again."

WNYK, ELIZABETH CITY/NORFOLK, VA M.D.-BILL SIMMONS: "I'm surprisingly pleased with the Frampton LP. I've been waiting for this since 1977. You can't miss the great hooks in 'You Kill Me'. We're getting good calls on the title track...Something good finally started in Washington with the Iron Maiden. We tested 'Wrathchild' on our nightly test track and got a positive to negative ratio of 10 to 1. It's definitely better than 95% of the heavy metal out there now...What's this rumor I keep hearing about Jeff Pollack getting kicked out of Norfolk?"

WQBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER: "First, Joan Jett, her band, and the Q104 Pink Flamingos joined forces on the softball field against my team of contest winners and pounded us 30-14. Then today, I walked into the office to find a goat shitting on the rug. I just get no respect!...We would like to thank Joan Jett, the Blackhearts, Julie Radar, and Kenny Laguna for the softball game promotion. Joan Jett went 6 for 7, picked me off at second base, and Kenny got so overwrought we had to restrain him on the side lines with chains. We packed almost 700 people into a local nightclub for the Joan Jett show, and Joan got the place shakin'. There is a wealth of strong material on the new Jerry Jeff Walker album. 'Maybe Mexico', 'Take It As It Comes', and 'Pick Up The Tempo' are the cuts to try...David Johansen is very popular up here. So the new David Johansen material is very welcome. The always hard to please John Cooper calls it the best stuff he's heard in '81...I'm quite impressed with the new 20/20 album. A solid follow-up. I like 'Beat City' and 'American Dream'...Try to find a hot new single from the Cyclones called 'He's So Cool'...Finally, Fast Fontaine made the most on air progress this week."

WLAV-FM, GRAND RAPIDS, MI P.D.-DAVE LOGAN: "As the dinosaurs roll over and resurface, I'd like to pause just a second and raise a toast to the Joe Vitale album. Anyone from the Joe Walsh School Of Reality is O.K. by me. This album belies an artist on his first outing. The licks from 'The Bomber' are as magnificent as anything on his album (Hell, it's Joe's band.). When fused together with the seamless Szymczyk production, the result is smooth sailing with the boat weirdos. Climb aboard before you get left standing on the dock...The Moody Blues have been in heavy for more than a week now. We're getting great response to all cuts. I think the key to the successful integration of these artists is the ability to effectively mix the music in a non-offensive, complementary manner. To tell you the truth, these artists will probably show little activity beyond the refugees of their original cults...A perfect example is the new Elton John album. So far no calls. But you have to know deep down inside, those people are still out there--people just like us...Big news in the retail include: Billy Squier (Top 5 and roaring); The Tubes (beginning to sink in as to where they were/are); and of course, Van Halen, which stepped right in at #1. Their show blew through town Memorial Day Weekend and left the town devastated. Look for the band to break a Guinness Book Of Records mark during their Madison Square concerts. Tony and David Lee Roth had a most relaxing and genuinely enjoyable conversation backstage following the great show. Many thanks to David Lee and the boys for their generous hospitality and warmth. Thank God some people are still in it for the fun!...One more sales stomper that merits serious support from someone is the new Camel import 'Nude'. It's a legitimate Top 10 here when we can find it in the stores. Doesn't anybody want a hit album these days?...Finally, thanks to: Alan Wolmark from Atlantic for taking time to call. It's always great to hear from you."

WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D./M.D.-ED LEVINE: "Silver Condor is a very strong album. We're leading, as are most people, with 'For The Sake Of Survival'. My feelings about its ultimate commercial acceptance are mixed to a certain degree. While the tunes are indeed strong, I'm not convinced that there is a blockbuster track. On the other hand, albums that have this sound (i.e. Loverboy or Journey) are usually the ones to break out of Syracuse, so I'm definitely going to give it the opportunity to prove itself...I was pretty disappointed in the Moodies except for the obvious killer tune 'The Voice'--ranks up there with 'Question', one of my favorites from them...I haven't noticed a lot of add activity on the Zappa album, and I think people are missing the boat. He's one of the few artists that has sold out 7,000 seats in town in the last year. He's great image, and 'Fine Girl' is a decent enough tune...I want to jump on the Frampton bandwagon. From the cover to the music, Frampton is out of the syrupy black that he was into and is rocking again. We're going with the title cut for now...Last Friday night, we had kind of a unique double-header. Early in the evening, we had a night with the Syracuse Chiefs--the TripleA club in town. The crowd was over 3 times what they would expect to draw. After that, we went across town and presented U-2 in concert. The show did very, very well attendance-wise; and, musically, the band is already far superior to the band that was captured on the 'Boy' album. They're going to have to be dealt with in the future...Retail Notes: God bless Phil Collins. After 22 weeks, REO's reign of terror at #1 has ended...The Van Halen is selling, but not nearly to the extent of any of the previous albums...Tom Petty held steady this week at #14--a definite disappointment there so far retailwise...Kim Carnes, meanwhile, is up to #15...And maybe one of the big surprises of the year is the way the Who's album 'Face Dances' has totally stiffed. Maybe it's time that people realize that even a band like the Who needs to be promoted...On Whitesnake--any band with that many members from Deep Purple has got to be reckoned with. 'Come And Get It' is your basic Foreigner meat and potatoes type rock and it could happen...I moved Marty Bain up this week on the strength of the obvious smash single 'Hearts'. I also feel 'You Left Your Mark' is going to be an album classic... Van Zant is slow, what do you want me to say?"

WCCC, HARTFORD, CT P.D.-PAUL PAYTON: "Between young Carl in heavy rotation from midnight to 6, our Mr. Bill has struck again--Silver Condor is everything the front page says. Sure, the fix is in, but the music is top shelf, the cover is gorgeous, and the sound is instantly familiar, yet new. It has more hooks than a fly fisherman. While I didn't hear it on the 12", this album says 'Boston with balls' to me. We'll start with 'Sake Of Survival' and 'Goin' For Broke', and will open it up as those become familiar...The Plasmatics getting real phones, not just from geeks. If you doubt whether to play it, sell the audience the song, not the group. For example, 'Whip It' was a hit, not Devo and their entire trip...Thanks to Paul Yeskell for the advance listen to the Blackfoot 45. Guaranteed heavy out of the box. This will make Blackfoot a household word. P.S., check out the B side, especially the intro rap...While it's hard to distinguish between the Ghost Riders phenomenon, and the hype, the music nonetheless stands out. We have added 'Moroccan Nights' and 'C Rider' in this hotbed area of Deadheads... Looking forward to the Psychedelic Furs. We did well with the first, and the lead cut on the 7" cover samples sounds like another killer...Late add: On the Union 12". BTO was big here, and this is BTO again. One play and immediate phones...I don't know if I like the new Frampton album, but that is irrelevant. I do know it's grabbing immediate phones and in-store interest...I used to be one who thought the Moody Blues were the slushy side of rock, but the more we hear this new album, the better and more solid it sounds. 'The Voice' is the obvious immediate winner, but the album is deep... Johnny Van Zant is getting good phones...The Tubes are beginning to be recognized and requested by name. 'Talk To Ya Later' is killer material...Still don't hear the Elton John beyond side 1...Zed's 'Darkhorse' now a 45 too. I hope it happens, but have doubts due to the glut of quality product..."

Glad to increase airplay this week on: Split Enz, Squeeze, and Bram Tchaikovsky...The Movies are indeed different. 'Clockwise To The Sun' could be the cut we're watching...Taxxi was overlooked when released last year, but group member Colin Payne is working it himself. Try a track called 'Stranger'--it's good...Thanks again to Don Everley at London Wavelength for the international exclusive debut of 25 Years Of Rock, part of our ever successful Memorial Day weekend...Billy Ball is not copyrighted exclusively by Oakland. The CCC riders softball team is 10-0 on the season. Some of the Bay area magic must have found its way East."

WMAD, MADISON, WI P.D.-SEAN SCOTT: "I've had this idea for several years, and since we haven't heard anything from the Atlanta Rhythm Section for some time, I offer this idea publicly now. Styx went back for 'Lady'; Lynyrd Skynyrd went back for 'Freebird'; and, I offer to the ARS association to go back to 'Dog Days' to pull out 'All Night Rain'. With Top 40's playing mostly ballads a la Climax Blues Band's 'I Love You', etc., and with 'All Night Rain' being a great Summertime song, I feel it has massive commercial potential and will give it max support here in Mad City...I see nothing but green for Silver Condor. 'For The Sake Of Survival' hooks you into the song for the first 15 seconds and never lets you go. An immediate out-of-the-box add at WMAD, and complete support from our airstaff...I'd really like to see a reworked version of 'Wine Woman And Song' off the new Whitesnake. Coverdale sings too much to the point of monotony. He should have let his musicians carry a rockin' number. Nevertheless, don't fall into the Side 1, Cut 1 routine as 'Wine Woman And Song' is the movingest number on the new Whitesnake."

WMJQ, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-OREST: "How do you get 1,500 people to pay admission and see a band they've never heard before? Good on-air promotion. How do you keep all those people throughout the whole show? Leave it up to the band. That's what happened this past weekend in Rochester when we brought in Visitor from Albany. They are a dynamite group of guys, and they came off so slick that you'd think they had been at it for years and years. They put everyone on their feet throughout the two hour show, and I mean show. They've got an album out on their own label. If you need more information about the band, call me or Bruce Moser at Could Be Wild. By the way, I'd like to thank Bruce Moser and Doug Dombrowski for all their help this past weekend, and to all the guys with the band...On to other business. Added the Frampton and Moody Blues albums. Moody Blues is a fantastic album. It's great to see them comeback real strong...Getting great sales on: Ozzy, Phil Collins...The phones go crazy for 'The Stroke' by Billy Squier."

WYNF, TAMPA, FL M.D.-NICK VAN CLEVE: "95 FM is proud to welcome the Pat Travers Band, Johnny Van Zant, and the Producers. The show will be given a big boost by the quick acceptance and response of 18-24 males for the new Johnny Van Zant record. After toying with a number of tracks, 'Right Or Wrong' simply has the goods to make it go...Absolutely no initial image problem with the Peter Frampton. All has been forgiven, skeletons are back into the closet -- Peter come home...Maybe the double teaming of Felder and Walsh will give the Vitale record all the go-power it needs. 'Lady On The Rock' seems to be bringing the response...25-34 seem to really be welcoming back with open arms the Moody Blues. The single is okay, but far and away 'The Voice' has the proven/Moodies formula...The Silver Condor record, track for track, certainly seems to be one of the strongest Spring/Summer contenders...Considering Mother's Finest, Elton John."

WIMZ, KNOXVILLE, TN P.D.-KERRY LAMBERT: "We did an instore with Johnny Van Zant last week and drew a great crowd. We sold over 100 albums. He was in town for a show with Pat Travers. The show was a real bomb here--1,900 people in a 14,000 seat hall. We did a phoner with Pat and also talked with Henry Paul and Johnny Van Zant. Thanks for the cooperation from Polydor...I also heard the new Blackfoot this week and loved it. Looking forward to some good Summertime rock and roll...The Kim Carnes, Phil Collins, and Van Halen doing extremely well...The Tubes debuted at #15...Rick Springfield finally getting some sales--#17 on our sales chart...Tied for #19 are: Roger Taylor and Mother's Finest...We held our first Rock 104 Street Nationals this past weekend in Crossfield, TN--about 70 miles from here. Our morning man took a convoy of listeners with well over 200 cars in the convoy requiring assistance from the State Police. The event drew more than 7,500 and 500 contestants...The Van Zant is already selling extremely well...The Producers have a member from Knoxville. Although it's regional, the Police sound makes it well worth your time...Peter Frampton and Elton both have nice comebacks, but I'm more impressed with the Frampton...Still a lot of phones on 'Secret Policeman's Ball'...The Marshall Tucker Band is selling like hotcakes."

WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL M.D.-DICK BASCOM: "This, as I'm sure others have already noted, is the week of the comeback. The Moody Blues, to my ears, sounds as strong and consistent as most of their earlier efforts prior to 'Octave'. Great album for adult image and, at the same time, enough rock and roll to keep the kids happy...Elton John also comes back with an album that's perfect for album radio. 'Fascist Faces' survived the test. No negatives and very good positive response...Peter Frampton comes out strong with a solid rock and roll record. One that, hopefully, will re-establish him in the world of rock...Three comebacks in one week--not bad at all...Silver Condor's new record also sounds very strong. A lot of good cuts on the album, but the one that has the special something is 'Carolina (Nobody's Right, Nobody's Wrong)'--real solid hook to it...Ozzy Osbourne took over the #1 sales position this week, just barely edging out AC/DC. His show at the Metro Center this past weekend also went very well...Jim Steinman continues to show strong sales growth. It's going to be a big album...We had our annual Mother's Day concert in the park this past Sunday, the original date rescheduled due to rain. Six local bands provided rock and roll for the people. 10,000 Rockfordites turned out for the show. Our biggest concert to date. We anticipate even bigger crowds at our next one later this Summer...We tested Billy & The Beaters over the past week and a half and found that it did have a place within our format. Good adult response, as well as some interest from the teens. We'll play it and see what happens...Where sales haven't come through yet on the Tubes, requests are strong. 'Talk To Ya Later' has such an infectious hook, it's got to happen."

WPLR, NEW HAVEN, CT M.D.-EDDIE WAZOO: "Having heard the Frampton cassette prior to release, I felt that he definitely was on the right track. After a few days of response to airplay, my thoughts have been confirmed. Extremely positive reaction...The Moody Blues, likewise, have put out quite a good album. For album rock, the strongest tracks seem to be: 'Meanwhile' and 'Voice'...Jim Messina retains many of the musical qualities of Loggins & Messina. This record should be fairly easy to establish on the radio...Ghost Riders definitely do have that old San Francisco sound, leaning heavily towards the Grateful Dead. I can see definite reaction in the future...The Union 12" is really quite a thrill. The reunited BTO sounds better than ever. We're definitely looking forward to having the album and being able to play more tracks...Astounding response to Squeeze's 'Tempted'. Very active record. If Kim Carnes 'Bette Davis Eyes' went #1, so can 'Tempted'...Thanks to: Bob Feineigle, Walter Wynneck, Debbi Gould, and Michael Kaplan of Epic for the REO clock. We'll display it proudly...G.E. Smith has quite a large local following due to his tenure with the Scratch Band. We're getting good calls on: 'Heart Frozen Up' and 'Nuns With Guns'. This record sounds better with each play."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL P.D.-RAD MESSICK: "I'm glad the Moody Blues came out with an Lp instead of a 12". The album as a whole could be the comeback of the decade and is miles ahead of the last one. 'The Voice' sounds phenomenal on the radio and is already drawing calls from the 25+ old Moody Blues fans who can't believe their band is back...Johnny Van Zant is getting great response here in his hometown. We're looking forward to seeing him do all of 'Round Two' live with Pat Travers next weekend...Three cheers for Peter Frampton. While we're talking comebacks, we can't forget Peter. He really stretches out on the title song and 'Dig What I Say'. Nothing but straight ahead rock and roll from the wimpiest member of Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band...Good calls on: Les Dudek...Monster calls on: Van Halen. This could be their biggest yet...Jim Steinman continues to grow. It should make a Top 20 sales debut next week--calls are incredible...Ditto for Point Blank. A record that's been around for a long time and is finally coming through. 'Nicole' seems to be the cut."

WQXM, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-MOBY: "I'm extremely impressed by Diesel. They've come out of no where with an album that has the freshest sound I've experienced in ages. I hate to do comparisons, but to me the harmonies are reminiscent of Steve Miller; the melodies and lyrics remind me of the Eagles. All in all, a very strong album and everybody should give it an ear...I'd also like to say hello to Lisa, and keep Philadelphia together...After disappointment in the single, I was relieved to see the Moody Blues album is very nice."

KQRS, MINNEAPOLIS, MN M.D.-DOUG PODELL: "It's refreshing to see the Tubes back with a great album. 'Talk To Ya Later' is a hit...Heavy Phones On: Phil Collins and Billy Squier...People are wondering what we, and radio in general, will do with the new Plasmatics album. We'll be using it on a program we have called 'Twin City Beat', which airs Sundays at Midnight and deals with new releases, import rock and roll, and local talent. We're finding a very large market for this type of program...We had a large concert in town 'Rock On The River Flat', which featured: 38 Special, Ozzy Osbourne, and local talent. It drew over 20,000 people...There's a great rock scene here in Minneapolis. Being a transplant from Detroit, it's good to see it."

WHCN, HARTFORD, CT M.D.-BOB BITTENS: "After several weeks of searching, we've finally found someone with that unique talent to fill our 6-10PM slot. He's Paul Harris, formerly of WRCN, and we certainly do welcome him aboard the Rock...WHCN was Connecticut's first album rocker, and we celebrated our 12th birthday this past weekend with specials that included Westwood's 'The Rock Years'. I'm not a great fan of prepackaged music and history programs, but I have to say the 'Rock Years' is one of the best I've heard...Breaking All The Rules is certainly the best I've heard from Peter Frampton is a long, long time. The songs are real good, and the production style gives the album a hot live sort of sound. I like: the title track and 'Wasting The Night Away' so far. If people can forget the wimpy image that he's been building for himself over the last few years, he might have a major comeback album on his hands...If Frampton can come back, why not the Moody Blues? Calls are excellent for 'Talk To Ya Later'...The Silver Condor is the most consistent album I've heard in months. Was that Alan Sneed I saw at the listening party? This is the perfect followup to 'Seventh Sojourn'.); Elton John (sure doesn't sound like Granola to me); Johnny Van Zant; Joe Vitale; Plasmatics (Yes, they're coming to town and one of our listeners will get a chance to have their television destroyed by Wendy O.'s chainsaw)...Lots of good jazz released this week. Two on Pablo head the list: Count Basie and Clark Terry...The John Klemmer was a bit disappointing vocalwise, but the instrumentals are very pleasing...Also added two records that will be released on smaller labels: Simon And Bard on Flying Fish features the guitar of Larry Coryell, and the Ross/Levine Band on Head First features Pat Metheny...If you get a chance, check with your EMI promo person about the Kim Carnes video. Very interesting...Response coming in on: Missing Persons, Frank Zappa, Bram Tchaikovsky, Adam & The Ants, and Kim Carnes...If you want to get the Kamikaze Kloned single I mentioned last week, call 303-674-7084 or 303-399-1543."

KKSN, PORTLAND, OR M.D.-GREG LEE: "Adds: Silver Condor, Moody Blues, Spider, Peter Frampton, and the A's...I heard some of the new Blackfoot album last week when Vickie Germaise stopped by on her swing of the West Coast. It was incredible stuff!..KKSN is presenting a 3-day John Lennon Special this week with the interview done 3 hours before his tragic death. Audience response has been huge. Especially outstanding is the cover of 'Friday On My Mind'...The new Moody Blues is another good one. The single is poor, but several cuts on the album stand out. Especially good are: 'The Voice' and 'Nervous'...For some harmonic rock and roll, check out the new 20/20 and the debut album from Silver Condor. Both are slick...Joe Vitale's solo effort is much like Joe Walsh. Works well with the new Joe Walsh album out at the same time...Don't miss 999's cover of 'Little Red Riding Hood'--a real cruncher...If what's on the Joe Hansen Ep sampler is any indication of what's to come on the album, it'll certainly be his best yet...Last, but certainly not least, is the debut album from the Ghost Riders. WTPA, HARRISBURG, PA M.D.-BILL GRANT: "Adds Include: Peter Frampton, who has to be the comeback-artist of the year, so far. This is his best since 'Comes Alive'. Reminiscent of Frampton's Camel and his Humble Pie endeavors. My picks for airplay are: the title and 'You Kill Me'...Our second add was the Moody Blues masterpiece. The single isn't bad, but my pick is 'The Voice'. This song has that hypnotic easy flow that I think will serve this album much longer than any other cut...We expect Frampton and the Moody Blues to be big Summer records...Our final add was Spider. 'Change' was the song that got me cranking my stereo at full volume. If we were to go deeper on the album, 'Behind The Lines' would be my second choice...Billy Squier continues his movement. Van Halen and Tom Petty debut tied for #1 in sales; Rush, AC/DC, Jefferson Starship come in that order behind the top two...The big surprise is Iron Maiden, who debuts at #10. Impressive!...Considering: Marty Balin."

KILO, COLORADO SPRINGS, CO M.D.-ART PHILLIPS: "The response to the new Moody Blues has been nothing short of phenomenal. Not just another old rock band releasing their 99th album, the Moody Blues are a current event in Colorado. They've sold out two nights at Red Rocks, and phones have been hot for the album all weekend. For starters, 'The Voice', '22,000 Days', plus the single...Frampton has lunged for the album rock jugular. It's going to shake the 'I'm In You' image which has plagued him over the last couple of years. 'Rise Up' is our favorite... 'Pretty' (ha, ha) slick, this Silver Condor. 'For The Sake Of Survival' takes the honors as best new song of the week...Joe Vitale should stir some interest. Walsh's guitar work on 'Lady On The Rock' is exemplary... 'Power Pop Tales Of 1981 Life', that's 20/20. And round two for the band sounds much tighter than the first. How's this for a front sell?...Who's played with David Bowie and Hall & Oates, is married to Gilder Radnor, and has his first album out? You guessed it--G.E. Smith. WGIR-FM, MANCHESTER, NH M.D.-KAREN ANDERSEN: "I went nuts this past week over the Gary U.S. Bonds show. Few artists appear to have so much fun on stage. The music has enough of an R&B flavor to give the over-all sound the satisfying edge. I was pleased to see how well chestnuts like 'Quarter To Three' and 'New Orleans' not only fit in, but were received just as well as the newer 'This Little Girl' and 'Jole Blon'. Bonds is so enthusiastic, how can one not like him? Peter Frampton is back in fine form, rocking back to some of his pre 'I'm In You' sound. When all else fails, all you have to do is make tracks to rock and roll, and that's just what he did. It's good to have him back to where he should be. Favorite cuts here are 'Friday On My Mind', 'You Kill Me' and 'Dig What I Say'...The Moody Blues is refreshing because there's really no one else around who's doing what they are. Their multi-layered sound is relief for the ears. 'Gemini Dream', 'The Voice', and 'Meanwhile' were added...Thanks go to Al Perry for venturing up to New Hampshire and joining us for a ROCK101 night featuring Boston's R&B band, The Zaitchek Brothers...Also thanks to Debbie D. for the tickets to the U-2 show. I was bowled over by the audience response. The band had 1,500 fans stomping and clapping for two encores...This past weekend ROCK101 ran ABC-FM's Rock And Roll Never Forgets program which was an excellent production. Live tunes, John Lennon's One To One shows and live 1974 Steely Dan music were real fine. We're hearing nothing but positives from the streets...Adds: Peter Frampton, Moody Blues, Bram Tchaikovsky, Whitesnake...Conversions, Medium: Kim Carnes Hot: Greg Kihn Band...Sales: AC/DC 'Dirty', REO, Tom Petty, and Van Halen."

WAAL, BINGHAMTON, NY P.D.-ROBERTA HABER: "Adds: Moody Blues, Peter Frampton, Silver Condor, Lee Rittenour, Spider, Ghost Riders...Heavy: Tom Petty, Joe Walsh, Kim Carnes, Who, Santana, Gary U.S. Bonds, Jim Steinman, Starship, Winwood, Elton John, Harrison 45...This was a week for rock and roll resurrections. Album radio may have forgotten about the Moody Blues, but the listeners never did. There is tremendous interest in 'Long Distance Voyager'. This album will be an across-the-board smash. 'Gemini Dreams' will be a hit single. Album radio (us included) will go many cuts deep. 'The Voice' is the obvious first choice. I liked nearly everything on side 1 and quite a few on side 2. Welcome back boys...The welcome mat is out for Peter Frampton too. Although I don't think he's in his pre 'Comes Alive' stride yet, there are some solid cuts on this album. 'You Kill Me' will be our lead off...Silver Condor is everything the pre-release hype promised. Strong vocals, tight guitar work, good songs -- what else do you need? 'Survival' is just the tip of the iceberg... It took a few listens, but I finally hear what everyone else is raving about on Spider. Amanda Blue is definitely the front runner in the 'sounds like Chrissy Hine' sweepstakes. Wendy O. Williams? Forget it...The Ghost Riders is our out-of-shallow, left center field add for the week. 'Sea Rider' has such a nice feel to it, it makes me want to go frolicking in the rolling surf (quite a feat in Binghamton, NY...The Lee Rittenour Lp is something we couldn't ignore any longer...I finally had a chance to move up my favorite musician in a Hawaiian shirt, David Lindley. 'Mercury Blues' is such an unbelievable tune...Finally, credit goes to where credit is due -- to Epic/Columbia for their 'Exposed' double album. All that fine music at such a low list price makes it a true bargain in an overpriced world."

WRCN, LONG ISLAND, NY ASST.P.D.-MALCOLM GRAY: "Adds for the week: Leyden Zar, Peter Frampton, Iron Maiden, Silver Condor, and the Moody Blues... 'Long Distance Voyager' is the best album I've heard this year...Leyden Zar is great, keep you eye on it...Frampton is a surprise as well as Iron Maiden...Silver Condor sounds as good as anything that Earl Slick has done in the past."

WQFM, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-MIKE WOLF: "If you would have told me 3 months ago that I was going to add a Peter Frampton album out-of-the-box into heavy rotation, I would have told you you were crazy. Good hooks, great guitar work, and a minimum amount of wimpiness make this the surprise record of the year. 'Wise Up' and the title track stick out as the best songs...The Moody Blues still have that magic power to catapult the listener to the music cosmos. 'The Voice' is a good, up, positive tune which has as much power with the 25-34 crowd as Ozzy Osbourne's 'Crazy Train' does to the 12-24 group. This album is a definite must for any station who wants to appeal beyond the 12-24. QFM and Mainstream Records have gotten together in a unique effort to spur retail-concert activity. QFM has installed remote broadcast studios at Mainstream stores. We used the studios last week to conduct an in-store interview with Ozzy Osbourne. It was a huge success as over 300 people showed up to get Ozzy's autograph. We also broadcast our 'Q Wave' show live from that record store every Sunday night, 8 to 9:30. Record reps should keep this helpful promotion vehicle in mind when your groups visit Milwaukee."

I hope all had as good a Memorial Day as we did. Looking forward to a good rocking Summer!"

KBLE, DES MOINES, IA P.D.-RON SORENSON: "This week's set features vastly improved albums from two new artists. 20/20's 'Lookout' shows some maturity and definition of style. The first album only hinted at it. Rich Podolar's squeaky clean production is certainly a plus, too. 'Strange Side Of Love', 'Nuclear Boy', 'A Girl Like You', and 'Life In The U.S.A.' lead...Second improved offering is from the A's. A pleasant surprise, as I didn't much care for the first album. The next RAINBOW LP will be ready by Christmas, with contributions this time around by new members JOE LYNN TURNER and BOB RONDINELLI. Currently touring Europe and Japan, they'll be back in the States with the new one in January.

An interview with RAY MANZAREK of the Doors. Ray has just finished producing the new album from the Los Angeles based band X.

Q: How did you first meet X?

RM: "I first met them at the Whiskey-go-go and ironically, that's where the Doors got their start... I had actually gone to see another band and X was the opening act. They were absolutely fabulous. They had more strength, more power and more poetry than anything I'd seen in L.A. in a long time. As far as I'm concerned, they're the best band in America right now."

Q: You played on the album as well as produced it...

RM: "I played on a couple of tunes on the first album (Los Angeles), and after we did the album we had a wild weekend gig at the Whiskey. I sat in with them and played the songs I did on the album. I'll probably play with them again when we do something in New York and Chicago. It'll be a spur-of-the-moment thing if we do it."

Q: What do you think of the music that's happening today?

RM: "There's not a lot of good music within the mainstream. It's on the fringes. I think America is about to have a musical renaissance. A musical explosion. I think the whole political structure is obviously very conservative and by next Summer things are gonna start to make a major change. I'm very excited about it. I think a lot of it is gonna come out of Los Angeles, because there are just dynamite bands here in L.A. that haven't been signed yet and we're going to hear a lot from them."

Q: Are you going to get involved with any of these bands?

RM: "I definitely want to do some more producing. I'm doing a six-song EP through Rhino Records with a band called The Zipperz. It's more of a pop-rock thing than X is, but they're equally as intense and committed."

Q: And that's obviously important...

RM: "I think that's the whole point of the music. You've got to be committed to your music and committed to saying something. That's what's going on in L.A.; none of the bands that are committed are being signed by the big record companies. They're signing all the bands that have a slick gloss and polish, which is fine for the Mike Douglas show... But, man, rock n' roll is about reality. If there's no reality, if there's no guts, then it's nothing..."

MICHAEL PLEN, IRS (212-980-6874): "Watch out America as IRS records prepares to unleash five little girls, alias the Go Go's, on radio and the world. If you're not familiar with them, they hail from L.A. and are probably that area's most popular band, except Van Halen. But who'd call that a band? Their single 'Our Lips Are Sealed' will ship to radio on the 9th of June and be prepared! Richard Gottherer (who has produced Blondie, Robert Gordon), produced this album. There are additional tracks on the Lp to satisfy your little girl urges. This band is not a goof and they're not trying to portray the Runaways. They're just five girls who happen to play rock and roll well. Their import single on Stiff 'We Got The Beat' was on the dance charts for 33 weeks and is still a popular seller today. Watch out! IRS is on the Go Go...Magazine's single 'About The Weather' had a pretty good week first week out. About 10 stations are on it out of the box. The Lp ships on June 9th as well. This band is full of five musicians who are intercreating not only good music but a mood to match their sound. If David Bowie and Roxy Music mean anything to you, then so should Magazine. Hey, how about the weather...And finally, the best for last, if you haven't listened to the Cramp's 'Goo Goo Muck', then your brain must be full of it. Call me or your local A&M person for a copy. I've been getting weekly responses back from programmers saying that 'Goo Goo Muck' is a wonderful morning programming item. It's different but it definitely could be the edge you need to niche out the competitors. FOR YOUR INFORMATION:
When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. **PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. **PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. **AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 10. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 10 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 5 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

Before the lead cut listings, you will notice three columns of numbers. We feel that it is highly relevant to include the number of weeks a station has been on a given album--so we're listing that information in a third column at the far left...We list debuts with a small "d". That indicates that the lp is in the second week of play. So--this week, we took last week's debuts, and gave them a 3 in the "weeks on" column. Next week those 3's will change to 4's--and so on. It's pretty simple.
