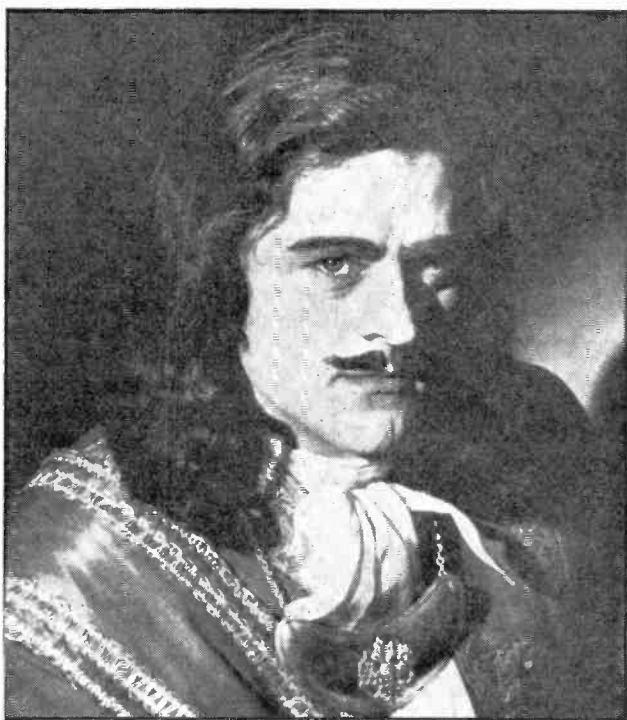

Five Years to Wait—Maybe

DON'T put off buying a new radio. According to radio engineers, there will be no revolutionary changes in reception to make present models obsolete. The final stages of perfection have been reached, or very nearly so. The only thing that remains to complete the radio millennium is the perfect program and television. The perfect program, one that will please all classes of people, is a will-o'-the-wisp; and television is five years away. Yes, the same five years that it has always been, but for a different reason this time.

While great strides have been made in television experiments during the last few years, many problems remain, not the least of which are due to economic conditions. Because of the indefiniteness of practical television, we are told that sponsors cannot be expected to pay any appreciable amounts for talent and time until ample coverage is assured to warrant the expense.

No less an authority than Doctor Baker, vice-president and general manager of the RCA Victor Company, gave out the following interesting figures in support of his contention that we have five years yet to wait:

"If 700,000 persons should spend \$300 apiece to equip their homes with television apparatus, that would require a total expenditure of \$210,000,000. To serve that many persons about eighty transmitting stations would have to be provided, at a cost of \$40,000,000, and another \$40,000,000 would have to be spent to develop an interconnecting network. It would take \$58,000,000 a year for costs of transmitter operation and for depreciation.

"Another problem is that of programs. A radio broadcasting network is likely to have

5,000 program hours a year. For a television station to show once each of the 300 feature motion pictures produced in a year in the United States would take up only 300 program hours. To broadcast each of the new plays of a year shown on New York stages would take up only another 300 hours. Shorts and newsreels would bring the total only to 2,000 hours. And not all news events would be in reach.

"The artist's life, in television, would be for only a few brief weeks. You can listen to an entertainer over the air repeatedly, but you would not be content to see his grimaces more than a few times. So artists would demand high pay.

"Who is to pay for the vast costs? It will take years to develop television. You can't expect the manufacturers to pay for it, nor can you expect advertisers to pay much until coverage is assured them. European nations have become accustomed to government operation of all communications systems and to paying a government tax for radio broadcasting. American social psychology is different."

However interesting and convincing Doctor Baker's figures are, we doubt that the inventive and business genius of America will permit his five-year prophecy to stymie an earlier consummation of practical television. Too many tools are already developed and too many hands grasping them not to expect results much earlier. Figuratively speaking, it is not unlikely that we shall wake up some fine morning to see Mahatma Gandhi taking his bath in the Ganges in our living room. And Mahatma would be a bad risk for a five-year term life insurance.

ETHER GLEANINGS

NO longer will the California State Fair depend on the exhibits of the prize hogs, cattle and sheep, the products of the soil and the works of industrial handicraft to bring 'em through the turnstiles.

"See the finest livestock in the state and the very best 'A-1' products of the soil" ceases to be the ballyhoo of the State Fair press agents, if this year's Fair is to be a precedent. For radio has stepped in.

The personal appearance in the Fair Grounds there in Sacramento of the State's foremost microphone personalities, actual broadcasting from the various exhibits at the Fair and other feats of interest to radio tuner-inners, will be the major attraction.

The directors of the State's biggest show this year have contracted with the Don Lee network for the personal appearance and a series of special broadcasts direct from the grounds. The Fair opens on September 1.

The Merrymakers will come up from Los Angeles to stage their show on September 1 and 2. The Happy-Go-Lucky Hour with Jay Brower handling the m. c. job is scheduled to appear from September 3 to 9 inclusive, and the Blue Monday Jamboree, in its entirety, is billed for two performances—September 10 and 11.

A big expansion program is planned by the Northern California Broadcasting System, which will be consummated by October 1.

Ralph Brunton, president of the recently organized chain, stated that the recent grant by the Federal Radio Commission of an increase in power to KQW for 1,000 watts daytime broadcasting and the increase to KJBS of 500 watts will mean new transmitting equipment for each station.

It is possible that KJBS will be moved to another San Francisco location when the new equipment arrives from the East. Their new studios will be constructed both for KJBS and KQW. Brunton has been considering, too, the removal of the KQW San Jose studios when everything is ready for construction of the new transmitter and aerials.

Jean Wakefield, pianist, composer and singer, who a few years ago was one of the foremost women in radio hereabouts, is a regular contributing artist to KYA's programs now. Thrice weekly, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, she is billed on a solo spot and is called "Lady of the Evening," singing a sophisticated serenade. Her style is modernistic, and during the quarter hour

periods she intermingles bits of her own verse and philosophy, not to forget some of her own songs. She is likewise billed as one of the featured artists on KYA's new revue type program called "Bathday Party" which hits the ether roads Saturday nights.

Tom Mitchell, who had a large following when he was on the NBC some time back, has returned to the network fold and may be dialed on KPO five days a week from 3:15 to 3:30 o'clock.

Rube Wolf, who has been wowing 'em so long on the Fanchon and Marco shows around the coast, is now directing the orchestra at the Edgewater Beach Cafe in San Francisco, his "chunes" being broadcast by KFRC and the Don Lee chain.

Fred Allen, one of the funniest on the air in our belief, together with his Hour of Smiles program, have had their radio contracts renewed for another year. It's an NBC event Wednesdays from 8 to 9 o'clock.

A San Francisco lad was the recipient of a real "break" recently when Henry Ford, scheduled to speak over a coast to coast hookup from the World's Fair in Chicago, failed to show up. Robert Turner, the local youth, was standing by in an NBC studio, ready to fill in with piano music in case anything should go wrong. And so he got his chance to play to the nation. Turner is the son of a San Francisco jeweler and started to play over the radio when he was knee high to an ant.

Don Church, a lad with a lot of what it takes in his voice, is on his way to a prominent place in the radio sun. Just watch his smoke. He is now featured with the Southern Four over KQW every Monday, Wednes-

day and Friday at 5:30 o'clock and was recently picked from auditions to participate in the Happy-Go-Lucky Hour on the coast Don Lee-CBS network.

Among the more recent folk to be added to the KYA artists staff are Mildred Baldwin, coloratura soprano, formerly vocalist in the Chinese Theater in Hollywood; Grace Ehardt and Carmen deObarrio, concert pianists.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP



• • • Marshall Sohl, leading tenor at stations KJR and KOMO, Seattle, has joined KHJ as a staff artist. He made his official debut on the Merrymakers program Sunday night, June 17. Sohl was born and reared in San Francisco, where he studied under some of the leading music teachers of the Bay District. For about ten years he specialized in oratorio work and then went to the Pacific Northwest where he joined the staff at KJR. He sang the leading rôle in "Lohengrin" with the Seattle Civic Opera Company a few seasons ago, and last year had the lead in "Faust." Northwest radio listeners think of him specially in connection with his work in the old Mardi Gras program. For a while, in Seattle, he conducted musical studios and did a great deal of choral directing.

• • • A change in the instrumental set-up of the Al Pearce Gang has taken place. Earl Hatch, pianist and accordionist, and his wife and piano partner, the former Jackie Archer, have left the Al Pearce Gang. Ralph Richards, a Portland, Oregon, boy who was with Walt Roesner in San Francisco for two years, now is featured at the piano. Richards studied under Rudolph Ganz in Chicago. He won a concert piano contest in competition with students from all over the nation. He is just twenty-two.

• • • The reader might imagine that because Babe Ruth is a baseball star that most of those who listen to his Quaker Puffed Rice and Puffed Wheat broadcasts over the NBC blue network are either boys or men. But the Babe has been analyzing batches of the 600,000 letters he has received and he finds that fully 40 per cent of them come from girls and women.

• • • As a boy in Rocky Mount, N. C., Kay Kyser had the record of falling off every building in town. As fast as one went up he fell off it. At various times he broke a collarbone, both forearms, an elbow, a leg and, as he says, "busted his head" five times. They finally stopped putting up buildings—maybe to save Kay's life and perhaps that it why the place has remained small.

• • • Eddie Peabody, recent guest on Captain Henry's Show Boat, probably belongs to more clubs than anyone in radio. He is a member of such lodges as the Elks, Eagles, American Legion, and 40 and 8, and has been made honorary member of the

Franklin County Bar Association of Ohio, SZE Fraternity, and belongs to most of the service clubs of his home town and he is an active member of the Riverside, California, Chamber of Commerce. He is assistant Scout Master of ten troops in various cities from the West Coast to New York, including scout troops in England, Scotland and Ireland. Eddie also belongs to Masonic America Lodge No. 475, Los Angeles, and Islam Temple Shrine of San Francisco.

• • • Raylyn Kinney, KYA contralto, tells us that she was a child dancer and that she made many appearances upon the professional stage. In later years, however, Raylyn found that she could sing and began her study of voice; her dance engagements she kept a secret from her rather cranky teacher. Unfortunately, as Raylyn puts it, the tutor attended a charity affair and to his amazement saw his star pupil whirling gracefully across the stage. In cold tones the next morning the diminutive Miss was informed that she must give up her dancing career as it would prove a detriment to her singing. Reluctantly Raylyn obeyed, and to this day has never worn her dancing slippers.

• • • When he returned to the Cocoman Grove in Hollywood last month, Gus Arnheim brought Mary Wood, whom he is training as a new type of entertainer. Mary has been well known as a classical soprano, but Gus, whose judgment seldom fails, fully expects her to be a sensation under his direction. His male vocalist is Jimmy Newell, a tenor with a baritone range.

• • • Bill ("Last of the Mohicans") Doemling of the KHJ announcers staff, has finally fallen in love, according to reliable reports from the KHJ studios. It is Bill's first offense in the last six years, or possibly his sixth offense in one year. Bill himself is not quite sure. Incidentally, Doemling is the last of the KHJ announcers to succumb to the fatal darts of Cupid. All the other announcers are married or about to be. air in the KFRC studios each Friday, and from that group Brower will select the best to appear on future programs, he announced recently.

• • • Rehearsals of the Revelers quartet are very informal affairs held in Frank Black's office around a piano. They learn a new number with various members of the group wandering in and out of the office so that at times they are singing solos, duets and trios as well as quartets.

• • • Trust your radio fan to keep his eye peeled for pertinent news. Somebody sent Captain Henry the following clipping. "Chicago—Mrs. Evelyn Marblestone, 24, who said her husband couldn't make good coffee, was granted a divorce." The caption on this story was the single word—"Grounds." "Have Tiny Ruffner put these young people wise," urged the fan.

• • • Phil Hanna, Al Pearce Three Cheer, won a tennis match with the 1933 Canadian Junior singles champion, Collins Milne, while the Gang was playing in Vancouver B. C.

• • • Winifred Wolfe, eleven-year-old dramatic star who plays Teddy, the little girl next door in One Man's Family, made her microphone debut a year ago. She had had no previous experience acting, yet she won two auditions in less than two weeks.

• • • George Gibson Davis, producer of the Noonday Concerts heard daily except Sunday on KYA, steps on hairpins for good luck. George's hobby is fishing, as is almost every other member of the station staff.

• • • Here is one for the books, or should we say "records" . . . (no pun intended) . . . KGGC, through its managers, W. N. McGill and Ray Lewis, announce the addition of RECORDING equipment in their studios. A record can now be made of any program on the air and can be played back immediately. The recording is a new development and will not bend, break or wear out, and reproduces with a natural quality that is amazing. This recording equipment appears to be a smart move on KGGC's part, not only from a commercial angle but as a voice check for artists.

• • • Russ Columbo, the Pacific Coast baritone who achieved nation-wide radio fame over NBC networks and who now is one of Hollywood's popular leading men, was born in San Francisco, California, and spent his early years in Calistoga, not many miles away. As a child he began to study the violin and at the age of fourteen he was playing solos at the old Imperial

Theatre in San Francisco. The family moved to Los Angeles, and it was in that city that Columbo's mellow baritone voice first attracted attention. After engagements at various hotels and in pictures he went East, broadcasting his first nation-wide program over NBC networks from New York on September 5, 1931. As the "Valentino of Song," his unique singing style won the applause of the entire country. Among the pictures in which he has appeared are "Moulin Rouge" and "Broadway Through a Keyhole."

• • • Gus Arnheim, whose melodic dance rhythms are heard regularly over a Columbia network, has been called the leading dance band conductor of the West Coast. Gus is the maestro responsible for innovations and arrangements that have later been followed successfully by many similar musical organizations in the United States. About three years ago he started the custom of featuring a girl entertainer with a dance band—against the advice of everybody supposedly "in the know." That girl was Loyce Whiteman and she was a hit.

• • • A San Antonio paper carries the story about Blackie, an incautious tomcat whose life was saved by a certain famous brand of coffee. (Three guesses on the brand.) It seems that Blackie swallowed some poison and was a pretty sick cat for a few days. His distracted mistress tried everything and finally noticed that Blackie looked wistfully at the table when coffee was poured. She gave him a cup and was amazed to see him drink the beverage. • • • Rosaline Greene, dramatic actress aboard Captain Henry's Show Boat, has saved all of her radio parts. Rosaline has been in radio for a number of years, so you can imagine what that means. She has all of the scripts put away in a big cardboard carton stored in a closet. Recently Rosaline moved from one apartment to another. The scripts were the biggest moving problem.

• • • There are a lot of dramatists in this world. Gene and Glenn are finding that out. They offer a prize for the best "Blue Streak" drama sent in by a listener to be used Monday through Friday night each week, or five dramas a week. They promise to have "Jake" and "Lena" act in the dramas. And they had only been announcing the drama contest for a week when they got 1,500 submitted—at least 500 of which the boys say are excellent.

• • • Roy Shield, NBC's Central Division music director, is almost as proficient with a driver as he is with a baton. He's golf enthusiast and consistently shoots in the eighties.

• • • Thirteen-year-old Billy Idelson, who takes the rôle of Rush in the NBC Vic and Sade sketch, says Mae West is the public personality he most admires.

• • • Kay Kyser recently asked his band for suggestions to make the programs better. As one man the fourteen arose and told Kay how he could be a better band leader. Fortunately, Kay can "take it."

• • • The June issue of "The Booster," an amateur fan publication of Harvey, N. D., is dedicated to Annette Hanshaw, who just became an active member of The Booster Club. If these amateur papers continue to flourish, the rising generation ought to produce a crop of fan editors second to none.

• • • Frank Black, NBC musical director, is compiling a complete encyclopedia of native American music from Puritan hymns down to the present cycle. When all the material is collected he hopes to offer a radio program of American musical history. Collectors of American folk music are urged to cooperate, with the assurance that the source will be noted on the program.

• • • Frances Minton, who writes continuity for many NBC musical programs, is a well known accompanist, and appears frequently in concerts in San Francisco.

• • • John Barclay, leading man of the Palmolive Beauty Box Theatre, and his wife, who is a distinguished musician, are planning an automobile trip to Virginia. They are going to take a tent and camp out in the mountains when they get there.

• • • Elliot Shaw, of the Revelers, doesn't mind admitting that he comes from "out where the tall corn grows," and that his musical debut was made as a boy soprano in a church in What Cheer, Iowa. (Yes, it's on the map!)

• • • Most musicians like to play rare and costly old fiddles but Walter Kelsey, Al Pearce violinist, is raving about the tone qualities of a violin he obtained recently from a violin maker in Vancouver, B. C. Purchased very reasonably, Walter says it is one of the the finest violins he has ever used and he has played on instruments worth thousands of dollars.

• • • Oddly enough, requests for tickets to the broadcasts of Captain Henry Show Boat come from all over the country, not just from New York City and environs. And the writers say that if they knew they could see Captain Henry and his performers, they would be more likely to come to New York for their vacations.

• • • Leah Ray is a "brother" in Alpha Tau Omega fraternity. She was initiated by members of the Stanford chapter in 1933.

• • • Phil Duey, NBC baritone, is not so popular in his own home. Mrs. Duey insists that Phil confine his vocal outbursts to such moments as will not disturb the children. As a result, Phil rehearses almost solely in the NBC studios.

• • • Morey Amsterdam has taken thousands of feet of moving picture film during the present Al Pearce tour of the Northwest, mostly of Mabel Todd.

• • • Scotty Mortland, speaker on Your Boy's Future, over KPO, estimates he will have uttered 140,000 words before microphones at the end of this year.

SILHOUETTES



A TRUE pioneer is J. Walton McKinney, popular KHQ lyric tenor of the Northwest's radio land. Walt first appeared before the "mike" when radio was a struggling infant, housed for the most part in out-of-the-way corners of piano stores. Born October 10, 1905, in Pilchuk, Wash., Walt migrated to Seattle as a child and received his education in the Seattle schools. He was graduated from Garfield high in 1924. During his high school days he studied voice under M. Kingsbury and Madame Nurelli, both prominent in Seattle musical circles. He carried the lead in several high school operettas.

Upon his graduation, however, his musical career seemed at an end. Every door was closed to him, and he finally gave it up, taking a job in a Seattle tire shop. Then came his "break." One day while working on the car of Henri Le Bel, the organist at the Blue Mouse theatre, he broke into song. Le Bel listened, then invited him to take an audition at the theatre.

Walt clicked, and for three years he vocalized at the Blue Mouse. It was here that he met KHQ—the first KHQ, then located on the mezzanine floor of the old Sherman and Clay music store in Seattle. Between shows he used to dash and sing before the "mike"—just for the novelty of it. When KHQ moved to Spokane, Walt worked for KJR, then KOMO and finally KPQ, now in Wenatchee, but at that time in the Continental Building in Seattle.

While making records for Columbia with Jackie Souder's Olympic Hotel band, Walt was given his first opportunity to visit Spokane. Columbia wanted a vocalist to record with the Garden Dance Band and Walt was chosen. His next trip to Spokane was made with Sam Wineland, who came over to lead a stage band at a Spokane theatre. That was in 1928 and soon Walt had resumed his friendship with Louis Wassmer, owner of KHQ. Wassmer convinced Walt he should return to the air. Walt did, and he is still with KHQ—the oldest artist in the Inland Empire in point of service. And incidentally, Walt is still among the most popular of the KHQ entertainers. During his many years with KHQ, Walt has done everything from cowboy songs to ladies style programs. At present Walt appears twice a week in solo spots and sings vocals with several ensemble groups.

T. S. STRIBLING, distinguished novelist, Pulitzer Prize winner, and author of the social history of the South, "Conflict," which is dramatized twice weekly over the nation-wide CBS network, was born March 4, 1881, the day of President Garfield's inauguration.

Although the place of Stribling's birth was Clifton, Tennessee (which, incidentally, continues to be the site of all his vacations), most of his youth was spent in northern Alabama at the home of a maiden aunt. There his aunt's discipline augured Stribling's future career. At the age of six he was made to keep a diary. It proved to be his initial monetary return from literature.

Unofficially, Stribling appointed George, a negro farmhand, as diary-filler inner. The pages ran as follows: "George set a rabbit gun. George did not catch a rabbit this morning. George did not catch a rabbit today. George did not catch a rabbit." Every dozen pages, however, the cheerful news that George did catch a rabbit tended to relieve the monotony of the tone. In return for this labor Stribling picked cotton for George and a negro woman, named Mat, on an acre of ground that was given to them for private planting. At the end of the season, when the crop was in and sold to a buyer, the proceeds came out indivisible by two. There was a nickel left over, which went to Stribling.

This remunerative work kept up for several years. Farming in the summer and educational research work at the public school in Clifton during the winter. Then came teacher's training at Normal School in Florence, Alabama.

After one term at teaching it became apparent that Stribling was just as curious to see what his pupils were going to do next as they were. Stribling retired from the pedagogical field with the general approval of the field and considerable relief to himself.

The next step for Stribling was the world of literature. He entered this work wholeheartedly, as office boy to John Trotwood Moore, editor of the *Taylor-Trotwood Magazine*. After the magazine's board passed a vote of disconfidence in Mr. Stribling and elected another office boy in his place, the retiring aide-de-camp found himself adrift on the perilous seas of literature at the age of nineteen.

Having led a life of uprightness, clean thinking and activity, Stribling naturally

turned to the evils of cigarette smoking as the general theme for all his stories. He struck a market in Sunday School magazines. At least until the World War came along and cigarettes became a national institution. After the Armistice was signed, good stories which went like hot cakes at \$2.50 each before the war were now rejected even at bargain prices of \$1 each or \$10 a dozen. After some time Stribling decided that he would have to mend his stories or starve, or go to work. He determined to mend his stories.

From that time to this, Stribling has written stories for about half the magazines in the country; made a play out of his novel, "Teetfallow," which was produced under the title "Rope"; and also authored the novels "Birthright," "The Cruise of the Dry Dock," "Fombombo," "Red Sand," "The Forge," "The Store"—a Pulitzer Prize work—and "The Unfinished Cathedral," the latter chosen as the Literary Guild selection for June. The last three books complete his sociology trilogy of the South, depicting the crumbling of an old civilization after the Civil War and the birth of a new one as spanned by one man's life.

THE charming lady who plays the role of Maria Jameson, sister of Captain Henry of radio fame, and mistress of ceremonies in the new Friday full hour "Maria's Certo Matinee" is a veteran stage actress named Irene Hubbard. She is half Russian and half English and all wit and gayer of spirit. . . . They call her "Duchess" in the studios. . . . Miss Hubbard is married to an actor and has a 9-year-old son. . . . When she was a young girl, her cousin, the famous Elbert Hubbard, introduced her to Sir Ben Greet and that was the beginning of her career as an actress. . . . She tramped with the Ben Greet Players for years. . . . Has played everywhere in this country and in every role from Portia to Tandelayo, the dusky siren of "White Cargo." . . . Became Charley Winninger's (he's Captain Henry) radio sister a year and a half ago . . . has been before the microphone ever since. . . . Miss Hubbard is a small, slight person with

a delightful smile and a heavy, incredible braid of brown hair down the back of her neck. . . . People think it can't all be real hair—but it is. . . . A student of Shakespeare. . . . In fact, with the first money she earned, Miss Hubbard had a photograph made of herself costumed as Juliet and posed a la Marlowe. . . . Loves to play in the classics. . . . A fine scholar. . . . She studies for the fun of it—learning Russian right now. . . . Carries her books to rehearsals. . . . Favorite books, "Growth of the Soil" and "Judge the Obscure." . . . Favorite composer, Beethoven. . . . Favorite poem, "Ode to a Grecian Urn." . . . Says if she could choose different work she'd like to teach delinquent girls, because there are so few teachers who really understand and sympathize with them. . . . Was in the Miami hurricane, the biggest one—in water up to her waist for five hours. . . . Sang, "Nearer My God to Thee" and emerged peevish and unharmed. . . . Her high school classmates predicted she'd be a poet, which just shows you.

THUMBNAIL sketch of "Tiny" Ruffner: He's six feet seven, so they call him "Tiny." His real name, Edmund Birch Ruffner, does more justice to the dignity of the announcer of "Maria's Certo Matinee." Born in Crawfordsville, Indiana, in 1899, "Tiny" is the son of a newspaper man who was a singer and musician in his spare time. That gave "Tiny" a singing start. His first professional job, gathering mushrooms and selling them to the neighbors, earned him a bicycle. This bicycle started a love for travel, to which he hopes to surrender leisurely—in his old age. He began his theatrical career as a singer in Seattle, Wash., in 1922. Before long, however, he began to produce radio programs for the Standard Oil Company of California. In these original musical comedies and operettas, "Tiny" sang and acted, as well. A most versatile young man. Concert work in various cities of the Pacific Coast was his next venture, followed by New York appearances in two operettas—"Princess Flavia" and "Circus Princess." He toured the country in both of these productions. His best and worst trait, he says, is frankness. He is enthusiastic about golf and squash and likes all other sports. He gets quantities of fan mail, chiefly from young girls. He plays the piano, likes strawberry shortcake to eat and champagne and burgundy (one at a time) to drink. He has an undying faith in radio. It's an education, he says, as well as a career.

And Mother Barbour asleep in her chair. Wouldn't you like to tiptoe up to her and gently smooth her hair?

Romance! That lovely, lovely scene on the sea wall! Clifford and Lindy, with the foaming breakers at their feet, and the lighthouse and hills in the background. This scene, too, is exactly as it comes to us over the air. Some more Romance! We maintain that Paul has no right to kiss a girl that way, then claim that he doesn't love her. Who would believe him?

And we are so glad to see "Hank and Pink," who by the way look as we thought they did. They, with their adorable mother, Hazel, make a perfect picture.

Teddy, in the garden, is a "darling," and should never be termed a "pest." And last but not least, Jack in the kitchen with his demonstration would sell us 100 per cent on Snowdrift, had that not already been done long ago. We've always "been strong" for Jack, with his mixers and loyalty to Wesson Oil and Snowdrift, and we still are. In fact, the Scrapbook only verifies that which we have always known: that the Barbour family is a perfect example of real folks.

NO MATTER how much fun we get out of make-believe, life itself is, after all, more interesting and the real things that happen to real folks are more worth while than anything that we can think of in all our wildest imaginings. Such is the program entitled, To the Best of Their Ability, over KPO Wednesday nights with Police Chief William J. Quinn as the story teller.

True stories from life put into dramatization by Carleton E. Morse and presented by the National Players is enough guarantee to any radio fan that it is a program of unusual worth.

The cunning of San Francisco's underworld matched against the wits and sagacity of its police force holds us in a thrill of suspense through many scenes, and such stories as that of Micky, the boy of fourteen who was saved by the officer, who in turn was saved from worse through his interest in Micky, reach our hearts and plumb their inmost depths of sympathy and understanding.

It is REAL. Don't miss it, you who are looking for worth-while broadcasts.

SUNDAY NIGHT on Temple Square. Glorious music is broadcast by Frank Asper at the Tabernacle organ, and by William Hardiman, violinist.

If you lovers of good music want to just lie back in your favorite chair and be borne away on waves of melody that satisfies your need for great things, then tune in to KSL at 9 p. m. Pacific time and drift undisturbed for a whole hour.

We are impressed, not alone by the music of these masterful artists, but by the thought of the great and famous building from which they are broadcasting. We note the reverence in the voice of the announcer, Earl J. Glade, as he announces the numbers to be played and so graciously thanks each performer.

In all, it is a concert of reverent beauty and gracious dignity, closing with a grand old hymn played on the great organ.

NEWS *and* COMMENT

320 STATION GAME SPORTCASTS OF FOOTBALL BY ASSOCIATED OIL

Current activities of the Associated Oil Company in the fields of football, six-day bicycle races and track broadcasts reveal how the company is extending its sponsorship of

sport events on the air and adding a new host of sport fans to its Western audiences.

Sportcasts of six-day bicycle races were introduced by the Associated Oil Company in San Francisco early this year, with the veteran Ernie Smith and Dean Maddox at the microphone to give trackside accounts of sprints, spills, jams and interviews with riders, and last month Frank Bull at the KMTR microphone gave Southern California fans their first air account of bicycle racing.

Just last week the company announced that it has scheduled more than 320 station game sportcasts of football games for 1934—substantially greater than the 1933 program.

Associated's new ventures in sportscasting came on the heels of the completion of an agreement by Harold R. Deal, advertising and sales promotion manager, whereby all of the Pacific Coast conference and major independent college football games will again be broadcast this fall. The agreement calls for an outlay of \$125,000 for broadcast rights, station time and other necessary expense during the fall season.

Football, baseball, hockey, tennis, crew, track, basketball and bike racing now are included in the Associated repertoire, and they're liable to put horseshoe pitching or ping pong on the air before long. Certainly they will if the public wants it.



RADIO STARS TRAIN ASPIRANTS IN SCHOOL OF BROADCASTING

Meeting the needs of both the commercially inclined aspirants and those that believe in the need of microphone ability for a general well-rounded education, the San Francisco School of Broadcasting offers special summer rate courses in vocal, dramatic and musical radio training. With department heads now starring on the air at times not occupied at the school, such stars as Barbara Jo Allen, Cy Trobbe and Harrison Ward are training the air personalities of tomorrow in the radio station studio of the San Francisco School of Broadcasting. Special attention is being given the needs of aspirants now employed, and they are maintaining instruction throughout the day, evenings and Sundays.



CALL LETTERS "KILS" ASSIGNED TO COLUMBIA'S ARCTIC STATION

The call letters KILS have been assigned to Columbia's temporary Arctic station in northwestern Alaska by the Federal Radio Commission. The transmitter will be the northern point of Columbia's spectacular attempt to link the Arctic and the Antarctic by radiophone.

KILS, with its modern 1000-watt transmitter, will be the most powerful station in Alaska. Bob Flagler, song-writing announcer-engineer, has left Nome and is on his way to the Arctic Circle, where he will start tests immediately upon his arrival to determine the best location for originating the broadcasts.

A circuit of approximately 17,000 miles will carry voices from one end of the earth to the other. Flagler's voice, transmitted by KILS, will be picked up by the RCA either

at Point Reyes, Calif., or Riverhead, L. I., for relay to Little America and simultaneously to the nation-wide Columbia network.

Flagler will also set up a multiple receiving system in the Artic Circle in order to hear the Antarctic part of the broadcast, either through the nearest Columbia station or the RCA transmitter at Bolinas, Calif.



**KING AND QUEEN TO LAUNCH
GIANT CUNARD LINER "534"**

The King and Queen of England will participate in the ceremonies of the launching of the world's largest ocean liner, the great Cunarder so far known only as "534," which will be broadcast over NBC networks direct from the shipyard near Glasgow, Scotland, some time in September. Queen Mary will christen the huge ship, and Their Majesties will join in the jubilation of the crowd as the monster liner takes the water to the accompanying tumult of scores of harbor craft.

The speakers for the event will be announced later, but it is certain that their number will include several prominent government officials and it is even possible that Queen Mary herself will be heard by NBC audiences as she gives the liner a name to replace its present numerical designation. When finished, the new Cunarder will be the largest, probably the fastest, and certainly the most luxurious liner afloat. She will have a speed estimated at 30 knots. The NBC broadcast of the event will be received from Glasgow via BBC, London.



**WYNN TO RETURN FOR THIRD
SEASON ON NBC IN FALL**

Ed Wynn, now on summer vacation from the microphone, will be back on the air over National Broadcasting Company networks again next fall for his third season of broadcasting under the sponsorship of the Texas Company.

The famous Fire Chief of the air again will be the star of a weekly series of half-hour broadcasts over nation-wide networks, beginning at a date and hour to be announced later.

And this time, Graham, the program is going to be different, says the Chief, who is thinking up new ideas for his return during his vacation, the second he has had since he made his radio debut on April 26, 1932.

Since that first appearance before the microphone, which launched him on a radio career that established him more widely in a few weeks as the Fire Chief than all his theatrical years had as "The Perfect Fool," Wynn has given nearly 100 broadcasts.

BATTLING FOR EARS

By DICK TEMPLETON

WE are about to witness the "battle of the ears." That is, unless present plans miscarry, Eddie Cantor, the banjo-eyed, outspoken fellow who has been able to antagonize many New York radio editors, is to do eight weeks in the fall for his present coffee sponsor who now offers Jimmy Durante on Sunday nights. After that eight weeks, Cantor and company shift not only sponsors but networks. Cantor is reputed to have more listeners than any other performer in radio. He goes to Columbia for the makers of Pebeco toothpaste.

And when he does, his coffee sponsor is reported as planning the biggest and perhaps the most expensive radio program in history—one of the reasons perhaps being that Cantor will be heard on the rival network at exactly the same hour on which he has been heard for the coffee maker. It will not be amiss if the coffee sponsor builds a show deliberately aimed at outdrawing listeners who have loyally followed Cantor that the program will cost around \$25,000 per broadcast. The sponsor found that Cantor sold coffee and if he sold it, his successor, if a better drawing card, might sell even more coffee.

Rumors have been going around to the effect that Paul Whiteman's orchestra plus Bing Crosby—certainly a great draw for female listeners and hence prospective coffee purchasers—plus any one of a number of things and people might be the opposition. The idea of taking up the great George Arliss, reported to have asked \$100,000 for thirteen broadcasts, in this spot is not out of the way. Arliss might not make 'em laugh at wheezes of the Cantor type, but he might draw a terrific audience. So might original musical comedies by the father of American operettas, Jerome Kern, who is on the market if the sponsor puts down \$50,000 in advance. But the gentlemen who built the original Cantor program are facing a stiff task.

It will not be easy to follow Cantor. And there is little solace in the idea that mayhap Cantor is losing his ear appeal. Sponsors of the Ed Wynn show thought perhaps the cackling comic had slipped, but a telephone survey convinced them that he was well worth renewing for another series this fall.

The one danger in the looming battle for auricular attention lies in the fact that the gentlemen who once controlled what is known as the American theater outspent their rivals and as result found they were paying stars so much money that even a sold out house left them only coffee money. And if high salaries for stage shows ruined

the theater, might the same tactics not ruin radio? Suppose the time came when the sponsor who spends \$5,000 for a show—which is above average for a half-hour program today—suddenly found himself in the piker class.

The drawing power of names cannot be underestimated. But there are still several brave souls in the advertising agency business who believe that "the play is the thing" and that a high priced star does not necessarily mean a high degree of excellence.

But the gentlemen who advertise may stage just such a battle, and from the viewpoint of the listener, it should prove highly interesting.

Should the battle end in a tie, it will mean two radio sets in each home with papa listening to Cantor's jokes and mania and the young folks tuned in on his opposition, or vice versa.

At all odds, it will be one battle "worth listening to!"

DX fans are often puzzled by the time difference throughout the world, and have difficulty in computing the time at distant points with respect to the local time. Particularly is this true in the short-wave field, where foreign DX reception is not only possible, but a regular occurrence. For instance, when the Pacific network gives us the London rebroadcasts, no doubt many listeners are puzzled to know the hour in London corresponding to Pacific time. The local time, under the "Pacific" heading, corresponds to the time indicated on the same

horizontal line in any other part of the world. It is seen that 2 a. m. here is 10 a. m. in London, 9:30 p. m. in New Zealand, 8 p. m. in Sydney, 7 p. m. in Japan, etc. If you should hear Manila on short waves at 6 a. m., you will know that it is 10 p. m. there. In order to determine whether it is the same day, or the preceding or following day, follow this rule: Crossing from dark to light area at midnight, indicates the following day. Crossing from light to dark area indicates preceding day.
