WALRUS STATISTICS

Our statistics are a quantitative reflection of current LP acceptance based on our contributors' reports. Progressive Retail Reaction is derived from Top 15 retail reports while New Retail Action is derived from New Reaction reports. Both are weighted to compensate for the size of the store chain.

Radio Emphasis is computed by counting radio reports of Audience Reaction and Heavy Airplay. (Heavy Airplay new additions are not included.) New Releases to Watch is calculated by counting all indicated New Additions and weighing them according to heavy or moderate play. All calculations are first done regionally then combined to form the national totals.

NEW RELEASES

Below is a catalogue of new releases. They are divided into categories designed to give you an idea of their relative musical worth. These first impressions are not meant to relate in anyway to past, present or future sales, nor should they be taken as the word of God.

SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

Bob Marley & The Wailers/LIVE!/Island ILPS 9376 (Previously reviewed as an import. Seven of Marley's great tunes drive this audience to tears on every level. His music attacks the soma and intellect with equal force. Our only reservation is that the album introduces no new songs but, the Lp's magic compensates.)

Stevie Wonder/SONGS IN THE KEY OF LIFE/Tamla T13-34062 (It's a bore continually calling Stevie Wonder a genius, but, he is. He is incapable of a bad melody and he doesn't stop his musical development. Songs... is the rare case of a 2 record set that should have been.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(The following Lps are Merit Albums which we feel have an extra edge.)

Eric Clapton/NO REASON TO CRY/RSORS 1-3004 (This album is a delight not because it is so much better than others rather it is because it exudes assurance. There is no pressure to succeed, artistically or financially. Both are assured and an air of confidence pervades each song. The cream rises to the top.)

Steeleye Span/ROCKET COTTAGE/Chrysalis CHR 1123 (There was a time when we suffered from traditional English overkill. That situation has changed as the other groups have stepped further and further away. Suffice it to say that this lovely Steeleye Lp comes as a fresh breeze in some stale air.)

Strawbs/DEEP CUTS/Polydor OY 1-1603 (A supercharged Strawbs mounts a veritable offensive on its own music. As long as David Couzins' voice is audible all is well. Lots of good songs sustain quality throughout.)

Robin Trower/LONG MISTY DAYS/Chrysalis CHR-1107 (Credit must go to Trower as he writes a lesson to lesser power band talents. While Robin gives no quarter in power he also never sacrifices the song. His power isn't a smoke-screen, it is illumination and emphasis.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(This is a temporary category to help distinguish these Merit Albums which tend, in our opinion, to be better than the other Merit Albums. There may be only a percentage point's difference between them but, with the volume of good albums around it seems necessary to make the distinction.)

Joe Bonner/ANGEL EYES/Muse MR 5114 (Each side has a different character. Side one is dominated by two solo piano extrapolations of interest. While side two is more energized and musically challenging. All three tunes deserve attention each for its own message.)

Brian Cadd/WHITE ON WHITE/Capitol ST-11573 (All of the elements are properly in place, the songs are good and the arrangements and playing are at standard levels. It is Brian's singular singing which identifies this album and stamps it with flair. Best when he pushes it.)

Gavin Christopher/Island ILPS 9398 (It is not so much that Gavin brings something new to the state of the rhythm and blues art. He brings a fresh energy which the genre needs. His music is based in real songs, not symbolic, Sly chants or lush dance beats. Solid.)

Climax Blues Band/GOLD PLATED/Sire SASD 7523 (They don't charge the air with original ideas, Climax instead works their blues band turf through to rock bottom. A well disciplined unit which commands its quality material.)

Ned Doheny/HARD CANDY/Columbia PC 34259 (Ned recorded several years ago but was doomed to obscurity mostly because he wasn't writing as well as he is now. His days in the shadows are numbered. These tunes are naturals telling the new Doheny craftsmanship.)

Charles Earland/THE GREAT PYRAMID/Mercury SRM 1-1113 (In spite of string arrangements which could have been done following less standard patterns, this Charles Earland album has a touch of magic. A few super melodies are the major contribution but, their execution is more than merely a medium for communicating them. Solid throughout.)

Earth, Wind & Fire/SPIRIT/Columbia PC 34241 (Amazingly, complex rhythms remain articulate. Some are potent enough to maintain listener attention without melodies. But, in the end the tunes dominate. Earth, Wind & Fire repeat their familiar groove.)

El Chicano/THIS IS.../Shadybrook SB 33-005 (It is hard to believe that this is El Chicano's seventh album. Well it is true and it is also true that their Latin-rock finds quality. Mickey Lespron's guitar sings. The eleventh record promises to be even better.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Narvel Felts/DOIN' WHAT I FEEL/ABC Dot DOSD-2065 (Operating with the truest rock and roll heart and the purest motivation Narvel's open throated music charms. He may be a man out of his time but, he is genuinely doin' what he feels.)
- David Forman /Arista AL 4084 (A musical second cousin to Randy Newman and Leonard Cohen. David's real good, not quite reaching into their league. A vague feeling of conscious weightiness seems to be attached to the album by its subdued style.)
- Bonnie Koloc/CLOSE-UP/Epic PE 34184 (The time is right for Bonnie. She has gathered the experience and identity to deliver her talent. Her album is a nicely honed whole, with a touch of melancholy.)
- Joachim Kuhn/SPRINGFEVER/Atlantic SD 1695 (The lines of musical demarcation continue to cloud. Joachim Kuhn's Lp defies labeling. But, it does represent a school of open, spacious music which is the antithesis of the more commonly heard cluttered school of music. Supreme players are gathered. Side one contains some truly elevating moments.)
- Harvey Mason/EARTHMOVER/Arista AL 4096 (You've heard the speeches about drummer lead bands, well in this case you can throw out the rule book. That is because Harvey demonstrates excellent musical instincts. He transmits a reverence for delicate melodies.)
- Bat McGrath/FROM THE BLUE EAGLE/Amherst AMH 1005 (Clearly a success, Bat writes songs rounded for comfort. Their straight forward folk-rockin' presentation smiles as the record turns. Built for enjoyment.)
- Jimmy Owens/Horizon SP-712 (A welcome jazz album. Jimmy is the rare contemporary jazz artist who seems able to incorporate the intensity of today in an essentially acoustic setting. He is able to do it with old standards and new melodies alike.)
- Robert Palmer/SOME PEOPLE CAN DO WHAT THEY LIKE/ Island ILPS 9420 (Out of the mass of folk-rock and rock singer-songwriters comes a man who has listened to some black music. How refreshing. Palmer ties funky loose ends together in this album. He also invests it with some creative arranging touches.)
- Parliament/THE CLONES OF DR. FUNKENSTEIN/Casablanca NBLP 7034 (The Parliament-Funkadelic connection is a marvel. They are on their own wavelength. Like a musical Harlem Globetrotters they are superior players who cannot resist the humor of it all.)

MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for all stations.)

- Mose Allison/YOUR MIND IS ON VACATION/Atlantic SD 1691 (Allison is as valued today as he was 20 years ago. He is valid because he is an original - they are rare. [Refer to last issue's Concepts.] This album is especially useful because of its quality and format, lots of short songs.)
- Baby/WHERE DID ALL THE MONEY GO?/Chelsea CHL 517 (Baby's album is a mixed metaphor and suffers because of it. The harder tracks are universally bad, partially because they seem unnatural and partially because they perform their weakest material that way. Stick to the lighter tracks, most written by Johnny Schell. He's their strength.)
- Long John Baldry/WELCOME TO CLUB CASABLANCA/ Casablanca NBLP 7035 (Baldry is always entertaining. He generally picks good songs and is quite a good singer. The contextually inconsistent first track and the bad acting was unnecessary.)
- Stephen Bishop/CARELESS/ABC ABCD-954 (Bishop's album is anything but careless. It is crafted and reminiscent in many ways of the Simon & Garfunkel style. Though not all songs are gems there are a few which possess a luminescent sparkle.)
- Brand X/UNORTHODOX BEHAVIOR/Passport PPSD-98019 (Previously reviewed as an import. These tunes are exercises in fusion playing. Brand X can hold their collective heads up from a playmanship point of view. However, as captivating melody writers they are somewhat less impressive. O.K. for the technocrats.)
- Chango/HONEY IS SWEETER THAN BLOOD/Mercury SRM 1-1103 (Chango covers some musical ground on their second Lp. Here they sound like a Latin band who has listened to and absorbed some hard rock. Less Santana and more Aerosmith.)
- The Billy Cobham-George Duke Band/LIVE/Atlantic SD 18194 (As one might imagine the playing captured here is commanding. However, this union, which seems made in heaven, is melodically underdeveloped by comparison. It is not bad, it is simply not as riveting.)
- Rory Gallagher/CALLING CARD/Chrysalis CHR 1124 (This may be the best Rory's singing has ever sounded and it is not too good. Solid presentation, which doesn't lean into excess, improves on the Gallagher past also. Strong blues feelings are very satisfying.)
- Mac Gayden/HYMN TO THE SEEKER/ABC ABCD 960 (Though Mac's spiritual tendencies don't always translate into the best music, he does O.K. The instrumental "To Our Ancestors" stands artistically at the forefront of the Lp. On the whole, side two feels stronger.)
- Johnny Gimble/TEXAS DANCE PARTY/Columbia KC 34284 (Smooth Western swing music is one of life's guaranteed joys, Johnny's live album cruises, it doesn't sparkle. Jazz fans should be listening to this music with open ears.)
- Phillip Goodhand-Tait/OCEANS AWAY/Chrysalis CHR 1113 (Somehow massive oversweetening on a fair portion of these songs is not too offensive. That doesn't excuse them. In spite of them a quality album emerges based mostly on good material.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Tom T. Hall/THE MAGNIFICENT MUSIC MACHINE/Mercury SRM 1-1111 (Tom's new, joyful album returns to the hills which generated country music itself. Pickin' and singing a fine collection of songs makes for organic music of a high order.)
- Jerry Lee Lewis/COUNTRY CLASS/Mercury SRM 1-1109 (Jerry isn't bashful about extolling his own praises, as the title of this Lp implies, but, he is right. He is a great singer and stylist, he always has been and he continues to be. Classy country-blues.)
- Limousine/Pye 12140 (These continentals have a good feeling for rock 'n' roll, including a strain of R&B influences. How distinctive they are is yet another question. Some real good songs sneak up on you.)
- Moxy II/Mercury SRM 1-1115 (A vast improvement over the Moxy I sludge is immediately apparent. The band still isn't near the top of their genre but, here they don't embarrass themselves melodically and some of the guitar work is impressive.)
- Willie Nelson/THE TROUBLEMAKER/Columbia KC 34112 (An album of traditional songs is the kind of Lp done for both the fun of it and to get the artist's version of those wellspring melodies on record. Willie rips through these tunes with casual assurance.)
- Opa/GOLDENWINGS/Milestone M-9069 (Contemporary intensity and jazzy intentions make this enlarged trio an object of interest. They work in a less cluttered fusion style than is common. Nice tunes too.)
- Brian Protheroe/I - YOU/Chrysalis CHR 1108 (Protheroe is one of those artists who has so many ideas that they sometimes get in his way. One of his favorite moves juxtaposes two melodies and tempo changes in angular contrast. Most of the time it works but, not always. This type of Lp requires solid production.)
- Flora Purim/500 MILES HIGH AT MONTREUX/Milestone M 9070 (It may be sacreligious to say in the presence of her devotees but, Flora, more often than not, sings lousy songs. Her vocal gifts are unquestioned but, her ear for good melodies is less secure. She saves many of the things she does. "Cravo E Canela" is the kind of joyous tune which should be the rule rather than the exception.)
- Troy Seals/Columbia KC 34271 (Well established as a potent songwriter, Troy applies himself to his own career as an artist. His country-rock setting is sometimes interrupted by cursed strings. But, the overall impression has to be a positive nod for modern country.)
- Joey Stec /Playboy PB 412 (Jimmy Miller, who knows how, has gotten a good ole rock and roll feeling behind Joey. Stec's songs are O.K. and his singing is too. Excellent sound quality enhances it further.)
- Ringo Starr/ROTOGRAVURE/Atlantic SD 18193 (This album tends to take itself more seriously than recent Ringo Lps. He's more substantial than anyone had given him credit for being. And he has quite a group of luminous friends.)
- Styx/CRYSTAL BALL/A&M SP 4604 (Bombastic Styx retains its reputation for power and precision. Sometimes they reach too far getting too tricky for comfort. Smartly they recognize the need for counterpoint, they end each side tastefully.)
- Richard Supa/LIFE LINES/Epic PE 34277 (Except for the atypical first song (made to be a single) Supa's Lp is an easy flowing singer-songwriter album. If you remember his previous albums you'll probably agree that Richard is a powerful singer, an aspect which gets suppressed in this production. Still, taken as a whole, this is his best try.)
- Chip Taylor/SOMEBODY SHOOT OUT THE JUKEBOX/ Columbia PC 34345 (As part of the cadre of young super writers in Nashville, Chip has distinguished himself. He makes yet another fine album buoyed by strong performances of strong material. Sidestep some excessive sweeteners.)
- Ian Thomas/GOODNIGHT MRS. CALABASH/Chrysalis CHR1126 (Previously reviewed as an import and rewritten here. Ian's album is all right but, not more. A contributing factor to it being less than it could have been in Ian's own production. The two tracks John Lombardo co-produces show ideas and a dynamism rarely displayed elsewhere.)
- Van Der Graaf Generator/WORLD RECORD/Mercury SRM 1-1116 (Their posturing pretentiousness is almost too much to bear. Hamill, after all of these years and albums, still can't write a melody to save his life. But, these fellows do play brilliantly at times. Some instrumental triumphs save the album.)
- Weapons of Peace/Playboy PB 413 (Side one is where you'll find the music on this album. Weapons of Peace are less formidable on the second side. Powerful presentation and sufficient tunes make the good things good.)
- Rusty Wier/BLACK HAT SALOON/Columbia PC 34319 (Through a very comfortable album Rusty's consistent writing establishes itself. The arrangements push the right buttons at the right time too. Nicely brought off.)
- Bob Willis & His Texas Playboys/IN CONCERT/Capitol SKBB-11550 (Last issue we erroneously listed this Lp has a re-issue. It is not. It is instead a new release of radio concerts from the late 50's. Not only is the music good but, the exuberance of the playing is uplifting. The sound quality is passable.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

- (Albums of acceptable quality which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)
- Eddie Jefferson/STILL ON THE PLANET/Muse MR 5063 (At times Lifeless and other times rag-tag, Eddie's style recalls King Pleasure. He, Eddie, doesn't compare favorably. Finally, the lyrics often don't do justice to the riffs upon which they have been overlaid.)
- The Earl Slick Band/RAZOR SHARP/Capitol ST 11570 (Quite to the contrary the Slick Band is not razor sharp this time around. The music labors under a heavy buzz and inert songs, more like a blunt instrument.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS CONTINUED

Tattoo/Prodigal P6-10014S1 (Tattoo fits into the "just another rock band" category. While they demonstrate proficiency all around they do not raise themselves out of the crowd. They project nothing to distinguish their music.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

- Monty Alexander/LOVE & SUNSHINE/MPS G22620 (Monty is at home in an easy going 50's combo style. He shows us a graceful manner but, not a real individuality.)
- Gene Ammons - Sonny Stitt/TOGETHER AGAIN FOR THE LAST TIME/Prestige P-10100 (This recording takes on added poignancy because of the death of Gene Ammons shortly after its conclusion. It is a good document reflecting the work of two journeymen be-bop players. Easy.)
- Marie Cain/LIVING ALONE/Columbia PC 34275 (A good singer and fair writer Marie is placed just out of progressive reach by intrusive sweetening. She has MOR appeal. Purists will ask, "Who is Marie Cain to rewrite a Dylan melody?")
- The Carter Family/COUNTRY'S FIRST FAMILY/Columbia KC 34266 (Implied in the notes is that this Lp amounts to an unconscious tribute to Mother Maybelle Carter, grand dame of country music. It is a pleasant straightforward album. While there is not much pizzazz in it, there is also no excess.)
- Sonny Criss/OUT OF NOWHERE/Muse 5089 (Criss' Lp has a resident consistency about it which is rarely achieved. It operates at a minimal level of adventure but, at a maximum level of certainty.)
- The Dramatics/JOY RIDE/ABC ABCD 955 (Over the years the Dramatics have established themselves as a consistent R&B force. Their albums are always pop directed but, always leave a few points of progressive interest, i. e., "I Can't Get Over You," in the classic mold.)
- Ronnie Dyson/THE MORE YOU DO IT/Columbia PC 34350 (Dyson, who came from success on Broadway as a teenager, is recorded in the contemporary pop R&B pattern. His strength as a singer is readily apparent. The title track, unlike the rest, harkens back to fertile rhythm and blues days.)
- Enchantment/United Artists UA-LA 682-G (Solid pop R&B enhanced by a few songs of value. They give us nothing in the way of individual character.)
- Freddy Fender/IF YOU'RE EVER IN TEXAS/ABC Dot DOSD-2061 (When Freddy sings R&B ballads of the kind which would have been sung by The Platters, he is incredible. The back-up here doesn't take advantage of Freddy's strength. "Livin' It Down" and "It's Too Late" and "Sometimes" are real good but could have been better. Don't miss the 50's medley.)
- Jim Hall/COMMITMENT/Horizon SP 715 (Languish in the masterful mellow of Jim Hall. His articulate guitar style derives its grace from understated play. A higher degree of skill is required to play in this manner.)
- Denise La Salle/SECOND BREATH/ABC ABCD-966 (An artist of some depth Denise is a fine performer and a rather good writer. Only the production style, which is right for her, holds her on the fringes.)
- Mel Lewis/Horizon SP 716 (With or without Thad Jones the Mel Lewis Band has none of the coziness or intensity of modern combos. It is a sound from the past, which is nicely turned out, still it is an anachronism.)
- Ken Little & The Spoon River Band/LEANIN' ON THE BAR/Dharma D-805 (The bright Ken Little sound is pleasantly clean-cut. If their folksy music has a weakness it is in an occasional lyric line and that 1962 hootenanny quality.)
- David Matthews with Whirlwind/SHOOGIE WANNA BOOGIE/Kudu KU-30 (Matthews isn't the artist. He is the arranger. That gives you a perspective on this Lp's derivations. It is disco music and/or rock based background music. Functional art that is beautifully mounted.)
- Mary Kay Place/TONITE!.../Columbia PC 34353 (Mary Kay is of some interest because of her incredible role on Mary Hartman. Coming out of that T.V. series gives her quite an opportunity. This Lp doesn't fully capitalize on it. It's mere competence throughout does not give Mary Kay the kind of musical identity which she establishes as Loretta Haggers. The Lp lacks distinguishing characteristics.)
- Prelude/BACK INTO THE LIGHT/Pye 12139 (Prelude puts itself in the fringes because of two reasons. One is a batch of completely innocuous lyrics and the other is a limp rhythm track by rock n' roll standards. Finally they rarely vary their tempos beyond moderate or slow.)
- The Quick/MONDO DECO/Mercury SRM 1-1114 (On the pop side of Sparks. The Quick borrows liberally from the recent past as they speak to the vortex of teenage taste. The new bubblegum done well.)
- Johnny Rodriguez/REFLECTING/Mercury SRM 1-1110 (With his place in country music secure, it is appropriate to consider him in other contexts particularly because he is the genuine article. Especially in an album like this one Rodriguez is cast as a bluesy balladeer with a country flavor.)

One Man's View of Radio Syndication By Robert Michelson

Radio Syndication is a business of marketing concepts.

It is a difficult business requiring at a minimum, a knowledge of the medium coupled with production skills and an ability to sell your product.

Syndication functions as a programming tool, as an advertising vehicle and as a creative barometer for the medium.

I've always believed that within the context of business a radio station has an obligation to inform, entertain and educate. Within this framework, AOR is restricting its potential by requiring music concepts coupled with a strong penchant for barter.

Special programming costs money. Advertisers in general will not support a concept. Their call letters are CPM's and GRP's.

FRINGE ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Rush/ALL THE WORLD'S A STAGE/Mercury SRM 2-7508 (The long awaited and also inevitable Rush live album is here. Whatta rush. "A milestone to mark the close of chapter one, in the annals of Rush.")
- George Shearing/PIANO SOLO/MPS G22369 (Shearing's music is a quiet interlude. He is a Britton who predated the invasion adding his gentlemanly countenance to the musical world. Graceful.)
- John Valenti/ANYTHING YOU WANT/Ariola AM ST 50012 (John is singing at the edge of his voice as he strains for a position in these mountainous, swirling arrangements. He writes round melodies which put him in pop contention.)
- Various Artists/JAZZ GALA CONCERT/Atlantic SD 1693 (Generally, these kinds of all-star amalgomes add up to less than the sum of their parts. There is something synergistic about a group which always plays together. What results from this German experience is a standard big band back-drop for some nice solos.)
- Cedar Walton/FIRM ROOTS/Muse MR 5059 (Excusing some raunchy sound quality, will enable you to enjoy the quiet intensity of this finely tuned trio. Not surprisingly the liner notes mention the rhythm section first. Louis Hayes is truly astounding on this live recording.)
- Paul Williams - Soundtrack/BUGSY/RSO RS-1-3501 (Pretty good music, especially for a movie. But, its delivery is usually valid in the context of the film. The title tune and "Tomorrow" are usable in a progressive radio context.)

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

- Patrick Gleeson/BEYOND THE SUN/Mercury SRI80000 (Gleeson, generally a popular music electronician, takes on Holst's "The Planets." He does it with a second generation synthesizer and the point of interest is less the music and more the instrument. At least from this example it seems that as synthesizers become polyphonic, that is, more like other instruments, they will sound more like other instruments which reduces their unique qualities.)
- Herbie Mann/GAGAKU & BEYOND/Finnadar SR 9014 (In his hayday Herbie, as common practice, would incorporate the sounds of other cultures into his music. Some of his earlier vitality is restored with this album's use of delicate Japanese textures, instruments and modes. This kind of musical archeology creates a vicarious adventure for the listener. Fine work.)
- Pat Martino/WE'LL BE TOGETHER AGAIN/Muse MR 5090 (Pat moves away from his recent energy work to a subdued mood which is probably a truer reflection of the man. This album is an introspective piece of musical psychoanalysis, not to mention its musical superiority.)

- Triumph/Attic LAT 1012 (Triumph has mastered all of the punky moves but, little in the way of real music. The material has to be there first. After the opener on each side things thin out fast. "Blinding Light Show" is best but it is out of sync with the rest of the Lp. Satisfactory.)

CONCEPTS

It is unfortunate that management has not seen fit to invest in programming. There are only a handful of AOR stations with budgets or contingency funds for special programming.

The initiative for funds must come from the program director. Perhaps it is asking too much but it certainly would be exciting to learn of a fund established by the vanguard of AOR stations for the joint development of special programming.

The potential for the medium has never been greater. Let's realize it.

Most of the audience hooted, hollered and joined in the fun, but a few people shook their heads, walked out disgusted, drove home to Duckburg, and felt relieved that they had not offered to put the band up for the night.
