## News and Comment

A LITTLE white-haired woman sat in Columbia's Radio Playhouse in New York as Fred Waring and his Pennsylvanians filled the air with music. It was a cavalcade of music from the pen of Jerome David Kern. Softly the strains sounded and the chorus of voices droned, almost like a chant; then gradually they rose and blended to superb tonal heights, like a benediction.

More than 1,000 spectators sat in rapt attention. Suddenly they relaxed and a salvo of applause rent the air. But, the little white-haired woman didn't stir. She looked about her and wiped a transient tear from her cheek.

She was Mrs. Jessie C. Waring, mother of the youthful Fred who was taking his bows.

And as the applause continued, an unassuming, white-haired man in another part of the theater wiped away tears that welled in his eyes. He was Jerome David Kern.

Then Waring raised a hand and said: "I should like to introduce to you the man who wrote all that I have just played. It is an honor to know he is here." Mr. Kern took the stage and said, "I am not ashamed to say I have been crying. They were tears of joy!"

Waring again faced his audience. He looked down at his feet, toyed with his hands and finally stammered: "And, ladies and gentlemen, there is a little woman sitting right there—(and he pointed)—who is my mother." The spectators leaned forward and as the little woman rose a roar of applause came! Then she sat down, blushing with pride.

Lily Pons, she of the golden voice, and Andre Kostelanetz, noted orchestra conductor, were also present and joined in the applause.

On November 11th, for the third consecutive year, Jessica Dragonette, NBC soprano, will be featured soloist at the Armistice Day ceremonies, held under the auspices of the American Legion at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington Cemetery, Wash-

ington, D. C. Her soprano offerings will be "Taps," "Roses of Picardy" and "There's a Long, Long Trail A-Winding."

Miss Dragonette was presented with a silver plaque by the District of Columbia department of the Legion on July 26. She is the only radio artist to appear at any of the organization's Armistice services in Arlington Cemetery.

For twenty years Edgar A. Guest has been a celebrity. His poems are known to countless millions. He read his poems on the air for more than two years—but when he took the role of editor in "Welcome Valley," a homey radio script program, movie moguls took notice. He sounded sincere, he read his lines well. Here was a tyro radio star, aged 54. The kindly quality so evident in all his radio work has focused the cinema camera on him. Radio did in six short months what national fame had not accomplished in two decades.

Barry McKinley, youthful baritone star of "When Dreams Come True," is now a Kentucky colonel. This in itself is not unusual. Many people become Kentucky colonels. But young McKinley holds another title, conferred on him by ex-Governor White of Ohio, that of "Ohio's Ambassador of Melody." Perhaps this will set up a new regulation in radio: only those with military or diplomatic titles will be signed considered for sponsorship!

Phil Duey, who stars on the "Musical Rendezvous" over NBC, contends that too many people fail in their business efforts because they don't mind their own business.

# Philharmonic-Symphony to Poll Audience for Favorite Works

Will Play Nation's Choice, Celebrating 200th Broadcast December 1, over 115-Station Net

**C**ELEBRATING the 200th broadcast of the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Society over the Columbia Broadcasting System on Sunday, December 1, the world-famous orchestra, under the direction of Otto Klemperer, will offer a special program composed entirely of selections chosen by Columbia's nation-wide radio audience. The concert almost coincides with the 93rd anniversary of the orchestra's first program, played on December 7, 1842. As usual, the broadcast will originate in Carnegie Hall, New York City, and will be heard over the combined CBS and Canadian networks from 12:00 to 2:00 p. m., PST.

This unusual concert promises to be a memorable one for several reasons. For the first time in its distinguished history, the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Society will feature a program composed exclusively of selections chosen by radio listeners from coast to coast.

During the regular Philharmonic-Symphony broadcast, the radio audience will be asked each week to send in their choice of symphonic works in three different categories. Listeners will be asked to choose a standard overture, a standard symphony, and a major work by a living composer. All nominations must be in the hands of the orchestra's directors by Sunday, November 24.

According to Lawrence Gilman, the Philharmonic-Symphony's commentator on the Sunday series, this is the first opportunity music-lovers at large have had to register simultaneously their judgment on the works of living composers. Additional interest in this field of modern music arises from the fact that Klemperer, who will direct the concert, is known as a noted interpreter and enthusiast for modern works. Compositions by living composers played in recent seasons by the Philharmonic-Symphony Society include works by Schoenberg, Glazounoff, Richard Strauss, Stravinsky, Shostakovitch, Prokofieff, Respighi, Casella, Honegger, Maurice Ravel and American composers such as Deems Taylor, Roy Harris, Aaron Copland and others.

Radio has played an increasingly prominent role in the recent history of the celebrated orchestra. The first coast-to-coast broadcast by the Philharmonic-Symphony Society over the Columbia network was heard on Sunday, October 5, 1930. A vivid contrast is afforded when one recalls that the first small audience of this notable orchestra gathered in the

Apollo Rooms on Lower Broadway, New York, on December 7, 1842, to hear a brief program of classical music featuring Beethoven's Fifth Symphony. There were two more concerts in that memorable first season. The orchestra's 200th broadcast over the Columbia system on December 1 will be heard through approximately 115 stations in the United States and Canada reaching a potential audience of more than 75,000,000 people.

Millions of American homes, long isolated, have found their living rooms flung open within a single decade to the world's repertoire of good music broadcast by the greatest artists. The directors of the Philharmonic-Symphony Society discovered this two years ago when their appeal for funds netted over \$60,000 from radio listeners alone, with thousands of letters from individuals whom no one would have suspected of being devotees of symphonic music. Season after season the radio response to the orchestra's Sunday broadcasts has grown in volume and extent.

## Thru the Radioscope with Earle Ferris

**I**MITATION, it would seem still takes the form of flattery in radio. One sponsor wants "something like" the other fellow has. A case in point is the fanfare attendant on the signing of **Helen Hayes** to be starred in "The New Penny." Hardly was the ink dry when news was flashed that **Leslie Howard**, another noted personage from the dramatic stage, would be featured in a series. Leaving the barrier, it would seem that Miss Hayes is on top because her script has plenty of heart-throb possibilities and down to earthiness; Leslie Howard has started off with a portrayal of a stilted character of yesteryear that has yet to get into full swing.

Now there is the report that "The Magic Voice" has been signed by a sponsor. This is the vehicle in which **Nick Dawson** and **Elsie Hitz** rode to their initial fame and which was dropped when they began their present NBC success, "Dangerous Paradise." Miss Hitz has what critics are pleased to call "the perfect voice" and in reviving the script act which Hitz, Dawson, et al. permitted to die, the program builder has the idea of using **Gertrude Hitz**, sister of Elsie, and an actress whose voice is most nearly like Elsie's.

One lesson, it would seem, that has not been learned, is that sponsors who sought "something like **Amos 'n' Andy**" have long ago left the two taxicab operators alone in their field.

From **Lincoln** to **Dragonette** in one generation. That, it would seem, is the history of the noted American sculptor, **Max Kalish**, who achieved his first national fame for carving a bronze Lincoln in a square in Cleveland. Now he has turned his hands to modeling la **Dragonette**. Notable among the other radio stars who have been models for sculptors are **Frank Black**, whose hands have been carved by no less than 17 people.

And speaking of art, a new type of voice has been discovered. It is the "dry point etching." It belongs to none other than pretty little **Babs Ryan**, who, with her brothers, will be heard on Wednesdays over CBS with Ray Noble's new "refreshment time." Noble put the label on her voice, which lies somewhere in the soprano register, and yet is neither, mezzo, lyric or coloratura.

Apparently the newest "sensation" in the vocal division of radio is titian-haired **Deane**

Gone forever is the lad who got 5000 letters a week when he wasn't giving away a trip to the moon or Ethiopia.

### *Ben Klassen, Ballad Singer, Joins Gypsies Program*

**Ben Klassen**, noted NBC tenor from the Pacific Coast, has joined the "Gypsies," radio's oldest network commercial broadcast series, as featured soloist. He is now heard each Monday at 9:00 p. m., E.S.T., over an NBC-WEAF network in the East.

In joining the ten-year-old series, Klassen follows in the footsteps of some of radio's outstanding tenors. Among his predecessors have been **James Melton**, **Jan Peerce**, **Robert Simmons** and **Frank Parker**.

Klassen is a radio veteran in his own right. He also started broadcasting ten years ago. For the last five he has been heard over NBC networks from the Pacific Coast on many programs, including **Carefree Carnival**, **Waltz Time**, conducted by **Meredith Willson**, and the **Woman's Magazine of the Air**. The Gypsies' program is released as far west as **Omaha, Nebraska**, through station **WOW**.

*Babs Ryan and Her Brothers Featured  
With Ray Noble's Orchestra*

**B**ABS RYAN and her Brothers, famed for their gay songs and musical novelties, will be presented with Ray Noble and his Orchestra in their new series over the nationwide Columbia network each Wednesday from 6:30 to 7:00 p. m.

The engagement of Babs and her Brothers marks another milestone in the success of this original singing trio. With their humor and their unique style of sophisticated singing, they will form an important part of Noble's unusual settings of popular melodies in a program which promises to be an outstanding one of the season.

Babs has been a gay spirit in the music world since she was the leading piano teacher at the age of 14 in Davidson, Tenn. She played the piano when she was 3 and at 12 she had her own orchestra and was booked for all the local club dances. Meanwhile her lively brothers were off touring with a gay act in vaudeville. Then Babs made her radio debut in Kansas City and found herself there, at 15, the hit of "The Cuban Gardens" and as sure of herself as any of the oldtimers.

Next she ran off to Chicago to join her brothers, Charlie and "Little," and the famous trio was formed then and there. Incidentally, it's Babe who wrote many of their trickiest arrangements. Fred Waring heard them at a song publisher's and immediately engaged them. Their humor, gayety, and velvet-smooth vocal delivery won them fame across the continent. Many of their distinctive qualities are similar to Ray Noble's own conceptions of presenting popular music in a suave, sophisticated manner.

Mel Frey, KYA continuity writer, is in the midst of a book that she is writing called "Cameos of San Francisco," which she hopes will rival James Caldwell Dobie's book on this city. Mrs. Frey is an experienced newspaper woman, having edited several magazines and newspapers in the north.

According to information, KNX, a true pioneer in the realm of broadcasting, and acknowledged top ranking outlet, will send many sustaining programs northbound. This will prove costly for a time, but business must warrant expenditures.

Olive West, who as a child played with the immortal Lotta Crabtree, and who spent more than fifty years before the footlights, contemplated retirement. She was to journey to her home in the country and enjoy the quietude that is due an artist who had given her tested talents through skim and full days. When she first appeared in NBC playlets, this veteran gave her all with the eagerness that evidenced itself when she first appeared on the stage. Positive that she had offered her Swan Song, Mrs. West was about to leave the city. BUT Sam Dickson, author of "Hawthorne House," a serial play, now heard on the NBC Coast network, had the grand old trouper paged, and it was at his insistence that she agreed to play "Grandma," one of the lead characters in the script. Now the listener is assured of another noteworthy performance in the long line of portrayals given by Olive West.

Proving that the listener takes his radio seriously, the response to join the Radio Listeners' Alliance is heavy. This organization—non-profit and non-commercial, is composed of persons who strive to get the maximum of pleasure from radio. unfortunately on arrival at the studio, he was told the number was restricted for air use. Because of his nervous tension, the lad broke down and a ready stream of tears found a course along his cheeks. Finally Cy Trobbe, station musical director, in consulting his files, discovered that the selection could be sung after all. Later, Marsden, a bundle of fidgets, sat in the rear of the broadcasting room. On his head was a ten-gallon hat which he removed when he sang at the microphone. When he finished his song, he placed the cowboy hat back on his head and repaired to his chair. The audience applauded with gusto. It continued, and Albert joined in the handclapping. Trunk lines in KYA's switchboard were stimulated, and from latest reports, the boy who had never been in a large city is to win the first prize—a free trip to the San Diego Exposition.

The Mail Bag—Andre Kostelanetz's orchestra is offered Wednesdays and Saturdays over CBS . . . Howard Barlow wields the baton on the "March of Time" program on the same hook-up . . . Betty Lou Gerson is the new leading lady of NBC First Nighter dramas. Her good luck came as the result of an audition. Hundreds of other actresses were tested . . . Mort Werner is back on KGGC conducting his "Open House" feature with guest artists each night . . . Charles Kaley, former CBS vocalist, is to be featured in a series of transcribed programs . . . Harold Dana, baritone, will have his three-a-week presentations sponsored by a well-known manufacturer beginning November 4th . . . Jack Hasty, former Coast writer, is authoring for Al Pearce and his Gang.


**"Brick" Holton Eastward Bound**



THE Junior Amphion Society of Seattle, which joins the ranks of "Male Chorus Parade" presentations with a program over the Columbia Don-Lee Network on Wednesday evening, November 6, from 8:15 to 8:30 o'clock, has the distinction of being the first junior glee club to be organized in the United States.

The club was conceived for the purpose of forming a link between embryo high school voices and the more trained voices of the Senior Amphion Society. Foreseeing the advantages of such an organization the Amphion Society, through the efforts of its president, Alexander Myers, agreed to sponsor this Junior Society.

The first meeting was held in a classroom in Broadway High School in Seattle, in September, 1922. In early years there was extreme uncertainty as to there being enough members to carry four parts. Today the club has a roster of sixty members.

Aside from being a choral society, the club has many social functions which serve to bind the members in closer fellowship. As the present season draws to a close, the Junior Amphion Society passes the thirtieth milestone in its history.

Rosario Bourdon's favorite story at the moment concerns the sweet young thing who fluttered into a newspaper office. "I think your paper is just marvelous," she began to the "want ad" man. "I placed a 'Lost' notice about my bracelet this morning, and when I got home a short while ago, there it was on the piano already!"

Chosen from 2,300 girls who competed as "unknowns," she became the star of "Musical Footnotes" over CBS on September 8. Long has the lure been to amateurs—you, too, may become a star. Don Austin, KJR announcer, recalls with relish the time he took Otto Kahn on a fishing trip in Elliott Bay in Seattle, during the famous financier's visit to the coast in 1926. Austin took Kahn to the west waterway, scene of the Salmon Derby recently broadcast over NBC, rigged up his tackle and set out in a rowboat.

Within a very few minutes, after they had progressed to about fifty yards from the boat house, a salmon hit Kahn's tackle. Kahn yelled, "Mein Gott, I got one"! The huge king salmon took a mighty run and the fight was on. For twenty minutes the fish ran and Kahn reeled. Then the salmon leaped out of the water; he took one look at Kahn, Kahn took one look at the fish; then the king shook loose the hook and was gone.

"Dot's enough excitement for me for one day," sighed Kahn. "I'm going home. My nerves, my nerves!"

It was during this same year that Don Austin caught and landed a 96-pound Chinook salmon in Elliott Bay, the second largest fish caught in those waters that year—and a mighty big fish in any year.

Thus, when listeners hear the mustachioed foil, Jimmie Wallington, exclaim: "Why, Eddie, where are you going in that towel?" Cantor dashes onto the studio stage wrapped up in a tremendous towel.

Dressing the part is now an important feature of Cantor's Hollywood shows, and all members of the cast, as well as the star, follow that routine. It seems Eddie is one of those dyed-in-the-wool troupers who cannot perform without putting his heart, soul and even his clothes into his program.

Bob Trout, CBS announcer who accompanied President Roosevelt on his trip to the West Coast, is back in New York after having been "sunk a dozen times." Bob was on the U. S. S. Dewey, one of Uncle Sam's swiftest destroyers, during the technical maneuvers in the Pacific. As the Dewey was a target for other ships of the battle force, Bob was "attacked by airplanes overhead and by submarines below. In all, I guess I was 'drowned' or 'killed' a dozen times. Anyway, it was great sport," he said. Bob also reported that the pores of his skin and his hair were literally clogged with alkaline dust kicked up as the party sped through Nevada. At times, he remarked, he looked like a marble statue.



**R**ADIO, no less than our military, naval and diplomatic services, has its career men—outstanding personalities whose general fitness commands that they achieve greatness.

Such a radio personality today is Igor Gorin, the twenty-seven year old baritone star of the CBS "Hollywood Hotel" programs.

Igor Gorin came to this country from Vienna, not more than two years ago, and, despite his youth, has in that short space of time achieved stellar billing through his West Coast program and been signed by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer for featured roles in their musical productions.

The cultural background of this young man is extremely interesting. Born in Russia, in the Ukraine, he was brought to Vienna at an early age and there received his schooling. Through the teachings of his father, a Doctor of Philosophy and noted historian and scholar, Igor learned at an early age to appreciate the value of his studies. He soon manifested an extreme interest and ability in his work and it was decided that he take up the profession of medicine.

Young Igor, then nineteen, was apparently destined to become a brilliant surgeon. But one of those small accidents of fate, like a tiny pebble that diverts a stream to another course, intervened in the shape of a glass of wine! That was all—a glass to many, perhaps, but Igor, who was with some friends in a Grinzing wine cellar, threw back his head and sang as he had never sung before. The happy circumstance came in the form of Professor Victor Fuchs, noted singing teacher of Vienna, who was one of those in the room who listened spellbound. He has distinguished himself as a tennis and a football star, has studied dramatics, played the leading roles in more than thirty operas and speaks fluently in Russian, German, Polish, Italian and Czechoslovakian. But it is his rich and romantic baritone voice that clearly points to his ultimate destiny as a career man in radio, a grand opera star and a new screen "find."

Nyland Jordan, KFRC newcomer, via the "Road to Fame" amateur route, has joined the KFRC's song staff. She's a contralto and is heard with Happy-Go-Lucky as well as having a 15-minute spot with Bill Davidson on "Rise 'n' Shine. Wednesdays, from 8:15 to 8:30 a. m.

The word "stooge" has become so widely used in radio that its origin may be traced to Phil Baker, the Great American Tourist, in the same fashion that certain actresses were the first to wear boyish bobs. In days long gone, Baker and his aide, Sid Silvers, were in a Broadway musical play, and Silvers was reading an English novel about a lad at Oxford. The hero crammed in his studies so much—overstudied—that his pals called him "Stooge." Baker liked the name, applied it to his original heckler, and when theatrical press agents picked it up, it was added to the vocabulary of the entertainment world.

*Minute Biographies*

**J**OVIAL David H. Broekman (pronounced "Brookman"), rapidly winning nation-wide recognition for his distinctively modern "California Melodies" (KHJ, 7 to 7:30 p. m., P. S. T., Saturday night), is a Holland Dutchman with an European background of exceptional interest.

Born in Leyden, May 13, 1900, he was in his teens when he began to study composition at the Royal Conservatory at The Hague. At the age of 20 he became conductor and coach of the Royal Opera, The Hague, and later conductor of the Royal Opera in Neu Strelitz, Germany.

At 24, Broekman came to the United States and joined the Philharmonic-Symphony Society of New York under Toscanini. Subsequently, with the Witmark Publishing Company as music editor, music advisor of the Western Electric Company, and with the Victor Recording Company for Columbia Pictures.

He was called to Hollywood by Universal Pictures and became music director and composed the scores and directed the music for more than 200 pictures, including "All Quiet on the Western Front," "King of Jazz," "Frankenstein," and "Phantom of the Opera."

Broekman has composed many musical compositions, but his most noteworthy creation is his American Negro Symphony, "Harlem Heab'n," which he conducted in the Hollywood Bowl last summer. He is now completing a modern suite entitled "Manhattan Fairy Tales," which will have its premiere at an early date.

His hobbies are four . . . his wife and their three daughters . . . 3-year-old Deetje (who selects a boutonniere for her baton-waving daddy from the Broekman garden each morning); 2-year-old Melisandre, and 2-months-old Jacqueline.

Lawrence Tibbett always wears a William Tell (pull the bow and hit the apple) tie when he is on the air. He finds them easier to rip off during a song when his collar gets too tight.



THE recent refusal of the British Broadcasting Corporation to retransmit a speech by Baron Aloisi, the Italian diplomat at Geneva, to American audiences focused world attention on the importance of short wave transmissions in international goodwill, or as a medium of disseminating propaganda. While Geneva has a short wave transmitter, the Italian envoy apparently believed he could get better reception in the United States by using the BBC station as a relay. Authorities in this country pointed out that nations with the most powerful short wave transmitters thus hold an advantage in international diplomacy almost equal to that of a trade balance.

\* \* \*

It is rather interesting to note that the League's short wave station has been heard with good volume on the Pacific Coast every Sunday evening for the past month. Contact is made with 3LR of Melbourne, Australia, at 10:15 p. m., the Geneva broadcaster working on 9.59 meg., while 3LR employs a frequency of 9.58 meg. Peculiarly enough, "Radio Nations", is usually reported with more volume than the Australian transmitter at that time.

\* \* \*

Japanese baseball games are being wafted over the low-wave ether lanes every Friday and Saturday evenings. The running commentaries usually commence near 8 or 8:30 p. m. from either JVH on 14.60 or from JVM on 10.74 meg., the broadcast continuing over one or the other of these stations until JVN concludes its international program at 10 p. m. The remainder of the game is then handled by JVN on 10.66 meg.

JVH seems to be on the air daily from 2:10 p. m. with a program of setting-up exercises for Manchukuo. (2:10 p. m., P. S. T., is 7:10 a. m. in Japan.)

A special beam antenna is now being employed by the German short wave station on DJN, 9.54 meg. The new aerial is not utilized on any regular schedule, but Monday seems to be the customary day to put it into operation. DJN has been received with volume greater than that of W2XAF near 7 p. m., when the special antenna system is being used.

Experimental station DJO is now testing on 11.795 meg. from 2 to 4 a. m., and the Reich-Rundfunk-Gesellschaft requests reports on overseas reception of this frequency.

\* \* \*

A new law in Colombia requires that the power of all short wave broadcasting stations be between 501 and 5,000 watts, stations having less than that being confined to medium waves. This means that the next month will probably witness the disappearance of about 19 of Colombia's 27 short wave stations.

Station PRADO of Riobamba, Ecuador, has been heard nearly every night recently from 7 to 8:30 p. m., in addition to its regular Thursday broadcasts. It seems that an expedition is now attempting to penetrate some hitherto unexplored region near the Brazilian border, and short wave contact with PRADO maintains their only contact with civilization.

\* \* \*

Despite many reports to the contrary, station VE9CA of Calgary, Canada, is still broadcasting programs daily on 6.03 meg. Signoff is usually effected near 8:30 p. m., except on Thursdays, when the transmitter remains on the air until 11 o'clock.

## The DX Corner

PHI of Huizen, and PCJ of Eindhoven, Holland, have been on the air at the same time recently, although their schedules expressly refute this fact. The former, operating on 11.74 meg., and the latter, working on 15.22 meg., have both been logged with fairly good volume between 6 and 7:30 a. m.

\* \* \*

Station SPW of Warsaw, Poland, has been heard by many Pacific Coast listeners during the past few weeks. It is reported to be operating on 11.63 meg. from 8:30 to

9:30 a. m. irregularly, with announcements in Polish, English, French and German. Since the antenna system employed is directional on Japan, signals to this region come via Asia and across the Pacific Ocean.

**OXY of Skamlabaek, Denmark**, now operates on approximately 9.52 meg. after midnight, P. S. T. Fair reception has been noted on this frequency Sunday mornings, and full announcements are given in English at 1:10 a. m. Religious services commence at 1:30.

Another new Mexican station has appeared in the short wave spectrum. This newcomer usually operates on 6.02 meg. between 8

and 10 p. m. No announcements are given in English, but the call letters in Spanish have been definitely identified as XEWU.

The new Java station on 9.58 meg. seems to be located in the city of Batavia. Broadcasts have been heard irregularly (usually Saturday and Sunday between 1 and 7:30 a. m.) The program for the final half-hour is the same as that broadcast by P1.V on Tuesday and Thursday from 7 to 7:30.

**PZH of Paramaibo, Surinam, Dutch Guiana**, now broadcasts on a regular schedule every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from 5:40 to 6:40 p. m., and sometimes later. The frequency used is 7.00 meg.


