Top talent managers leave Canada for U.S.

RPM has learned of the impending exiting of three major management firms from Canada to a new base of operations in the U.S. Scouting new U.S. horizons are Leonard Rambeau of Balmur Ltd., Bernie Finkelstein and Bernie Fiedler of Finkelstein & Fiedler and Martin Onrot of Martin Onrot Management (MOM).

Rambeau, who manages Canadian notables, Anne Murray, John Allan Cameron and Bruce Murray, expects to settle into his new offices early in the new year. He told RPM: "I found that I was spending one out of four weeks in Los Angeles, so now I'm reversing the process". He went on to explain that while he was in close contact with Los Angeles by telephone he found he just wasn't on top of things, spending most of his time in Canada. "I can do much more for my artists if I'm in the centre of activity and that happens to be Los Angeles. I can also work much closer with the Tower (Capitol) when it comes to record activity for Anne". Rambeau explained he believes that now is the time for Anne Murray to move from superstar status in Canada to an international superstar and he can only accomplish this by being on top of things. Rambeau noted: "Anne Murray is from Canada but her music is for everywhere and we intend to step up activities to open the international door much wider". Balmur is now in full control of Anne Murray's management activities and recently switched agencies from ICM to APA. Ms. Murray's new album is now in its final mixing stages and was produced by Jim Ed Norman at Toronto's Eastern Sound Studios. The

GRT's Prism added as openers on Styx tour

GRT Reocrds report GRT group Prism have been added to the upcoming national major concert tour by A&M recording group Styx. The November tour, which is being copromoted by Toronto-based Concert Productions International and Montreal-based Donald K. Donald, covers 11 major concert stops through Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime provinces.

The tour begins November 5 in Ottawa, and continues with dates in Montreal (9), Quebec City (10), Moncton (11), Halifax (12), Fredricton (13), London, Ontario (16), Toronto (17), Sudbury (18), Kitchener (19) and Kingston (20).

For Vancouver-based Prism, addition to the Styx tour coincides with favourable reaction to their new album and single on an international level. In Canada, the album continues to make impressive sales and airplay gains, accompanied by favourable trade and consumer press notices. Both the album, titled after the group's name, and single Spaceship Superstar, are rising on RPM'S charts.

In the U.S., where product is released on the Ariola American label, the group has met with similar favourable response, achieving trade chart numbers and favourable airplay and press reports.

album is expected to be released the latter part of December, one week before a U.S. release to coincide with a front page for Canada's Snowbird on TV Guide. Her new album contains material written by Brent Titcomb, the Everly Brothers, Johnny Nash and Patti Page's old hit, Tennessee Waltz, and encompasses the full spectrum of music of today which happens to be country/pop.

Bernie Fiedler expects to announce shortly the opening of Finkelstein & Fiedler offices in Los Angeles and cites reasons for his exodus as wanting to become much closer allied to the international scene. They are currently breaking new ground in the U.S. with the Dan Hill album and single, the latter, Sometimes When We Touch, has already surpassed sales of 86,000 in Canada and is experiencing a good spillover effect in the U.S. They are also hopeful of opening the international door for Murray Mc-Lauchlan who, like Hill, has had U.S. releases but is unable to break into the market. "We can do much more if we have a U.S. base", noted Fiedler, "It's a matter of being where the action is. We spend a great deal of time in the US and we find we accomplish much more through personal contact than by telephone'

Martin Onrot also feels the pinch of regionalism in Canada and is looking forward to the new challenge of a U.S. operation. "We spend a lot of money on long distance telephone calls and I've found that overall the cost of operating in the U.S. is much cheaper with far greater results. I have to look for international recognition for the people I represent: Malcolm Tomlinson,

Domenic Troiano and Chilliwack and I can do it better if I have a U.S. base of operations."

Many in the industry feel that the exodus of the three most important artist managers from Canada is the result of frustration within the industry.

Years ago, the talent drain endangered Canada's music industry, but in more recent times the attention swung to the management and direction of artists and the lack of good qualified artist managers in Canada.

An observer of the Canadian music scene has said that this may be the start of an exodus of artists, songwriters and technicians who have found that Canada is not progressive enough in the music industry to hold their talents here.

Another source close to the industry said "The talent is leaving because they don't feel they are part of a growing industry. The 30% Canadian content ruling will go on but it will just be tougher and tougher to find good people to stay. The encouragement is just not there from the broadcasters."

Many broadcasters may feel that if the talent leaves, the Cancon ruling may be abolished, but a spokesman for the CRTC has assured RPM that the ruling is here to stay and it will be a problem for the broadcasters to lick or will result in tougher legislation.

Great opportunities present themselves in the U.S. and it is generally felt in the industry that this move by three of Canada's top managers all in such a short period of time may be the beginning of a Canadian content talent drain.

Sherman's/Mister Sound open 1st of 4 new stores

Capitol Records-EMI of Canada have announced the opening of the first of four scheduled new stores in the Capitol-owned Sherman's/Mister Sound retail record and tape chain. The new store, located in the Markham Place Mall in Markham, Ontario, marks the 32nd outlet in the chain. The official opening took place October 19.

Sherman's/Mister Sound, although affiliated with Capitol-EMI, operates independently under vice-president and manager of retail Brian Josling. The division currently operates stores across Canada, using the Mister Sound name in Alberta and Ontario and Sherman's in the province of Quebec. The chain is now three years old, and has become one of Canada's major retailers.

Additional stores are already being slated to open in Toronto's North York-Sheridan Mall in November, with outlets in Guelph and Ottawa slated for March. Capitol reports six additional locations currently under negotiation.

In announcing the new store opening, Josling stated, "We are constantly seeking

Gov't to sponsor companies to 1978 MIDEM

The government of Canada has announced ten Canadian music industry companies have confirmed participation in a joint stand at the 1978 MIDEM, International Record and Music Publishing Market, slated for Cannes, France January 20-26, 1978. The stand is being sponsored by the federal Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce.

Confirming companies to date include Anthem Records of Canada (Thornhill, Ontario), Aquarius Records (Montreal), Attic Records (Toronto), Disque Fleur Inc. (Montreal), GRT of Canada (Toronto), Les Productions SMCL Inc. (Beloeil, Quebec), London Records of Canada (St. Laurent, Quebec), Morning Music Ltd. (Mississauga), Performing Rights Organization of Canada, and Phonodisc Ltd. (Scarborough).

The Federal Government's Office of Information and Public Relations reports market statistics show the Canadian music industry has made broad gains on the international scope during the period from 1970 to 1976. During that period, export sales rose from \$0.5 million to \$1.9 million, a gain of 280 percent. Performance royalties received from foreign societies increased over a ten-year period from \$123 thousand

During the 1970-1976 period, imports also increased dramatically, from \$4.4 million to 14.2 million, a 223 percent increase, but significantly, the ratio of imports to exports has decreased dramatically, from 35 to one in 1965 to 5:1, indicative of the significant acceptance of Canadian music internationally.

Information and Public Relations points out a number of additional indications of industry growth. In the Canadian market, sales from recordings have increased from \$69.7 million in 1970 to \$172 million last year, with total net shipments increasing by 71 percent over the period, from 44.1 million units to 75.4 million. At distributor's net selling price, the value of total sales increased 147 percent over the six-year period to \$160.1 million. Record sales expanded by 129 percent, with tapes showing a 203 percent expansion. Annual growth varied from nine percent to a high of 25 percent.

According to the federal government, Canada is now considered a leader in the development of new technologies. Canadian firms are pioneering in the development of direct-to-disc lacquering and digital sound recording techniques. Over the past two years, the number of recording studios in Canada has increased by 32 percent, with quality staff and equipment attracting many major international artists. In addition, a number of new pressing facilities have emerged recently, providing room for the national growth and up-to-date pressing and matrixing equipment.

WEA artists top 14 of 15 categories in U.K. poll

Artists whose product is distributed in North America by WEA Music completely dominated a recent annual readers' poll taken by British major trade/consumer music publication Melody Maker, placing winners in 14 out of the 15 categories. Included in the list of poll toppers was Canadian Joni Mitchell, WEA artist who was selected top female singer by the British readers.

The bulk of the awards went to British groups Emerson Lake & Palmer, Yes, Led Zeppelin and Genesis and their members. ELP placed four winners, with Carl Palmer topping drummers, Keith Emerson as top keyboard player, Fanfare For The Common Man as best single and Works as top album. Yes and Led Zeppelin each placed three winners. Yes took honours as top band, with members Jon Anderson and Chris Squire placing as best male singer and bassist respectively. Zeppelin leader Jimmy Page won kudos as top guitarist and top producer, and shared composer honours with group lead vocalist Robert Plant. Genesis won two awards, as best live act and top arrangers.

Also topping the poll was New York new wave group Television, a WEA act awarded top honours for brightest hope. WEA reports their artists also held the largest number of positions in the top ten place rankings in each category.

Mike McCoy exits CBS

Mike McCoy has exited CBS where he held the position of National Promotion Manager and is now looking for a new challenge within the record industry. An on-air personality for the past ten years, Mr. McCoy has been associated with several major stations including CHIQ-FM and CKY in Winnipeg, CFGO Ottawa, CJCH Halifax and CHUM-FM. It was while he was associated with the latter when he joined CBS

Capitol's Domenic Troiano opening dates for Mayall

Capitol recording artist Domenic Troiano, currently on release with his debut album for the label, Burnin' At The Stake, is slated to perform a series of opening act dates for noted British bluesman John Mayall in Ontario. Dates include London's Centennial Hall (October 24), Kitchener's Bingeman Arena (28), and McMaster University in Hamilton (29).

Capitol reports the release of Troiano's debut single with the label, Savour The Flavour, from the current album. The single is being shipped to Canadian radio stations on creamy white vinyl. The album is achieving sales and airplay on a national basis.

Toronto-based Troiano is a veteran guitar player and group leader, with credits including membership in such notable groups as Mandala, Bush, the James Gang, the Guess Who, and several permutations of the Domenic Troiano Band.

Van's Redwood label buys rock interviews

Redwood Records, a Vancouver-based label headed by Les Vogt and Graham Wood, have made a successful bid for the recording rights to Red Robinson's collection of historic rock interviews. The interviews were conducted by Robinson during his heyday as the west coast's top rock jock through the last 50s and 60s.

The deal includes a six figure guarantee versus a percentage of profits. Some of the names in the series include: Elvis Presley, Buddy Holly, The Beatles, Gene Vincent, Jerry Lee Lweis, Roy Orbison, Jim Reeves, Colonel Parker and others;

The initial Redwood release, The Elvis Tapes, issued in April of this year, prior to Presley's death (Aug 16) has chalked up sales of 250,000 copies throughout the world with the greatest portion of the U.S. sales reportedly yet to come. It has been reported that in view of these figures, Redwood exercised their option to purchase the remainder of the Robinson collection. Both Robinson and Redwood are convinced that "The time for the talkies has arrived".

The Elvis Tapes was released in Canada by Polydor.

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Moe Koffman - New relics for the Toronto veteran

Continuing in a tradition that was established with the signing of their recording deal in 1971, GRT Records and veteran jazz musician Moe Koffman have combined for another in a series of annual album releases by the noted Toronto flute/sax player.

The new album, Museum Pieces, is unique in a number of ways. The album was commissioned by the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto, who split the expenses with GRT, to give the museum publicity coinciding with its current \$42.5 million renovation project.

Museum Pieces evolved out of an idea had by R.O.M. director of programs and public relations David Young, Koffman explains, "The idea began when Dave Young was listening to the radio one day and heard an interview of somebody and myself talking about our Solar Explorations album. That's the album we did based on the nine planets of the solar system. A light bulb lit up in his head and he tought, what a great idea if he could get me to do a similar album based on the museum

"He called me about it, and it didn't appeal to me very much at first, because I didn't see much of an inspiration in doing an album based on the Royal Ontario Museum. I sort of pictured it as a kind of stuffy, antiquated thing. But the idea was still in the back of my mind when I was in to see (GRT President) Ross Reynolds to discuss this year's album."

Koffman was given a relatively low budget by GRT for the album: "I mentioned to him the idea that was presented to me, and he said, gee, it sounds interesting." But budgetary problems prevailed, and it wasn't until the museum offered to commission the project that the album was underway.

The album is built around the museum, with the compositions described as "jazz interpretations of the R.O.M. collections" Their titles are Museum Piece, Rocks (Mineralogy), Digs (Archaeology), Evolution Blues, Pharaoh's Dream, Wildlife (Mammalogy), Days Gone By (Egyptology), and Dinasaurus: "This is the first time I've gone into an album where I had to get the names of the tunes before the music was ever written, because to do an album with this concept, I had to visit the museum several times and get titles that would really suit eight tunes. Then I sort of commissioned people to write the tunes." Contributing writers were Rick Wilkins, who also arranged the strings, Don Thompson, who coproduced the album with Koffman, Doug Riley, who contributed keyboards, and Marty Morell, drummer in Koffman's

"The title of the album, Museum Pieces, was a natural. It was thought up by Don Thompson. I decided I'd write the title piece, and it would be natural to have the title song be in a sort of antique-type baroque melody, which would fit the museum. That's how the concept came about, and it turned out really great. I'm flattered that the museum did go through and do the album."

The album was a thorough project, but not particularly expensive by current standards: "It's pretty strictly the quintet and 13 strings. So with the studio time and everything, we're not looking at a high-budget album at all. We budgeted at about \$20,000, and we came in slightly under." The album was recorded at Toronto's Soundstage Studio, with David Green handling the engineering.

Museum Pieces was debuted October 20 at a press/media reception held at the R.O.M. It was attended by several hundred press, media, industry and museum people, who previewed the product. The album is a general, rather than a special release, and will also be on sale at the museum. Essentially, The R.O.M. served as executive producer, commissioning the production and then leasing it to Koffman's company, GRT.

Koffman sprung to national attention in 1958, when a flute song from one of his early albums, Swingin' Shepherd Blues, became a major hit. Ironically, it wasn't until that time that he became a serious flautist, having previously studied and excelled at alto sax. He now totals 15 or 16 album releases, since his first product in 1948

Another major aspect in Koffman's life is his regular monthly week-long appearance at George's Spaghetti House in Toronto, an Italian restaurant which has been noted for its jazz music since Koffman began his regular stint there 17 years ago: "I'm sort of the music director of the place. I book all the other groups in when I'm not there, and we're sort of the house group. It's become a traditional jazz club, and it's the kind of place where we can try out all our new material for albums, and sort of use the audience as guinea pigs."

In the future, Koffman's additional plans include the special concert, which will be held November 20 at the Royal Conservatory Concert Hall. The concert is being put on by the museum, with the purchase of an album as the price of admission.'

THE BEATLES Love Songs Capitol SKBL-11711-F

One of the best, if not the best packages of entertainment marketed by the Capitol people, from this history making rock four. Producer George Martin did the honours as usual with the exception of The Long And Winding Road with which he was given a co-production hand by Phil Spector, No. doubt this 2-record set will be an early item to spark the holiday buying spirit which isn't that far away. Look at the titles. Norwegian Wood, I'll Follow The Sun, Yesterday, Michelle, Yes It Is. A solid collection of Beatle nostalgia from 1964 through to 1973. Contains a libretto with all you need to sing-a-long or whatever.



BING CROSBY **Beautiful Memories** United Artists UALA-883G-N

There will be many releases paying tribute to the great "groaner" but this package will probably be best remembered. Produced by Ken Barnes this album was released in the UK in September and was the last session Harry Lillis Crosby would do. He died the following month (Oct 14) but here he brings to life exceptional interpretations of contemporary composers, Paul Williams, Randy Edelman, Gilbert Becaud and Marvin Hamlisch as well as selections by Hoagy Carmichael and Rogers and Hart, Although in his mid-seventies, Crosby's rich vocals and smooth delivery has yet to be matched by the younger generation. A collector's item. Beautiful Memories was one of the better things to happen to Crosby in his later years and a beautiful musical legacy to his millions of fans.



THE ORIGINAL DUMBELLS Aquitaine ALS 385-H


The miseries of the soldiers in the trenches during WWI were lightened somewhat when some of these poor souls had the opportunity of seeing and hearing the original trench entertainment put together by a group of Canadian soldiers led by Captain Merton Plunkett. The group conjured up every conceivable situation that could generate a smile for the war weary soldiers. The original drag show from Vimy Ridge in France moved from Flanders to the civilian and much safer stages and a successful ten years of showbiz. Spoofs on dirty bedraggled soldiers looking for cooties to a tearing apart of General Douglas MacArthur's famous Rainbow Division which, by the way, created a stormy niche for the group in international circles. It's all here, produced by Eleanor Sniderman with an invaluable assist from Edward B. Moogk, head of the Recorded Sound Section of the National Library of Canada. The group disbanded in 1929 but through the wonderful world of sound reproduction. they live on thanks to remix engineer Harry Bragg and Philip Joiner who mastered this collector's item.




FABULOUS POODLES Pye NSPL 18530-L

Unfortunately the Fabulous Poodles fall into the category of Punk Rock or its nicer sounding but equally destructive music form, New Wave. These Britishers will probably gain in stature because of the tagging but what they are offering is a brand of high energy rock and roll that smacks of the excitement of the 1964 era. Tony de Meur, lead vocals, guitar and harmonica, does most of the writing, teaming up with Bryn Burrows, drums and vocals Richie C. Robertson, bass and vocals and Bobby Valentino, violin, mandolin and vocals for other cuts. Check out Workshy and Rosie Pink for the fiddle influence and Rum Baba

Boogle for an interesting mandolin insertion. Contains their current single release, When The Summer's Thru





Wilcox, New Teddybears pack 'em in through Ont.

Following a layoff of several months between bands. Toronto's David Wilcox has introduced his newest version of the Teddybears to Ontario with virtually unmatched fervor.

The new band is demonstrating, in its first month on the road, that it is likely to exceed the success of its predecesors, for whom packed houses and encores had earned a reputation as one of Ontario's top club acts.

The new band consists of Wilcox on lead guitar and vocals, Kit Johnson on second guitar, bassist Terry Wilkins and drummer Bukka (Big Sound) Love. Wilkins, a holdover from a previous permutation of the Teddybears, is a veteran of Lighthouse. Love was the drummer in Wilcox' first major Toronto-

based band, the legendary Rhythm Rockets. The group are booked exclusively by Music Shoppe International.

The current Teddybears made their debut the week of September 26 at the Knob Hill Tavern in Scarborough, Ontario, followed by weeks' bookings in Owen Sound and the Ascot Inn in Malton. The band then returned to the heart of its following, downdown Toronto, for a highly successful stay upstairs at the El Mocambo.

The next week, October 17-22, they moved into Ottawa's Black Swan. Playing before packed houses all week, the group created momentum in Ottawa so great that the appearance received coverage on the six o'clock news, as well as major favourable write-ups in the city's dailies.

Onstage, Wilcox himself provides the centre of attention. His high-profile visual image, highlighted by Salvador Dali-style moustache, long, shaggy hair, suit (often a white zoot suit) and carnation, any of a variety of colours, draws the audience focus to his high-energy stage antics and strong, very deep voice. A solid guitarist, Wilcox has toured with such names as Maria Muldair and Ian & Sylvia, and has sessioned with Muldair, Charlie Rich, Bobby Bare and Anne Murray. In his own band, Wilcox' guitar work comprises solid rhythms and leads, as well as sound effects and comic relief. Over a good-natured, often humourous backdrop, the band performs a wide variety of music, specializing in solid rock & roll. They normally receive at least one encore per

Wilcox is currently in the market for a recording deal. A number of companies have expressed interest.

The group are currently completing a week at the Collins Inn in Dundas (October 31-November 5), to be followed by an appearance at the Queensbury Arms in Toronto (7-12).

Guitar sponsorship, new 45 for Ixtlan's Baumber

Toronto-based Ixtlan Records reports a busy fall season for Ixtlan recording artist Ron Baumber. The fall season began with the announcement that Baumber had become the first Canadian artist to be sponsored by S.L. Mossman guitars from the U.S. The

Now approaching the end of the fall season, Ixtlan reports the imminent release of a new single by Baumber. Titled Duncan & The Devil, the song was self-penned and produced by Baumber at Toronto's Thunder Sound and Grant Avenue Studio in Hamilton. A number of top Canadian musicians are featured on the sessions, including guitarist Danny Lanois, whose credits include work with Shirley Eikhard, Sylvia Tyson and Ray Materick; fiddler Ben Mink (Of Murray McLauchlan's Silver Tractor); noted session man Bruce Pennycook (Lighthouse) on sax, drummer Bob Di Salle (Shirley Eikhard, Jackson Hawke, Ronney Abramson); and vocalist Marty Worthy and Paul Quarrington (Direction artists).

The single is backed with another Baumber original, Keep It On The Tracks, which features Tony Kosinec on background vocals.

Toronto-based concert promoter Martin Onrot reports an upcoming major concert headline debut for Toronto-based classical guitarist Liona Boyd. The concert is scheduled for Toronto's Massey Hall, February 4, 1978.

Boyd, Canada's first internationally celebrated guitarist, is no stranger to the major concert hall. She has toured extensively with Gordon Lightfoot throughout the United States and Canada, performing in major concert halls throughout the continent, including Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens. Solo touring has also taken her through North and South America.

Boyd is also noted as a recording artist. Her debut album The Guitar, on Boot Records, has sold more units than any other Canadian classical recording. Her second album Liona has also achieved Canadian sales successes. A third album, titled Miniatures For Guitar, is being slated for release by the end of November.

Marc Jordan release set for January

Marc Jordan's initial album release for Warner Bros is now under way with a January release pencilled in at time of writing. The album, Mannequin, is being produced by Gary Katz. The tapes, are now in their final mixing stage.

Jordan's album session is apparently being given top priority at Warner Bros where Katz and Jordan have been given all the time and freedom they feel necessary to come up with a top flight album. Musicians employed on the session to date include: Jeff Porcaro and Lenny Castro of Boz Scaggs, the Coasters' Chuck Rainey, Donald Fagen of Steely Dan. Jeff Baxter of the Doobie Brothers, The Eagles' J.D. Souther and Tom Scott.

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RCA to release Kneptune single by Bayou Brothers

White Rock, B.C -based Kneptune Records have announced completion of negotiations between Kneptune president Kenny Harris and RCA Records for the release by RCA of Kneptune-produced single Sing Me, backed with Love Don't Change, by Kneptune group the Bayou Brothers.

The main side, Sing Me, was a recent success in Britain. It was leased to Kneptune by Holland-based Oaks Records.

CTL producing Jackie Rae, Ben McPeek collaboration

The Canadian Talent Library is currently going into production of what promises to be an interesting album project. The project is an album collaboration between Jackie Rae and Ben McPeek, featuring a 17-piece orchestra without strings.

Rae, a veteran musician, songwriter, television personality and record executive, and McPeek, composer, musician, arranger and producer, are putting the effort together at Toronto's Eastern Sound Studios. Rae is producing the album and handling the arrangements. McPeek is orchestrating the arrangements and conducting the sessions. Peter Mann will be handling the engineering chores, with CTL's Mal Thompson acting as executive producer.

The 17-piece orchestra will feature a rhythm section, and a number of woodwinds and trombones. In addition, Debbie Fleming and Elaine Overhalt will be featured on lead and background vocals. The album will blend such popular songs as You've Got A Friend and I Won't Last A Day Without You with four original songs — one each by Fleming and Overhalt, one by Rae, and one Rae-McPeek collaboration.

Second Tom Dunn album to be released by U.A.

The Canadian Talent Library has reported the upcoming release of a second CTL-produced album by Tom Dunn, again on the United Artists label. The new Dunn effort was produced recently at Toronto's Eastern Sound by Jim Pirie, with Hayward Parrott handling the engineering chores Mal Thompson of the Canadian Talent Library served as executive producer.

The new album, titled Make It Hot, is being slated for a release by the beginning of December. U.S. Records is currently choosing a debut single from the album, likely to be a Dunn original. Of the ten songs on the album, five were self-penned.


The album release follows by one year the release of Dunn's debut album effort Melody Man, also produced by CTL and released through an agreement with United Artists

P.Y. Curtin & Associates expect comparable success to original Laserium I and II, which attracted several hundred thousand people in Southern Ontario.



CBS' Hollies slated for 2nd annual Canadian tour

CBS recording group the Hollies are preparing for their second annual cross-Canada major concert tour. The tour takes place strictly in Canada, with no U.S. dates. It will be opened by MCA recording group Sherbet, one of Australia's most popular groups who are making their debut Canadian tour.

The tour begins in Vancouver, October 31 at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre. Further dates include Calgary's Jubilee (November 1) Winnipeg's Concert Hall (2-3), Lakehead University in Thunder Bay (4), Regina's Centre of the Arts (5), Centennial Hall in Saskatoon (6), Edmonton's Jubilee (7), London's Centennial Hall (11), the National Arts Centre in Ottawa (13), Toronto's Massey Hall (14), Hamilton Place (15), and Montreal's Place Des Arts (16).

The Hollies began their recording career in England in the early 60's, and have compiled a track record containing numerous international hits ever since, from early hits such as Bus Stop and Look Through Any Window to more recent successes with The Air That I Breathe and He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother. Most of their original membership remains intact, with the notable exception of Graham Nash, now with Crosby, Stills & Nash.

The current tour is being booked through Bud Matton Enterprises by Tom Wilson, who also booked their 1976 fall tour of Canada.

International gains for Rush Farewell To Kings

Anthem Records report current new album release A Farewell To Kings by Anthem recording group Rush is gaining impressive credentials in a number of countries around the world. In Canada, the album is already certified gold and is approaching platinum status. It is receiving solid AOR airplay nationally, and should it reach platinum status, it would be the group's first.

Anthem reports the album is also over halfway to gold status in Sweden, with continuing good sales reports. In Britain, where the album was recorded, it is reporting national chart figures nearing the top 20.

In the U.S., where the band has achieved status as a major headline act, the album is receiving impressive trade chart figures, within the top 50 on all three U.S. trades.

The album, the group's sixth, differs slightly from their previous efforts in that the group's heavy metal image is joined by a degree of softer and more commercial material. A debut single from the album, Closer To The Heart, is showing signs of becoming the group's first successful single, receiving airplay at a number of major market stations in Canada, including CKLW Windsor, CKOC Hamilton, CKCY Sault Ste. Marie, CHEX Peterborough and CFJR Brockville, as well as all three Toronto AOR stations. The single has achieved Canadian trade picks, as well as U.S. trade numbers, and is currently charted in RPM's Top 100 Singles.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

CAMPUS DIALOGUE

Thank you for hosting the second RPM Talent & Entertainment Conference. I think the Conference has the potential to be an extremely worthwhile, educational experience for people in all areas and levels of the Canadian music industry. I always find I get a lot out of these gatherings — mainly because it is one of the few chances I get to meet with many of the people I deal with regularly from other parts of Canada especially Toronto. However, as with all fledgling operations, there is much room for development and I would like to offer a few suggestions for your consideration.

I think that some kind of follow-up should be done after the Conference or even after various of the sessions so that people who are reluctant to sit down and compose a long drawnout epistle like this one, would have a chance to make their opinions known.

The age-old problem of regional representation has almost become too boring to discuss, but I think it can be improved without a great deal of trouble. Dalhousie and one other Halifax University are the only two schools I know of in the Maritimes whose entertainment chairpersons received word of the Conference in advance. The others (St. F.X. University, Antigonish; Acadia University, Wolfville; to name two) said they would have come if they had known about it. How about having somebody in each region to act as liaison for you - to provide you with an up-to-date mailing list. encourage support from people in their area. even to have input in the initial planning of the thing? Even if you had one person from the Maritimes, one from Quebec and one from the West, it would help eradicate some of the prevalent "Toronto-ness" of the whole affair. I think the location should remain the same -- "it only makes sense that people should travel to Toronto which is. after all, the centre of the Canadian music industry. Delegates from other areas can visit clubs, performances, and conduct business there during conference free-time.

More input from the buyers. This year there seemed to be a much greater proportion of industry people to buyers and surely the main purpose behind the thing is for the buyers and sellers to get together? I think one answer is much more advance publicity. There should be a brief announcement stating the dates and location at the beginning of September so that people can start thinking about it. This could be then fol-'lowed by an application form with a detailed run-down of conference activities. Ideally a final-details notice should be sent after that to pick up the dawdlers and provide lastminute enticement to those who still aren't sure. I know this is costly, but the more people you attract - the more money you bring in. If you had to raise the registration fee a bit, I don't think people would mind as long as the quality was raised along with it. Maybe the answer is to hire a really good PR specialist (Perhaps someone like Joyce Barslow) just to coordinate the promotion and publicity of the conference. Every college/highschool buyer, club-owner, talent booker, etc., should be made to feel that this conference is unmissable.

I think the panel discussions should be more specialized, with some for beginners and some for the experienced (who can always learn more!) I realize how difficult these are to organize and to get people to turn out to, but again, I think if you asked for various industry people and buyers from various regions to prepare a session in their particular specialty, you would get some results. In many cases the panelists don't prepare anything - they simply take questions from the floor which usually results in chronic meandering away from whatever the original topic may have been. For example, for the panel on promotion and publicity -- have someone actually demonstrate a particular promotional campaign from start to finish. How they prepare a concept, who they go to see, how they budget for it, etc. I think the audience would get much more out of this kind of presentation which can be supplemented with questions and answers.

Having the sessions start in the afternoon or late morning is an excellent idea — now if they were just a little more interesting I think you'd get a really good turnout.

Showcases were presented well but were too long. The groups just can't be getting judged fairly by people who have been sitting for 3 or 4 hours without a break, trying not to lose interest. The volume level alone eventually gets just too much to bear and when the audience gets restless the group unjustly suffers as a result. Time limits should be enforced. If an act begins to go over their time, they should be unplugged. Also, a bit more variety would be nice. Saturday night was a good example, with La Troupe Grotesque providing a nice relief from the monotony of rock bands.

To conclude, congratulations to Stan Klees and yourself for the planning and organization of this large undertaking. It's something everybody in the industry can learn from and should be developed to the furthest degree possible. I hope my suggestions won't offend but can prove to be of some help in planning next year's function.

Herewith, we are printing your letter as a development of the Conference and we will enter a dialogue by trying to answer some of your questions and review some of your suggestions. Where better to voice your opinions and ours than in this weekly. Here we can see what interest there is in the Conference and what ideas will be

forecoming.

In answer to the two universities that would have attended had they known about it, I have enclosed the complete list of Nova Scotia schools that were sent Three promotional pieces on the Conference and five copies of RPM with promotional pieces on the Conference (in some cases a two page spread) which answers this question.

Your comments about raising the registration fee is something that must be considered before next year's Conference. I was only asked once if the conference was underwritten by a "grant". It wasn't, but I was pleased there was one person who had the perception to realize the cost against the revenue. The fact is that RPM has underwritten the Conference for two years.

In the case of the panel discussions, it isn't easy to get good and qualified panelists and moderators to make the conference "unmissable". It's a problem likened to the cart and the horse. In each case when we have begun seeding for a successful conference, few are really willing to actively participate until the prestige of the conference is established.

By the way, the proportion of buyers to industry people was about 50-50.

A great compliment to the groups that showcased is the fact that each one was allotted 35 minutes and the average each night was 37 minutes which isn't bad, considering it is hard to end a set on the button. Possibly we could showcase fewer each night. I would like to have a response to that from the sponsors. Variety in the acts came after the application deadline. We are led to believe there isn't that much variety used by buyers and therefore not too much exists over and above the music acts. I couldn't agree more that the middle act' the first night did break the monotony of an all music showcase.

You have been of great help to us and I hope you aren't offended by our using your letter to launch what we hope will become a dialogue. The Conference could be more useful if the industry and the talent buyers viewed this sort of thing in the same light as you obviously do.

We have twelve months to make a decision about next year, in the meantime we are ready to hear from anyone who attended or chose not to. The big question is, "How much is such an event needed?"

Just wanted to congratulate you on the success of the 1977 Talent & Entertainment Conference held Oct 8, 9, & 10th.

I found the entire weekend informative and of course the talent showcases were of enormous benefit to me as an A&R man. I am hoping that Capitol can do business as a result of the convention. Deane Cameron



Titcomb is currently on release with a debut album on his own label, Manohar, and a debut single from the album, I Still Wish The Very Best For You, which is receiving country playlist additions. The single features sideman work by Gordon Lightfoot. In addition, the song was recently recorded by Anne Murray for her upcoming Capitol album.

Stringband member Marie-Lynn Hammond, noted for her contribution to the group's three albums on Nick Records, is booked into the Groaning Board for a rare solo appearance (15-19), followed by a week with Florida's Gamble Rogers (22-26), a noted singer, guitarist and story teller. Ending the month is a young, emerging group called Short Turn (29-December 3).

Canada tour dates for Arista's Eric Carmen

Capitol Records reports a series of three Canadian tour dates for Arista recording artist Eric Carmen. Dates include Ottawa, November 29, Montreal (30), and Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens Concert Bowl (December 1). The Montreal and Ottawa dates will be opened by fellow Arista artists the Kinks, with the Toronto date to include CBS recording artist Billy Joel.



Music Arts to do talent, publicity for Horseshoe

Toronto-based music publicity and promotion firm Music Arts Company report they have negotiated an arrangement with Toronto club the Horseshoe Tavern whereby the company will direct talent coordination and publicity at the Horseshoe.

Both partners in Music Arts, Ellen Davidson and Richard Flohil, will be involved in the project. Flohil will direct publicity efforts for the club, and Davidson will supervise talent co-ordination, which will involve deciding on and buying talent for the room. Davidson handles similar duties with another Toronto club, the Groaning Board, an acoustic music showcase room.

In making the announcement, Davidson stated, "The Horseshoe has long been the Toronto heart of country music. In recent months, it has broadened its policy to include a variety of contemporary music styles. It's our intention to book contemporary artists who have their roots in contemporary music and other basically folk styles."

Currently booked into the Horseshoe is Downchild (October 31-November 5), to be followed by Joe Hall & Joe Mendelson (7-12), Colleen Peterson & The Small Change Band (14-19), Prairie Oyster (21-26), Colin Linden & Lucky Charms (28-December 3), and The Great Sneezy Waters & His Excellent Band featuring a Hank Williams musical revue.

The Agency arranges for booking three D-P acts

Toronto-based booking firm The Agency reports it has entered into exlusive booking arrangements with three Toronto-based acts, including Attic recording group Triumph, Diane Heatherington and Desperado. The acts are all in the process of completing exclusive booking deals elsewhere, and the Agency arrangements will become effective when they expire.

The three acts are all managed by Toronto-based firm Dixon-Propas. With their addition, the Agency will be booking the bulk of the firm's artists. They already currently book Abbey Road and RCA recording group the Good Brothers.

For Triumph, the move comes in time to coincide with their second album on the Attic label, which is currently in the process of being completed for release.

Capitol recording artist Steve Miller celebrated his tenth anniversary as an artist with the label in Toronto with a bang. At a press reception held at the Hyatt Regency the night before, he was presented with an anniversary cake, a double platinum album for Fly Like An Eagle, which has surpassed 200,000 unit sales in Canada, and single platinum for his latest release Book Of Dreams. The following night, he performed before the huge Gardens crowd with his sixpiece band, which featured two additional guitarists, keyboards, bass, drums, and Norton Buffalo, whose own band opened the show, as they have done with Miller for the past two years. The show garnered five encores.

Following the opening set, which featured Buffalb's strong harmonica work in a variety of rock, blues and country feelings, Miller brought his band onstage. Beginning his set with a number of his earlier tunes, including hits such as Living In The U.S.A., Miller moved into the seventies, featuring material from his Joker album as well as the two newer releases. Highlighted by a strong light and laser show, he kept his audience spell-bound for over an hour without performing any of his hit singles.

Miller closed the show with a string of major hit singles, including such audience favourites as Rock 'n Me, Jet Airliner and The Joker, one of his encores, plus a pair of blues efforts.

The icing on the cake came the following day, October 25, when Capitol reported the Book Of Dreams album had surpassed the double platinum level.

WEA artist Tom Waits proved himself a consummate showman twice in one night before near-packed houses at Toronto's New Yorker Theatre. Accompanied by string bass, drums, and Frank Vicari on saxophone, Waits performed in black suit and hat, looking like a cross between Frank Sinatra and a Jarvis Street wino.

After beginning his set with a neodrunken version of Standing On A Corner, Waits treated his audience to a full set of stylish lounge piano work, scat singing, and his powerful lyrics, free-flow and poetic, through his emotional if badly battered voice. Songs were featured from his Small Change album and his new Asylum release Foreign Affairs. Waits earned a total of five encores for the two shows.

The only low moments in the show were an hour-long wait for the early show, caused by equipment delays, and a very sub-par stand-up comic who opened the shows.

Capitol country artist Hart set for Regina date

Capitol Records reports Capitol artist Freddy Hart, a veteran international name in the country music field, is slated for a Canadian concert appearance in Regina, November 27. Hart, whose current Capitol album The Pleasure's Been All Mine is his 15th album with the label, has achieved a number of international country hits through the years, including Easy Lovin', which has become a country standard.

Hart's most recent single, from the album, is Falling All Over Me, a self-penned effort. 'Capitol is slating late October for release of a new single, The Search, also from the current album.

MCA names Keith Patten national promo manager

MCA Records (Canada) marketing vicepresident Scott Richards has announced the appointment of Keith Patten to the position of national promotion manager at MCA

In the new position, Patten will assist the company's field people in all aspects of radio promotion, and in dealing with MCA Canadian and international artists on tour in Canada.

Patten's music industry career spans over ten years, during which time he has acquired experience in promotion, publishing and A&R. Most recently, he has been employed by United Artists Records in A&R.

Patten will report directly to Richards.

U.S. reports pre-release reaction to Alan Price LP

United Artists Records reports a surprising amount of pre-release reaction at radio, dealer and public levels to a new North American album debut by Alan Price. The album, titled after his name, is Price's first product release with U.A.'s Jet Records

Price has long been in the public eye, originally as a member of top British group the Animals, with whom he played keyboards. He also gained notices in North America several years ago for composing the music for the film O Lucky Man, which included the title hit. Price has had several European releases, but the new album is his first major product in North America other than the movie soundtrack.

Price also appears on the Animals' new release on United Artists. The album, titled Before We Were So Rudely Interrupted, is a one-shot reunion effort by Eric Burton and the Animals. U.A. reports the Price solo album is more commercial and pop-oriented than his efforts with his former group, which are somewhat blues-oriented.

Capitol to open Screen Gems' Colgems in Canada

Ira Jaffe, vice-president of professional activities and talent acquisition at Capitol-EMI Inc. (U.S.), has announced Capitol's U.S. publishing group, consisting of Screen Gems-EMI Music and Colgems-EMI Music, are opening a Canadian branch office. The offices, located at 31 Prince Arthur Ave. in Toronto, will be managed by John Bennett, whose title will be manager of Canadian affairs

The Canadian company Screen Gems-EMI Music Ltd. will be affiliated with P.R.O. Canada, with Colgems to affiliate with CAPAC. Bennett's responsibilities will include exploitation of the publishing companies' extensive catalogues by making the songs available to producers and artists, maintaining liaison with the company's Canadian writers, purchasing songs, scouting and signing Canadian writers and writerartists, and handling copyright matters and administrative business throughout the country on behalf of the company, Bennett will also manage the interests of Capitol's existing Canadian publishing concerns Beechwood Music (P.R.O.) and Capitol Music (CAPAC). All four companies will fall under Capitol Records-EMI Canada as divisions of the Canadian company.

Prior to joining Screen Gems, Bennett has acquired music industry experience in a variety of fields. In addition to working as an artist, he spent almost three years working with recording group Edward Bear, handling the group's publishing, booking, press and label liaison. More recently, he has been working with Bernd Schaeffer, manager of Warner Bros. artist Marc Jordan, administrating Jordan's publishing concern, Mortgage Music.

In announcing the opening of the office, Jaffe stated, "As our company became more familiar with the Canadian market, we realized there are many untapped sources of creativity in that country and many overlooked songs that might not find their way to the United States and the rest of the world if the particular record the song is on fails to get an international distribution deal. Canada is a worthwhile market for our catalogue too."

Detroit rock group Tilt for Canada dates

London-based booking firm B.B.R. Agency reports Detroit-based rock group Tilt are slated for a series of one-nighter concert dates in Ontario in early November, The dates include Niagara College in Welland (2), Humber College in Toronto (3,4), and London Armouries (5).

Tilt are a four-piece high-energy rock group. They are managed by Detroit firm Star Management, who recently signed an exclusive Canadian representation agreement with the London agency. B.B.R. reports efforts currently underway to gain major Ontario club showcase dates, to begin in January



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New tour for Canada's smallest dance company

Tournesol, Canada's smallest dance company, have embarked on their third cross-Canada performance and workshop tour. The tour began September 12 in Vancouver and will conclude November 30 in Nova Scotia.

The company, which consists of Carole and Ernst Eder, are known for intimate, involving and informal performances. The choreographies are primarily experimental in nature, and geared to utilize the art of

Among the company's dance works is a piece called Separation, created specifically for Tournesol by John Juliani, founder and director of Savage God. The Eders performed the work during their Toronto appearance, which took place October 21-23 at the Ballet Ys Studio. The piece was premiered in Paris May 20 at Le Mai De La Creation, an international festival of dance, music and theatre.

Quality releases 7 new Golden Treasures singles

Quality Records reports the release of seven new singles in its Golden Treasures On Wax series. The series consists of re-releases of records distributed in Canada by Quality which have achieved gold status through the years. Now totalling over 250 released on a variety of labels, the singles appear on a Golden Treasures label featuring the logo of their original labels.

The new group of releases are all from the Roulette label catalogue. The singles are Easier Said Than Done by the Essex; the original version of See You In September by the Tempos; Beep Beep by the Playmates; Daddy's Home, by Shep & The Limelites; the Flamingos' version of I Only Have Eyes For You; The Gypsy Cried by Lou Christie; and Barbara Ann by the Regents. The Golden Treasures singles are backed with other single releases by the same artists.

Capitol bows new Alan Parsons single

Capitol Records reports the release of a new single from Arista recording group the Alan Parsons Project. The single, titled Don't Let It Show, is culled from the group's current album effort, I Robot. It follows single release I Wouldn't Want To Be Like You, from the same album, which has achieved good airplay and sales reports across Canada, and which is still charted on RPM's Top 100

The Alan Parsons Project is a rare example in which a group is known by its producer. Parsons produced and engineered the album, and also included himself on the sessions, contributing keyboards, acoustic guitar and some of the back-up vocals. The current album has become a major international success, reporting good national sales and AOR airplay. It is currently charted in RPM.

Motown gains airplay on

new, established artists

Motown Records reports strong international airplay gains on single and album product by a variety of new and established Motown recording artists. Topping the list of established artist product are new single Gettin' Ready For Love by Diana Ross, from her new album Baby It's Me, which is receiving impressive U.S. trade gains, and current Commodores single Brickhouse, now a major U.S. hit, which is rapidly making playlist and chart gains in major and secondary markets across Canada, and is currently rising on RPM's Top 100 Singles chart.

On the new artists side is a debut single, Solar Flight — Opus One, by mystery artist Mandre from his debut Motown album titled after his name. The single is making international airplay gains in its first weeks.

Motown is particularly excited about new album and single product by a new, Pasadena, California-based group called High Inergy. The group, which consists of four girls, aged 16-19, has seen release within the past month of debut album Turnin' On and single You Can't Turn Me Off, on Motown's Gordy label. Both single and album are acquiring U.S. trade notices, with the single already showing signs of becoming an international hit.

DON'T BE LEFT OUT OF THE CMID

CBS' Vibrators 1st U.K. new wave group in Canada

CBS Records reports CBS recording group the Vibrators have become the first British new wave group to embark on a Canadian tour. Dates include a week at the Nelson in Montreal (October 25-30), an Ottawa concert at Carlton University (31), and two concerts at Toronto's New Yorker Theatre (November 4-5).

The Vibrators have a number of years' experience under their belts. They started out in the British club circuits, and later became the back-up group for guitarist

Chris Spedding of Eno, Brian Ferry, John Cale and Donovan fame. The four-piece group consists of Knox on vocals, keyboards and guitars, John Ellis on guitar and vocals, bassist Gary Tibbs and drummer Jon Edwards.

The group's debut album Pure Mania is currently in Britain's top 50 and climbing. It has established the Vibrators as one of the U.K.'s forefront new wave groups. It is also establishing them in Canada, where CBS reports exceptional product sales on the new release.

CBS reports continuing heavy Boz, Boston sales

CBS Records reports continuing heavy sales figures on album product by CBS artists Boston and Boz Scaggs. With Boston, CBS reports their album, titled after their name, has been the fastest selling debut album in the history of rock. Having already achieved triple platinum status in its first year, the album is expected to add another platinum by Christmas. CBS reports a second album from the group is being readied for release early in the new year.

Scaggs, whose most recent CBS album Silk Degrees, his fifth with the label, is now at double platinum, is receiving continued heavy sales figures. CBS has just released a new single, Hard Times, culled from an upcoming album, Still Falling For You, which is scheduled for release shortly. The single is already receiving favourable U.S.

trade action and chart bullets, and is beginning in its first week of Canadian release to pick up airplay.

Toronto-based booking firm Music Shoppe International reports they are booking in five weeks of punk rock, new wave attractions to Toronto club the Chimney. The first group of bookings, on a trial basis, will feature some of the major U.S. new wave groups.

Following weeks include Ram recording group The Fast, a noted attraction at Max's Kansas City in New York (14-19), the Johnny Barnes Group, who record on Nightcrawler Records (21-26), Boston-based Rat Recording group Nervous Eaters (28-December 3), and Mercury recording group the Demons, from New York City (5-10).

Music Shoppe is currently negotiating for top U.S. and British new wave attractions to bring into the club for future dates, in addition to some of Canada's major new wave groups.

Acting as directive agent on the project for Music Shoppe is the company's Mike Greggs, a British native who is the firm's new wave expert.

Oshawa's J.J. Barrie pens tribute to Crosby

J.J. Barrie, a native of Oshawa, Ontario has written, produced and recorded a tribute to Bing Crosby, So Long Bing (You Taught The World To Sing). The single is being rush released in Canada by RCA and in the U.S. by Janus.

Barrie, who caught the international ear last year with his single, No Charge, which topped the English charts, is also taping a Midnight Special, Nov 8 for televising Nov 18.



Road Show fails at crowds but opens doors

The Opry North Road Show has failed at its major goal of presenting its show to full houses throughout Ontario, but CFGM program director Dave Charles feels it has opened a number of doors and achieved some successes. Charles felt the show failed because it was premature, lacked sufficient support from some of the local radio stations, and didn't allow for advance promotion by the road show itself, since there was no time for promotion between dates.

After the first half of the show, the remaining dates were cancelled due to lack of audience support. However, Charles noted a number of encouraging signs. At every stop that was completed, the show was highly successful with the audiences that were present, indicative of a high standard of production and talent. In addition, the success of the tour as a promotional vehicle for the CFGM-syndicated Opry North radio show was proven, with local stations at every stop not previously on the Opry North network picking up syndication as a result of the road show date. These new stations, CIGM-FM North Bay, CHOV Pembroke and CJBQ Belleville, bring the total number of stations receiving Opry North to 30.

Charles noted after much hard work and effort, Opry North has also gained the Canadian Armed Forces Network through Europe as a syndicated carrier of Opry North. Charles feels this is a major plus, not only for the show, whose international reputation gains credibility, but also for Canadian country music in general, which will now be exposed to a large number of people in a completely new market.

Charles reports the Road Show dates were not all poorly attended. Two dates, in London and Sudbury, were sold out, with good crowds also experienced in Belleville and Kingston. According to Charles, another tour is being planned for next year. Some changes will be made. CFGM, who own Opry North, will be producing the tour themselves, fronting it and controlling the pre-promotion. It will consist of eight to ten selective dates, separated by a few days each to enable onthe-road promotion. There will also be about three weeks advance promotion on

GRT's Don Williams firm for Western Canada tour

GRT Records reports ABC recording artist Don Williams, whose product is manufactured and distributed in Canada by GRT, is firmed for a major concert headline tour of western Canada. Dates begin November 1 at Winnipeg's Centennial Hall, with additional dates at the Jubilee in Calgary (4), Saskatoon's Centennial Auditorium (5), the Centre of the Arts in Regina (6), Edmonton's Jubilee (8), a return date in Winnipeg (15), and the Queen Elizabeth Theatre in Vancouver (20).

. Williams, for several years a noted international country artist, is currently on release with a new GRT-distributed album, Country Boy, which was recorded recently in Nashville.

each date: "We feel that CFGM, by this time next year, will be ready to undertake, almost as a separate business to our broadcasting division, to have Opry North as really a full-fledged business, because that's what it has now become for us."

Another merchandising device Opry North will be using is a special RCA double record set, featuring a collection of material by RCA artists who have starred on Opry North, with artists featured such as the Good Brothers, Ronnie Prophet and Myrna Lorrie. Each station on the network will be able to sell the album in their area for three months at a price of \$5.99. Profits from record sales will be divided between Opry North and the Academy of Country Music Entertainment (ACME), for the betterment of Canadian country music talent.

Charles was recently elected president of the Academy for this year.

The flip of Joanne's single, Lost By Myself, was written by Ottawa writer Dave Britten who also produced the session. Ted Daigle has added the single to his CKBY-FM show as have CFRA in Ottawa and CJSS in Cornwall. Diana's Ralph Mongeau reports that Massey's single. There's A Man, now boasts listings on 29 radio stations in Canada as well as stations in Michigan, North Carolina and Virginia. In the meantime, Bobby's recording his first album at the Marc Studios for release in November.
