These same stations have been granted for month of February special experimental authority to operate stations WHN, WQAO-WPAP, and WRNY, using transmitter of WHN, make changes in equipment, increase power from 250 watts to 1000 watts for a period from 1:00 a.m. to local sunset and to operate at will during that period.

We wish to thank Mr. Carleton Lord for the complimentary copy of Keller's Radio Call & Log Book. We again want to call to our members attention the fine new DX department that this magazine has started, under the capable supervision of Mr. Lord. Incidentally this magazine has changed their policy and until further notice will be a bi-monthly magazine.

Mr. Lord also sends some very good suggestions in a recent letter. He adds an improvement on Mr. F. P. Busted's idea about filling out your own verification card and sending it to the foreign stations to sign. His suggestion is regarding post cards that our Post Office Department puts out known as "UNIVERSAL POSTAL UNION" United States of America. They are in the form of the familiar double post-cards. There are two style cards a blue card and a red card. The blue card is good for postage to and from Canada, Cuba, Mexico, Spain and South American countries and costs only 4 cents, while the red card costs 6 cents and is good for postage to and from all other countries. The idea is to write to the station requesting the verification on the one card and fill out your verification on the other requesting the station to sign it and mail it back to you. This method should secure quite a few foreign verifications for our members. Mr. Lord claims that this method is very successful and has used it in preference to International Reply Coupons in many cases. However Mr. Lord adds that it is necessary to mention to the stations on your request that the reply card is pre-paid and aware of the fact and think they have to add a sta-
