

Consumer gets break in Airwaves '83 show

Toronto: Airwaves '83, sponsored by the Electrical and Electronic Manufacturers' Associations of Canada has, for the past two years, been limited to high end audio and been restricted to those in the industry. However, this year, organizer Karen Cook has decided it's time to go public. "The first two days will be for dealers," she noted, "and last year over 3000 attended. Then we'll open the doors to the public, because this year we've broadened the content and kept our quality standards: consumer demand for this equipment and comprehensive way to learn about what is available, is growing by leaps and bounds."

The three-day show (Sept 9-11) is being held at the Constellation Hotel. Billed as "the most comprehensive high-quality home entertainment show ever presented in Canada," the emphasis is on high quality audio with more than 100 distributors displaying over 325 brand names. There will also be displays of video equipment, musical instruments, records, car audio and accessories, including the first automobile Compact Disc player from Mitsubishi.

Of particular interest to the recording industry will be a live recording session at the Constellation's Banyan Bar. Phil Sheridan will produce an album by jazz singers Sara Hamilton and David. The session takes place at 9 pm each evening over the three days with special guest artists Rob McConnell, Guido Basso and Eugene Amaro, all supported by

WEA beefs up Cancon with two new signings

Toronto: WEA Music of Canada has recently signed two Canadian bands, the Kitchener-based reggae group Messajah and the Vancouver six-piece unit, Images In Vogue.

Messajah were the winners of this year's U-Know Awards Most Promising Independent Artist Category. The awards are presented by local new music station CFNY-FM. In addition, the reggae group was also named as Top Reggae Group in the Black Music Awards.

Most of the band members are Jamaican-born, but were schooled in Canada. All are reggae veterans. Also in the group is Rupert "Ojiji" Harvey, a former member of the group Crack of Dawn. Harvey has two solo LPs to his credit.

WEA has released their album Rock You High, previously issued independently, but have augmented the re-release with a 12" special mix of four songs from the LP.

Dates for Messajah include Waterloo (Sept 12), Thunder Bay (14), Winnipeg (16), Saskatoon (17 & 18), Edmonton (19 & 20), Red Deer (21 & 22), Calgary (23), and Edmonton (24).

The five-song EP from Images In Vogue, scheduled for a late October release, was produced by Lindsay Kidd and band-member Joe Vizvary. All tracks are new except for one song that was released independently, but has been re-recorded for WEA. A national tour for the group is to follow. The band has already been touring, opening for Roxy Music and Depeche Mode.

bassist Dave Young and drummer Brian Leonard. The tape will be edited at Sheridan's McClear Studios on the only digital editing assembly in Canada and re-leased on his own Innovation label.

One of the special events scheduled is CKFM's Looking Back show which will broadcast live (10) at a dance to be held in the Ballroom of the Constellation with all proceeds going to Ronald McDonald House.

On public display for the first time will be an exhibition and video presentation of rare Beatles memorabilia, owned privately by Toronto-based actor Geoffrey Giuliano. Items include original drawings by John Lennon and Paul McCartney, never-before-seen photos, rare posters, the original Butcher cover and the unreleased Harrison cover for Somewhere in England, plus much more.

Seminars on audio topics have been set up with special guests including England's Ross Walker, designer of the Quad, Mike Wright of Dayton-Wright and Floyd Toole of the National Research Council.

Love In The Shadows a new direction for Hill

Montreal: PolyGram gave listeners the first sample of the "new" Dan Hill with the release of the title track as the first single for his Mercury album, Love In The Shadows.

A 7" single, in a four-colour picture sleeve, Of Love has been shipped along with a radio-only 12 inch containing the LP and extended dance version of the single, as well as the track, Where You Gonna Run To.

PolyGram reports the LP represents a major change in direction for the singer/songwriter, as well as two years of work. The new recording contract was apparently signed on the basis of demos put together by Hill and John Lewis Parker. The latter's compositions have been recorded by such names as Sheena Easton, Dolly Parton, The Pointer Sisters and others.

Parker, who also co-wrote six songs for the LP, produced the album as well. PolyGram explained that the collaboration between the duo was pure chance. The meeting between the two was arranged by ATV Music, for whom both were writers. Both were stuck together in the same office to write songs and a partnership developed.

PolyGram noted that Parker also encouraged Hill to become "more aggressive and physical" in his writing and to take a "more modern view of music." About 50 songs were composed during Hill's two-year absence, which were narrowed down to 10 tracks for the LP.

The company pointed out that the "trademark ballads are at a minimum with the focus on a harder-edged rockier song." PolyGram added that both the single and LP will come as "something of a surprise to those who have typecast Hill as a writer and singer of tender and touching ballads, suitable for airplay on A/C radio."

Hill admitted that one of the major reasons for maintaining a low profile was to give himself the opportunity to do what he hadn't done before and to break free of the image he had been forced to conform to.

CIRPA set to host Video seminar/workshop

Toronto: The Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA) will be hosting a two-day seminar/workshop on music video October 26 and 27, at Toronto's Royal York Hotel.

Guest speakers, comprised of major industry figures, are to be spotlighted at dinner on the 26th and luncheon on the 27th. The guest speakers, plus the studio locations will be announced at a later date. Registration is already being accepted for the two-day event.

With focus on video production and marketing, the first day of the seminar will feature a production workshop with speeches and demonstrations taking place at studios and post-production houses in the city.

The second day kicks off with a panel discussion of marketing with video experts to discuss and answer questions on marketing strategies, video retailing, video club exposure and more.

The marketing session will be followed by a panel on legal matters including contract preparation and copyright issues. A special panel featuring representatives of each of the proposed music video TV channels, will complete the session.

Moodies back on course after 2 years absence

Montreal: After a wait of almost two years, the Moody Blues return with their Threshold album, The Present, distributed by PolyGram.

The group's last album, Long Distance Voyager, was released in the fall of 1981, and has surpassed the triple platinum mark in Canada.

Like Long Distance Voyager, The Present was produced by Pip Williams and features 10 new tracks. At The Wheel has been taken as the first single. A 12" radio-only single has been shipped with the album version on one side and the edited version on the flip.

The band line-up on The Present is the same as their previous LP, comprising vocalist/guitarist Justin Hayward, bassist/vocalist John Lodge, drummer Graeme Edge, keyboardist Patrick Moraz, and Ray Thomas on flutes, harmonicas, and vocals.

Over the two-decade history of the Moodies, the band has sold in excess of 30 million albums worldwide. Although the group has undergone some line-up changes, the core of Hayward, Lodge, Thomas and Edge has been intact since their classic 1967 LP Days Of Future Passed, which combined rock and classical music.

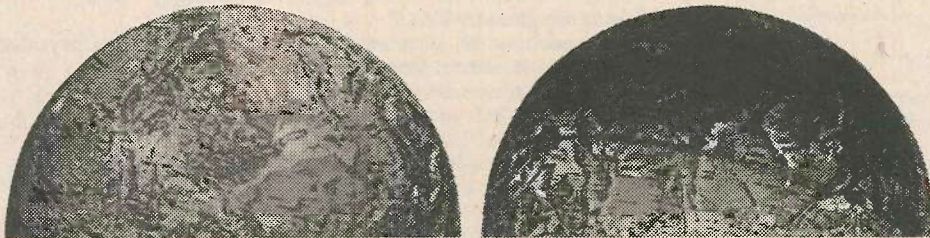
The band scored their first hit single in 1964 with Go Now with Denny Laine on vocals. He was later to become a member of Wings. Since taking on their progressive direction beginning with Days Of Future Passed, the Moodies have churned out one successful LP after another. Keyboardist Mike Pinder left the band a few years ago to be replaced by Moraz who also played on their last LP.

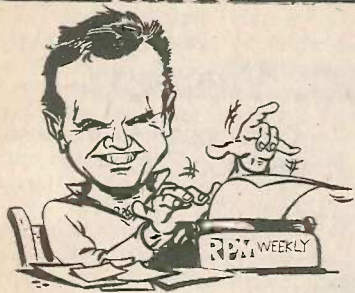

Here's another name from the past - Big "G" (Glen Walters), a super smooth CKEY personality of the '60s. Glen is currently doing the 7 to midnight shift at CJLB in Thunder Bay, Ontario. How about Joey Reynolds, who was voted America's Top Jock of 1965-6 through his powerful WKBW Buffalo nite-time show. He's apparently in Los Angeles, but not on radio.

The Nylons are steamrolling!!

The Nylons continue to surprise the industry. Their Attic album, *One Size Fits All*, released less than one year ago, has gone platinum, the first a cappella group to ever reach that status. Their international popularity is now on a roll and they haven't lost any of their local draw, attracting an audience of upwards of 11,000 for their date at Ontario Place (Toronto) Forum.

Building a star system???

A very good friend, not in the industry, subscribes to RPM just to see what is happening. He recently commented that the music industry in Canada must be "the most photographed industry in Canada". As I thought about it - ain't it the truth? He went on to say, "They're (the industry) always handing out all kinds of awards. Everytime I pick up an RPM, someone is getting a gold, silver, platinum or diamond record." He then showed me the trade magazine that comes out for his industry. Piles of type, statistics and few pictures and none of anyone in the lower order. Now, when he sees me he says, "Building a star system in Canada??" Yes, we are, and occasionally we may even bring some attention to a recording artist or two.

More froth from Foth!!

Labour Day in Vancouver must have been quite a hoot. Anything that's successful or popular is bound to draw a negative from Allan Fotheringham, the one person in Canada who probably thinks he can do it (anything) better. Fotheringham's most recent tirade (Toronto Sun - Sept 7), takes a shot at the Jerry Lewis Telethon, rock music's most successful acts which were appearing in Vancouver. These included Supertramp, Bryan Adams and The Payolas. I wonder how much he paid for his ticket? In this column however, he somehow overlooked the political field and the country in general. Could be someone reminded him that Canada isn't such a bad place in which to make a living - even as a writer, hack or otherwise.

Pressing business!!

The street buzz is that a major label wants to get back into the pressing business and they've made an offer to buy a successful manufacturing operation but the offer was turned down. In another pressing matter there's apparently more than a few actions against a pressing plant, which will become common news shortly.

Tollington to Chrysalis!!

Nothing official at press time but I have been told that Dave Tollington has left his publicity job at WEA to become label chief for Chrysalis in Canada. Nice to see a former RPM member making his way in the industry.

Bee Gees & Schilling will be big!!

New from Europe is the Peter Schilling single, *Major Tom (Come Home)* on the WEA label and it's gonna be a giant. The English translation for this German release was done by David Lodge, a Toronto-based writer recently signed to Peer-Southern. The **Bee Gees** are trying again and they could do it with their new single, *Someone Belonging To Someone* and watch **Agnetha Faltskog** crash into chart prominence with her Polydor single *Can't Shake Loose*. On the album front **Bette Midler** should lead the pack with her *No Frills* release, and watch **Graham Parker** bring the customers in for his *Real Macaw* release.

AROUND THE MUSIC BIZ

New Saga LP ready

The Maze label is readying Saga's new album, *Head or Tales*. The Toronto group's LP was produced by Rupert Hine, also producer of their previous album, *Worlds Apart*, and was recorded at Hine's Farm Yard Studios in London, England. An interview disc is also in the works. The group will be setting out on their world tour Sept 29, beginning in East Berlin. U.S. dates commence Nov 10. Don't expect Canadian dates until March or April of next year.

New Teenage Heads single

MCA Records has released a second single from Teenage Heads' latest album *Tornado* titled *Blood Boogie*. Although the LP was produced by Toronto guitarist/producer David Bendeth, the single has been re-mixed and re-edited by Dan Lanois a producer/engineer of note. The 7" single has been shipped in a colourful picture sleeve. Also released is an AOR 12" version. The band is currently playing U.S. dates in support of the album, their first American release.

AC/DC gets new drummer

Simon Wright, a 20-year-old Manchester, England native, is AC/DC's new drummer. Wright replaces their original drummer Phil Rudd who left earlier in the year and who can also be heard on all tracks on the metal group's latest album *Flick Of The Switch*. Wright will be making his live debut with the band on AC/DC's forthcoming North American tour. No Canadian dates as of yet.

Tyler album surpasses platinum

Bonnie Tyler's latest album *Faster Than Speed Of Night* has surpassed the platinum level boosted by the hit single *Total Eclipse Of The Heart*. The single went #1 across the board and has surpassed the gold mark. CBS has followed up the song with the new single *Have You Ever Seen The Rain*, a cover of the old Creedance *Clearwater Revival* classic. The vocalist recently completed a promotional tour of the U.S, and is expected to appear on the *Solid Gold TV*er.

Major push on Kenny Rogers

RCA have launched a national push on their debut album for Kenny Rogers, *Eyes That See In The Dark*. The LP was rush released, shipping well over gold, in time for the only Canadian date on his present tour, which took place at the Toronto's CNE Grandstand. *Islands In The Stream* a duet with Dolly Parton, has been taken as the first single.

Tibet wins CFNY's talent search

Brampton, Ontario station CFNY-FM reports that Tibet came up the winner of their third Annual Great Ontario Talent Search. During the six months the contest was in progress, over 100 bands were heard by listeners. A winner was voted on each night to meet a new challenger the next night. Tibet win a Staccato drum kit from Toronto Percussion Centre, a Thursday Night Live Broadcast from Carlsberg at the El Mocambo with gate receipts from the concert presented by CFNY, recording time at an exclusive studio, a Yamaha hand-crafted L5A and Fender Bullet Guitar from Ring Music, a complete band portfolio courtesy of the Beast, a Lado

bass guitar and case and Yamaha keyboard and case from Multi Music, and lastly Clydsdale cases from Clydsdale Custom Cases.

MCA release, new Wabbit album

MCA has just released the new album from local rockers Wabbit titled *West Side Kid* produced by Toronto guitarist/producer David Bendeth, who has also worked with Teenage Heads. The LP, mixed and recorded at Metalworks Studios, is being made available at a special suggested list of \$7.98. Say Lady Say is being released as the single. MCA is expected to launch a national push on the third LP from the group. Wabbit comprises lead vocalist Lou Nadeau, guitarist John Albani, bassist Chris Brockway, drummer Gary Craig, keyboardist Lou Pomanti, and background vocalist John Rutledge.

George Martin on CBC Radio

George Martin, the producer of almost all of the Beatle's records, is being featured on a CBC Radio series titled *Through The Ears Of George Martin*, produced by Bruce Steele of Soundings Steele Inc. On the final episode of the series for Sept. 25, Martin performs an impromptu concert on piano and also discusses his relationship with his long-time engineer Geoff Emerick, who got his big break at the age of 19 as an apprentice engineer when he engineered what may be the Beatles' greatest album - *Sergeant Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band*. Martin was often considered the fifth Beatle because of his major contributions to their music. He was reported to have played piano on some of their recordings.

Five new albums added to CBC SM5000 series

Toronto: CBC Enterprises, the largest manufacturer and distributor of Canadian classical recordings, has announced the release of five new albums in its SM5000 series. The series was first introduced in November of 1982 with the release of six

albums that have chalked up impressive sales.

Allen Shechtman, Record Manager for CBC Enterprises, explains that the SM5000 series "is designed to provide Canadian orchestras with access to the international market and to make first-quality, classical recordings available on the mass-market level."

A U.S. distribution deal has been set with Intersound of Minneapolis through which product is already available. Shechtman, who was touting the SM5000 series at MIDEM, has had good response from the European market but distribution has not yet been finalized.

The five new albums, like the previous six releases, were recorded in studio sessions over the past two years and are mastered digitally at half-speed from high quality analogue tapes. The new albums are Stravinsky: Concerto in E Flat (Dumbarton Oaks). Concertino Bartok: Three Village Scenes. Contrasts by the Canadian Chamber Ensemble with Raffi Armenian conducting; Geminiani: The Enchanted Forest. Vivaldi: Concerto in D Major for Two Violins by the CBC Vancouver Orchestra, John Eliot Gardiner conducting; Stravinsky: The Rite of Spring by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra with Andrew Davis conducting; Grieg: Piano Concerto in A Minor. Sibelius: Karelia Suite by the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Kazuyoshi Akiyama conducting and with soloist Andre

Laplante. Italian Operatic Overtures: Rossini Zedda. Rossini/Corghi. Verdi. Donizetti. Wolf-Ferrari. Bellini by the National Arts Centre Orchestra with Franco Mannino conducting.



Anton Kwiatkowski,

The big plus for the CBC classical series was the commissioning of Anton Kwiatkowski to upgrade recording standards for the Corporation's broadcast recordings project. He joined the CBC in 1977 at age 29 after eight years with EMI in London where he distinguished himself as an outstanding producer/engineer. Just prior to joining the CBC he won first prize for records that he had produced and engineered in two of sixteen categories for classical records in the Music Trades Association Awards, which is the British equivalent of the Grammy's. He

has produced more than one hundred records, winning gold and silver discs for several of these productions. As well, his work consistently appears in Gramophone Magazines' Annual Critics' Choice, which is a listing of the year's best recordings.

It didn't take too long after his arrival in Canada for his talents to be recognized. His first release, the Vancouver Symphony's recording of Pines Of Rome and Roman Festivals by Respighi, was honoured in 1979 by the Canadian Music Council's Grand Prix du Disque.

The SM5000 series has met with exceptional critical acclaim, a welcome change for the Corporation that over the years has produced more than 400 classical albums, the majority of which were shot down by the critics. New recording technology, the use of digital mastering techniques with the Sony PCM unit and half-speed mastering has given the CBC an obvious edge over their previous productions, and of course, the aggressive high-tech approach of producer Kwiatkowski.

Another major factor in the success of the SM5000 series is the pressing, using virgin vinyl and a very closely monitored quality control. The cassette configurations are exceptional and far outdistance the discs in dynamic range. The cassettes are low-noise, high output ferric-oxide or chromium dioxide, and have been favourably compared to Deutsche Grammophon's Cr02 product. Like the albums, the cassettes are attractively packaged, printed with bright gold type on black glossy stock and complete with no puff, well-written liner notes.

The eleven releases comprises performances by the National Arts Centre Orchestra, two conducted by Mario Bernardi and one by Franco Mannino; two by the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra with Kazuyoshi Akiyama conducting; two by the Canadian Chamber Ensemble with Raffi Armenian conducting; one by the CBC Vancouver Orchestra with John Eliot Gardiner conducting; and three by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, one by resident conductor Andrew Davis, and one each by Kazuyoshi Akiyama and James de Preist.

With the popularity of the SM5000 on a roll, CBC's Allen Shechtman, is now looking into future releases on the new Compact Disc system. The lineup however, is rather long for this popular new adventure in sound, and Shechtman doesn't expect to see CD SM5000 releases for at least another fifteen months.

Western distribution for CBC Enterprises is handled by D.J.'s Service of Calgary while Alun Reid looks after Central Canada and the Maritimes.

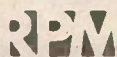

While in Toronto they will be re-signing with RCA, which is only natural being that they are currently looking good with their single, Cowboy From the '40s. Manager Richard Watt has completed fall dates for the group which will include Vancouver Island dates this year. Johnny Paycheck, who was playing the Newton Inn recently, chanced to hear MRB's material and apparently was so impressed he may include a couple of their songs on his next LP.

Country in Canadian Living?

Country music has soared to new heights of recognition. There in the March issue of Canadian Living, which accidentally passed my desk a few days ago, squeezed in between fast delicious microwave recipes and scrumptious chicken stir-fry is a powerful feature titled Canada Loves Country by Wally Hucker. Wally knows his country music and he chased down some of the biggies in Cancon country to come up with a real eye-opener of an article. He talked to Carroll Baker, Harold MacIntyre, Dallas Harms, the Family Brown and a bunch more.

Michael Kosser off on Book Shop

Gilles Godard's Book Shop label scores a coup with the release of a Michael Kosser single, That Somebody. Kosser is well-known in the U.S. country field where he has written material for several name artists including T.G. Sheppard's Daylight, Freddie Hart's Thank God She's Mine, the Family Brown's, It's Really Love This Time, as well as songs for Conway Twitty, Marty Robbins, Charlie Rich and more. He also co-wrote the script produced by Drake Chenault and narrated by Ralph Emery for 1983's release on The History Of Country Music. Book Shop is distributed through their Cornwall, Ontario offices.

Godard to St. Louis

Gilles Godard is recognized as one of the best steelmen in North America and was asked to perform at the Annual International Steel Guitar Convention in St. Louis, Missouri (Aug 30). Nashville's Music Row biggies are interested in Godard's songwriting abilities and he is meeting with several of them the first part of September. A Nashville video firm is also interested in producing a video of Godard, performing one of his songs.

More Cancon from Comstock

Frank Fara has been busy on the Canadian front and adds to his Comstock label, Gale Wahl from Saltcoats, Saskatchewan. Initial single release, The Higher The Fire, was produced by Patty Parker at Nashville's Sound Emporium. There is no indication the record

is Cancon, however Frank does note that the flip, Canadian River was penned by Marilyn Cain, but again there is no information as to what the Cancon properties are.

Colly release for Sundown

New from the Sundown gang is their Colly single, Rowina, which was produced by their steelman Al Gain. The other members of this Aurora, Ontario-based group are Jack Pledge, Ken Post, and Terry Chisholm. The label copy doesn't carry a MAPL logo but it does qualify as four-parts Cancon. The single was produced in Toronto and the song was co-written by Al Gain and Jimmy Pecchia.

Tyson and Bird to Albert's Hall

Sylvia Tyson and The Great Speckled Bird take their brand of country to Albert's Hall, (Sept 5-10), a Toronto catch-all type of showplace. The Bird are Randy Kempf (bass), Joan Besen (keyboards), Danny Greenspoon (guitar), Rick Whitelaw (guitar), Al Kates (steel), Lenny Soloman (fiddle), Zeke Mazurek (fiddle) and Bohdan Hluszko (drums). It must cost quite a bundle for a large package like that.

Acclaim's first American act

The Toronto-based Acclaim label has released a Frank Dycus single, Magic On The Mountain, the first American artist to record for the label. Dycus has quite a history of songwriting behind him including Jerry Lee Lewis' He Can't Fill My Shoes, the Porter Wagoner and Dolly Parton duet of Is Forever Longer Than Always and George Strait's Unwound, Down And Out and Marina Del Ray. He also wrote material for Ringo Starr, George Jones, Kenny Rogers, Charlie Rich and more.

David Thompson Country

During his recent tour of Western Canada, Diamond recording artist David Thompson came across a sign on a highway in Alberta which read Welcome — David Thompson Country — Tourist Zone. His manager Chuck Williams sent along a photo of David

standing under the sign, but it's in colour, which makes reproducing for a black and white newsprint mag like RPM very difficult. We'll try but if it's too dark we'll have to scrap it. If you're sending photos, make sure they're black and white and preferably 3x5 or 8x10.

New single from Perras

Anita Perras, who has become one of the bright new talents of Cancon country music, follows her recent RPM Country 50 chart item (Somebody Said It Was Me) with her new Tailspin single, You Got What You Want. The single, a Tim Taylor original, was produced by Ted Gerow at Altair 4 Studios.

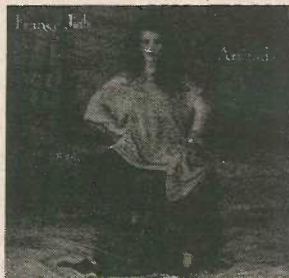

NEW ALBUMS

SUSAN COGAN - Pop One - Scone WRC1-2797

A seasoned player in the performing game but new to the recording field, Susan Cogan's self-produced package of pop pleasures has an abundance of poetic charm and vocal magic that should bring her into national prominence. She has given the album a boost by mounting a hectic promo/concert tour which took her across Canada and into the U.S. this summer. The listening is easy as Cogan gently moves into soft rock, pop with jazz overtones and friendly, highly message-prone folk, Clipped and soaring vocal energies illustrate Cogan's lyrical control and a confidence of more than a decade performing before the critical types of audiences she met in coffee houses and honky-tonks. Cogan has also gathered an impressive lineup of session people including keyboardist/guitarist David Morrow (Rough Trade), Clive Parks on keyboards (synthesizers) and guitars; and acoustic guitarists Chad Irschick, John Jackson, Danny Greenspoon, Jack Grunsky and Cogan herself. A couple of the more impressive tracks are 'Your Lovin' Eyes' with superb sax and trumpet inserts by Don Englert and Michael Lucas respectively, and

Peacock Eyes, featuring harpist Jeanette Pass Goldhar and Parks on synthesizer. A single, 'The Moon At Sunset Bay with In Favour Of The Sensitive Man' on the flip, has been taken from the album. Produced at Toronto's Inception Sound. Distributed through Cogan's Scone Records, Box 2, Fulford Harbour, B.C. V0S 1C0.



FRANCE JOLI - Pop Attitude - Epic FE-38829-H

Montrealer France Joli first became a familiar name on the charts when, at 16, she reached into the Top 15 of the U.S. trade charts with her debut single, 'Come To Me.' That was in 1979 and she continued her chart presence over the years with 'Feel Like

Dancing and 'Hard To Break The Heart In 1981 and a very popular dance entry of 'Got To Get Over You' in 1982. Now signed to Epic and with Giorgio Moroder, whose disco and dance music ratio of success goes without saying, as executive producer, this Pete Bellotte production should ease onto the charts with little effort. 'Girl In The '80s' has been taken as a single, an excellent promotion vehicle at both the radio and dance club levels. Joli tries her hand at writing, co-penning 'Dumb Blonde' with Daniel Vail, a cut that takes her vocal magic into another dimension. Also notable is the Holland/Dozier/Holland penning of 'Standing In The Shadows Of Love' which features Merald "Bubba" Knight, William Guest and Edward Patten of The Pips on background vocals. Synthesizers, of course, play a major part in this production and they were effectively programmed by Phil Shenale.

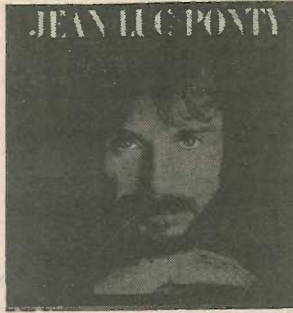

have the opportunity to take stock of their talent and their potential and, of course, their audience. Hill, no slouch in the song-writing or performing arena, has removed himself somewhat from that dull, very repetitive middle ground that ironically was his vehicle to success. The best illustration of what the new Dan Hill is all about is the prior release of a 7" and 12" single of the title track (the latter includes both the album version and an extended dance vocal mix as well as a second track, Where You Gonna Run To). If anything, Hill's vocal aggressiveness has grown even more intense with an unflappable dignity that squeezes the sincerity out of his lyrics. Most notable is the title track co-written by Hill and his co-producer John Lewis Park. The latter is heard on this track on guitar and Oberheim (OB-8) and wrote most of the material on the album with Hill. Also outstanding is the In Your Eyes track, written by Hill and Michael Masser and which was picked as the title track for the latest George Benson release. Hill's new album is also a very sound endorsement of the Fairlight System, used on several tracks, most notably In Your Eyes and Something Ain't Right. New direction aside however, Dan Hill's vocal majesty is much more than complete on the Old Lady Song, which he wrote himself and on which he is featured on piano with very subtle but effective acoustic and electric cello inserts by Dick Armin. Produced at Manta. Lyrics included.

JEAN LUC PONTY

Individual Choice - Atlantic 78 00981-P

It's been some time since Jean Luc Ponty



has released an album but the waiting and the label's marketing prowess will no doubt bring this "violiniste superbe" back into chart prominence very quickly. So keen is the Ponty cult following that front-racking should be foremost. Ponty isn't just a fiddle player here as he electro-pops his original material with himself at the synthesizers, organ, keyboard bass and, of course, the violin. Ponty's jazz following should be impressed with his stretching of this music form into the futuristic pop world. In Spiritual Love might be just a little too left of what is expected of Ponty but it's a standout track with George Duke soloing on a mini-Moog. This cut was produced at Duke's Le Gongs West studio. Ponty does all the instrumentation (synthesizers and violin) on two very impressive tracks, Computer Incantations For World Peace and Eulogy To Oscar Romero. Kingswood Music Theatre - Toronto

I can say with all honesty, that in over ten years of attendance at varying types of shows, outside of perhaps the Who, I have never seen a more passionate and compelling show than the one brought to us Thursday night. As the progenitor of guitar-based Latin-rock, Carlos Santana has moved through numerous phases in his career, yet has maintained the conviction of his music and a seemingly unending joy in delivering it.

A large part of the show consists of the atmosphere and talent brought to bear by vocalist Greg Walker. His rendition of several numbers (notably She's Not There) was sensitive but simultaneously powerful, forcing the audience to flow with him and get right to the heart of the song. His respect for Carlos is apparent (as with all the musicians) and their interplay was a highlight of the evening. As for the rhythm section, not much else may be said but that they set up a tremendously powerful groove which they kept up for virtually three hours. A group that includes Armanda Peraza can't help but have a good time; constantly smiling and tapping away, he seemed genuinely surprised to have the audience clap along with him toward the end of the show. Orestes Vilato was another story, grinning at Carlos while emitting a wall of sound, and generally acting as if he does this sort of thing as a hobby. Graham Lear and Raul Rekow rounded out the group, overall an amazing contribution to the show. David Margen on bass and the incredible keyboard section were additional pleasures, showing a tightness and versatility that we can assume Carlos has come to demand.

The bottom line however, must be with the man himself, one of the last guitar heroes; endlessly inventive, energetic and showing himself to be compassionate and aggressive. I lost track of the types of sounds he was capable of producing, and continually marvelled at his effortless control

over the structure of each song. One forgets through the course of a 14-year career that live performing is the man's forte. Even the older material was treated deferentially, and occasionally given new life, as with a personal favourite, Black Magic Woman. The relatively restrained lighting and uncluttered stage set-up did nothing to detract from the music. I gave up my count after he returned to the stage for a second encore, and was gratified to think that he had not resorted to padding songs, or adding superfluous instrumental breaks. At the very end, the band linked arms with Carlos, thanking us for sharing the music and being there with him. Carlos, thank you for showing us where it all begins and continuing to show us different sides of the legend and his music.

IRON MAIDEN

Kingswood Music Theatre - Sept 5/83

While I continually struggle to reach any conclusion regarding the current appeal of heavy metal, occasionally a band surfaces with a number of points in their favour which allow for a newer perspective. Phenomenally popular in their native England, the Maiden are only now reaping the benefit of several top-selling records on this continent. Inevitably the basic elements exist; macho posturing, excruciating volume, and enough lights and dry ice to open a circus. The prime factor which pulls this band ahead of the pack is the presence of one Bruce Dickenson, lead singer, field-marshal, and general rabble-rouser. Offering witty little dissertations on the lyrical content of the songs, and showing total enchantment with the material, he made the difference. Instrumentally, there is not a lot happening here that we haven't seen before. Those around me also indicated they had seen a far superior light show on previous Maiden dates. The location was little help, sending Mr. D.'s voice in all directions at once. As well, I was astounded by the fanatical following in these parts for the band, as shown by seas of raised fists and frequent shouts of "Maiden! Maiden!".

Of All. Rounding out his back-up crew are drummer/percussionist Rayford Griffin and bassist Randy Jackson. Produced by Ponty.

BRETT PETERSON

Touching Down - Moxa MR-001

Produced by Dave Pickell and Rene Worst at Vancouver's Pacific Coast Sound and Ocean Sound studios, Brett Peterson obviously has more going for him than an expensive recording session. The vocal polish and projection, the sincere and confident lyric interpretation suggests the musical makeup of a veteran. The young, Vancouver songwriter makes an easy entry into the business, although this isn't his first time 'round. He released a single on the A&M label several years ago. This time however, the timing for his brand of soft, balladry rock should meet with programmer approval. The emphasis is on the soft pop side, of which more than 85% of radio is into anyway. A single should be taken from the album and a major promotional push mounted to bring the album home. Choice are To Make Me Love You More, Goodbye To Sarah, and the title track.

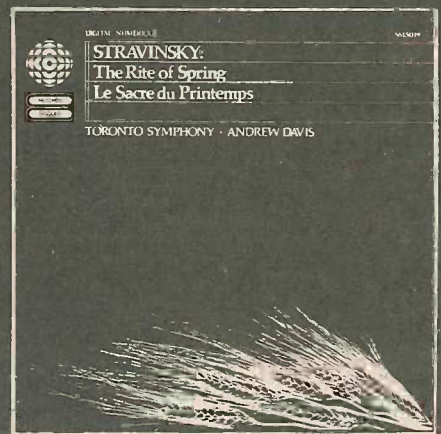
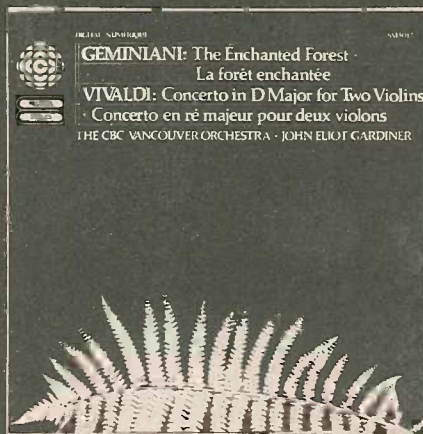
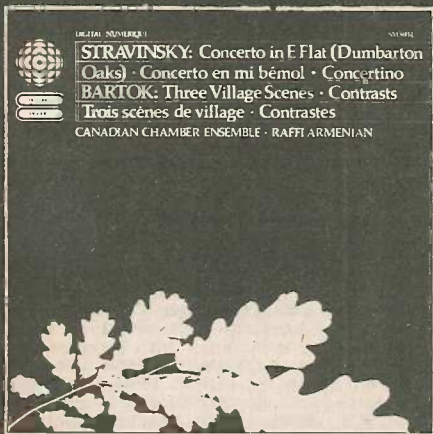
