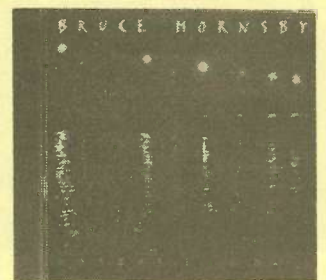

Canadian acts kick butt at SXSW conference

The Canadian contingent at the recent South by Southwest Music and Media Conference in Austin, Tex. met with a lot of success.

"Austin was one giant party," says Warner Music Canada's vice-president of A&R, Kim Cooke. "And one common comment that I heard was that the Canadian bands can stand tall with anything that was showcased there from around the world. And in many

The Gasworks is set for a big re-opening weekend

The Gasworks will soon be back.

After a couple of months of refurbishing, the Toronto entertainment landmark will once again open its doors to the public at 9 p.m. on April 8. The Razorbacks will baptize the club by performing songs from their soon to be released Tremolo album.

Ray Lyell will take the stage the next night and The Saddletramps will round out the opening weekend with a performance on April 10. There will be no cover charge for the first three nights.

Future performances at the club, which will boast a new look, sound and menu, will include: The Carpet Frogs (April 12-14); National Velvet (16); Leslie Spit Treeo (24); and the Downchild Blues Band (30).

Songwriters on Stage sponsored by SOCAN

Marc Jordan, Colin Linden, Amy Sky and Christopher Ward will be featured in two upcoming songwriter showcases sponsored by the Society of Composers, Authors and Music Publishers of Canada (SOCAN).

The first showcase will be at Centennial Hall in London, Ont. on April 22 and the second will be at Toronto's Bathurst Street Theatre on April 25.

The four performers will sing their own material and share stories behind the songs they've written for such artists as Reba McEntire, Diana Ross, Anne Murray, Melissa Manchester, Chicago, Rod Stewart, Alannah Myles, Peter Cetera, Harem Scarem, Marylou Zahalan, George Fox, Michelle Wright, The Band and Heart.

cases they were clearly superior to the competition."

The conference featured 400 bands and 2,000 industry people. More than 100 major label A&R people attended the event, which included performances by 17 Canadian acts. Canada was well-represented in Austin, but more Canadian industry people might have attended the world's third largest music conference had it not been for the events in Toronto which led up to this year's Juno Awards. The conflicting schedules also meant that some American and international industry people chose Austin ahead of Toronto.

Intrepid Records' Graham Stairs helped organize Canada's representation in Austin and he reports that the Canadian showcase was packed, its booth attracted a lot of attention, and shows by Blue Rodeo and Alberta's Huevos Rancheros sold out.

One of the highlights of the conference, according to Stairs, was a road hockey game pitting a team of Canadians against a team of American A&R people. The Canadian team, which featured members of Spirit of the West, Big Faith and One among others, defeated the Americans 10-2. Blue Rodeo's James Gray played both the Canadian and American national anthems on the accordion before the game.

Lang and Cockburn confirmed for Earth Day

K.D. Lang and Bruce Cockburn will perform at the national Earth Day Show at the Hollywood Bowl in Los Angeles on April 16.

The two Canadians will share the bill with Paul McCartney, 10,000 Maniacs, Steve Miller and others. This will be Cockburn's third consecutive appearance at an Earth Day show. His first two were at Foxborough Stadium in Massachusetts.

Cockburn is currently in Los Angeles putting the finishing touches on his new album with producer T-Bone Burnett. The album is scheduled for a summer release. The album's production began earlier this year in Woodstock, N.Y.

A&F Music Ltd. signs to manage Chieftains

A&F Music Ltd., in a joint venture with Stephen Macklam, has signed The Chieftains to a worldwide management deal, effective May 1.

The Chieftains have released 30 albums in the past 30 years and won two Grammys at this year's awards ceremonies.

A&F Music Ltd. is the parent company of S.L. Feldman & Associates and Bruce Allen Talent. S.L. Feldman & Associates' operations include talent booking, artist management, film-music supervision and Characters, an agency representing theatrical talent. Bruce Allen Talent's management roster includes such clients as Bryan Adams, Bachman Turner Overdrive, Rockhead, Loverboy and producers Bruce Fairbairn and Bob Rock. Macklam manages Virgin recording artist Colin James.

Top of Sutton Place is setting for Big Country

The Big Country Awards banquet will be held on the 33rd floor of Toronto's Sutton Place on May 30.

The annual country event will be taped for television that night and edited and telecast at a later date.

Big Country co-founder Stan Klees is pleased that the CBC will be doing the show for the second time. "With the kind of ratings we got last year, and with the more elaborate set-up we have for this year, I'm sure the show will attract many more viewers when it is edited to one hour and shown later. The show will be shot against the background of the Toronto skyline and I would like to re-create the feeling we had at the original Junos back in the early '70s. I can't think of a better place to hold the country music social event of the year than in the hotel to the stars."

This year's nominees will be announced shortly.

Again this year, the Variety Club will salute the Big Country Awards at a luncheon on May 28 at the Royal York Hotel in Toronto.

Merenda is director of Sony national promotion

Nat Merenda is Sony Music Canada's new director of national promotion.

Merenda will direct radio and chart priorities of all of Sony's international and domestic artist roster. All of Sony's promotional representatives will report to Merenda.

Merenda joined CBS Records in December 1985 as an Epic promotional representative. He became a Columbia promo rep in September 1990, and during that time he was a three time winner of the Sony Music Promotion Representative of the Year Award. In June 1992 he was promoted to promotion manager of Sony's eastern region.

Canadian Music Week raises charity funding

More than \$30,000 was raised for charity during this year's Canadian Music Week.

The Rock For The Children auction and party, featuring a performance by Randy Bachman, raised \$20,000. The net proceeds went to the Q107 Kids Fund, the Hospital For Sick Children, the Children With AIDS Fund and the Children's Wish Foundation of Ontario.

Native Beat, a celebration of contemporary Canadian aboriginal talent, raised \$2,500 for UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) in support of the United Nations' International Year for the World's Indigenous People.

And the annual Rock 'N' Bowl with the Stars Celebrity Challenge raised \$10,000 in support of the CARAS Academic Fund, the Variety Club, the Children's Wish Foundation and the T.J. Martel Foundation.

CBC's on a roll . . . ! Fresh from incredible ratings for the Juno Awards (2.18 million), the CBC cashed in with more phenomenal overnight ratings (2.7 million) for the March 28 airing of Anne Murray In Nova Scotia. The warm, homespun special was one of those quietly engaging shows that producer/director Sandra Faire has built her reputation on. Through the roving eye of the television camera, the rest of Canada had a window on one of the country's most beautiful provinces. Catching the step-dancing Rankin Family on a pier among lobster pots and again in the warm confines of a lodge, and seeing the Gospel Heirs doing what they do best in church, was pretty eye-grabbing stuff. Anne Murray and her dry wit, of course, was the glue that kept everything in place, not to mention her musical numbers, including a rare duet with Rita MacNeil. The show ended on a high with a memorable helicopter shot of the whole gang, plus the Men of the Deepes, in a picture postcard setting, singing Leon Drabinsky's

Rise Again . . . a fitting finale. Pretty grabbing stuff. (EC: *Homespun . . . ?*)

The Anne Murray touch!!! Many believe that Anne Murray's influence on the Junos had a lot to do with the healthy ratings of both the Junos and her CBC special that followed. The expanded scope of the Junos was something the industry has fought for over the years. The glitzy production of the Junos and the fact that it was all Cancon had a lot to do with its success. The CBC and the Juno people are getting the idea. Under Ivan Fecan, the CBC has begun to build a star system with the music industry. Television shows that contain and promote Cancon are beginning to attract viewers because they aren't watered down with two-bit foreign acts. CARAS topper Dave Charles came in to save the Juno show, which had been written off by many in the industry, and made the right changes. He also did a lot of fence-mending, and it showed on the screen. This could all be the beginning of a new era in Cancon and the star system in Canada. (EC: *Eat your heart out Bruce Allen!!!!*)

Plaid should play forever!!! Laurence Follows and Jeffrey Latimer have a musical hit they can be proud of. The talented production team moved into the newly renovated New Yorker Theatre (previously the Showcase movie house in downtown Toronto) with a very bright and polished Canadian company of Forever Plaid. This show puts the hit parade on stage and the four-guy vocal groups that were happening from 1948 through 1964. This is nostalgia, sincerely woven together by four youngsters who weren't even a gleam in their father's eyes during this time frame. The producers were clever not to allow an intermission as the quartet creates a time warp around the 30-odd oldies hits that many of us oldies fondly remember. Particularly grabbing was the almost four minute spoof on the Ed Sullivan Show with trained seals, trapeze artists, hoop-flying dogs and more. It was a laugh-a-minute creation. Sparky, Smudge, Jinx and Frankie, who are Forever Plaid, get to perform the show they missed when they were killed in an auto accident on the way to the Fusel Lounge of the Airport Hilton on Feb. 9, 1964. The Four Lads, Crewcuts, Four Aces, Four Freshmen, and Hi-Los aren't there, but through the talent of this incredibly gifted foursome, they are, in song, just as many of us remembered. The show builds throughout but never peaks. This is a romp through rock history using a strange but loveable vehicle, Forever Plaid. The show should run forever. What great musical years they were. (EC: *Sounds like the music business to me. Where were the Four Lads, Crewcuts and Diamonds from anyway?????*) Cancon strikes again!!!

What's in? New country!!! The billboards, the kisses, mugs and sundry other campaign items to establish CISS-FM's new country format as a major influence in Toronto are just the outside dressing. If the programming material doesn't capture the listener, forget it. And we've had a bunch of examples over the years of how disastrous this can be. I'm still predicting that CISS-FM will be among the

top five in the next book. Anne Murray and Michelle Wright, two of the top-selling country acts in Canada, helped launch the station. Not bad strategy, wouldn't you agree? New Country, a song written by Barry Brown and produced by Randall Prescott and starring the cream of Cancon country, including Prairie Oyster, Cassandra Vasik, Don Neilson, Lisa Brokop, Patricia Conroy, Gary Fjellgaard and others, is being programmed daily as a hit. In the couple of hours each day that I listen to the station, I've heard records by Colleen Peterson, George Fox, Tracey Prescott & Lonesome Daddy and newcomer Jim Witter. The station is committed to 32 per cent Cancon, and I'll bet they're up over that commitment quite often. I like the sound. There's a nice mix of the traditional, though thankfully not too much, with contemporary country and some off-the-wall pop renderings that can only attract that young FM listener who likes the odd jolt. (EC: *Credit, where credit's due?*)

Bitchy! Bitchy! Bitchy! That one trick pony, who can't cut it again, caused a bit of a nasty scene at Canada's only talk-Cancon variety show last week. Was stardom a little too premature? Is there time to kiss and make up and start all over again? Most of those who have seen the ugly side agree that there can't be a new beginning. It's all but over. Too bad attitudes destroy great talent, but haven't you seen it happen time and time again? (EC: *Talk about ambiguity . . . !*)

Clubs were packed for industry showcases

A&R feeding frenzy as bands invade Toronto

More than 100 acts from across the country converged on Toronto in the week preceding the Juno Awards in hope of impressing someone enough to maybe land a contract. Well, no deals have been announced yet, but RPM talked to a number of A&R people from the major Canadian labels to find out their likes and dislikes concerning Canadian Music Week.

Many were impressed by the quality and quantity of Canadian talent, while others thought that a lot of bands had jumped the gun and showcased before allowing themselves a chance to fully develop both their music and stage presence.

Without a doubt, the biggest buzz from the week surrounded Liquid Bone Dance, a hard rocking alternative band from Winnipeg. "A lot of us had seen them in the fall when they were called Twist Of Fate, and I thought they had a tonne of potential," says Cam Carpenter, MCA's director of A&R. "I think they realized that potential that week."

About the only person who didn't get

excited over Liquid Bone Dance was David Bendeth, BMG's vice-president of A&R, who says, "I found myself being one of the few people that didn't go crazy over the bands that everyone went crazy over."

Some of those bands that people "went crazy over" were part of the Newfoundland showcase which packed the Horseshoe on St. Patrick's Day. Kim Stockwood, a country singer who has now relocated to Toronto, and the Irish Descendants, a group of 30-something men who play both original and traditional Celtic songs, both impressed.

Anahai (Toronto), Universal Honey (Toronto), Cactus Juice (Toronto), 98DA (Toronto), 49 Acres (Toronto), Scott B. Sympathy (Toronto), Fishtales (Ottawa), Furnaceface (Ottawa), Me Mom & Morgentaler (Montreal), Eric's Trip (Moncton, N.B.), King Cobb Stealie (Guelph, Ont.), and Malhavoc (Pickering, Ont.) were also named as favourites.

Seven provinces took over clubs to present showcases, which everyone thought was a good idea. "I think it's a great opportunity for bands to come from around Canada to gather in one place with all the A&R people," says Richard Zuckerman, Sony's vice-president of A&R.

"It's an intensive week of one-stop shopping," says Warner vice-president of A&R, Kim Cooke. "It's good for the bands too, a lot of which don't always have the ability or the financial wherewithal to tour to the degree they might like. So if they're supported by their provinces in getting out here, that type of synergy is a positive thing."

Bendeth likes the idea of provincial

showcases, but questions the criteria for selecting who got to be in them. "I didn't feel we had the pick of the crop from each province. From the music I've been receiving lately, I can probably name you two or three bands from each province that I would have preferred to have been there. And, in speaking to a lot of the people from the provinces, I don't think that they felt, in general, that the provinces were totally represented."

Allan Reid, A&M's director of A&R, enjoyed the provincial showcases, but also put in a vote for Toronto talent. "I think a lot of us tend to overlook the local acts that we see all the time like The Lowest of the Low or Junkhouse or Hhead. Those are all great bands. The thing is that when someone is coming in from out of town, you tend to go see those shows."

But Bendeth is pleased that so many acts are now coming out of more far-flung places, and that everything doesn't have to revolve around Toronto. "It's a whole different structure that's happening, whereas before, no-one talked about anybody from Halifax except for Matt Minglewood. Now you've got a whole scene happening there.

"And Vancouver's been happening for 10 years. Winnipeg now has come alive. Edmonton and Calgary are next. I've got a feeling that by the end of next year, we'll all be going up to the Yukon to see groups. It's a healthy scene. There are Americans watching our acts."

There were, however, a few problems with the way the week was set up. One of the biggest complaints was that schedules of exactly when bands would be playing weren't posted. Although many of the clubs used during the week were along the relatively compact Queen St. W. strip, when five acts a night are playing at each club and you want to see acts at more than one of them, it can make time management difficult. "In the context of a very crowded playing field, in terms of the number of bands, that's something that you can't have," says Cooke.

Jody Mitchell, EMI Music Canada's manager of talent acquisition and artist

development, also felt that some of the venues might have been inappropriate for some showcases. "I think they underestimated the turn-outs because all the clubs were jammed, which is great for the bands and it inspires them to play, but I think there could have been a little more room."

All in all, it was generally agreed that the week was a success and should be continued next year. But the bottom line remains, will any bands be signed as a result of it?

Bendeth says he's looking at two bands as possibilities. "There were a lot of mediocre things going on, so I'm trying to figure out whether the things that I saw that I liked were

basically just better than mediocre, or were they actually great."

Reid says, "I don't know if any one band

came out with a deal or anything like that, if there was anything that impressive, but I think there were definitely a lot of things that people will be nibbling on more so than anything else."

Mitchell believes it's still too early to talk about potential deals, but his curiosity has been piqued. "There certainly was interest generated on quite a few fronts. I wouldn't want to be any more specific than that now. Some of those bands that I was talking about are signed independently but have distribution through major labels, so I'm looking at those and seeing when those deals are up."

Carpenter emphasized that there was a lot of talent displayed during the week, and that both he and the other A&R representatives may have a number of decisions to make over the coming months. "Some deals will probably come out of this, maybe not immediately, but I know a lot of the other A&R guys are buzzing about a few bands. We're all pretty aware of what others are doing. And there seems to be enough right now for everyone to get a little piece, which is nice."

McKennitt visits Europe with Mike Oldfield

Loreena McKennitt has been globetrotting while her most recent Quinlan Road/Warner album, *The Visit*, is closing in on double platinum status in Canada.

McKennitt has spent the last month in Morocco researching material for her upcoming, as yet untitled, fifth album, which should be ready for release this fall. After a brief return home, McKennitt set off for Europe to open seven dates for Mike Oldfield.

The Visit has been released in more than 40 territories around the world and its engineers, Jeff Wolpert and John Whynot, recently won a Juno Award for the song *The Lady Of Shallott*.

Now a star in Canada, Kennedy's looking south

As the youngest of eight children growing up in Douglas Harbour, N.B., Joan Kennedy began singing in a church choir with her musical family. She continued through high school and got her first break by winning the Bud Country Talent Search competition in 1983. The next year, with the help of the Mercey Brothers, she recorded her first album.

Now, almost a decade later, Kennedy is cresting on the success of her recent MCA album, *Higher Ground*. The first single, *I Need To Hear It From You*, was a Top 10 country hit. And her latest song, *Talk To My Heart*, is also moving quickly up the RPM 100 Country Tracks chart. Kennedy is particularly proud of *Higher Ground* because it reflects her own personality more than her past efforts.

"This album is a little bit tougher," she says. "The sound is more traditional and more country. It's going back to where I came from."

Luckily for Kennedy, country music seems to be growing in popularity. She feels she no longer has to cross over into more of a pop style to become successful; that she can continue singing the music she has always surrounded herself with.

Kennedy feels her vocal range has grown with the new album, but she still wants to write more to prove she's an all-around talent. She went through 1,000 songs submitted by writers from across North America before settling on the 11 which appear on *Higher Ground*. "On the next couple of albums I'd like to have at least one cut that I helped pen," she says. "I don't think that would be too difficult to do."

Kennedy raised her Canadian profile by hosting her own weekly half-hour variety television show out of Halifax from 1989-91. But the TV series can't explain her success in Europe, where she boasts of outselling Randy Travis.

Coch International distributes Kennedy's albums in the United Kingdom, Scandinavia and the Benelux countries. She has completed two European tours and a third is in the works for August. "They love country music over there," she says. "They're very devoted to the whole package of country. They come in with cowboy hats and boots and spurs. It's really great to see. I think if they had more access to it, it would be more successful."

With two territories conquered, Kennedy is now poised to break into the American market. She was the featured performer at a Canadian Country Music Association-sponsored showcase at the recent Country Radio Seminar in Nashville, where she impressed a large crowd of American broadcasters and other industry heavyweights. Although no American deal has yet been signed as a result of the showcase, Kennedy believes it at least put her foot in the door.

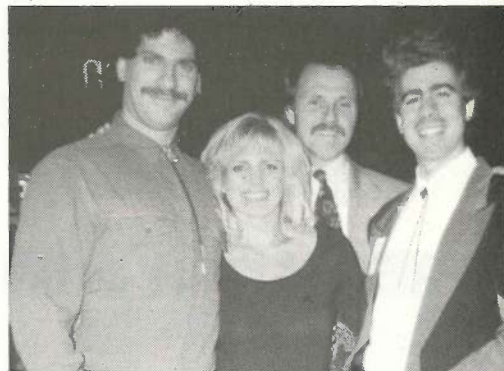
At this relatively early stage in her career, Kennedy has already joined Hank Snow, Wilf Carter and Don Messer in the New Brunswick Country Music Hall of Fame. But the man she married last fall works in Maine, so she will soon be moving south of the border.

"Canadians have a hard time accepting the fact that we artists go to America," she says. "It's not that you want to leave your country, it's just that you want to get your music heard by the masses."

Though Kennedy will play Canadian dates throughout the spring and summer, she says that because of the limited domestic market, you won't see her in a video until she's secured a U.S. deal. "We'd rather put our energies behind the album and market the album, as opposed to spending \$50,000 on a video.

"Having distribution in the U.S. is probably a crucial part in having video play.

If people see the video and they can't go out and buy the product, then they're going to forget about it until the next time they see the video. After a while they're just going to get tired of looking, so I think it's important to have everything in place before we actually do it."

*Consumer magazine will promote Canadian music***SoundCan given new life with Gregg as publisher**

SoundCan, a consumer magazine dedicated to Canadian music which was faced with extinction after just one issue, has been rescued by a new publisher.

Allan Gregg and his company, Roll Music Ltd., took over SoundCan from Keith Sharp and K Sharp Music Enterprises Inc. on March 1, and has now published two issues of the magazine.

"I've always felt that a national consumer magazine, dedicated to Canadian music, was central to a strong and vibrant musical community in Canada," Gregg says.

A new No. 1. Sting's If I Ever Lose My Faith In You climbs into the No. 1 spot on the Hit Tracks chart. It is his second song to reach the top. All This Time reached the top of the chart two years ago.

Occupational hazard . . ! This is Sting's second No. 1 hit as a solo artist. As a member of The Police, he hit the top on three occasions. The Police is one of several artists with an occupational name to have a No. 1 song. Name other artists with a job title that have had a No. 1 song. There are at least five.

Continuing the trend. For the third week in a row, an album has debuted in the Top 10. Depeche Mode has had a strong following for many years and this release proves that following is still there. Songs Of Faith And Devotion enters at No. 7.

One more time. Michael Jackson is moving up the chart with his latest release from Dangerous. Who Is It moves up 23 spots to No. 44. The only song with a bigger jump is One Last Kiss from Sophia Shinas. It climbs 31 places to No. 62.

The language of music! New artists are dominating the best-sellers list of many record stores across the country. At Sam The Record Man store on St. Catharine St. W. in Montreal, Bill MacEwen reports five of the 10 hottest movers have been out less than a month. Here is their complete Top 10. 1. Depeche Mode 2. Sting 3. Coverdale-Page 4. Eric Clapton 5. The Bodyguard Soundtrack 6. Lenny Kravitz 7. Living Colour 8. Sade 9. Mick Jagger 10. Spin Doctors.

Don't get carried away. Depending on how far you stretch the rules, you could come up with a dozen artists that have an occupational name and have had a No. 1 song. I don't count Fine Young Cannibals, Zombies and Supertramp as professions. I also discount James Taylor for incorrect spelling. Tina Turner would qualify, but Vanna White is the only turner I know, so my list has five artists: Royal Guardsmen (Snoopy vs The Red Baron in 1967), The Carpenters (Five No. 1s in the '70s), Pilot (Magic in 1975), Doctor & The Medics (Spirit In The Sky in 1986), and Mike & The Mechanics (The Living Years in 1989).

Gregg's taking over of SoundCan could cause some controversy, however, as he and partner Jake Gold are the operators of Management Trust. The company manages such Canadian acts as The Tragically Hip, The Watchmen, Andrew Cash and David Gogo.

Obviously, many people will perceive a potential conflict of interest between Gregg's positions at Management Trust and SoundCan. (A short article on The Watchmen appears in the current issue.) Gregg is aware of this and says he may even go as far as discriminating against his acts in order to maintain the magazine's integrity.

"There is no safeguard against the conflict of interest other than common sense. You can't appear virtuous, all you can do is be virtuous," he says.

"If SoundCan looks like a shill for advancing the interests of my artists, other artists aren't going to participate. If that happens, the magazine isn't going to get the big feature interviews and it will undervalue the investment that I made."

Sharp had published Music Express and other publications for the past 17 years, and he put out the first issue of SoundCan late last year. Though he's proud of his accomplishments, he says he never had the major financial support or corporate clout needed to be competitive in a major way. "I basically made a decision to wind down my operation to allow for a new operation to come forward and take the spirit of what I'd achieved on to a higher level with the proper financial backing."

Gregg established a separate company, of which he is the sole shareholder, to publish SoundCan. While he won't disclose exactly how much he has invested in the magazine, he allows that it's "over six figures."

Sharp says of Gregg, "He didn't really want to be involved in the old luggage of the old operation. He wants to come in with a fresh start and a fresh outlook. He wants to know that the investment capital he's putting into the company is moving forward instead of handling past problems."

Part of Music Express' troubles were attributable to its distribution relationship with the bankrupt A&A Music and Entertainment Inc. retail chain.

Gregg says the new SoundCan will publish 100,000 copies monthly which will be available in "virtually all music retail chains," except Sam's, which has its own Network magazine. Some nightclubs are also carrying the magazine, but paid annual subscriptions are available for \$29.50.

As a subscription inducement, SoundCan will annually release six compact discs featuring Canadian artists to subscribers. Russian Prince vodka is sponsoring the CD program.

Gregg says he will have an arms-length relationship with the editorial staff, which will remain as is. His main initial concern is ensuring that SoundCan is profitable and that those profits are then re-invested back into the

magazine. He has hired Sharp on a consulting basis to help with the editorial and industry end of things. The new magazine is continuing much in the same vein as Sharp's, although it features some information on international artists, which the original SoundCan didn't.

Gregg would like to see more in-depth feature stories on Canadian artists and he's looking to increase both the magazine's budget and its quality of freelance writers.

"I don't see any reason in the world why this magazine shouldn't get Mordechai Richler to do an in-depth piece on Leonard Cohen. That, in turn, would become the definitive source, to be quoted in publications throughout the world, on Leonard Cohen. I want people to talk about the articles."

Music Express, which had a more international focus than SoundCan and was distributed in the United States, has been put on hold at least temporarily. Gregg says it would take a significant re-evaluation and restructuring of financial and distribution arrangements before he would consider starting it up again.

Publishing SoundCan is just the latest of Gregg's endeavours. He is also the Canadian chairman of the Hill and Knowlton public relations firm, chairman of Decima Research, a director in CARAS, a director on the executive committee of YTV, and a director of Standard Broadcasting.

Gregg is in the last year of his contract with Decima, a company he founded, and he says he will also look into scaling back his other activities in order to give SoundCan the attention it deserves.

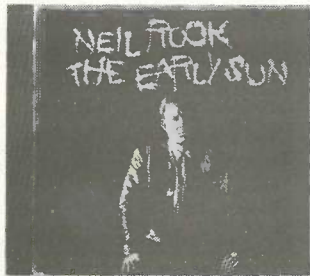

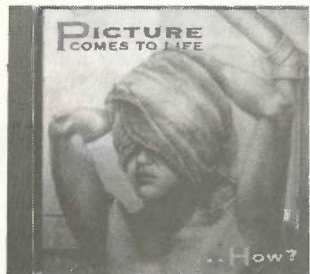

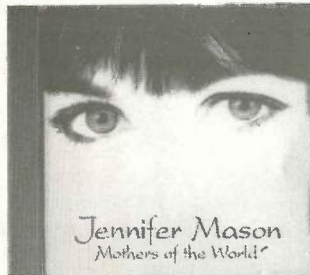

NEIL ROOK - Pop/Rock
The Early Sun
 Crooked House/Trend - CHCD101
 This debut from Vancouver's Rook shows him to be a very talented singer/songwriter. At various times the album mixes folk rock, pop, rock and country elements, and Rook's backing band, The Have-nots, handle it all with aplomb. The first single and video, Walkin' Backwards On My Knees, is a peace-oriented pop song highlighted by Tom Keenlyside's sax playing. A video for the folk rock follow-up, Fifteen Restless Virgins, is expected in May. Crooked House and Faith In The City, where Rook's voice bears more than a passing resemblance to Ian Hunter's, are the best of the rockier numbers. Rook's vocals have more of an edge on Jack The Ripper's Grandson, another song where Keenlyside's saxophonist stands out. A violin is effectively added to the mix on Good Evening #93. The Old And The New, Isn't Anybody and the title track are also recommended. Major labels should take note of this one. - SM

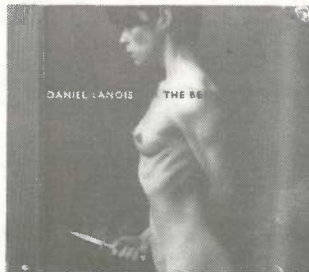


PICTURE COMES TO LIFE - Pop

 Toronto's Picture Comes To Life was formed in 1985 and received a 1989 CASBY nomination for most promising group on the strength of its self-titled BMG distributed debut. The band, comprised of Kathryn Manx (vocals, piano), Ron Proulx (vocals, guitar, keyboards, percussion) and Shelly Hines (vocals), is back again with an album of gentle pop music. A number of guest vocalists and musicians also contributed to this Proulx production. When I Fall is the first single and video. I'll Be There For You and Jimmy Had A Baby, the only song on which Proulx handles lead vocals, are my personal picks. - SM

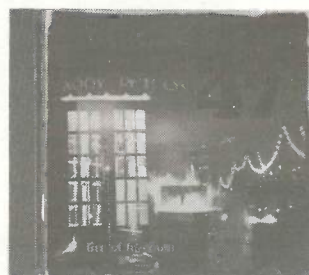


JENNIFER MASON - World music
Mothers of the World
 Lul-Ah-Bye Holdings - LHCD001
 This album didn't put me to sleep, though on an album full of lullabies, I'm not sure if that's a good thing or not. Mason is a personable Toronto-based lyric soprano

and, along with keyboardist/producer Paul Gilman, she has released an album dedicated to all mothers. This album features six traditional lullabies from around the world, which have been re-arranged by Mason and Gilman, and three originals. Yemanja is an Afro-Cuban lullaby, Nana comes from Spain, Suo-Gan from Wales, Byzantium from Greece, Nenneko from Japan, and Cayuga from the Cayuga Indians. Akanda, one of the originals, is heavily influenced by East Indian music. The closing track, Gaia's Song (about Mother Earth), features nature sounds and messages in Sanskrit, Russian, Arabic, Armenian, Dutch, Japanese, Urdu, Gujarati, Polish and English. The appeal of Mothers of the World may be limited, but those interested can file it along with those Windham Hill new age-type albums. - SM

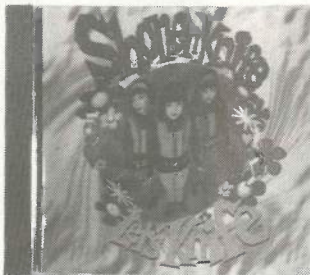


DANIEL LANOIS - Pop/Rock
For The Beauty of Wynona
 Warner Bros. - CDW 45303-P
 Lanois is known most as a producer for such artists as U2, Peter Gabriel, Robbie Robertson and The Neville Brothers, but this is his second solo album. Of course he produced it too. Aside from Lanois on guitar and vocals, the album features long-time collaborator Malcolm Burn on guitar and keyboards, Bill Dillon on guitar, guitorgan and mandolin, and the New Orleans-based rhythm section of Daryl Johnson on bass and vocals and Ronald Jones on drums. This is a somewhat understated album, but more band-oriented than Lanois' debut, Acadie. Sleeping In The Devil's Bed, which was originally recorded for the Until The End Of The World soundtrack, should please many. Brother L.A., Death Of A Train, The Unbreakable Chain and Rocky World are other highlights. The album's title refers neither to Ryder nor Judd, but to a small southern Ontario town outside Lanois' native Hamilton. The cover may cause some retailers to rack this less predominantly than they otherwise might. - SM

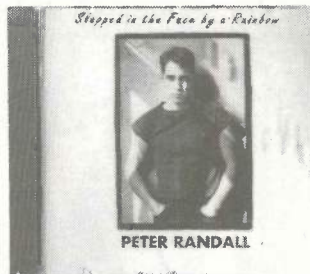


BLACK 47 - Rock
Fire Of Freedom

 This album from New York City's Black 47 is one of the most interesting debut albums to come out this year. The band mixes traditional Irish influences, rock guitar and an occasional dash of hip hop, with lyrics that encompass everything from politics to getting personally polluted. Perhaps we could call the group the thinking person's House Of Pain. Larry Kirwan is the main man behind the band. He wrote the songs, sings them, plays guitar and co-produced the album with The Cars' Ric Ocasek. In addition to bass, drum and guitar, other instruments appearing on Fire Of Freedom include saxophones, Uilleann pipes, tin whistles, bodhran, keyboards and trombone. Funky Ceili (Bridie's Song) is the first emphasis track and video. Rockin' The Bronx backs up an autobiographical rap by Kirwan with traditional Celtic music.

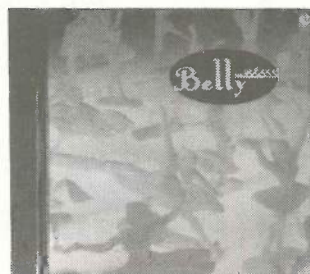
The title track ends with some dancehall reggae featuring toasting by the Bad Brains' Darryl Jennifer. New York, NY 10009 is another autobiographical yarn. Maria's Wedding and Livin' In America respectively show both the party time and more sombre sides to Black 47. - SM

 There is a god. After going through the first three months of the year without hearing an album that truly excited me, I encountered these three bubbly young women from Japan. Shonen Knife's first domestically released, all-English album took me back 15 years to the joyous time when I first discovered the somewhat similar kitschy punk and power pop of The Rezillos. The singing and the playing certainly isn't great, and the lyrics are silly and often childish, but damn it, it's fun. And isn't that what rock and roll is supposed to be? Radio will probably be afraid of this, but Let's Knife could be a fun album to promote at retail. After all, the band has attracted a cult following, including more than 30 American bands which contributed Shonen Knife covers on the recent Every Band Has A Shonen Knife That Loves Them tribute album. Cross your fingers for some Canadian appearances. - SM

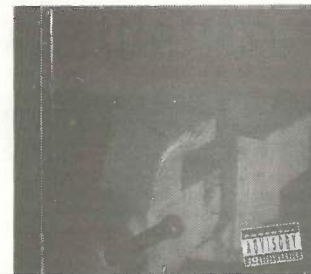


PETER RANDALL - Folk rock

 Randall is a sensitive singer/songwriter from Toronto who can sing songs about racism, war, the environment, gun control and other social ills without becoming too preachy. Randall produced the album and the backing music to his tales comes across as being more than adequate. His high-pitched vocal style is unique, with the closest comparison I can think of being Roland Gift from Fine Young Cannibals. The first single, What Kind Of World Are We Living In?, a song which decries Canada's current state of affairs, is the best on the album. - SM

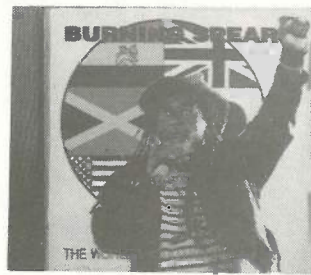


BELLY - Pop/Rock

and The Breeders, two popular bands with the alternative crowd. But, with the melodic hooks found on Belly's debut album, Donnelly has the potential to cross over and enjoy more mainstream success. The band's recent appearance on the Letterman show won't hurt either. Most of the songs on Sire were produced by Tracy Chisholm and the band, but the standouts are the four tracks handled by Pixies producer Gil Norton. Of particular note is Feed The Tree, one of the best singles released so far this year. The danceable, easy to hum along with pop song has enjoyed a stay at #1 at CFNY-FM in Toronto for the past few weeks. Gepetto and Slow Dog are also outstanding. - SM



FIREHOSE - Rock

 This is the fifth album (third for Columbia) from a trio of veteran eccentric alterna-rockers which was formed in the mid-'80s by the two surviving members of The Minutemen and one of that group's fans, Ed (fromohio) Crawford. Disciples Of The 3-Way, with its slight jangly rockabilly feel, may be the most commercially accessible song on the album. But tracks like Formal Introduction, Blaze, Herded Into Pools, Rocket Sled/Fuel Tank and The Cliffs Thrown Down should all have appeal at campus and alternative radio. Mr. Machinery Operator was produced by Dinosaur Jr.'s J. Mascis, which may help raise its profile. Firehose is an exciting live act which has attracted a dedicated following over the years. - SM



BURNING SPEAR - Reggae
The World Should Know
 Heartbeat/Denon - CD HB 119
 Winston Rodney (Burning Spear) hasn't tried to cash in on the current dancehall craze, but instead gives us more of the conscious reggae music he's been making for almost 25 years. The four-time Grammy nominee is a reggae legend and The World Should Know should do nothing to sully his reputation. I Stand Strong, Identity, It's Not A Crime and the title track are all excellent. Another winner, Mi Gi Dem (I Give Them), gets additional kudos for mentioning Canada. - SM

THE CANDY SKINS - Pop/Rock
Fun?
 Geffen - GEFD-24494-J
 This five-piece band hails from Oxford, England and, no, none of the members attended university there. The group's second Geffen album contains some fine '60s influenced pop featuring two electric guitars and one acoustic. Wembley is a rocking fast-paced love song which harkens back to England's 1966 World Cup soccer victory. The guitar pop/rock on Dig It Deep is equally energetic. House At The Top Of The Hill and Land Of Love both take a cynical view of love. Tired Of Being Happy and Let's Take Over The World are two more clever pop nuggets. Fun? Yes. - SM

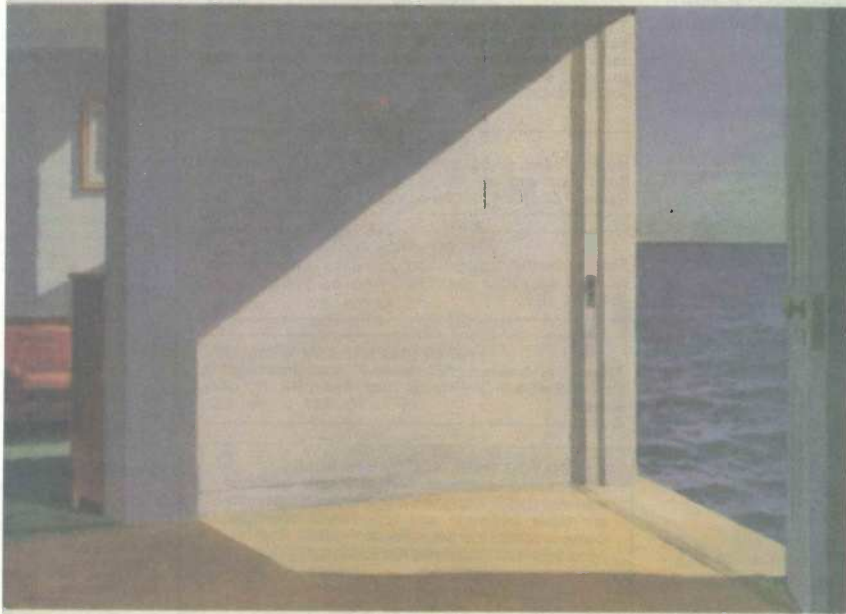
