The Week's Special Events on the Air

PROGRAM schedules are settling down for the summer season, and many new features are due within the next few weeks. Indications point to more new programs this summer than any previous season, as well as holdovers, on coast-to-coast features.

The Columbia network will carry an international broadcast from a steamer up the Danube River from Vienna during the traditional blossom time festival on Sunday, May 12, between 8:45 and 9:00 a. m., P. S. T. A Columbia commentator will broadcast from the vessel as it arrives at the village of Duerstein, in the Wachau District, where the blossom festival is concentrated.

At 11 a. m., the Handel and Haydn Society from Boston will interest music lovers. St. Louis puts her best radio foot forward at noon Sunday over CBS, instead of the Philharmonic Orchestra as formerly.

A new series featuring Ethel Merman and Al Goodman occupies the Eddie Cantor spot at 4 p. m. over CBS.

NBC offers a new feature at 9 p. m. Sunday, titled "Benny Walker and His Entertainers," featuring the Jones Boys Quintet.

It is welcome news to many fans that Al Pearce and Gang are to be heard Monday and Saturday at 10:30 a. m., beginning Monday, May 13, over KPO and network.

"American Adventure," a new dramatic series with Stanley High as narrator, is heard over the NBC network on Monday, May 13, at 4 p. m. At 4:30 p. m. follows a coast-to-coast broadcast by Meredith Willson, with Tommy Harris as soloist.

Al Smith is scheduled for a talk on "The Human Side of Life" at 6:15 p. m. Wednesday over KPO network.

On Thursday at 6:30 p. m., Horace Heidt broadcasts from Denver on CBS, while at 9:15 the return of Meredith Willson's "Chiffon Jazz" opus is celebrated over KPO network, with Lucile Kirtley, soprano, as soloist.

Red Davis in Book Form

"Red Davis," a book based on the dramatic program of the same name, will soon be published by Engelvan-Weisman.

It is a narrative version of some of the incidents broadcast in dramatic form, and was prepared by Kenneth Hallam of the staff of RKO. The Red Davis dramatic script is written by Elaine Sterne Carrington, well known author.

The Red Davis radio program was a popular feature with NBC listeners. On the air three times weekly for thirty weeks during

the fall of 1934 and the spring of 1935, the program will probably return to the networks again in the fall.

Irene Rich Begins

New Original Drama Series

Irene Rich, celebrated star of stage and screen, whose radio portrayals of original roles have delighted radio listeners in the East, is now scheduled for the Pacific Coast on Friday at 4 p. m. over a KPO network.

The new dramas presented by Miss Rich and a cast of veteran microphone performers, from New York, succeed "Jewels of Enchantment," the radio serial in which Miss Rich was featured for many months.

Landon on Blue Moonlight

Clay Landon, NBC guitarist, will replace Alvino Rey on the Blue Moonlight program starting May 12.

Rey has resigned from the NBC staff and left for the East on May 9.

Landon, who comes from Santa Cruz, California, has been playing in NBC orchestras for the past year. His pleasant singing voice is heard occasionally with the orchestra, and he is an expert "dialectician" and voice-doubler.

What—No Spats?

Don Bestor, director of the musical destinies of the Jack Benny radio program, has gone Hollywood, by his own admission.

Much to the surprise of Benny and the studio audience, Bestor appeared for his second program at Hollywood's NBC studios clad in a grey sport ensemble, with low shirt and flowing tie.

And, horror of horrors, he had no spats on. "Bestor, where are your spats?" shouted Benny across the stage.

"The southland has got me at last," Bestor answered, with that toothsome grin of his. "I've gone Hollywood!"

"Well, after this," reprimanded Benny. "don't forget your spats, no matter if you come in shorts. What do you think we built that 'spat' gag up for anyway?"

"Mr. and Mrs." skit changes time from 3:45 to 9:15 a.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday, over KHJ-KFRC network.

"Between the Bookends," formerly heard at 1:45 p.m., is now scheduled for 10:30 a.m. over CBS daily.

"Circus Night in Silvertown" is now heard on Friday at 6:30 p.m.

News and Comment

EDWARD TOMLINSON, internationally known authority on South and Central America, is now en route to Buenos Aires, where he will report the proceedings of the Pan-American Economic Conference in a number of programs to be rebroadcast over NBC network.

The conference meets in the Argentine capital on May 26, and that day Tomlinson will present his first program, during which he will introduce to NBC listeners Dr. Carlos Saavedra Lamas, chairman of the conference, and the American Ambassador, Alexander Weddell.

The exact number of programs, which will be relayed to the NBC network from the studios of Radio Splendid in Buenos Aires, has not yet been determined.

Tomlinson has been heard many times over NBC in talks dealing with the twenty republics below the Rio Grande. In his journeys about the southern continent he has covered many thousands of miles—20,000 on a single airplane tour—and he is intimately acquainted with leaders in politics, industry and commerce.

During his present trip he also will write a number of newspaper and magazine series.

P. T. A. Programs Heard Again

Dr. Harry Overstreet, head of the Department of Philosophy and Psychology of the College of the City of New York, opened a new series of programs under the auspices of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers over a coast-to-coast NBC network each Thursday, May 2, at 1 p. m.

The Mother Singers will open and close the program from the NBC Chicago studios.

This series of weekly broadcasts will be released in the West over an NBC-KGO network.

Epic of America to Be Related in New Dramas

The American Adventure, radio's new departure in dramatic entertainment, is now heard over a nation-wide network at 4 p. m., P. S. T., each Monday.

Stanley High, noted commentator, will be narrator for the series, and will act as coun-

sel for its authors on angles of American political, economic and social history.

Each of the thirteen installments is being prepared by a different member of NBC's continuity staff. Each performance is a complete episode of a distinct era in the life of a typical American family from the time of the famous Mayflower Compact, America's "Magna Charta," to the present day of complex government and social problems. KPO heads the NBC network in the West broadcasting this program.

Francia White Now Star of "The Haydns"

Lovely Francia White, co-starring with James Melton in "Music at the Haydns," came east to broadcast over coast-to-coast hook-ups only a few months ago, and already has won stardom in her own right. Today she has climbed the radio heights to a position where she co-stars with no less a favorite than James Melton, one of America's most popular young tenors.

Miss White sings the part of Barbara Haydn. As originally planned, Barbara wasn't intended as the star of the series. With Miss White in the rôle, however, it automatically grew to starring proportions and the script had to be plotted accordingly. The same applies to the rôle of Rudolf Rondelli, which immediately assumed starring proportions when James Melton stepped into the part.

Al Goodman's Orchestra furnishes the music.

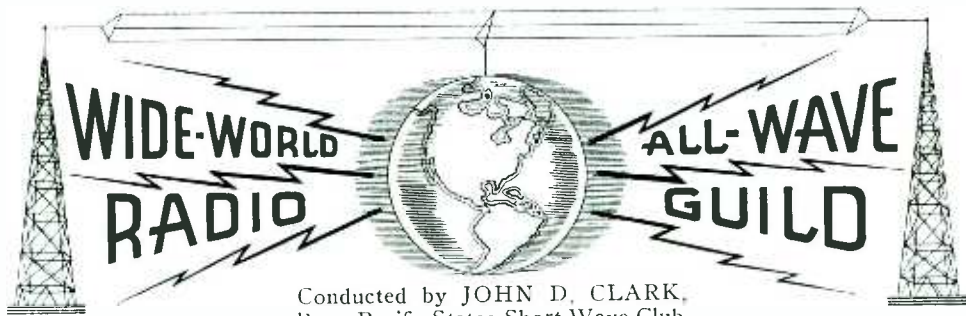

Allen's present contract with sponsors of Town Hall Tonight, allows for a thirteen-week vacation after his June 26 broadcast. He will go to the West Coast early in July for the picture and will return to the air in the fall.

Pres. Pacific States Short Wave Club

IN spite of generally unfavorable conditions, a distinct improvement has been noted during the past few weeks. The three British Empire stations, GSD, GSB, and GSL, continue to be the star performers, followed closely by "Radio Coloniale," and with Spain's EAQ running a poor third. GSD is now being heard between 11 a. m. and 1 p. m., and GSB from 3 to 5 and from 9:15 to 11:15 p. m., the former operating on 11.75 meg., and the latter on 9.51 meg. GSL is heard four times a week (Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday) from 7 to 8 p. m., with an experimental transmission for the western United States and Canada. The familiar chimes of Big Ben are a regular feature of every broadcast from the Daventry stations, and for listeners who want their time first hand from the Greenwich observatory, we might add that the first stroke of the hour from this historic old clock indicates time which is correct to the half second.

The powerful French station "Radio Coloniale" comes on the air every morning with the familiar strains of the "Marsellaise." Unfortunately, very few announcements are given in English, but the words "Ici Paris, Radio Coloniale" are frequently repeated during the program, and a studio clock with chimes similar to those of Big Ben can be heard every quarter hour. The frequency is 11.90 meg. The same station may also be heard on 11.71 meg. from 3 to 6 p. m. daily.

As summer approaches and the days get longer, the majority of South American stations on the 49 meter band will probably disappear into the rising noise level.

On about 8.20 meg. is a powerful Ecuadorian transmitter which refuses to give way in the endless battle with atmospheric interference. Formerly operating on a frequency of 4.10 meg., this station is now broadcasting on the higher frequency, using the same call letters, MCJB, and the same slogan, "The Voice of the Andes." The friendly announcer, who incidentally speaks perfect English has requested that this change be made known to the station's many listeners in North America. Programs are broadcast daily until 8:30 p. m.

The phantom Chinese station ZBW, which was mentioned in this column last week, has already left the air, vanishing almost as suddenly as it appeared. The announcer indicated a change in frequency to 4.51 meg., but an extensive search has failed to reveal even a trace of this new Hongkong broadcaster.

Station HJ4ABL, "Ecos del Occidente," is one of the few South American broadcasters which feature multi-language announcements. This transmitter, which is located in Manizales, Colombia, broadcasts a special program every Saturday night from 8 to 9 p. m., and announcements are made in English, French, and Spanish. Mr. Van den Euden is the versatile linguist, and does all the work at the microphone unassisted. Tune in HJ4ABL for a fine program. The frequency is 6.10 meg.

* * *

If you haven't yet heard a Japanese baseball game you are missing one of the short waves' most interesting broadcasts. Station JVM, working on 10.74 meg., usually transmits running commentaries on these games three or four times a week between 9 p. m. and midnight. Usually Friday and Saturday seem to be the most popular days. College yells, bands, and excited announcers lend a high degree of color to what might otherwise be a rather dull performance for those who are not acquainted with the Nipponese language.

* * *

While the short waves are full of baseball games from Japan, horse races from Australia, rugby contests from England, basketball from Colombia, and chess matches from Russia and Panama, the ether has not, until last week, been utilized for contract bridge. But the stations are always searching for some new novelty, and it remained for W2XAF and HJ1ABB to initiate the latest in radio "stunts." The north and west hands were played by two members of the W2XAF staff and their partners were two señoritas at station HJ1ABB of Barranquilla, Colombia. Just to provide the ultimate in fairness, the cards were dealt by station VK2ME of Sydney, Australia. The match was scheduled

to take place during the regular Monday afternoon contact at 2:30 p. m., but was carried over a day because of atmospheric interference.

The DX Corner

Station PHI of Huizen, Holland, is now on 17.77 meg. daily except Tuesday and Wednesday from 4 to 6:40 a. m.

PCJ of Eindhoven, Holland, is broadcasting special test transmissions on Tuesday from midnight to 3 a. m., and on Wednesday from 4 to 8 a. m.

TFK, one of **Iceland's** new short wave stations, has been heard on the Pacific Coast Monday and Friday between 6 and 9 p. m. The frequency is 9.09 meg.

HC2JSB of Guayaquil, Ecuador, is now working on a new frequency of 7.83 meg. The schedule calls for operation daily between 4:20 and 8:20 p. m.

A new station is now on the air in Colombia, operating on 8.62 meg. near 3:30 a. m. It is owned by the Radio Department of the Ministry of War, and uses the call HKV. "K as in Kentucky and V as in Virginia."

Station HJ1ABE of Cartagena, Colombia, now broadcasts its regular Monday evening special program one hour later to avoid interference from W2XE. The transmission is carried out from 8 to 8:45 p. m. on 6.115 meg., and is dedicated to the short wave clubs of the world.

HIH of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic, broadcasts a special program to short wave clubs of the United States and Canada for one hour commencing at 11:40 p. m., Saturday night. The frequency is 6.81 meg.

Station ORK of Brussels, Belgium, is now being heard by a number of listeners on the Pacific Coast. They broadcast daily programs on 10.33 meg. from 10 a. m. to noon, and announce "Ici Bruxelles I. N. R. Emission speciale pour le Congo par la station de Ruysselede. ORK, 29.04 meters."

YDB of Sourabaya, Java, is now on 6.04 meg. every morning commencing at 3 a. m. Excellent recorded programs are given in both English and foreign tongues.

VE9HX of Halifax, Nova Scotia, is once more reading letters and notes to the trappers of the far north. Transmissions are effected every Saturday night between 8 and 10 p. m. on 6.11 meg.

Do You Remember?

Eight years ago San Francisco and other cities on the Pacific Coast heard the first program broadcast over the National Broadcasting Company's western network.

On April 5, 1927, the inaugural program marking the first NBC hook-up on the Coast was presented from San Francisco. The first headquarters for the then new NBC division was a two-room suite in the Hotel St. Francis, but the inaugural broadcast took place in the Gold Room of the hotel in order to accommodate the imposing array of talent gathered there.

Included was the entire San Francisco Symphony, with Alfred Hertz on the conductor's dais. Standard music comprised the largest part of the program; Jean Gordon, contralto, Elfrieda Wynn, concert and opera star, Mary Groom, Grace Le Page, Gwynfi Jones, and Albert Gillette were featured artists. Max Dolin played a violin solo, and Dorothy Talbot, coloratura soprano, and Lambert Murphy, tenor, were also heard. On the lighter side of the entertainment were the Duncan Sisters, with a Topsy and Eva skit, and Henry Halsted and his orchestra.

Two persons who took part in the broadcast still are heard regularly. They are Gwynfi Jones, tenor, and Jennings Pierce, who announced the program. Pierce now is director of agricultural broadcasts for the Western Division, and Jones is a soloist on the New Woman's Magazine of the Air.

Shortly after the division was organized, NBC moved its headquarters to the 111 Sutter Street Building's top floor. Since then, growing needs of what has become one of the major industries of the West have caused NBC to utilize space on the twenty-first floor for additional studios, the turrets of the building for music library, and the entire second floor and most of the third for offices. Additional studios in Hale Brothers' department store also are in constant use.

Rita Lester in New Series

Rita Lester, glamorous contralto of musical comedy, is now heard every Wednesday at 10:45 a. m., P. S. T., over an NBC nation-wide network. She comes to the air following extensive appearances on the stage.

Since her first professional engagement at Grauman's Chinese Theatre in Hollywood, Miss Lester has sung leads and parts in musical shows all over the country. In 1927 she was cast in the lead of "Topsy and Eva," playing larger Pacific Coast cities. From 1928 to 1930, Rita was featured at Chicago theatres and sang in "Hands Up" and "Take It Easy" in a thirty-week run on the Publix Circuit. KPO heads the western network releasing Miss Lester's programs.

Chiffon Jazz Returns to Air

Further assurance to dialers that there will be an abundance of good western programs on the air during the summer months is given in the announcement that Chiffon Jazz will be revived, each Thursday at 9:15 p. m., P. S. T. This distinctive and popular sustaining program achieved wide favor until the time it went off the air over a year ago. Meredith Willson's orchestra will be featured in the program, which offers just what its name implies, American song favorites in suave and delicate arrangements. Lucile Kirtley, soprano from the musical comedy stage, will preside as Mistress Jazz. KPO heads the NBC network broadcasting this program.

The tiny RCA-Victor short-wave receiver, and the specially constructed eight-watt transmitter, which Captain Albert W. Stevens and Captain Orville A. Anderson will carry with them when they attempt another invasion of the stratosphere early next June, have been completed.

Captains Stevens and Anderson will utilize the miniature broadcasting equipment to give NBC listeners a description of the world's envelope and report progress of their flight, through arrangements between the National Broadcasting Company, the Radio Corporation of America, and the National Geographic Society, which is sponsoring the flight jointly with the United States Army Air Corps.
