#### CBS hits the road with product show

CBS marketing, sales and promotion people have moved out across Canada with their 25th Anniversary four hour road show featuring 36 new releases from Columbia and Epic labels. The first showing was at Toronto's Sheraton Hotel (Sept. 24), hosted by CBS Chairman Arnold Gosewich who also hosted the Montreal show the following evening held at the Four Seasons Hotel.

Product from both Columbia and Epic including a healthy lineup of Cancon is being presented including new releases by Bruce Springsteen, Willie Nelson, Steve Forbert and Kenny Loggins, Cancon being showcased includes that from the Winnipegbased Harlequin, Montreal's Martin Stevens and Leonard Cohen, Vancouver's Dale Jacobs, Ottawa's Bruce Cockburn and

Toronto's Hellfield and Liona Boyd. Joining Boyd in the Columbia classical roster are Robert and Sarah Seurstein, who perform on the guitar and piano respectively.

The eight city CBS tour will also touch media and retail bases at the Calgary Centre (26), the Edmonton Plaza (27), the Vancouver Hotel (28), the Winnipeg Downtown Holiday Inn (Oct. 1), the Halifax Holiday Inn (2) and the Beau Sejour Hotel in Moncton on Oct. 3.

CBS head office support players travelling with the anniversary show include Johnny Desjardins, Bert Dunseith, Graham Powers, Marty Herzog, Don Oates, Terry McGee and Graham Thorpe. Branch personnel from each centre will also add strength to the presentation.

#### Sturrock appointed VP of Van's Casino Records

Sheldon Sturrock has been appointed Vice President of the Vancouver-based Casino Records and will be based in the Toronto area. Sturrock has just returned from Vancouver mapping plans for future activities with the label's President Ray Pettinger.

Casino is on release with album and single product by Ray Materick, Bim, Diamond Joe White and Shooter. The Materick album, Fever In Rio, has been experiencing good sales and will receive an added boost with the release of the single Only A Fool. Heavy airplay on the album has been credited with the sales success of the album.

Concert dates for Casino acts have also been scheduled to give support to album product. These include Bim with Doucette in Medicine Hat, Lethbridge and Calgary, Oct. 5, 6, and 7 respectively and Ray Materick with Minglewood and Doucette at the Coliseum in Vancouver on Oct. 10.

Casino product is distributed in Canada by London Records.

#### Quality switches to Laurel Records for Manitoba/ Lakehead distribution

The Winnipeg-based Laurel Records has been appointed distributor for Quality product for the province of Manitoba and the Ontario Lakehead. The new deal took effect Sept. 26 of this year.

Laurel Records is a well established distribution company that covers western Canada and is headed up by veteran record man Wally Sokulsky.

The above announcement was made by Barry Stafford, Vice President, Marketing, Quality Records.

#### CBS continues album and singles chart domination

CBS Records continued through the month of September to maintain a very solid domination over Canada's other distributors, according to a study of the RPM album and singles charts of the five issued during the month.

On the singles charts, CBS racked up an impressive 126 total listings to maintain its number one position, averaging 25.2 singles per top 100. This was a mild increase over the company's August showing, and enough to increase its lead over its nearest rival from 5.5 per week to 7.6.

In fact, during the month of September, the top seven finishers all maintained their positions. Capitol rebounded from a slow start to easily hold onto second place with 88 total listings, followed by WEA, solidly in third with 82, and PolyGram with 56. A&M continued to stay close behind the top four companies with 43 charted singles, followed by RCA with 34 and MCA with 30.

On the top 25, CBS continued to lead the field, logging a total of 34 top quarter


singles for an average of 6.8. However, they were threatened in September by Capitol, who finished strongly with a total of 31 and a very strong grip on second place.

WEA regained strength through the month, moving up from fifth to regain its place in the top four with 16. A&M continued to fight it out with the top companies, staying very close in fourth with 15 top quarter singles, and PolyGram slipped to a close fifth with 13. RCA totalled seven to take over sixth place, followed by MCA with five and GRT with four.

Capitol were led through the month by the industry's newest supergroup, the Knack, with additional support coming from the likes of Dr. Hook, Little River Band, Raydio, Robert John and Blondie.

Three different singles occupied the number one position through the month. In the first week, Patrick Hernandez's Born To Be Alive continued to hold down the top spot, replaced in the second week by the Knack's My Sharona. The Capitol

release held at number one for three weeks, to be replaced last week by Kiss' I Was Made For Loving You on Casablanca (PolyGram).

On the album charts, CBS' domination continued, with the company's tremendous margin of leadership virtually untouched. CBS totalled 146 charted albums through the month, for a weekly average of 29.2, down fractionally from last month. WEA experienced heavy growth through the month to finish second with 76 total listings, up from fourth place in August, and replaced Capitol. Capitol hung on to finish in a very close third with 74, and PolyGram slipped to fourth from third with 65.

RCA had a good month, overtaking A&M for fifth place with 42. A&M and MCA finished tied for sixth with 33.

CBS also continued to run away with the top 25 albums, totalling 34 top quarter listings, or an average of 6.8 WEA again showed growth, easing into second place with 26 and replacing PolyGram, who slipped to third with 21. Capitol continued to hold solidly to fourth place with 15.

MCA, led by Trooper and the Who, held on to fifth place with 10, and A&M moved up to tie RCA for sixth place with seven each.

Supertramp's Breakfast In America continued to hold down the number one

Advertising rates on request Second Class Mail Registration No. 1351 PRINTED IN CANADA position during the first week of the month for A&M, but was quickly replaced by the Knack's Get The Knack for Capitol. The Knack album held the top spot solidly through the last four weeks of September.

One significant factor which can be seen this month is the success of RCA at breaking back into the level immediately behind the top four companies. Boosted by sales strength of a number of country records from such artists as Dolly Parton and Waylon Jennings, as well as support from the Island, Salsoul and 20th Century labels, RCA is now holding its own against A&M and MCA directly behind the leaders. Current hit singles include Robert Palmer's Bad Case Of Loving You (Island), Lead Me On by Maxine Nightingale (Windsong) and H.A.P.P.Y. Radio by Edwin Starr (20th).

#### Rob Deans to play keys on tour with Trooper

MCA recording group Trooper have announced that noted Vancouver-based musican Rob Deans will be accompanying the group on their cross-Canada tour as keyboard player. Although not officially added as a member of the group at this time, Deans will be replacing on tour Frank Ludwig, who recently exited the group following the recording of their new Flying Colors album.

Deans has extensive experience in the Vancouver area as a studio musician. His credits include all keyboard work and strings on Heart's international supersmash album Dreamboat Annie on Mushroom. He also wrote and performed Coming Home on the highly successful Armageddon album by Magnum group Prism.

Trooper also announced changes in their itinerary on tour including dates

in Thunder Bay (Oct. 10), Lethbridge (26), Calgary (Nov. 7-8) and Edmonton (9).

One of the major tour dates so far took place August 26 at the Edmonton Commonwalth Stadium at the first annual K-97 Rock Cirkus, before nearly 45,000 people. Playing on an eight hour show which also included the likes of Heart, Peter Frampton, Eddie Money, Streetheart and the Dixon House Band, Trooper received a very enthusiastic reaction and highly favourable press response.

The group's Canadian breakthrough album, the hits collection titled Hot Shots, will reach the quadruple platinum status in Canada pending the filling of back orders. The new studio set, Flying Colors, shipped gold and is platinum pending back orders.

The five day MUSEXPO Workshop/ Seminar program will take place Nov. 4 through 8 at the Konover Hotel in Miami Beach, Florida.

#### Ottawa's NAC sponsoring bursary to music student

Donald MacSween, Director General of the National Arts Centre in Ottawa, has announced the creation of a special National Arts Centre Orchestra bursary to be awarded each year to a music student in the National Capital region pursuing a career as a professional musician. The award is being created in celebration of the orchestra's tenth anniversary this year.

Monies for the bursary will be collected via the orchestra's gala anniversary concert, held at the NAC October 4. A two dollar tax deductible donation will be added to ticket prices for the concert, and the National Arts Centre will match the donations to a total amount of \$10,000. The yearly interest from this amount will be allocated to the annual award.

Details of the bursary trust fund have not been finalized as of yet, but the Centre has announced a Bursary Committee will be chosen from among Ottawa's musical community.

BRUCE COCKBURN

Dancing In The Dragon's Jaws - True North TN-37-H Pop/jazz Suggested List \$8.98 Veteran singer-songwriter Cockburn has continued through recent years to show more and more jazz influence in his music, so much so of late that he has garnered offers to record for the prestigious European jazz label ECM. The new album, produced by Eugene Martynec at Toronto's Manta Sound, is an exceptional set of all-original material which again features Cockburn's somewhat freeflow, mystical lyrics, his soft, easy voice and superlative jazz/folk music and guitar playing, plus a richer sound than can be expected from only four musicians. Includes the single Wondering Where The Lions Are, and lyrics in both English and French (one cut sung in French).

#### **DANIEL BARBE**

Destination - Bobinason LB-1907-Solo Dist. Instr. Pop.

Montreal native Barbe's first solo album, on the young Quebec-based Bobinason label, shows the multitalented artist in a wide variety of roles, as co-producer (with Louis Mercier at Les Studios Bobinason), composer of all material and performer on all instruments but bass and one guitar track. These include guitar, piano, drums, percussion and synthesizer. The music is very much pop-oriented, although instrumental, ranging in tone from light disco to pop and soft rock. Several cuts would make good AC fare, or possibly even use on soundtracks. Non-lyric vocals on some cuts. Liner notes in French.

#### KATHRYN MOSES

Music In My Heart - PM PMR-017-L Jazz

Suggested List \$8.98

First public release for noted Canadian flautist who is also a very highly qualified sax player, vocalist and producer/arranger. Moses' first recording, a non-commercial CBC transcription, was chosen Canadian jazz recording of the year by the Canadian Music Council. Music In My Heart shows Moses simply oozing with talent in a wide range of jazz formats, from latin to funk to gospel. Sturdy support is provided from a selection of the country's top session/band musicians. Recorded at Toronto's Phase One & Kensington Sound, and New York's Sound Ideas and Red Gate Studio. Most of the cuts are original, all are Canadian-written.

#### A GUIDELINE AS TO HOW THE RPM 100 IS COMPILED

The RPM 100 is a national chart compiled weekly from national sales and radio station airplay and chart action. The top 50 records are computed from sales and airplay.

The computation of the records from 51 to 100 is based on early airplay, chart action and regional sales and breakouts. The chart is based on samplings from markets across Canada and indicates trends that may not be prevalent in all areas of Canada. Shaded numbers indicate a strong upward trend and gains in airplay or sales. This chart is offered as a guide to new product and an indication of trends in Canadian markets.

The RPM 100 singles and album chart (or any part therof) may be reproduced with a proper credit.

#### **NEW ALBUMS**

#### THE EAGLES

The Long Run - Asylum X5E-508-P Pop/rock

Suggested List \$9.29

One of the most awaited albums of the year, and the group's first release since their seven-times-platinum Hotel California of over two years ago, The Long Run is again exceptionally well-produced by Bill Szymczyk and highlights basically the songwriting of drummer Don Henley & guitarist Glenn Frey, with help from Eagles Joe Walsh, Tim Schmit and Don Felder, along with J.D. Souther, Bob Seger & Barry De Vorzon. The country edge on the group's sound left when Walsh, a rocker, replaced Bernie Leadon. The sound is now rock-influenced pop, very commercial, but with more AOR and fewer singles than in the past. Still a sure-fire hit. First single Heartache Tonight.

#### STYX

Cornerstone - A&M SP-3711-W Rock Suggested List \$8.98 With their ninth album (fifth since signing with A&M), Chicago-based rock group Styx continue to increase their following steadily and become tighter. Cornerstone is a successful exercise in the production of energy without sacrificing listenability. Much of the material is driving rock, but clean instrumentation, including strings and horns, and rich harmonies of up to five parts smooth out the sound and make the album an ideal package for FM radio. There are also several softer cuts, well-written and placed, and many of the tracks would succeed as singles. Exceptional, unusual packaging completes the set. Lyrics enclosed.

#### FRANK ZAPPA

Joe's Garage, Act 1 - Zappa SRZ-1-1603-Q Rock/concept

Suggested List \$8.98

Another in a series of concept albums by Zappa, who composed, arranged, conducted and produced the entire set. Joe's Garage, Act. 1 takes the form of the soundtrack to a play, complete with scenarios, lyrics and narration from a character known as the Central Scrutinizer. The object is a futuristic scene in which music becomes illegal (already the case in Iran). Most of the action involves a rock group called Toad-O, the girls they attract, and Joe, who loses his girlfriend Mary to the group. Much of the material is not suitable for airplay. An album to be played right through. Hopefully, there will be an act two - the story is left unfinished.

#### MICHAEL CLARK

Save The Night - Capitol ST-11982-F Pop

A debut album for Clark, an Illinois native, now located in Nashville after a lengthy early career in Boston and Louisiana. Clark's roots are in rock & roll and R&B, but since arriving in Music City has gained a name for himself as a session musician (he plays guitars, keyboards and is trained on trumpet and drums) and songwriter in the country idiom (with covers from Jerry Lee Lewis, Waylon Jennings and the Oak Ridge Boys). His own debut, carefully produced by Dain Eric, is basically a pop set with some light rock material and several possible singles. Prominent is Clark's voice, gravelly, husky but pleasant. Lyrics enclosed.

#### **CRYSTAL GAYLE**

Miss The Mississippi - Columbia JC-36203-H Pop/country

Gayle's first album release on Columbia, following an illustrious career with MCA and United Artists, continues to move the artist into the space directly between and including both the pop and country formats. The set is a very well-produced Nashville effort in the contemporary country tradition. Producer Allen Reynolds uses a full complement of Nashville's top session musicians at Jack's Tracks to create a well-thought-out album. The songs are well-chosen, with writing credits including Neil Sedaka and Dave Loggins. They are all ideal for Gayle, and several stand to become hit singles, crossover hits encompassing Top 40, AC and country. Lyrics enclosed.

#### SAD CAFE

Facades - A&M SP-4779-W Rock

The second North American album release (the first combines material from their first two British releases) could well be the one to make Sad Cafe a household name. The group are very tight, and the songs, while showing influences of rock, pop, jazz and reggae, are concise, well-structured, suited to the group and well-ordered. The group's harmonies are also noteworthy, and some of the softer material is well suited to AM and FM formats. Produced by 10 CC's Eric Stewart (two cuts self-produced) at 10 CC's Strawberry Studios South. All six members contribute material. Many in the industry have predicted a breakthrough for this group, and the new album could well become a major hit.

THE LAMONT CRANSTON BAND

El Cee Notes - Attic LAT-1069-H Blues/Rock

Minnesota's premier blues band achieve international release on this, their third LP and first release on Waterhouse Records (through Attic in Canada). The group first gained attention through the Blues Brothers' cover of Excusez Moi Mon Cheri (not on this album), and will continue to gain notices through their tightness and solid musicanship. LCB are a seven-piece blues/R&B group with horn section and up to three part vocals. This set produced by the group with Steve Raitt in Minneapolis. One side is studio recording of basically original material. The other was recorded live at Minneapolis' Cabooze Bar, showing the band's onstage tightness.

#### Horizon Audio produces Cancon Air Canada program

Creations Audio Horizon/Horizon Audio Creations, the Montreal-based firm which programs and produces Air Canada's inflight audio entertainment programming, has announced the programming of an exclusive tribute to the international growth and recognition of the Canadian recording industry

In conjunction with Alain Dore of the airline firm's In-Flight Service Division, Horizon Audio will be presenting throughout September and October an all-Canadiań program titled Air Canada Presents - The Music Of Canada. The program is a bilingual tape which will be featured on all

of the airline's 727, 747 and L-1011 flights over two hours long.

In addition to the music of notable Canadian artists, the program contains interviews with such established performers as Patsy Gallant, Gino Vannelli, Frank Mills, Dick Cooper (Cooper Brothers), Georges Thurston (Boule Noire), Dan Hill, Cherrill Rae (The Raes), Michel Pagliaro, Burton Cummings and Randy Bachman.

Another feature of Horizon Audio's in-flight programming, Studio 747, will include popular disco music and interviews with such artists as Jimmy 'Bo' Horne, Canadian artists Domenic Troiano

and Patsy Gallant, and Rod Stewart in an exclusive interview obtained at his last Montreal concert.

Horizon Audio handle all of Air Canada's in-flight entertainment channel programming. They report an audience reach of over 13 million people annually.

### CBS Records signs noted singer Suzanne Stevens

Arnold Gosewich, Chairman of CBS Records Canada, has announced the signing of noted Canadian singer Suzanne Stevens to a recording deal on the Columbia label.

Stevens, who is bilingual, first established herself in the French language, gaining major notices both in French Canada and France. Later, recording in English, she achieved such successes as Make Me Your Baby and Knowing How, Knowing When. Stevens won a 1975 Juno Award as Most Promising Female Artist. Two years later, she represented Canada at the prestigious Golden Orpheus Annual International Song Festival and won a bronze medal. Earlier this year, she again represented Canada, this time as a special guest performer and judge at the Vina Del Mar Song Festival in Chile.

In addition to her hit singles, Stevens has to her credit several successful albums in both French and English. She is currently in the studio preparing her first product for CBS.

### T.O.'s Drastic Measures record their debut album

Toronto rock group Drastic Measures have completed recording of their first album at Toronto's Phase One Studios, and with manager Headly Westerfield, are now looking for a recording deal for its release.

The album, titled It's Time To Take Some Drastic Measures, was produced by former CFNY-FM personality Keith Elshaw and features the talents of group leader Tony Malone, who handles all the lead and most of the background vocals, wrote most of the material (the group recorded three covers) and arranged the songs, as well as working closely with Elshaw.

Other musicians featured on the sessions included Basics members Fergus Hambleton and B. Duffield Norris, and Toronto veteran Nash The Slash, who contributed acoustic as well as electric violin and mandolin.

The group actually recorded a total of 17 songs, of which the best material will be selected for the album after final mix-down.

Manager Westerfield reports interest expressed by a number of major and independent record companies. He is confident the album will be released by early 1980. In the meantime, the group continue to work steadily in the Ontario market and Westerfield is working on a tour of the U.S. Midwest and New York.

### Carroll Baker - Looking out at international horizons

For the first time in the five-year history of the Big Country Awards, RCA recording artist Carroll Baker did not walk away with Top Female Vocalist honours. In order to beat Baker, who's known throughout Canada for her excellent performances, joyful personality and hit records, it had to take an exceptional year such as that of



Grammy award. winner Anne Murray.

As has been the case throughout her own illustrious career, Baker's own year has been comprised of considerable success. RCA is about to release her fifth album overall (fourth on the label), and have already shipped a new single from that album. Baker has completed another highly successful eight month touring stretch across the country, into the U.S. and Britain, and has finished taping of her second CBC-TV Superspecial.

Baker is excited about the new album, titled Hollywood Love. "I think it's the best album I've done so far." The set was recorded at Woodland Studios in Nashville, the artist's home recording base for some time, and was produced by her career-long manager, Don Grashey, who has produced everything she has recorded since 1973, when her records were issued on Grashey's own Gaiety label.

The anticipated success of the album is founded in the success of all of Baker's past efforts. The first RCA release, Sweet Sensation, became the first domestic country release to achieve gold status (50,000 units). It was followed by a self-titled effort, comprised of the earlier Gaiety recordings, a platinum-plus. Tee Vee set titled 20 Country Classics, and another successful studio effort, If It Wasn't For You.

### "...the fans asked why I didn't put any of my own stuff on the album?..."

The new release will include four Baker originals. Baker recalls, "On If It Wasn't For You, I didn't put any of my own cuts on it at all. I was getting a lot of flak from people in the industry saying I wasn't recording any other Canadians' material because I was a songwriter myself - yet a lot of other artists write and record their own songs. I wanted to prove to them that wasn't the reason at all. It's just that I hadn't been pitched enough good songs by Canadian writers for me. So on the last album, I recorded a lot of other people's songs, and the inevitable answer came around from the fans - why didn't you put any of your own stuff on the album? That's what I was waiting for, I'm trying to please my fans, not people in the industry."

So Baker wrote a bunch of songs, and

she and Grashey chose four for the album. Hollywood Love contains other Canadian-written material as well, including the title cut and a Ken Tobias song titled I Know I Can, among the total of 12 cuts.

The first single from the album is titled My Turn. Baker feels it's a hit. "I think it's going to be the biggest record I've had since I've Never Been This Far Before. We were pitched the tune by Chappell Music. Apparently, it had been turned down by everybody in Nashville - they thought it was the type of song a girl should do. Since I've recorded the song, and other people have been hearing my version, everybody wants it. Fortunately, we have a hold on it."

People in the U.S. are excited about the single, but last time around, Baker's singles were released by commitment and not promoted. Baker doesn't want that to happen again. "I would rather, if it wasn't going to get the promotion that I feel it deserves, that it was released maybe even on an independent label, just so it gets the proper promotion." RCA has first right of refusal on the single.

Baker's success has not been limited to the U.S. and Canada. All three of her RCA albums have been released in the U.K. as have three singles. In Britain, Baker has also scored points via a successful major concert tour, highlighted by a favourably received performance at the London Palladium.

Still, the lucrative U.S. market has been a tougher nut to crack. "It all takes time," notes Baker, "and I think if it happened for me all at once, it might not be good, because it's hard to follow up if you've got a smash hit right off the top. You can end up being a one-shot artist." And even though Baker has proven her longevity time and time again in Canada. she recognizes

that the U.S. market is a completely different scene, and that there is no guarantee of comparable longevity south of the border. But with five albums recorded, gold and platinum awards, dozens of hit singles, four straight Big Country and three straight Juno Awards as Canada's top female country singer, one as artist of the year, and a glowing record of live shows to her credit, if Baker breaks through in the States, she is a pretty fair bet to stick it out.

Baker feels one major obstacle Canadians face in the U.S. is a continued lack of understanding of the situation in Canada. "I've talked to higher-ups in the recordindustry who actually believed that Canadian Content forces people on the street to buy 30% Canadian records.

Of all the honours Baker has received in

her illustrious career, she feels her gold album for Sweet Sensation and platinum for the Tee Vee set, 20 Country Classics, are the most gratifying. "They tell the story. I love to win the awards. They're terrific - it's a really great compliment paid to artists by their peers. But to me, the gold albums, and the platinum in particular, are like the Rolls Royce of awards. They tell the final tale, of whether the people on the street have accepted you."

The Tee Vee set was highly unusual, in that it was a television package not comprised of previously recorded material. Baker went into the studio and recorded familiar songs not associated with her. "In the beginning, Tee Vee had wanted to do a hits package. But RCA wasn't going to go for it, because my albums with those songs on them were still selling very well. So they talked it over and decided, why not take somebody else's songs and do a compilation album of classics. That's what we did, and it was just a dynamite album. There are even some tunes on the album that a lot of people believed I was the first one to record, like Coat Of Many Colors. They know that Dolly Parton wrote it, but a lot of people think that I was the one who had the hit record with it!"

Unlike many artists, Baker's tours are seasonal, rather than being based on product releases or other movable industry factors. She tours extensively throughout Canada and internationally from February to the end of September, and then takes time off to recuperate and be with her family. However, the new album won't go unsupported during the next four months. On October 14. Baker's second CBC Superspecial goes to air across the country. There is also a Tommy Hunter Country appearance to be broadcast nationally in November. And, of course, there will be singles receiving airplay. "As long as you can keep yourself out there in the public eye during the time that you're off, it's okay, because you're still getting exposure."

The CBC special was recorded completely in Nashville, and Baker describes it as "dynamite! It turned out just great. We taped in the Grand Ol' Opry, and in the Hermitage, the studio where I record, the Hall Of Fame, and also from Hank Snow's ranch. We had really fine guests on it -Larry Gatlin, Hank Snow, Conway Twitty, Minnie Pearl and the Oak Ridge Boys. The show is very well-paced, and I'm really pleased with it. The sound is very good.' Among highlights of the special is a very well-received concert performed at the Grand Ol' Opry, "It got such a great reaction that I cried after the show. I'm very thrilled with the way everything went."

And so for Carroll Baker, life is still moving onwards and upwards. Having completely captured the Canadian country music scene, she looks forward to continued album, single, television and concert successes, as well as continued inroads into the U.S., Britain and the world. "I think everything's looking pretty good, and I'm just going to keep rolling with the flow."

#### Peter Tosh breaking throughout North America




Peter Tosh, whose records on the Rolling Stones label are distributed in Canada by WEA Music, has recently made a series of major career gains in North America.

#### Multiple gold presented to Casablanca group Kiss




Casablanca recording group Kiss, who recently appeared in Canada on tour to sell-out shows at Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens and the Montreal Forum. The shows and many of the group's special effects received highly favourable attention from local press in both cities. #### new LP. CNE

Western Canadian group Crowcuss recently paid a visit to RPM's offices just prior to their appearance at the CNE Grandstand, where they performed as opening act for vocalist Burton Cummings.

"The CNE is probably Canada's most prestigeous gig," says bassist Bill Wallace of the date, "It's our first foray into Toronto in two 'years," adds Hermann Fruhm, keyboardist with the five-piece band. "The last time we were here, we didn't have a record out, and no one knew who we were so it's nice to be able to come back this way."

The group's current self-titled LP, on the Stony Plain label, is presently garnering airplay and sales across the country, and the label's foreign agreements for the product have been gaining international recognition for the act. (An earlier single release previously hit the number one spot in Gutatamala!) Now Crowcuss are completing a second Stony Plain LP for a fall release.

"I'm really proud of our band for having survived as long as we have playing our own tunes," says Fruhm of the group's alloriginal material. "We've played the circuit with every top copy band and always managed to do well."

Crowcuss' original pennings have garnered the group many fans over the past years (the group celebrated their third birthday last May), and with the added exposure

"We're just happy that our tunes are so accessible," says Fruhm, "that we're not stuck in any one bag, musically. We write optimistic tunes, love songs, fun tunes things everyone can relate to. We feel really good about everything that's happening for us right now. This album is a natural progression from the first one; it's stronger, better, and that's how it should be. And, in future, people will be hearing even more musical departures from Crowcuss."

### Almada continues foray into domestic kids' LPs

The Montreal-based Almada Corporation, a national distributor with a very large catalogue comprising, folk, blues, comedy, spoken word, ethnic, children's and other labels, has achieved gold status in Canada with its first major Canadian content release. The album is the initial release of the Elephant Records label, One Elephant Deux Elephants by the Toronto-based folk trio of Sharon, Lois & Bram.

Now Almada are continuing their push into domestic children's record market with four new Canadian releases. Topping the list is a follow-up from Sharon, Lois & Bram on Elephant titled Smorgasbord. Like the debut, the new album was produced by noted percussionist/producer Bill Usher. Usher is also responsible for production on another Almada-distributed release, Chickery Chick by Sandra Beech. Beech is a member of the Millar family who comprise most of the Irish Rovers, and is a former Rover herself. Brothers Will and Ian Millar are among those assisting on the LP.

Also released through Almada, together with the Mariposa Folk Foundation, is an album titled Going Bananas, a somewhat zany children's record which includes Sharon, Lois & Bram, Sandra Beech, and Ken & Chris Whiteley of Troubador group the Original Sloth Band. The Whiteleys have also been involved with Raffi's highly successful children's records on Troubador.

The final new release through Almada is a new album by Bobby Gimby, the Canadian Pied Piper, with a group of children. The album, Gimby's first release in some time, includes the song C-A-N-A-D-A.

All the new releases come with activity books including the words and music to the songs. Some of the books also include anecdotes, games and other features.

In explaining the new releases, Almada's A&R chief and Ontario Sales Manager, Jonathon Lipsin, stated, "I have chosen to release these records for their high quality and their sales potential of leading to more gold records." Almada and the artists involved are embarking on an extensive publicity campaign in support of the releases, to include instore promotions, concert appearances and stop-ins at radio stations. The Beech LP, in fact, was launched September 6 with a national radio network appearance on Don Harron's Morningside show on the CBC.

### Mtl's Stephen Barry Band ready for

#### Maritime tour

Montreal-based blues group the Stephen Barry Band, whose debut album has been receiving FM airplay in Montreal, Toronto and Newfoundland, will be embarking shortly on the major leg of their Maritime tour. Following recent appearances in the Montreal area, including the city's new showcase club Le Pretzel Enchaine and an opening spot for Michael Pagliaro in L'Epiphane, as well as a week-long foray into St. John's, Nfld. (Aug. 21-26), the group heads off to a month-long eastern Canada outing.

The tour will include dates in Saint John, N.B., Summerside, P.E.I., Fredericton, Moncton and Halifax. It begins September 19 and ends October 20.

Following the Maritime tour, the group have tentative bookings in Ottawa and Kingston before coming into Toronto to make their debut appearances in that city. Confirmed dates include the Hotel California (Nov. 5-10) and the El Mocambo (12-17).

The Stephen Barry Band, a veteran group with a substantial Montreal following, record on the Fix It In The Mix label based in Montreal. Their debut album is a live effort, and the label has just taken the group into Montreal's Son Soleil Studios to record a single. The disc will include one cut each written by bassist/leader Barry and guitarist Jorn Reissner.

#### Quebec Celtic group Barde to three Toronto dates

Polydor recording group Barde have completed a series of successful concert dates in Toronto at the Bathurst Street Theatre. ### T.O.'s Soundstage active with major LP sessions

Toronto's Soundstage Studios, one of the city's longest established world class recording facilities, have had an abundance of major album recording activity over the past few months, both from domestic and international artists.

One of the studio's recent major success stories is the current Nils Lofgren album Nils, making its way quickly up Canadian and international trade charts. Studio manager Jim Frank reports other international projects recently completed at the Toronto studio by such notables as Shirley Bassey, John Sebastian, Richard T Bear, and German rock artist Inga Rumpf, and Pink Floyd were also in the facility recently to record overdubs toward an upcoming album.

A number of major albums by Canadian artists were also completed in recent months at Soundstage. Among those are Zwol's current EMI America release, Effective Immediately, projects by Max Webster, the Ugly Duckings, B.B. Gabor, Kid Rainbow and the WEA-released True Myth debut album, the first digital recording ever produced in Canada.

### Stigwood to produce four films in next 18 months

Robert Stigwood, head of the wide-ranging Stigwood Group of Companies, has announced plans to produce four major motion pictures over the next 18 months in New York City. Stigwood will personally oversee the production program, head-quartered aboard his yacht, M.Y. 'Sarina' in the Port of New York City.

The four films include Times Square, a youth-oriented drama with emphasis on music, directed by Allan Moyle from a Jacob Brackman (Days Of Heaven) screenplay; The Fan, starring Lauren Bacall, directed by Waris Hussein from a Norman Wexler (Saturday Night Fever) screenplay of the best-selling Bob Randall thriller; Angel, directed and choreographed by Patricia Birch (who choreographed the Broadway and film versions of Grease); and Stayin' Alive, a contemporary romantic drama, directed by Edward Bianchi from another Wexler Screenplay.

Stigwood's multi-faceted accomplishments in the entertainment business have included the RSO Records label, featuring such names as the Bee Gees, Andy Gibb and Eric Clapton. In the film industry, his successes include such films as Jesus Christ Superstar, Tommy, Saturday Night Fever, Grease and Sgt. Pepper. On stage, he produced Jesus Christ Superstar, the upcoming Broadway version of Evita, and concerts such as the Music For UNICEF special and the Bee Gees' current five-day run at New York's Madison Square Garden, which are grossing an estimated \$1.3 million.

All four films will feature soundtrack albums released on the RSO label, distributed in Canada by PolyGram Limited.

### A New Music season for CITY/CHUM simulcasts

CITY-TV is celebrating its seventh birthday, quite a mark amidst a financially turbulent past, many disbellevers and a highly competitive Toronto market Much of the publicity during the first chapter of CITY's history was spread through word of mouth, as opposed to huge sums of advertising bucks. They were the little guy among the network giants, and as a result, they received considerable attention and favourable press from the paper media. One of CITY's biggest drawing cards at that time was a Friday midnight feature called the Baby Blue Movie. Some called it smut. but a lot more regarded the program as a breakthrough in television programming. Here was a station willing to keep pace with social acceptances and CITY's audience figures for the uncensored flicks proved that the time was right. Timing has proven to be the key to CITY's success over and over again. Demographics and surveys indicated that a higher importance be placed on attracting women viewers between the ages of 18 and 49. Daytime programming was geared for that bracket, with more talk and game shows, and of course, the soaps. News and information is regarded as the cornerstone of any station so the next priority was to establish a credible information center that took the form of City Pulse.

#### The arrangement with CHUM provided the means.

In the summer of 1978, CITY's future was secured when CHUM Limited became the principle owners of the television station. CHUM's investment provided CITY with the funds needed to further its creative efforts and draw in a larger chunk of the Toronto viewing populace. The arrangement with CHUM provided the means for a project station President Moses Znaimer had been toying with for some time. With the advent of the home stereo revolution in the 70's, consumers now had the equipment and interest to make a visual/stereo broadcast a feasible reality. Production Manager Budd Pierce was assigned the task, and plans were formulated for a subsequent musical simulcast with CHUM-FM liaison Warren Cosford. Pierce wanted the feature to be unique. It would be a musical program unlike any other. The element that would provide that individuality would be the production technique, or rather, the lack of it. Other musical broadcasts tended to be very slick in nature, utilizing all the realms of technology in a buffed, un-natural final product. The essence of the CITY production would be to achieve the effect of actually becoming part of the audience in a live concert situation - to feel the energy and the immediacy of the performance drastically lacking in conventional music oriented programs. Ideally, the way to view and listen to a simulcast would be to set up a TV in front of a comfortable chair, placing stereo speakers on either side of the screen. The lights should be low and

#### The proper balance - without losing the mood

The first live program was a performance by Murray McLauchlan broadcast simultaneously on CITY and CHUM-FM. It was staged at Toronto's renowned El Mocambo before a packed house of enthusiastic fans. Because of the live situation and the newness of the project, the first number of broadcasts presented various problems, both technical and physical. A balance of lighting had to be achieved in order to provide adequate illumination for the cameras, without losing the intimacy and mood of the particular venue. Four or five cameras were used to cover each performance, and producer Pierce had to spontaneously choose shots and angles during the simulcast. Physically, the performers had to be in high gear and convey the feeling to the surrounding audience. The energy had to he maintained even through the two-minute commercial breaks that stopped the show periodically. Because of its one-shot situa-tion, there was naturally some amount of risk for both performer and producer that things would not go as planned before a potentially million-plus viewing audience.

#### Pre-tapings just as raw

To date, the CITY/CHUM-FM simulcasts have been extremely successful, and audience figures have numbered into the 100,000's, a substantial chunk of Toronto's viewing populace. Past programs have presented such artists as Downchild, Bob McBride, Streetheart, Lisa Dal Bello, Canadian Brass, Goddo, Madcats and the Good Brothers. Booking such acts for performances poses other problems with scheduling and equipment, venues and potential dates. Therefore, some of the more recent shows have been taped in advance. These pre-tapings are just as raw as the live broadcasts, and are presented at later dates on-air without being doctored in a separate production stage. Recent tapings have included dates with Bob Segarini, Carol Pope & Rough Trade, Ian Hunter, and most recently, the Nylons.

This year CITY has a new edge to its simulcast presentations, in that they are no longer restricted to the El Mocambo, where most of the programs have originated. That edge is a mobile sound studio that can be patched in, along with the video truck, to almost any location. The 16-track mobile studio is operated by CHUM-owned HUCHM Productions Ltd., and is one of two such trucks in Canada. The advantage to and flexibility of locations has allowed for unusual combinations such as An Act Of Goddo, recorded live at St. Paul's United Church, Bob Segarini and Carol Pope & Rough Trade, from a historical Toronto dance hall, The Palais Royale, the Nylons from Basin Street and Ian Hunter from the Ryerson College Theatre.

#### "Breaking the TV sound barrier"

Budd Pierce is pleased with the success the simulcasts have had, a program idea he regards as "an event, something different breaking the TV sound barrier." With each live show, more is learned and perfected. However, one of the areas still in contention, as far as Pierce is concerned, is more involvement from participating record companies in promoting their particular acts. A live performance taken in by hundreds of thousands presents an excellent marketing tool, and act exposure no other format can provide.

Pierce has been working closely with CHUM-FM's Warren Cosford, and hopes to attract international as well as Canadian artists for future shows. Names being currently tossed around through negotiations include Burton Cummings, the Minglewood Band, the Raes, Marc Jordan, Ronnie Hawkins, the Knack, Bruce Cockburn, Troiano, Long John Baldry, Ellen Foley and others

This season CITY has introduced a more consistent format for the simulcast programs. The music feature is now called

The New Music, and consists of either a one-hour stereo CITY/CHUM-FM broadcast or a new magazine-style program, exclusive to CITY, with hosts Jeannie Beker and J.D. Roberts, Beker is currently also co-hosting CHUM's Nine O'Clock Rock and has previously had acting and mime training in both Paris and New York. She's done various TV commercials and spent two seasons on camera with TVO. Roberts has been a familiar voice on CHUM for the past two years, and together with Beker, will take CITY viewers on a crosstown panorama of Toronto's rock and pop scene. The show will include artist interviews, a weekly calendar of events, reviews and off-the-wall humour.

Saturday night viewing and listening promises to offer something new and innovative for Toronto audiences, and when the words 'new' and 'innovative' are being used to describe programming, CITY-TV will very probably be at the forefront.

#### McCoy and Thuesen set for Edmonton's new FMer CKRA

Len Thuesen and Mike McCoy have been firmed to take on duties at Edmonton's new FM station, CKRA. Thuesen has been appointed Program Director and will also handle afternoon drive (2 to 6 pm). Thuesen is familiar with the Edmonton market having been associated with CHED for several years.

Veteran AM/FM programmer Mike McCoy has staked a claim in the west and will move into the new station to look after morning drive. McCoy has been associated with several major stations over the past eleven years including CHUM-FM which he leaves for the Edmonton job.

Owner/president of the new station is Hal Yerxa who also owns the country giant, CFCW Camrose/Edmonton. The Edmonton station is reportedly one of the most lavishly appointed in North America

and includes an 8-track recording studio. CKRA-FM will shortly initiate a program to develop local talent which was part of their proposal to the CRTC.

Observers expect the Edmonton market to be one of the most exciting in Canada once CKRA-FM gets into gear and makes a bid for the AOR (progressive FM) market which is now being well serviced by CRIK-FM. One observer noted: "The potential of the Edmonton market for the FM listener is mind boggling. The city already boasts a population of over half a million, a phenomenal population explosion that occured over the last couple of years. With an estimated 2,600 people moving into Edmonton each month, the broadcast future for Edmonton looks anything but dull."

#### Time for something totally different - part 2

They said it would never be done, but the re-mix of ABBA's Voulez Vous has arrived and it is sensational. The producers have given the record a heavier percussion bottom, and added a little longer break to it, lengthening the track from 5:13 to 6:05 This will surely be played in the clubs, and was re-mixed to celebrate the release of their gold album. The band will visit Toronto October 7th at Maple Leaf Gardens. Also on Atlantic, is a very interesting disco disc by reggae superstar Petter Tosh, whose Buk-In-Hamm Palace was given a disco mix by Mick Jagger. Very interesting with a west indisan influence, it makes for quite a record, culled from Tosh's Mystic Man LP.

Vogue Records have always been somewhat of an innovator in many musical stylings, are ready with yet another "avantgarde" project that is finding a place in Montreal discos initially. Telex, whose LP Looking For Saint Tropez will be brought to market by GRT very shortly has one excellent disco cut titled Moskow Diskow (4:10), already in DJ Robert Ouimet's top five at the Limelight in Montreal. Electronically charged and a killer of Russian additives.

Twist-A-Saint Tropez is another electronically spiced mixture of rock and disco, vocals through a vocoder. Even more unusual though, is their cover version of Rock Around The Clock, slow, but so different with its array of electronics with the vocal harmonies sounding like the Beach Boys. Another superb, but unusual project from the RKM group from Belgium.

From their new album So Delicious on ARC/CBS comes Catch Me by Pockets. Always liked this group (Take It On Up, still a very good R&B/disco tune from last year), and they've really come to life with their latest offering. Very up record, its bright, airy, feeling is quite fast, punched up by some good guitars and an excellent string section. Also on the album is another super track titled Charisma (6:45), well worth checking out. A must record.

The return of Idris Muhammad has been released by GRT through Fantasy and being re-united with David Mathews may return him to the form that made the classic Could Heaven Ever Be Like This. Two cuts on the album show great punch, the better being Foxhuntin, where Idris drums into some good breaks and Zach Sanders helps out on vocals. DJ Rawle James from Le Tube, Toronto reports great response to this and recommended Boogie Boots as the other good track. Can't agree more, its one step closer to the jazzier mold that's sure to return him to that prize winning form.

#### Quality's Soccio claims awards, 750,000 in sales



Gino Soccio, Montreal-based composer/producer/disco artist who broke internationally this year with his debut album, Outline, on Quality's Celebration label (Warner Bros/RFC outside of Canada) has been the recipient of 13 mid-year awards in the disco field, both in Canada and in the U.S.

Soccio, whose album and single releases Dancer and Dance To Dance have totalled more than 750,000 units in combined sales worldwide, received top honours as most promising new male disco artist from the nationally (U.S.) televised Disco Music Awards as well as U.S. trade recognition. The trades honoured him as top male disco singer of the year, his single, Dancer, as one of the top two singles and his album, Outline, as one of the top two albums. He also won a trade award for his single as being the top single in the heavey discollight radio category.

On the domestic front, Soccio achieved honours from the Western Canada International Disco Awards as best Canadian male artist and best producer, and for Outline as best Canadian disco album. The same three awards were presented to Soccio at the Ontario Disco Awards.

Soccio's album and Dancer single have both achieved Canadian gold status. Recently (above) Quality Records President George Struth (right) presented Ray Caviano, Warner/ RFC President, with a Canadian gold single for Dancer. The single topped charts in Canada and the U.S.

#### Country and pop releases herald entry of Boomtown

Boomtown Records, a subsidiary of Mayfield Music of St. Albert, Alberta, makes a bid for the country and pop markets with two single releases, one from Louie Timoteo the other by Skye

Timoteo is a regular performer at the Jasper Park Lodge. Jasper is actually the hometown of the 22 year old performer whose first single, Rocky Mountain Home, is an original by him and published through Nikki Time Publishing. 
