Stars of the Radio Theatre



FRANCES LANGFORD, *contralto*

FROM Main Street of Lakeland, Florida, to the bright lights of Broadway was an overnight hop for Frances Langford. Just eighteen months separated her first public appearance at a local fancy-dress ball and her first performance as soloist with Abe Lyman's Orchestra. She appeared in a Lakeland American Legion party "A Night in Hollywood." The director of a Tampa station happened to be present and the next day Miss Langford signed a contract for radio appearances.

Rudy Vallee chanced to hear her sing over the Tampa station, and offered her a guest appearance on his program. Six months later she was in New York, and appeared in Peter

Arno's musical comedy, "Here Goes the Bride."

The unusual quality of Miss Langford's voice is its resonant deepness.

Miss Langford bears a striking resemblance to both Lupe Velez and the Spanish dancer, Armida . . . is a cousin of Governor Carlton of Florida . . . native of the same town as Ruth Elder and George Haldemann, transatlantic fliers . . . likes horseback riding and golf . . . receives mail regularly from a curious admirer asking to whom she sings her love songs. Is now heard on the "Hollywood Hotel" coast to coast series, originating in Los Angeles with Dick Powell, Louella Parsons and Raymond Paige's Orchestra.

Special Events

Brahms' "Requiem" will be presented over a coast-to-coast network on Good Friday, April 19, from 8 to 9 a. m., P. S. T.

The first complete broadcast of this work last Good Friday resulted in a nationwide demand for a repeat performance.

This year the work will be repeated under the direction of Dr. T. Tertius Noble, organist and master of choristers of St. Thomas' Church in New York. He will conduct a chorus of 260 voices, consisting of the men and boys' choir of his church and the Newark Foundation Chorus, together with a symphony orchestra. Dr. Noble, formerly organist of Cambridge University, Ely Cathedral and York Minster in England, organized and conducted the York (England) Symphony Orchestra.

Brahms called his Opus 45 a "German Requiem" to distinguish it from the Liturgical requiem of the Roman Catholic Church. He selected his texts from the Lutheran Bible. His use of the adjective, German, in the title refers only to the translation of scripture from which he quoted. He disclaimed commemorating any national or historic event or personage in this composition, although his correspondence indicates that he frequently thought of his mother while working on the "Requiem." This work, which many authorities regard as Brahms' noblest creation, will be sung in English when it is broadcast on April 19.

KFI-KPO and affiliated stations in the West will broadcast this program.

For its concert on Sunday, April 7, between 12 and 2 p. m., P. S. T., the New York Philharmonic Society will present the last of the Brahms cycle. The rarely heard First Serenade will be performed and Arturo Toscanini will conduct the program, which will include Brahms' Fourth Symphony.

Lennie Hayton will return to the air with a Saturday series of full hour broadcasts over KPO, KFI, KOMO, KGW, KDYL, and other western stations, beginning April 20 at 5 p. m., P. S. T. He has been engaged to assemble a special orchestra and an imposing popular entertainment, embodying numerous new features. The broadcasts will originate in New York.

Listeners are promised many interesting radio glimpses of the California Pacific International Exposition which opens at San Diego, Calif., May 29, over KPO, KFI and affiliated stations.

Facilities for a series of broadcasts during the Fair are being installed for the benefit of listening audiences all over the country.

The sixty-first running of the Kentucky Derby will be broadcast coast to coast Saturday, May 4 between 4 and 4:30 p. m., P. S. T. For the first time the race will be sponsored. At the mike will be Thomas Bryan George, noted turf commentator.

Radio Shouters Pipe Down

The success on radio of men like Eddie Guest, Professor William Lyon Phelps, Jack Benny, and Lawrence Tibbett, have proved to American sponsors that a fireside manner pleases the armchairs.

Guest approaches the microphone with simplicity, talks just as though he were telling a story to a neighbor or reading a verse to one of the men in his newspaper office. Long a reporter and writer, Guest knows that bombast means nothing but noise, and that sound and fury never convinced anyone.

If anybody is entitled to assume an academic manner, it is Professor William Lyon Phelps, who has been talking to college boys for more than a quarter of a century. But he, too, has an excellent fireside manner, and his speech, while pure and well chosen, never sounds like studied rhetoric. Phelps seeks to interest listeners rather than to impress them.

In his little intimate talks about the songs he sings Lawrence Tibbett has a friendly manner. He, too, avoids any attempt to talk down to his listeners, and as a result he has won friends as a speaker as well as a vocal artist.

Jack Benny's manner is suave, and so is that of Fred Allen. None of them cling to the old hammer and tongs method.

Radio is a strange child which began by much yelling and table pounding. Most of the comics have ceased yelling. Ed Wynn is occasionally hysterical, and Jack Pearl shouts once in a while. But that is expected of them—a part of their act. The shouters are piping down and isn't it a relief!

THE "AMATEUR" CRAZE

Radio's Newest Program Stampede Now Going Professional,
With Veteran Showmen at the Helm

IT LOOKS as if the Amateur program craze is settling down to a new movement of pretentious proportions. Serious men of finance are playing angel for coast-to-coast amateur events, with seasoned radio impresarios keeping the wild and woolies of Amateurdom within reasonable bounds.

This is a promising trend, and it looks as if the good work instituted these years past by Paul Whiteman, Rudy Vallee, Major Edward Bowes, "Roxy," A. Atwater Kent and others, is going to bear good fruit.

The "Amateur" idea has been kicked around the radio lot for many years. For a long time "Amateur Nights" were devices of equally amateurish impresarios with the bright idea of getting by with a program (sponsored if a victim were found) without any talent cost.

The harvest of dollars was reaped by commission collectors at the expense of hopeful boys and girls touched by the microphone lure, and with hardly more than that. The reverberations from the armchairs, assumed formidable rumbling and grumbling proportions, with a "why-pick-on-us-refrain."

The picture is now happily changing. Talented amateurs are receiving competent and expert advice and preparation for their maiden efforts. It is good for radio to discover new talent. But it is an imposition on loyal artists who have given much at no return—waiting for a "break" with a cash coda attached, to inflict the raw, unprepared amateur on the listener.

Roxy Helps Newcomers

Roxy is one radio citizen who practices what he preaches. With all the hurry and flurry toward programs featuring amateurs, Roxy has consistently fought them on the ground that they are cruel to beginners.

He recently turned down an offer that would have netted him one hundred thousand dollars in a season to appear in a chain of theatres, to pick out the leading amateur of the week who would bear the label "A Roxy Discovery."

Probably no five people in radio have done as much to focus the flickering spotlight of fame on the newcomer as has Roxy. For ten years and longer, a day has rarely passed but that from one to a dozen ambitious youngsters have "auditioned" for Roxy. The question has invariably been the same: "any experience?" If they had none, he advised them to go and get it—on a small radio station, in their home town, in amateur theatricals, in night clubs, in smaller theaters. All of the talent Roxy has brought forth in

his years as an impresario has been experienced before he attempted to study it and advise it. He always felt that an ambitious person should learn one thing before he was suitable material for real exploiting and that is the terms of show business—the little fine points of which everyone seeking a professional career has need.

An outstanding example is Zora Layman, who is now being featured on Roxy's program. While no newcomer to radio, Miss Layman, has been knocking at the door of radio, all the while gaining that valuable experience to make her "suitable material" for progress. And there has been more talk about Zora Layman since Roxy presented her, than there had been in two years previously. Why? Because Roxy heard her, studied what she could do best and then presented her in the best light. She was "trouper" enough to understand what he was talking about, and as a result is a regular member of his featured "gang."

"But," asks Roxy, "could you do that with an inexperienced amateur? Never," he says.

Creates Telephone Problem

Major Edward Bowes of Capitol Family fame, has long been a friend of the amateur. His prestige as a showman is evidenced by this fact:

More than 160 persons, a newly created telephone exchange and 250 trunk lines were called into service recently to enable nearly 30,000 radio listeners in New York and Chicago to vote for their favorites on Major Edward Bowes' first amateur hour broadcast.

To handle the vast volume of calls, the New York Telephone Company created a new exchange and installed 200 trunk lines, terminating in a room containing 2,350 square feet of space and adjoining the broadcasting studio in Radio City. Fifty additional trunk lines were utilized in Chicago to collect the votes of Chicago listeners, totals of which then were relayed to New York by direct wire.

Receiving the incoming calls in Radio City were more than 100 operators, answering each call with the words, "Major Bowes' Amateur Hour. Your vote, please." The operators recorded the votes received on special forms, which were picked up at frequent intervals by page boys and turned over to fifteen tabulators. Tabulated results were then rushed by other page boys to the broadcasting studio for Major Bowes to announce on the air.

All this has the tang of "big business." But let us not forget, that without big business, last year's \$72,000,000 radio bill would not only be unpaid, but would never have been contracted.

With big business back of the amateur, listeners may confidently look for worthwhile results.

1935 Sports Schedules

Major sports events of two continents will be covered by radio during the spring and summer months. Racing, boating, boxing, tennis and baseball will be included in the schedule over KPO and western stations.

Western and Pacific Coast listeners have a wide range of choice in the Sports Events scheduled for spring and summer, broadcast from coast to coast. NBC has scheduled two broadcasts from the East-West Indoor Polo Championship play on Wednesday, April 10, and Saturday, April 13. On Friday, April 19, NBC's mobile transmitter will be driven to New England to bring descriptions of the start and finish of the historic Boston Marathon.

During May there will be broadcasts of some of the outstanding collegiate crew races, baseball, and the running of the Kentucky Derby on May 4 and the Preakness on May 11.

Baseball and tennis will be included among the outstanding sports events during the summer months. Such important tennis events as the Davis Cup Matches, the All-England Tennis Championships at Wimbledon, and the United States National Men's and Women's singles and doubles are included. John Tunis, internationally known sports authority, and also Graham McNamee, Ford Bond, Don Wilson and George Hicks will bring word-pictures of the country's outstanding sports events.

* * *

Columbia stations will place emphasis on the baseball and turf line-up for the season, with Thomas Bryan George, noted writer and radio commentator on racetrack doings; France Laux, baseball authority, and Ted Husing, the network's ace sports announcer, handling the major assignments in these divisions.

On April 16 Columbia will broadcast one of the major opening baseball contests of the season—the game yet to be determined—and on April 23 the engagement between the New York Giants and the Boston Braves at the Polo Grounds, New York. The latter event will be of especial interest to metropolitan fans in that it will mark the first appearance of Babe Ruth in New York as a member of the Boston Braves.

American turf events will be inaugurated on Saturday, April 20, with the opening of the eastern racing season at the Jamaica track, followed by the Wood Memorial stakes on April 27, which brings forward the eastern candidates for the Kentucky Derby. Then, in succession, radio listeners will hear eye-witness descriptions of the Preakness, on May 11; the Belmont Park opening on May 16; the Metropolitan Handicap at Belmont, May 18.

Another prominent place in the spring line-up is held by important eastern collegiate track meets and boat races. Most of these colorful classics of amateur sport will be described by Ted Husing, who draws as his initial assignment in this particular schedule the annual Penn Relays at Franklin Field, Philadelphia, on Friday and Saturday, April 26 and 27. On Saturday, May 11, Husing will do the Heptagonal Games—intercollegiate track meet—at Princeton, and the Princeton invitation track meet, on Saturday, June 15. Also, on the latter date, Husing will describe the annual Poughkeepsie Regatta from an amphibian plane.

New Personality Program

A new word of cheer is now being heard daily at 10:15 a. m., over the air lanes via KYA. The "Prosperian" is the name of the program as well as the title of a book of practical philosophy—and a personality as interpreted by Barry Hopkins.

Twenty years ago the inspirational writings of Dr. Orison Sweet Marden, James Allen, and others, were noteworthy influences in American business, as mental stimulants for all who were willing to work for success.

The "Prosperian," with an up-to-date picture of present-day conditions, should prove a helpful and welcome addition to the Marden books, James Allen's "As a Man Thinketh" and "The Magic Story" by Frederick Van Renssaeler Dey, which books have been translated into practically every language where reading stimulates confidence in the future and more productive effort in the present.

KROW Adds Extra Hour

To help meet the increasing demand of a large audience that heretofore has been neglected to a considerable extent, KROW is broadcasting the "Early Riser's Show" daily (except Sundays at 6 a. m.)

KROW now operates on a 20-hour per day schedule.

Jimmie Grier, whose Los Angeles Biltmore Hotel orchestra is heard nightly, knows when he has had enough.

Some weeks ago Grier announced that he would devote two afternoons of each week to amateur composers, hoping to find a successor to Pinky Tomlin's "The Object of My Affections," which Grier discovered and brought to popularity in just such a manner.

Long and short, fat and thin, good and bad, hundreds of aspiring tyros descended upon Grier in such numbers that his sleeping hours became a wakeful succession of soprano and tenor voices, and rhymes of "June," "moon" and "spoon."

The song auditions are off, and will not be repeated. Grier has announced.

Here's Another "What Do You Think" Topic

So many programs now have studio audiences, either genuine or artificial, which applaud every few minutes. This is rather disturbing in most instances and I believe detracts from the program. Many times one does not hear the beginning of the next words spoken as the audience is still clapping.

Applauding by the audience also takes up considerable valuable time which could be devoted to the program or advertising, although the latter, I believe, should be limited to proper intervals, such as, at the beginning or ending of the program.

The audience in the studio has the advantage over the radio audience in that the latter cannot see the performers, and therefore miss many amusing scenes which the studio audience, judging from the applause, must see. I would say that 75 per cent of the applause appears to be unnecessary and foolish to the radio audience. After all, they constitute 99 per cent and should be given preference. It would appear that the studio audience is merely a "stooge" audience, being told when and how to applaud, and this is really an insult to the intelligence of the radio audience.

I should also like to have listed among good classical music, such programs as the recordings of "Symphony Highlights," KYA or other programs of similar nature. Believe me, with so little of the best Symphony and Chamber music on the air, over against the superabundance of jazz and mixed programs (where a jazz number chases a classical record off the air in a promiscuous program) it is a relief to leave the radio tuned in to a station which gives us a half-hour of high-class recordings. Also the Sunday evening opera broadcast of KYA is worthy of consideration, when almost the entire Sunday evening is packed with jazz and whining and moaning organ music.
