We heard the following of the stations that consented to give us programs here in headquarters: CRCV, CHNC, 10AK, CHNC, LOBQ, CRTB, WHA, CJCA, CRCS and CMJK. We certainly regretted not being able to hear the others especially when there were some among them that we could have used as new stations ourselves. We might mention that at the last minute CJOR wrote our hard-working Brooklyn CPCman, Howard Schlobohm and informed him that they would be on this past Sunday from 3:00 to 4:00 A.M., but we were unable to hear them here in headquarters. However we hope that all of our members were lucky enough to pull in HIK who were operating on about 597 kycs until 6:00 A.M., this past Sunday morning. We might mention that while tuning for some stations that were to be on for us on Saturday morning we ran across three European stations which reminded us to tell you that Poste Parisien and Pecamp, France come on the air every morning around 2:15 A.M., E.S.T. We would advise you all to watch closely for those two stations for they both come in

very clearly when the weather conditions are right. The other European station that we were fortunate enough to hear is Frankfort, Germany who operate on 1157 kyces. They too come on the air very early in the morning and can be heard now and then around 1:30 A.M. or earlier in the United States. We thought that we might as well call your attention to these stations for they are the ones that seem to be heard the most frequently here in the states. We might also call your attention to the London Regional station operating on 843 kyces this station generally signs off at 7 PM E.S.T. and can be heard when weather conditions permit behind CKLW with good old Big Ben striking off the hour of midnight.

We have some FRC news to give you at this time. WENC has been granted a construction permit to move transmitter from Americus to Albany, Georgia and at the same time make changes in equipment. KDFN, Casper, Wyo. granted license covering local move of station and making changes in equipment. WMBR Tampa, Fla. granted permit to move transmitter from Tampa to Jacksonville, Fla. We understand that a new station has been assigned to Mass. but as yet we do not have anything definite on this, outside of the fact that it is to take the place of WLOE who were recently deleted by the FRC.

Our advisory chairman, Mr. C.G. Huber advises us that Mr. Meakin our other Greenville, Penna. member received a verification from WEED which reads in part as follows: "Tune in Sunday morning, December 31st 3-4 A.M., E.S.T." It is quite evident from this that WEED intends to run a DX program that morning hence we would advise you all to be on the watch for this station. Mr. Meakin and Mr. Criswell both of whom are members of our club advise us that they have heard a station on 1370 kyces on the morning of December 12 that said they were on a Government test that used call letters that sounded like WHEC and their location as Oakman, Ala. and what is more when they signed off they said they were on 1370 kyces by the authority of the FRC. Have any of the rest of you heard this station and who are they????? Can it be that this is some old station that has been re-enstated.

We have a letter on hand from Art Foerster who is on the CPC of the NNRC in which he advises us that he has arranged a special line-up of stations on 1200 kyces for Sunday morning, January 21st. We shall list them for you now so that you will have them well in advance. WNBO 1:00 to 1:45; WJBC 1:45 to 2:30; WJBL 2:30 to 3:15; WGER 3:15 to 4:00; WCLO 4:00 to 4:45; WRBL 4:45 to 5:30; and WCAT 5:30 to 6:15 we do not know for sure yet whether this is Eastern Standard Time or Central Standard Time, however we expect to hear from Art in a few days again with the information as to which is which.

We want to thank Mr. P. J. Hauss our Indianapolis member for the following tip. He advises us that KGFL will be on the air on Christmas morning from 3:00 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. Those of you that still need this New Mexico station had better watch closely for them that morning.

The morning mail also contains a letter from WJAG Norfolk, Nebraska in which they inform us that they too plan to run a DX program on Christmas morning from 1:00 to 2:45 A.M., E.S.T. They ask that our club report reception of this program.

Mr. F. F. Busted, gives us a suggestion which may prove helpful in verifying some foreign stations. He says that he takes a post card, which evidently is unstamped, types out a verification, self addresses it and does everything to it that a verify should be, excepting to sign it, he leaves the station so that. We might try this on some of the Mexican and Cubans that are so hard to verify, sending them a Reply Coupon

We are indebted to Mr. Meakin for some additional information this week. He advises us that CNCA will be on the air with a DX program on Saturday morning, Dec. 23 from 1 to 3 A.M.E.S.T. Thanks for all of this information Mr. Meakin.
