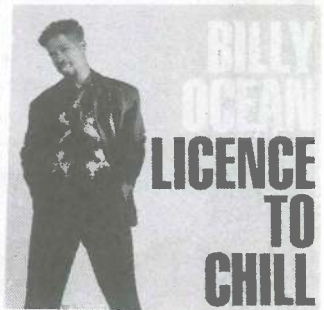

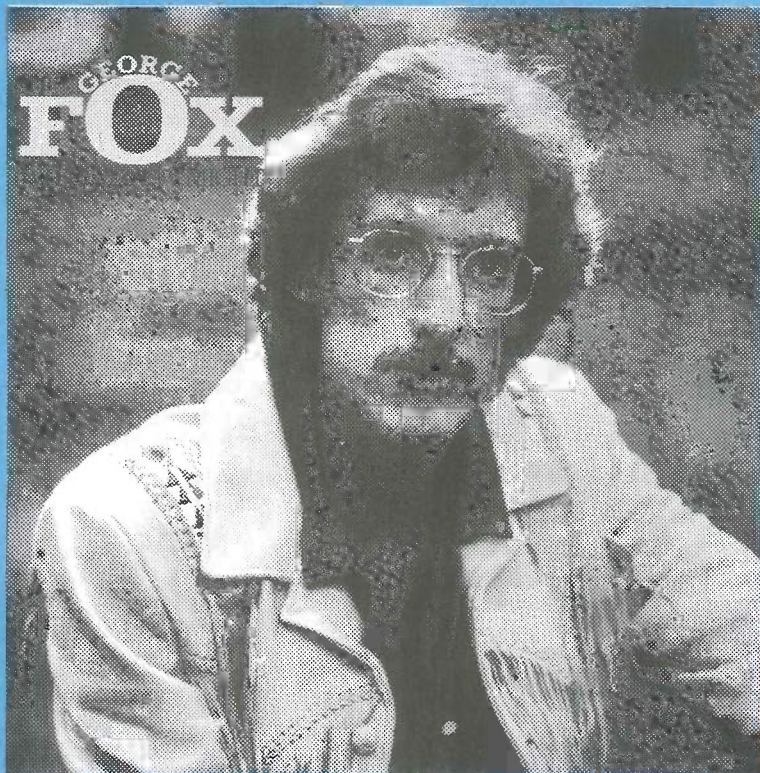

October "best month" in WEA's history - Kulin

Stan Kulin, President WEA Music of Canada, reports that October was "the best sales month in our history." He attributes this sales splurge to "overall good product," continuing with, "There wasn't one or two albums driving this increase, just look at the releases we've had this year from Alannah Myles, Tracy Chapman, Neil Young, Linda Ronstadt, Cher, Randy Travis, Aerosmith, Motley Crue, Don Henley, and Skid Row. They represent the full spectrum of good music.

Kulin goes on to point out that "quite often albums are overlooked when they're on WEA . . . but look at Madonna, her album Like A Prayer is now five times platinum, and The Singles by Honeymoon Suite shipped almost gold . . . and their new single was probably one of the most added Canadian singles last week."

Milgrim exits Elektra to head up Capitol U.S.

Joe Smith, President and Chief Executive Officer, Capitol-EMI Music, has announced the appointment of Hale Milgrim as President of Capitol Records. He joins Capitol from Elektra Entertainment, where he held the position of Senior Vice President, Marketing. Prior to that he was Vice President, Creative Services for Elektra Records from 1984 to 1987. He served as Director, Merchandising, Warner Bros from 1977 to 1984, and as Marketing Coordinator for WEA in San Francisco from 1973 to 1977.

Milgrim began his career in the music retail business, working as a sales clerk for various record stores in Southern California. He held a variety of positions with Discount Records in San Francisco and Berkely before moving into the recording industry.

Looking back over the past few months, Kulin admits "the industry had a slow summer, but sales at retail have now rebounded." During the waning days of summer consumers began a fairly heavy sales pattern, resulting in September, "which up to yesterday (Oct. 30) was our second biggest month ever. It's now our third biggest (the first was December of 1988), and follow that with October being our biggest month ever . . . and I have a very good feeling today (Nov. 1) that this month will be our biggest month ever. So, we will have three of our four biggest months occurring in this quarter." (WEA's fiscal year begins Dec. 1 and ends Nov. 30).

Interestingly, WEA did not have any real powerhouse chart items over the past few months, which leaves room for question. "We had our normal hot items," says Kulin, "but we certainly didn't have our percentage of the Top 10 that we normally have . . . but it doesn't seem to be reflected in sales. Our sales are just outstanding and perhaps the charts aren't as relevant as they used to be."

Kulin stresses that record buyers are looking for "good music, and if you take a look at that list of artists I mentioned, you'll see that these acts cover every area of music except for classics . . . and it's obvious that good music is bringing the customers back into the stores."

Kulin admits that catalogue has contributed to WEA's overall sales success, but he points out that catalogue and its very reference has changed over the last few years. "An item used to be termed catalogue after nine months," he explains, "but sometimes it now takes us six months to break an act, the classic being Paul Simon's Graceland album . . . and I think we're running into a

WEA's Toronto Branch makes personnel changes

Herb Forgie, Toronto Branch Manager for WEA Music Canada, has announced several changes within his regional operation.

Bill Banham, who held the position of London promotion and service representative, has been appointed Ontario promotion representative, succeeding Nigel Best, who is now Manager, National Publicity for WEA (RPM - Nov. 4). Banham moved into WEA's mainstream operation from the warehouse, which is quite often tapped for new talent.

Replacing Banham is Dale Kotyk, who will be based in London as service, sales and promotion representative. He will cover Sarnia, Kitchener, Cambridge and Windsor. His appointment becomes effective Nov. 13. Kotyk has been with WEA only a few months, where he was employed in the warehouse.

Forgie has also announced the hiring of Kimberly Ann Gilmour, who will work part-time assisting Mary Armstrong in the Ottawa area. He points out that in view of the pressure of concert dates by WEA artists as well as an increase in activity at the retail level, it was necessary to have a back-up for Armstrong. Gilmour was previously assistant promotion at CHEZ-FM Ottawa.

similar situation with the new album by Daniel Lanois, which I feel is a nine month to a year project. We've just crossed 17,000 on the album and we're confident that one of these days we're going to be talking about it as being a two or three times platinum LP."

WEA's catalogue, the Super Saver CDs portion, "represents 25 to 35 percent of our volume," Kulin admits. Also interesting is the fact that cassettes are still the primary sales item at WEA, "and will be for a good number of years, in terms of units," says Kulin, continuing with, "In terms of dollars, it's starting to narrow. In our case it's 55 percent cassette and 35 percent CDs, which it has been for the last couple of months."

Kulin concludes with, "I anticipate that as we are able to continue watching the costs on CDs . . . and maybe, hopefully drop them a little bit, that will narrow the gap even more."

Jive Bunny breaking with Swing The Mood

What could be the novelty record for the Christmas Season, Swing The Mood by Jive Bunny and the Mastermixers, has shipped 50,000 on release. "We can't keep up with the demand," says WEA's Vice President National Promotions and Special Projects, Kim Cooke, continuing with, "We definitely have a hot one here." The single was No. 1 in England for five weeks and sold in excess of one million copies.

It was obvious on release in Canada, radio programmers were unsure as to how to treat the track which uses a Glenn Miller base of In The Mood with a potpourri of inserts from Bill Haley, to Elvis Presley, the Everly Brothers and more. However, several majors experimented with the track and the phones apparently lit up from the first play, resulting in "accounts being inundated with requests for the record," says Cooke.

Initially, a three-song CD containing a radio mix and 12" mix of Swing The Mood and a Glenn Miller Medley, was shipped to radio only. A cassette-single of Swing The Mood followed.

COVER STORY - by Sean LaRose**Timing is right for Sheree's self-titled debut**

Timing was a very important tool used in Sheree's well-thought-out plan to succeed in the label end of the business. Beginning her professional singing career at age 16, Sheree Jeacocke (she has dropped her last name), played live for almost seven years before getting into studio work.

Although in popular demand as a session singer, Sheree still found time to play a few live dates. However, as it turned out there was just too much work for her in the studio, a very lucrative career. She has supplied background vocals for such notables as Glass Tiger and Kim Mitchell and she was the only featured female vocalist on the recent Gordon Lightfoot album, *East Of Midnight*.

Although it has taken 15 years to release her first LP, Sheree felt "I probably wasn't ready before, but three years ago I decided the timing was right, and I began writing songs for the album." Being such a prominent session singer, there was no need to go label shopping and after several offers, Sheree accepted a deal from David Bendeth, Vice President of A&R at BMG Music Canada.

Spending a year and half writing songs which "would mean something to me, as well as create some sort of emotion for the consumer," Sheree began recording at Toronto's Phase One Studio. After another year and a half in the studio, she realized her first solo album.

The first single, *Woman's Work*, has been received favourably by radio almost immediately on release. The single is Sheree's tribute to women, "My way of saying 'Hey, I know how tough it is for a woman out there; there's a career to take care of, a family and responsibilities . . . it's a tough job' . . . and *Woman's Work* salutes just how tough it is."

With three producers on hand to produce the album, Lou Pomanti, Fred Zarr and David Bendeth, Sheree comments, "I learned a great deal from each of them . . . each producer was very different. I also learned a tremendous amount from my personal involvement. Taking an active role in all phases of the creative process, beginning with the writing, and continuing with the recording; arranging and mixing gave me a

very complete and coherent link with the project. I hope to continue this hands-on involvement in my future recordings.

Sheree hopes to be involved more technically on the next LP. She is looking for co-production credits along with her writing and arranging credits. "I really hope to co-produce my next album, but there are a lot of variables to consider. If I find a producer that I really want and he doesn't want me to co-produce then I won't, but I am definitely looking at production in the future."

When questioned about her style of writing Sheree points out, "I write all my tunes to the piano, which is very uncommon, particularly in the dance genre. People write melodic ideas to grooves. However, I feel if they are written to the piano they stand up no matter how you arrange them." As far as the contents of her writing Sheree asserts, "I write songs that mean something to me, and touch people . . . heartfelt songs about emotional situations or just things people can relate to, stressing "although I stay away from political issues."

Although very pleased with the reception of the album by the consumer after only a week of release Sheree comments, "I'm very excited about the response the album has received so quickly, although I'm not getting all caught up in it," continuing with, "If I do what I'm supposed to do and I do it well . . . that's all I can do. If I get caught up in the business aspect, I may lose my focus. Sure I'm interested in the success of it, and I appreciate the hard work that's involved in getting it out there, but I'm just sitting back and watching what happens. It's out of my hands to a degree. I'm ready to promote it though, I love playing live, but once again I'm waiting till the time is right."

As far as touring is concerned Sheree is obviously no stranger to the stage, and has "very specific people in mind, to play for me, but I'm going to wait till the New Year, I want to tour when people want to see me. Besides I'm currently preparing to shoot my next video. The first video was shot in Toronto."

All ten tracks on the CD are strong tracks, including a duet with New Yorker Fonzi Thornton entitled *Forever You*,

Forever Me which is definitely a single contender, and when asked what the second single would be Sheree comments, "I can't really say for sure, but I'd like *Before We Fall* to be the next single. I like it because it's different and I want everybody to know that there is a variety in my music."

She concludes, "Variety is very important to me. I know as a record buyer myself, that when I go out and buy an album, I like to get my money's worth."

With the amount of work invested in this album, it is obvious that from the initial response Sheree's first solo album will open the door to a bright new future for her.

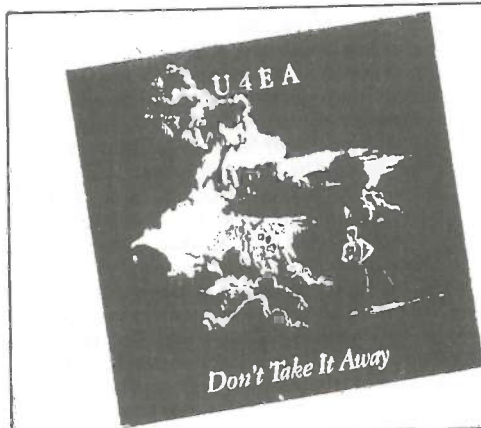

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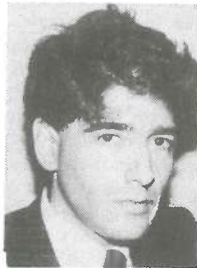
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Jason Sniderman opens "Our really big store"

Sam The Record Man's Jason Sniderman was front and centre, officiating at the opening of the chain's first free standing entertainment complex in Vancouver (Oct. 11). More than 200 local industry and media people and recording artists were on hand for the opening of the new store, a restored five-storey bank building built in the 1800's.

Sniderman bought the building in 1987. "We wanted to establish a downtown presence in Vancouver," he explains, "We wanted a building in the core of the city, and this old bank was the only available property . . . and it was just what we were looking for."

Sniderman, no slouch when it comes to design himself, having come up with the basic designs for the Edmonton Mall store as well

as the Halifax store, worked with local Vancouver architect Allan Hart of Baker McGarva Hart, "For two years," recalls Sniderman, bouncing my ideas of design off him and we became very good friends over the course of redoing the building," which took two years.

"We took a building that was built in the 1800's" says Sniderman, "and brought it up to current base standards, and that included seismographic tests." He continues with, "The building has state-of-the-art earthquake reinforcements, it is entirely sprinklered and it is entirely up to the national fire code's modern day standards."

Sniderman also stresses that in view of the unique design of the building and the fact that many of the old elements were in good condition, "We fashioned the store on that look of forty or more years ago," he points out, "utilizing wrought iron staircases, old light fixtures and tile flooring. We even bought up old fixtures and art decor from that period of thirty or forty years ago . . . items that looked as if they were there all along."

The exterior of the building was in pretty fair shape so it was decided to preserve as

Azoff pacts deal with Warner Bros

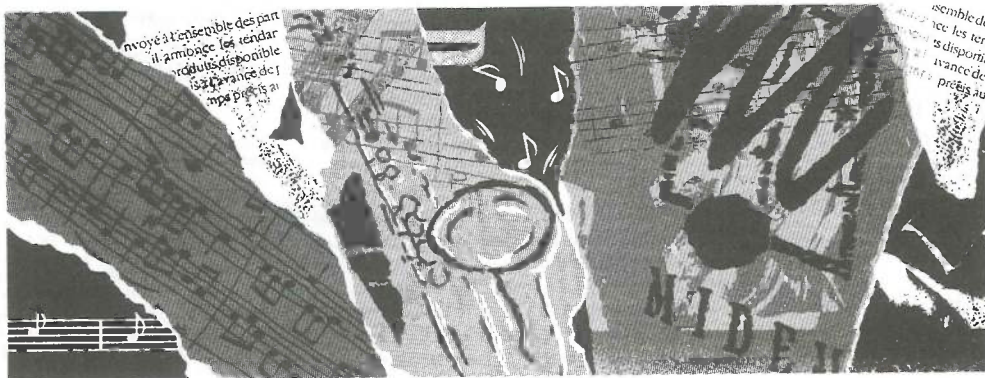

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Unger touch brings MacNeil into dance

Rita MacNeil continues to amaze the industry and public in general with her incursions into other than Cape Breton-influenced music. Working Man is her anthem, and it appeared for some time that she had slotted herself. Now, however, when she kicks off her shoes during her concert dates, anything can happen. The healthy looking 45-year old is now utilizing her powerful vocals to belt out R&B, pop with an edge, and, on record, the most stunning surprise, a dance version of Doors.

To say the reaction at dance clubs has been just short of "incredible" is probably an understatement. But to get that reaction took a lot of doing and the credit goes to one of the unsung heroes of remixing, Kevin Unger, a longtime club disc jockey (Skyline's Affairs) with an obvious edge over his counterparts in the market.

It was Virgin Canada President Doug

Chappell who first approached Unger with the MacNeil project. "A sleeper track on the album," recalls Unger, "sort of stood out like a sore thumb compared to all the other tracks . . . and Doug thought he could gain a wider audience by taking Rita to the clubs."

Of prime concern for Chappell was the squeaky clean reputation of MacNeil and he didn't want to ruin her successive projects, so he released the record on a white label without her name, and shipped it to the record pools. "There were a lot of guesses," says Unger. "Everything from Eurythmics to . . . well you name it. But the main thing is that reaction at the clubs was pretty fantastic, and when it was discovered that this was Rita MacNeil, she became one of the most requested at the clubs, and still is."

To get the sound required for MacNeil, Unger took the master of Doors into the studio, stripped the tracks, kept the horn and vocal lines and re-recorded the rest. He used standard keyboards, a drum machine and computer. The project took 188 hours in the studio. The reason it took so long was that the dance version and house version are totally different, "different style, different rhythm and elements," says Unger. "We didn't recognize that we had something until about half way through. I always have a vision right from the start, when I'm doing one of these projects . . . and even though the perspectives are always changing, the ultimate goal is nonetheless envisioned." Unger is quick to point out the importance of having a skilled engineer on the session, and in this case Jim Zolis not only handled board chores but the drum machine as well. "We work well together," muses Unger, "and

Studio 9, where we do most of our work, is one of the better equipped studios in Canada for this type of session."

Unger has worked the club scene for twelve years. "My roots stem from being a disc jockey in a club," boasts Unger. "I've gotten to know a lot of people in the industry and it was because of my friendship with many of these people that I got my start."

Unger's first job was an edit for RCA Records on Chris Rea's I Can Hear Your Heart Beat. The original was released as an import first and then domestically, but the arrangement of the song wasn't that great and the clubs were reluctant to play it. Unger's edit turned the negatives into positives. "Because I was a DJ . . . and I knew all the DJs in the city, I had a lot of support. They were raving about my edit and that opened the door for me and right then I decided I should be doing more of this type of work."

Unger's reputation grew through word of mouth. Early in the game he founded his own Tamah label, releasing Tiger Bay, a dance song by Francine Kirsch. The single became a Top 10 chart item in the UK. His credits now read like a veritable who's who of dance music including Louisa Florio (Deeper In Debt and Love Attack), Rita Johns (Haunted By Love), Tapps (Hurricane), Karen Silver (I Don't Want To Fall In Love), Yvonne Moore (Real Men), Chalk Circle (This Mourning), Tu (The Language Of Love), Northern Pikes (Dancing In A Dance Club) and Glass Tiger (Sing My Song), and more. He is currently working on a remix of Your Place Or Mine, by Sharon Lee Williams, the lead singer for Sway . . . not bad for an extraordinarily talented producer who only receives additional production and remix credits, for what is obviously a labour of love.

Thomson and Teitsson into computer software

Steve Thomson, President of Backstage Productions International, has teamed with Ingo Teitsson, a former programmer/analyst with the University of Toronto, to form Promotional Technologies. The firm will shortly launch a line of computer software geared specifically to the needs of the entertainment industry.

As Thomson explains, in order to handle his ever increasing workload and at the same time compete on an international level, "I had to automate my office and with no software tailored for the entertainment industry available on the market, a system had to be developed from scratch." He continues with, "I believed that with my practical knowledge of the industry, combined with Ingo's (Teitsson) broad base of experience with micro, mini and mainframe computers, we could develop the much needed micro computer software."

Interestingly, prior to joining Thomson, Teitsson had apparently spent many years developing leading edge software applications for IBM personal computers as well as providing consulting and custom software services to the marketing, manufacturing, educational and financial service sectors.

Now, after three years of what Thomson describes as "fine tuning" a computer system for the entertainment professional, Thomson and Teitsson are ready to launch a line of

software for IBM PCs and compatibles which they are calling Access To Success. The products will be handled through their newly formed company. "Our aim", Thomson stresses, "is to supply computer software to the music and entertainment industry at bargain prices."

Thomson goes on to explain that the first software package, Access Radio (Versions I and II), "is completely menu driven, is user friendly and enables the user to access all radio station music programmers on a national basis according to musical and geographic category." Thomson goes on to point out, "The user is able to print address labels and use a mail-merge feature to form custom letters or memos with a built-in text editor. Alternatively, information can be exported to popular word processors such as Wordperfect and Microsoft Word."

The cost of Version I is \$185.00. Version II, which will be released shortly, is designed to assist multi project users and features a follow-up check system.

Thomson reveals out that subscribers will be able to obtain updated diskettes three times a year, "depending on their requirements," concluding with, "I believe this initial package will be a boon not only for the independent label or manager, but also for the major players in the industry." 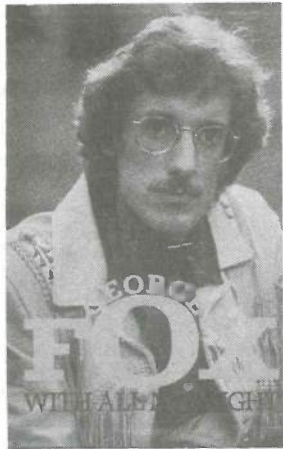

JOE STRUMMER - Pop
 Earthquake Weather

Although a strong package, more might be expected from one of the best songwriters to emerge in the past ten years. At times marginally reminiscent of *The Clash* during the Sandinista/Combat Rock period, but generally lacking the anthemic hooks that made his earlier work so memorable. Lyrically, the text is specific and often obscure and Strummer finds it necessary to include a legend to explain his references. Nevertheless, Joe Strummer fans won't be disappointed and may even be afforded the pleasure of hearing *Island Hopping* or *Sleepwalk* on more enlightened radio stations. Other noteworthy tracks include *Gangsterville* and *Ride Your Donkey*, which reflect Strummer's longtime infatuation with reggae, as well as the more subdued *Leopardskin Limousines*. GEORGE FOX - Country
 With All My Might
 WEA - 25-69274-J

This has been a big year for Canada's newest country star. Fox literally exploded onto the scene with his first album and he was rewarded with four Big Country Awards and a CCMA Vista Award. This album presents a somewhat different Fox than his first LP. There's more of an edge, a much greater feel for country here. Perhaps the producers are a contributing factor for the change. Brian Ahern certainly had an influence as one of the producers, along with Gregg Brown and Jerry Martin. Whatever it is, there's more vocal power and projection than before. Fox is hot and *No Trespassing*, the first single from this set, is paced perfectly to bring attention to the other tracks, key of which are *Lime Rickey*, *Bachelor Girl* and *Lonely Tears*. Don't overlook *Dylan's I Threw It All Away* and the powerful *Long Gone Lonesome Blues*, written by Hank Williams. - WG

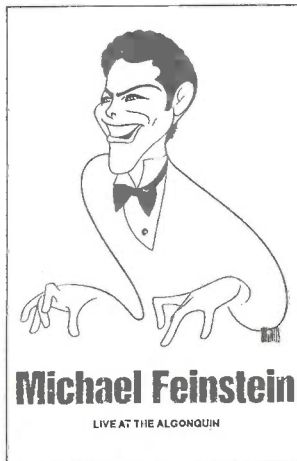
LIZA MINNELLI - Pop

This Tennant/Lows production will be of interest to *Pet Shop Boys* fans, although its appeal at radio is not certain. Liza's voice is not in top form, and the musical style seems to draw on Minnelli more as a gimmick than as a true mesh of talents. It seems that the *Pet Shop Boys* have merely found a new "doggie for the window". Notables include *Losing My Mind* and a version of *Tanita Tikaram's Twist In My Sobriety*. (CD Reviewed) - RG

 Storm Front - Columbia - OC-44366-H

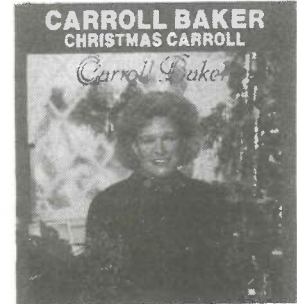
One of the most consistent artists of the past fifteen years, Billy Joel once again delivers a solid album that will please radio and retail, satisfying old fans with ballads like *And So It Goes* and *Lenigrad* while making new ones with big production pop songs. The first single, *We Didn't Start The Fire*, is off to a very hot start and there

should be no trouble finding a successor with either *The Downeaster "Alexa"*, despite a very weird vocal splice in the first chorus, or *That's Not Her Style*, seemingly about wife *Christie Brinkley* in which an unnamed female is defended from countless accusations and rumours. When in *Rome* is a great bouncy toe-tapper, but departs from the massive sound used on other tracks. Co-produced by *Mick Jones* and *Joel*, backing vocals are provided by *Richard Marx* as well as a host of others. - CM



MICHAEL FEINSTEIN - Pop
 Live At The Algonquin
 Elektra - 96-07434-P

This cafe society pianist/vocalist has three albums available and all in the CD format. Very well known by *New Yorkers*, Feinstein's reputation has been spreading over the years until today he has a large following in *North America*. Most of his repertoire consists of old show tunes and after-hour favourites. This is piano bar nostalgia. There are old chestnuts like *Thanks For The Memory*, *I Concentrate On You* and *I Love A Piano*. The album was recorded live with an audience in the famous *Oak Room* and anyone who has been in the music business for any length of time has stayed at one time or another at the *Algonquin*, one of the more famous of *New York's* hotels. The two previous albums, *Isn't It Romantic* and *Michael Feinstein Sings Irving Berlin*, complete the collection for the Feinstein fan. The very timely *Irving Berlin* album has an extra bonus in that *Liza Minnelli* sings with Feinstein on *Remember/Always/What'll I Do*. This track comes off as an impromptu party piece. As for radio programming, Feinstein fits the bill for the easiest of listening and in the minds of many sophisticates is a big star. (CD reviewed) - SK



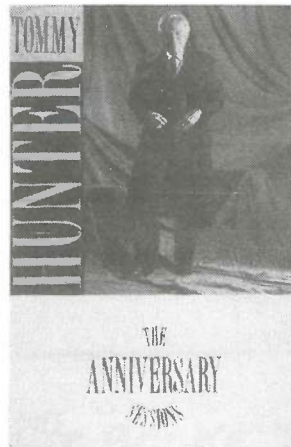
CARROLL BAKER - Christmas

CHR programmers will have a hard time wiping the grins off their faces after listening to this excellent sophomore effort. All songs cry out for airplay, smooth but full of a natural vigour, with strong melodic hooks put right up front. A fairly even mix which slightly favours quick dancy songs over slower offerings should provide a necessary variety as the band's sound, albeit incredibly infectious, is somewhat uniform. Standouts include *Dizzy Heights*, *Lonely Streets*, *Sick Of It* and past UK hit *Way Behind Me*. A group that can manage to be thoroughly accessible while avoiding the insipid quality possessed by so much blatant pop music is deserving of the highest praise. - CM



TOMMY HUNTER - Country
 The Anniversary Sessions

Canada's Country Gentleman, Tommy Hunter returns to active recording with a package of good time country that should keep him on the singles charts for some time. Initial single release, *The Man of '87*, is a four-part MAPL single written by *Vernon Rust*. Also key is a duet with *Janie Fricke* of *Couldn't See The Gold*, an exceptional coupling that should attract airplay on both sides of the border. Celebrating the 25th anniversary of his CBC-TV country variety show, the longest running of its type in *North America*, Hunter is obviously revitalized with this *Gillies Godard* production emphasizing his obvious concern for the young country market. NEW MARINES - Pop
 Bonfire - Chameleon - D1-74755-W

While this album is well-written, well-performed and is definitely straight out pop, it sounds a lot more like the state of *Top 40* about six years ago than radio's current diet. The slower *Too Far* is strongly reminiscent of *Duran Duran*. The best bets are the aggressive, but unfortunately slick, rockers *Stranger Than A Stranger* and *Mescal Rodeo*. 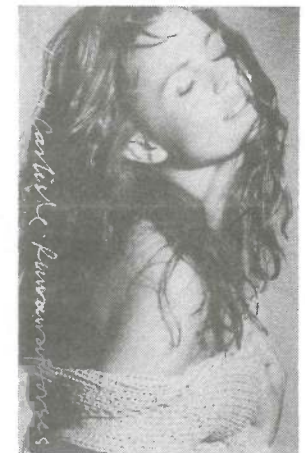
SYLVIA TYSON - Country

A chart pleaser, Tyson's latest single, the title track, was an immediate add at most country stations on release. This is not the usual laid-back, elevator type of country. Every track commands attention. Tyson's vocal qualities, can project an edge, but a warmth as well, a quality cultivated over the years of writing and performing music from "the heart" namely folk, country and pop. There should also be some *Adult Contemporary* crossover action here for the more aggressive programmers. With follow-up single *Principals Office* somewhat undercutting *Bust A Move* in its chart climb, this MC continues to make a name outside rap circles. Young's appreciation for all forms of music is clear and in no way does he commit rap suicide by limiting himself to the bounds of his genre. The entire album is filled with hot rhythms and choruses, with the hooks to sell on any mainstream CHR station. Worthy of acclaim from any camp as one of the better new artists. (CD Reviewed) - RG



BELINDA CARLISLE - Pop
 Runaway Horses

Like her second solo effort, *Heaven On Earth*, this work is once again a very well packaged group effort. Having co-written only one track, *Carlisle's* voice is put together with a handful of songwriters and guests. *Bryan Adams* and *George Harrison* provide backing vocals and a guitar solo, respectively, to bring even more marketing power to this CHR rich work. Any one of these chorus-with-a-hook tracks could find play. - RG

Troke launches retailer video assist company

Tim Troke, a Toronto video entrepreneur who developed the closed circuit program for A&W restaurants in Canada, has launched Troke Video Music (TVMi), a company that will concentrate on developing closed circuit programming for retail in North America.

TVMi will consult with retailers on the effective use of video in their stores. "Lots of retailers have it but don't use it very effectively," says Troke. "I'm going to take what we have been doing in the hospitality industry for years and apply it to retailers, using music video and non-music video formats. Once we are finished the retailer will be able to run the program himself and avoid any third party markups. Of course, we'll be

around to maintain quality and creative."

Troke is off to a healthy start, distributing Musicvision, a 90-minute program, to 350 music retailers across Canada. These include HMV, Top 40 and A&A Records & Tapes. Musicvision comprises 20 music videos which are tagged continuously allowing customers to always know what is on the screen. Tracking is done by phone and personal visits and updated on a monthly basis. The program, which for the present, combines rock, pop and country, will eventually be formatted into individual tapes for each music form.

Sound Source launches Decade - a radio special

Sound Source has announced the national launch of Decade, a 26-hour radio special that "recaptures" rock in the 1980's," says Sound Source's Lesley Soldat, "presenting musical and cultural highlights of the past ten years." Soldat goes on to point out that Decade "will take the listener on a journey of musical evolution through a dramatic period in rock history from the death of punk and the synthesizer, to rock's new social conscience to the truly 'corporate' rock of 1989."

The special will be heard in one-hour segments Monday to Friday during the month of December with a six-hour wrap up on New Year's Eve or New Year's Day.

Currently signed on for the special are CFOX-FM Vancouver, CKKQ-FM Victoria, CKIK-FM Calgary, CJRK-FM Edmonton, CFMC-FM Saskatoon, CIZL-FM Regina, CITI-FM Winnipeg, Q107-FM Toronto, CJSB Ottawa, CFPL-FM London, CHOM-FM Montreal, CJMO-FM Moncton and Q104 Halifax/Dartmouth. Some stations are airing the show within a different time structure. For further information contact Soldat at 416-922-1290.

As an assist to video retailers, TVMi, with the assistance of the Shannock Corp, has introduced Movievision which combines music video with movie trailers to form a 90-minute program that is consumer oriented. The program will run in 400 stores. "Our principal goal for this merchandising tool," Troke explains, "is to promote the video store as a total entertainment centre," continuing with, "We also want to promote sell-through video and music." The music video will be added free of charge. There are only 20 trailers allowed on one tape for this monthly program. Troke has also put together a MovievisionII program which is strictly dealer oriented. The program contains B title video cassettes with a minimum of 15 titles.

Old chain to bed trick pays off with radio action

Jeff Storry, WEA promotion representative in Winnipeg, used that old trick of chaining himself to a bed on the doorstep of a radio station to bring attention to an act the station was ignoring. The station in this case was CITI and the record, appropriately titled, was Sleeping My Day Away by D.A.D.

Storry took his own bed and a chest of drawers and set up shop on the doorstep of the station, vowing to stay under the covers until the station agreed to air the record. The bed was chained to a light standard at 6 am and, after a bit of a crush from morning traffic gawkers, the station gave in. Morning show personalities Dan Williams and Charlie Redmond aired the song just before 9 am, less than three hours after Storry took up his position. In view of listener requests, the station's Program Director, Ross Winters and Music Director, Gord Fry decided at 11 am to add the song to CITI's chart.

Besides the notoriety Storry received on the air and from rubbernecking light of dawn workers, he was featured, with photo, on the front page of the Winnipeg Free Press.

BX-93 gold to George Jones

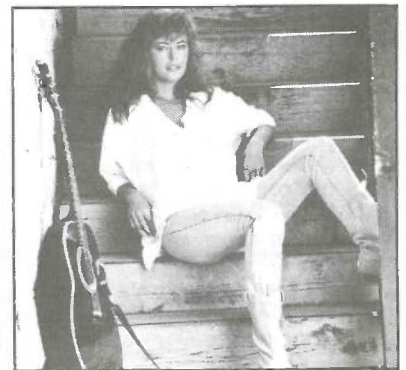
This past Thanksgiving weekend, London's BX-93 counted down the Top 300 country songs of all time and listeners were asked to nominate their three favourite tunes. The

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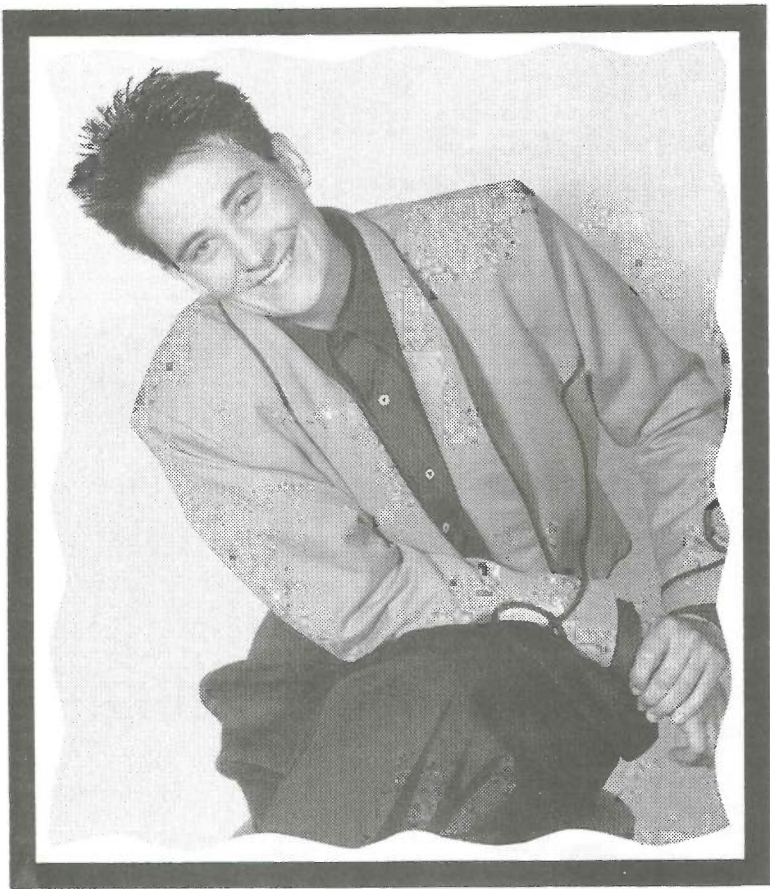

Sudbury's L'Etang fest now incorporated

Regarded as one of the largest French-language music festivals in Canada, La Nuit Sur L'Etang has finally been incorporated as a non-profit organization. Susan Sabourin, Vice President of the organization, explains that although the festival has been staged for the past seventeen years, "It was never incorporated for a variety of reasons."

The festival is held every spring at Laurentian University's Fraser Auditorium (Sudbury, Ontario). Says Sabourin, "Organizers believe that a permanent board of directors will enable La Nuit Sur L'Etang to make long range plans as well as maintain the presentation of high quality professional and non-professional performers."

Each year, the seven hours of non-stop music is featured nationally on the CBC's French radio network. As well, TV Ontario televises all performances and packages them into a series on its television network in Ontario.

The Board of Directors is chaired by Richard Malette. Board members comprise Henri Pallard, Marcel Vaillancourt, Michel Rodrigue and Luc Poulin. Poulin also heads up the executive committee which is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the festival. Also active on the board are Sabourin, Diane Perrault and Paul Demers. One position has yet to be filled on the executive committee.

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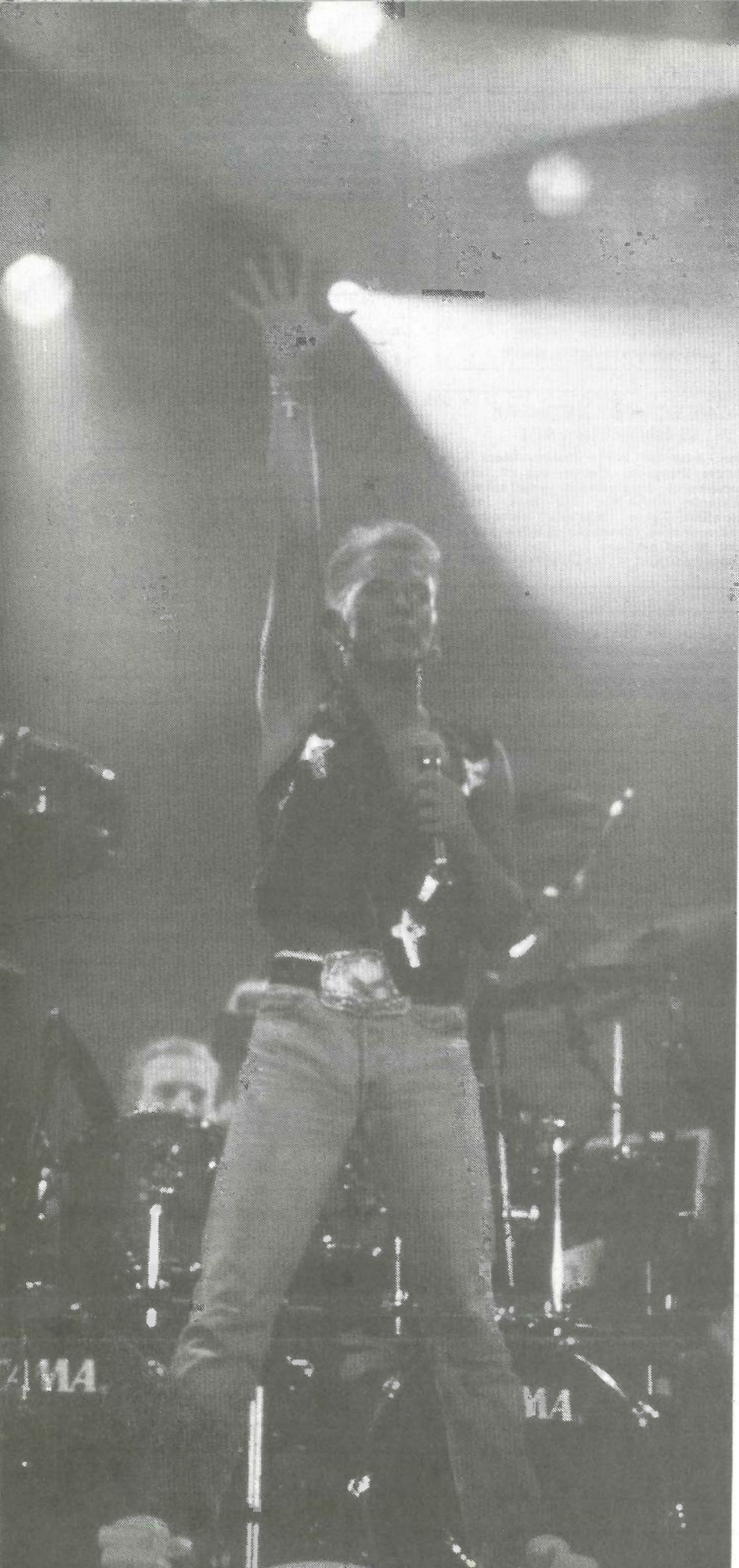
