

Solid Gold and MCA sign distribution deal

Toronto: Solid Gold's Neill Dixon and Steve Propas have signed a major U.S. distribution deal with MCA and a lease arrangement for England, the first time a Canadian label has had international distribution. The agreement, signed by MCA's Irving Azoff and Dixon and Propas allows Solid Gold complete license for releases - MCA does not have A&R approval.

The MCA pacting does not effect Canadian distribution which is handled by A&M.

Initial release under the agreement will be Toronto's Girls Night Out album, released earlier this month through a network of U.S. distributors. Initial impact of the release was quite impressive, particularly with AOR action, resulting in solid sales. The Toronto album will be followed with product from Headpins and Chilliwack.

WEA Canada & Duke Street pact distribution deal

Toronto: WEA Canada's first P&D (production and distribution) deal has been signed with the Toronto based Duke Street Records. The announcement was made by Stan Kulin, President, WEA Music Canada.

Duke Street, an active label for the past two years, is a subsidiary of Manta Sound. In concluding the deal, Manta/Duke's President Andy Hermant noted: "This merger of sorts, represents a unique opportunity to combine the top production facilities of Manta and personnel of Duke Street with the proven ex-

CRIA group researches cassette packaging

Toronto: After a full year of meeting and research centering on cassette packaging, the marketing committee of the Canadian Recording Industry Association reports that it has received approval from the CRIA Board of Directors to begin a comprehensive consumer market research study.

"The pre-recorded cassette is the only area of major growth in our industry at the present time," said CRIA President Brian Robertson. "And our Marketing Committee has shared the unanimous view that we should efficiently explore all the packaging and merchandising opportunities that are available to support this format.

"We have been meeting with representatives of major retailers and rack jobbers in the last nine months, and much of our research in the next few months will involve the consumer."

MUSEXPO registrations indicate good year

New York: With the Mexican peso remaining at a depressed level and with the heavy promotion campaign now underway, Roddy Shashoua is confident that this year's MUSEXPO will be a banner year. Shashoua arranged for a joint promotion and co-sponsorship arrangement with the Mexican government which allows for subsidized lower registration fees and office booth rental fees for the 9th Annual Record/Video and Music Industry festival (Nov. 1-4). The location is also ideal — Acapulco, one of the most commercialized and up-to-date tourist areas in Mexico.

Shashoua has also arranged for 2,000 hotel rooms at leading Acapulco hotels, reserved at special subsidized rates for MUSEXPO registrants.

Nylons score platinum a first for a capella group

Toronto: Attic Records reports that the Toronto quartet The Nylons have become the first a capella group in the world to receive a platinum album.

The platinum was for their latest album, One Size Fits All, their second for Attic, produced by Peter Mann.

The Nylons are also gaining international acclaim with the release of the LP in England, Belgium, Germany, Australia, and the Benelux countries.

The quartet was recently named International Chartbreakers of the Year by The Society of Record Dealers for the Benelux countries. The recognition came for One Size Fits All and the single, That Kind Of Man. Attic noted that the award is tri-national and the highest possible for international acts in the Netherlands, the Benelux equivalent of Grammy. In October they are to make a special appearance on a major televised gala awards show where they will perform three songs.

The Nylons are currently touring the U.S. mid-West as openers for the Little River Band, in addition to headlining several dates of their own. Select European dates are also being lined up, while an Australian tour is in negotiation for November.

In addition, the group recently set a new all-time attendance record for Ontario Place with their three headline performances at the Forum this summer, drawing almost 30,000, surpassing previous record-holder Burton Cummings.

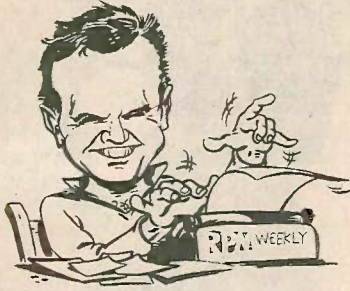

CBS recognition for retailers

Toronto: CBS takes the lead in recognizing record retailers with the introduction of their Creative Merchandising Award.

The awards are the brainchild of Alan Fletcher, Director of Sales & Marketing for the Central Region (Ontario & Manitoba) "Record retailers are the backbone of the business in Canada," noted Fletcher, "and I sometimes believe they are taken for granted. Many of the retailers I work with have come up with some pretty incredible ideas for displaying album and cassette product - and they've increased sales beyond what might have been expected. Retailers are the important link with the consumer and if a retailer's efforts creates more store traffic and sales, I think he should be afforded recognition, which is why we have introduced these merchandising awards."

There will not be more than seven awards presented each year, drawing from the 165 accounts in Ontario and Manitoba. There were five recipients for the first awards, and they are Brian Stewart, Sam's London; Flo Mercer, Music World Yorkdale; Joel Pye, Music World Scarborough Town Centre; Tom Radcliffe, A&A, Yonge Street, Toronto; and Garth Dietrick, A&A Winnipeg.

I mentioned in the Sept 24th issue that the only radio station reps attending the opening party of the Festival of Festivals was CKFM's Sheila Conner. The station did live broadcasts daily from the Festival's headquarters which included updates and interviews. I've had something going for Sheila for years so perhaps, along with that and the star gazing I overlooked the rather large delegation from CHFI, which included Jim Sward, President, Rogers Radio, Peggy Colston-Weir, Vice President, FM Programming for Rogers and Programme Director of CHFI (how could I not see Peggy?), as well as CHFI's Music Director Karen Lea Doan, Librarian Hazel James, Copy Chief Judy Burrell and Promotions Manager Charlene Roycht. On top of that CHFI's on-air personality Paul Fisher was emcee for the night. CHFI, as a corporate sponsor of the Festival, provided funds for all the live Canadian talent at the parties. Credit where credit's due - eh? By the way, did you notice that out of six reps from Rogers/CHFI, four of them were ladies, and they all have titles. I'm guessing but I think CHFI was the first radio station in Canada to recognize women's talents and rights and to reward them accordingly.

Cliff Lorimer to Dallcorte

Many of his friends will be pleased to learn that Cliff Lorimer, who has a slight handicap, has landed himself a job with Dallcorte. Cliff is a very talented young man who has gained a wide knowledge of both the broadcast and record industries.

Egg on their face??

Anne Murray's latest single, A Little Good News, is getting very heavy programmer action - in the U.S. There are a few Canadian programmers who have decided not to play the single because it isn't Cancon. If she performs this song on the CMA awards show, which she is co-hosting this year, watch out. Her album will become a huge seller and listeners will be flooding radio stations requesting the single. If it does happen there will be a lot of Canadian programmers playing catch-up.

When's a hit a hit??

Pale Shelter from the Tears For Fears album, The Hurting, has been one of the heavies on the "heavy rotation" list of several major AOR stations. Now that PolyGram has released the track as a single, the interest at the CHR level is a big yawn. Perhaps they're waiting for heavy U.S. response first. Too often it's been noticed that a single, released in Canada, can flounder for weeks but as soon as the U.S. tipsters and trades go on it, chart positions follow very quickly in Canada. The first major market programmer to chart Pale Shelter is Guy Brouillard, Music Director at Montreal's CKQI-FM.

There must be a better way!!

Drawing names out of a hat for executive positions was dropped years ago after a large conglomerate had discovered after they had announced the appointment of Mr. Size Eight as Vice President and General Manager, there was no such person. Could someone have brought back this practice?

Toronto: Brothers Randy and Tim Bachman and Fred Turner, three of the four original members of Bachman-Turner Overdrive, have given the old group an overhaul and are joined by former Guess Who drummer Gary Peterson. The foursome are already cutting material for their album, described as being in a "heavy rock vein."

Tim Bachman had recorded and toured with the group for some time, leaving to pursue another venture. His brother Randy and Fred Turner, who formed the original nucleus of BTO, wrote and performed the majority of the group's hits which were many during their command of the international charts. BTO was considered one of the most successful rock bands in the history of the music form, chalking up sales of more than 13 million albums. They were recognized as superstars, not only in Canada but in the U.S., the U.K., Europe, Japan and Australia.

In commenting on the new venture, Fred Turner noted, "There is a creative drive and energy in this association that is producing exciting results."

An extensive worldwide tour for 1984 is now in the planning stages.

Marketing direction for the new group is being provided by Aaronson, Powers Weir and Associates.

Parachute Club closes Canada's Wonderland

Toronto: Gerry Young of Current Records, reports the firming of Parachute Club as headline act for Canada's Wonderland closing (Oct 9). There will be two shows 2 and 6 pm.

A tour west begins (Oct 14) in Thunder Bay and ends in Vancouver (Nov 1).

The group is currently experiencing heavy radio play and sales on their self-titled album and their single, Rise Up. A follow-up single is now being considered and will be either Alienation or Boys Club, both of which are included on the album.

Underground release for Wright's Raincoat

Toronto: Tony Baylis, who heads up the Underground label which specializes in the release of hits of the '50s and '60s, has released The Man In The Raincoat by Priscilla Wright. The single was a monster for Wright in the mid-fifties when she was only 13 years of age. The Wright name surfaced a few months ago with the release of her Broadland single, God Bless You Baby. The Raincoat song was written by Warwick Webster of Orillia, Ontario.

The flip to the re-release of Raincoat is titled To Jone, a 1967 release by The Willapus Wallapus, a group that was actually known as The Rising Suns, but because of a label commitment with Columbia, assumed the Wallapus name. This song was written by Bruce Lee, who was the keyboardist on the Ronnie Prophet weekly TV series.

Murray McLauchlan - a return to the basics

In the course of watching the video for Murray McLauchlan's new single, Never Did Like That Train, one senses the intensity and devotion that has characterized the career of this True North recording artist. In having a one on one conversation with McLauchlan it becomes even more obvious that he is totally dedicated to the business and not, as depicted by some members of the press, a part time folkie who yearns to be a bush pilot.

McLauchlan's new album, Timberline, can probably be best described as a no-compromise return to the country-blues style which he popularized in the early '70s, but strayed from on later recordings.

"It may develop subtly," he commented, "but I think I've found a musical framework that I'm very happy with."

McLauchlan speaks very highly of his associates Bucky Berger (drums) and Terry Wilkins (bass), who are the only session people involved in the production, the result being a very solid presentation, produced by McLauchlan himself. "There were minimal overdubs," he explained, "and the tracks were basically taken right off the floor."

The Berger/Wilkins tie-in was neither by accident nor design as McLauchlan explains, "because they've played with Rough Trade so long, and so extensively, we were always running into each other....we just decided that we really liked to work together and make something happen."

On producing himself, "It was great. Actually I really enjoyed it. I've found that I'm the type of person who likes to have complete and utter control over whatever it is that I'm trying to create."

Over the years while performing with bands such as the Silver Tractors and the Lincolns, McLauchlan admits to exposing himself to several different musical styles which he now believes was very beneficial for him. "I think the experimentation I've done has been extremely valuable for me in teaching me something that I didn't know, which was the value of my style, or my sound."

Probably more than any other singer in his

field, McLauchlan would appear to have a penchant for love, coupled with loneliness, which could be construed as a release for

personal anxieties. McLauchlan explains, "The songs in which I deal with that aspect of life are obviously auto-biographical; I realize that sometimes you have to take these kinds of experiences and do something with them."

McLauchlan hasn't strayed too far from his beginnings. The writing is still as powerful as Farmer's Song, his first hit and actually one of the most memorable eras in his career. Farmer's Song garnered him three coveted Junos of 1973, Composer, Country and Folk Singles of the Year and also contributed to the Juno win for his True North label as Independent Label of the Year. The spillover of that year was obvious as McLauchlan won a Juno the following year as Folk Singer of the Year and in both 1975 and 1976 was honoured as Country Male Vocalist.

It was just prior to his Farmer's Song success when McLauchlan and True North label owner Bernie Finkelstein signed a personal management agreement, one of the longest running manager/artist associations in the business.

Programmers across the country have already recognized McLauchlan's return to the basics, reflected in their chart and playlist adds for his new single. It's expected that his Timberline album will do what it is intended; to showcase a talent that has once again found its niche and which will provide a basis for his continued artistic growth. Quality, especially when it's been nurtured by past success, never seems to go out of style.

Among the dates coming up for McLauchlan are Carleton University, Ottawa (Oct 19), Guelph (29), Hamilton Hall at Hamilton Place (Nov 4-5), Peterborough (12) and Kit-chener (Dec 2).

Homegrown album set for release by Z99

Regina: Z99 is preparing to release their first homegrown album titled Streetrock slated for a November 15, release date. The LP will feature eight local acts who were selected from over 50 tapes submitted to the station.

Eight bands will use, Studio West, to lay down one track each for the LP. The bands are Framed, Revisions, Uncle Friday, Rockin' Crocodiles, Pretty Pleasures, Billy Morton, Choice and Passenger.

Tembo marketing for new Boss Brass album

Toronto: The next Boss Brass album, All In Good Time, ready for the streets mid-October, is a joint venture between Jenson Publishers of Milwaukee and Innovation Records with Tembo Music Canada handling marketing. RCA will look after distribution.

Produced at Toronto's McClear Place by Phil Sheridan, engineer and co-producer of several Boss Brass albums, the new package will have a Canada/U.S. simultaneous release.

Said Sheridan, "From my standpoint, this is the best effort by all concerned. There is big band magic in this album and I'm proud to have it on my Innovation label."

Rob McConnell originals included on the album are Phil Not Bill, Can't Stop My Leg and Schlep It Up To Joe.

Lengthy Cancon list for Capitol's fall lineup

Toronto: In addition to the latest album from David Wilcox recently released, Capitol is shipping several key Cancon albums from their lengthy Canadian artists roster.

The latest is the new LP from Anne Murray, A Little Good News. The title track is the first single from the album and has been issued in a picture sleeve. Produced by Jim Ed Norman, the LP also contains the track written by Kenny Loggins, The More We Try.

Fans of the Toronto group the Sharks will be glad to hear that the company has just released the debut solo album from the lead vocalist of the band Sherry Kean titled Mixed Emotions. Still with Kean is husband, guitarist and co-writer David Baxter, also of the Sharks. The LP was produced by Mike Thorne, who worked Soft Cell's Tainted Love album. The title track is the first single taken from the album.

Not so long ago, Tracy Howe, lead singer

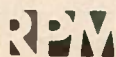

Music Video-The New Currency Part One - by Mel Shaw

With the emergence of video in the music marketplace via an audio visual bombardment from television, one of the most important gatherings of its kind was held at the Royal Ontario Museum during the Festival of Festivals, in the area of craft.

The panel offered a complete cross section of those involved with the world of video and their work will have a great affect on the public as the months and years go by.

Moderated by well-known and respected industry veteran, Paul Hoffert, the panel members were welcomed and given the opportunity to make opening remarks.

The panelists were: Philip Lind, Senior Vice President Rogers Cable Systems, now one of the major forces in North American cable markets; John Martin, who conceived and has been producing The New Music for CITY-TV for the past five years; Rob Quartlye, one of Canada's leading video producer/directors, and winner of the U-Know video award for The Best Video - Spoons (Nova Heart) and who is founder of Champagne Pictures; Producer Michael Rosen, who has worked as a musician with the likes of John Wetten of Asia, and the Average White Band. He is also experienced in management of recording artists as well as all creative aspects of video production.

Representing the recording side of video/film making was Karen Gordon, who, for the past three years has been doing publicity and promotion on a regional and national level with PolyGram. Karen's experience also includes news and public affairs for radio stations in the Ottawa, Winnipeg and Toronto markets.

David Devine of Devine Video Works was also a panelist. He is currently writer/director/producer of the music program, the Stray Cats Live at Massey Hall as well as the Chris deBurgh Live at Hamilton Place. He is in post production of a show devoted to the making of the recently released Strange Brew.

Also on the panel was Jay Switzer, program manager of City-TV, the home of New Music. Jay has worked almost every facet of television from cameraman, floor director, production assistant all the way up. He is involved in the application from City-TV for a third tier channel for Pay-TV that would be mainly music oriented similar to MTV in the U.S.

The artists were well represented with Mike Levine from the very successful powerhouse group, Triumph. Their Canadian and U.S. success both live on records and through their videos made him a most welcome addition to the panel.

In the future of the Canadian music business there will be many other get togethers that will all follow in the footsteps of this panel that broke ground and gave their knowledge on the hottest phenomenon to come along in the music business in decades. Paul Hoffert is to be congratulated.

Capsule introductory comments on Music Video by panel members.

David Devine:

He has found in Canada, other than New Music there are few outlets for videos while in the U.S. there are over 30 outlets including MTV, NBC NightFlight, FM Tonight, Night Tracks, and Hot Tracks. There is a broader base building for their use and a great deal of the craft owes some debt to the well crafted commercials such as Coke and Dr. Pepper that started using pop music in an inventive way to sell. He commented that Flashdance was like a ninety minute video. Conceptual videos are the most inventive and popular in selling either a new artist or an established one.

Michael Rosen:

He can see the producer's role being made much more viable with a strong involvement with the artist in pre-production stages of a video as they spend time listening and watching what is involved with each song. An

area that should be strengthened is the combining of communication between the record company and the producer. In some cases this communication does not exist.

Karen Gordon:

She believes that in today's marketplace a record company must take their video seriously in order to sell more records, open more markets, and open the "radio spectrum" for a wider selection of artist. In the recent past too many labels were scaring radio away from certain artists. Video has helped to erase the barriers that labels have built up. Consumers are now excited and back being involved with the artists and video has generated that new excitement. With the interaction of radio and video that combination affects the buyer. However, with the high costs of video production reaching an average of \$30,000.00 for new artist and ranging up to the mega bucks for superstar videos the question of who will pay the freight of the video costs is a point at this stage that remains up in the air. The company or the artist? (To be continued)

A record and TV producer of note, Mel Shaw's Northern Express was nominated best half hour documentary of 1975. He produced several other shows as well.

New Chilliwack album set for October release

Toronto: Solid Gold have scheduled the next Chilliwack album for an October release. A Best Of package with two new tracks, the album, Segue, was produced by Chilliwack founder and member Bill Henderson. Henderson has been co-writing with Ashley Mulford, formerly of Sad Cafe.

A single, Wild Montana Skies, which features Emmylou Harris on background vocals, has been taken from the album. The fold-out jacket displays Buckminster Fuller's Cymaxion World Map and Denver has appropriately paid tribute to the acclaimed late architect by penning World Game and also reveals his poetic talent with The Peace Poem. MENTAL AS ANYTHING
Creatures Of Leisure

A very tightly-knit Australian group, Mental As Anything should make an even greater dent in the North American market with this Russell Dunlop and Bruce Brown production (Seems Alright To Me and Working For The Man were produced by ex-Beachboy Ricky Fataar and Mark Morfett). The country, or rockabilly influence provides an even greater entertainment scope for this lyric-happy group, a weird mix, considering their cover of Roy Orbison's Working For The Man and Peter O'Doherty's (bassist) penning of Brain Brain, which O'Doherty describes as "a gutsy, stormy, narrative ballad that owes nothing to Don McLean." These are choice cuts as is Greedy Smiths (keyboards) Bitter To Swallow and Reg Mobassa's (guitar) Float Away. The remaining members are guitarist Martin Plaza and drummer Wayne Delisle. Mombassa's visual art talent is revealed through his clever drawings accompanying lyrics.

AL DUPUIS
Be With Me - 16th Avenue AVE-5701

- Country

Produced at Nashville's Oak Valley Studio by Dupuis and Clyde Beavers, this Chipman New Brunswick native takes a firm hold on the business with his debut album. A former schoolteacher, Dupuis is obviously concentrating on songwriting and this package is an excellent showcase for this talent that puts him a cut above many of his counterparts. The lyrics are intelligent yet humble and his vocal warmth adds to the urgency of his message. Influenced in his early years by his father a well-known Cajun fiddler, there's a touch of that here with nice fiddle work by Bruce Watkins, who also doubles on banjo and mandolin. Gary Prim and Michael Sykes provide keyboards, steelwork is by Doug Jernigan and John Huey, acoustic and lead guitars John Rich, which leaves drummers Ron Stroupe and Billy Blackwood, supplying a very professional but subtle back-up to the sensitive vocals. Choice are You've Been Special To Me, released as a single, Woman Such As You and Josie, the latter written by Marion Cameron.

THE ELVIS BROTHERS
Movin' Up - Portrait FR-38865-H

- Rock

A trio of brothers from Champaign, Illinois, Rob (guitar, vocals), Graham (bass, vocals) and Brad (drums) Elvis, supply their own version of vintage rock - which is all their own and as individual writers. Before their career blossomed they played a St. Louis concert where they opened for Carl

Perkins. He was so impressed he invited them to play a benefit in his hometown of Jackson, Tennessee along with the Charlie Daniels Band. There is no Perkins nor Daniels influence here but there is a distinct British feel, reminiscent of the Liverpool sound. Hidden In A Heartbeat has been taken as a single and it should be an excellent vehicle for this Lennie Pretz/Tony Bongiovi/Lance Quinn production. Also choice are Long Gone and Movin' Up. Nice packaging and the name alone, will attract. Should be front-racked.

What's New - Asylum 96 02601-P
The voice is the same but the repertoire has taken a U-turn for what normally brings Ronstadt to the charts. What's New is an up to date setting for Irving Berlin's What'll I Do, George and Ira Gershwin's Someone To Watch Over Me and I've Got A Crush On You and Gordon Jenkins' Goodbye. The Nelson Riddle Orchestra is the instrumental link with the past and a superb cushioning for Ronstadt's torchy delivery. Produced by Ronstadt's long-time mentor Peter Asher. Superb cameo sax solo by Plas Johnson on Sigman/Russell's Crazy He Calls Me. Other notable musicians are keyboardist Don Grolnick, and guitarists Tommy Tedesco and Dennis Budimir.
