We have some very important news for you this time. It has to do with another stride that we have taken to enlarge our club and make it stronger and better for all of us. This week we wish to announce that we have taken over the Central DX Club of LaGrange, Ill. Mr. Dewey has been in touch with us and informs us that he felt that he did not have the time to spend on the club to do it justice and therefore has made arrangements with us to take over their club. We certainly do want to extend a welcome hand to each and every one of you former Central DX club members and it is our hope that we shall be able to please you with our efforts. We now feel that we are in a position to give stations some real reports when they give us a DX owing to our increased membership. This Bulletin then is the first that the former CDC members will receive from our club and we hope that they will soon be taking part in our club contests and sending us whatsoever news they feel will be of interest to the rest of the members in our club.

We are in receipt of a card from Earl Roberts our foreign programs director and he advises us that LR5 Buenos Aires have written the IDA saying that they would be willing to run another DX program any time. Earl goes on to say that the IDA have asked them for a program on March 25 from 2:00 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. We shall certainly notify you just as soon as we hear whether this date will be accepted or not and we are certain that this is very good news to those DXers who were unfortunate enough to miss them during their December broadcast, at which time they came in so wonderful. Thanks very kindly for this information Earl.

We are also in receipt of a letter from good ol' Art Collins, our hard working Chairman of the CPC in which he asks ye editor to express his appreciation to the members of the CPC who have worked so faithfully to make our Mid-Winter DX Frolic such a grand success thus far and who have given so unsparingly of their time and efforts all season to give us all of the wonderful DX programs that they have this season. Art is a little downhearted though, for he has had tough luck with all of the stations that he has written to regarding our big Frolic and the result is that he is feeling badly about it. We are sorry that you have had all of this tough luck Art and most certainly hope that good luck will soon pay you a nice long extended visit.

In the meanwhile those ever faithful CPCmen are still at work and we have 3 additional acceptances for our big party. The latest to accept are WAWZ Zarephath, New Jersey for Saturday morning, February 10 from 4:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. We owe our thanks to Stew Miller for lining up this one for us. Howard Schlobohm also sends us still another acceptance which he was successful in lining up, namely, KALE Portland, Oregon who will be on for us on Sunday morning, February 11 from 3:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. and last but not least comes a report from John J. Barlow our West Coast CPCman who advises us that he has lined up USD Vermillion, S.D. for a program on Sunday morning, February 11 from 4:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. This week we have decided, in order to make the lists more clear, to remove these stations from the possible singleton list. They are HICF, HI4D, HI5E, HIT. These do not appear in Radex. We are adding HHK, as it has been apparently overlooked up to this time. It is now a possible Singleton. The others are possible singletons too, but we will not list them, for the reason given.

Ray Lewis' singleton on XED is the one at Guadalajara. Anyone having an eliminator for this same one may eliminate it. The other one, at Reynosa will not do.

We think one more explanation on a strange station is due, so here is the answer to what a great many must have been wondering. Bob Rawstron's singleton on VE9CF is one you may not be able to account for. It is a very strange one. He heard the Canadian amateur VE9CF using the transmitter of CHNS, and his veri states that fact.

Many have received veris from Frankfurt, but some are not very definite, and some are in German. As Keith does not understand much German, he is asking that all German veris be accompanied by a translation. The only one in English so far has been Henry Allen's which was a very good one.

Keith also advises us that he heard KGEK announce that he will NOT verify on frequency checks. Therefore you can save your time, trouble and money by waiting until you hear him on a DX program. K.L.F.

There was one thing that Keith also advised us about which we left out owing to our having an explanation about it. He says that he has heard a station on 820 kycs using the call letters XEBC, this is very true for Mr. Meakin also heard this station and is of the opinion that it is a new call for XEAC for it is doubtful whether they were allowed to use XEAC owing to there already being an XEAC in San Luis Potosi. Also, the call W8XC being heard on 1020 kycs is the experimental call for KYW. seeking a location in Philadelphia.

The morning mail brings a card from Keith Freas telling us of a station that he heard testing the other morning. He says the call was WBNS located in Columbus, Ohio operating on 1430 kycs. Our guess is that this is simply a new call for WGAH. Keith says that they test on Tuesday mornings from 5:00 to 5:15 A.M., E.S.T.

Bob Rawstron has several questions that we would appreciate your help on. On Monday morning, January 29 at 3:20 A.M., E.S.T. Bob heard a station operating on 1110 kycs. he says they had good strength but had too much noise to catch the call. On Friday morning, February 2 he heard a station on 810 kycs from 4:32 to 5:21 A.M., E.S.T. when he signed off. Bob says that several of the numbers played were "You're Gonna Lose Your Gal" "Heavens Only Knows" "Spinning Wheel" and signed off with "Song of the Islands". Bob certainly will appreciate any help one these you can possibly give him.

A letter from WKAQ San Juan, P. R. advises us that they will dedicate a portion of their DX program on Sunday morning, February 18 to the members of our club. The time to be dedicated to the members of the NRC is from 3:00 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. Our members are urged to report on this broadcast.

Another letter from CJOC Lethbridge, Alta. advises us that they are planning to test their new transmitter on February 18 from 2:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. They promise to dedicate a portion of this program to the members of our club and you are especially urged to report signal strength and modulation on their new transmitter as they are greatly interested in these facts.

A card from Stuart Walmsley advises us that he is now broadcasting DX Tips over radio station KFOX in Long Beach, Calif. We do not know the time of these broadcasts but will try to find out and advise you.

Good ol' C.G. Huber and Lute Grim report hearing a station on 1450 kycs or thereabouts on Saturday and Sunday mornings of this week. They are puzzled as to it's identity and would appreciate help on this station. They feel that it is either a Mexican or a French station.

C.G.H. also sends us a note that he has received a letter from Mr. C. Ellis Thompson, manager of station WEXL and he advises us that they will make every effort to stand by for our special broadcast over KFBK Sacramento, Calif this coming Sunday morning. Thanks to all of you for writing WEXL requesting them to stand by for us.

Henry Allen and C.G. Huber both send us quite a bit of FRC news this week. WENC Americus, Georgia granted permission to remain silent until March 1st pending construction. WHBU granted permission to remain silent during adjustment and reconstruction of station destroyed by fire. KGFK to move transmitter and studio from Moorhead to Duluth, Minn. WMBF granted license covering move of station from Tampa to Jacksonville. WRAM to move station from Wilmington to Durham, N.C. and change frequency from 1370 to 1500 kycs.

We have been told by one of the engineers of WORK that they are now broadcasting late programs every Tuesday morning from 1:00 to 1:30 or 1:45 A.M., E.S.T. We have tried to call the manager to confirm this statement but he has not been in all day. Will advise you definitely next week.

Mr. Allen M. Dewey, Jr. has kindly consented to work on our CPC. We certainly want to wish you lots of luck, Mr. Dewey.
