Once again we find that it's time to get started on this week's Bulletin and we can think of no better time to get started than right now.

First of all we wish to welcome the following DXers as members of our club. Mr. I. W. Decker, Box 821, Banning, Calif; Mr. Edward H. Rhoades, 2136 Glenwood Ave., Toledo, Ohio and Mr. John Bullock, 260 Edgewood Ave., New Haven, Conn. We certainly do hope that all three of these gentlemen will find their membership in our club more than worthwhile and that they will be greatly benefited by our tips and information.

The first thing that comes to our attention this week, which we feel will be of interest to you is a letter from LOBU Canora, Sask. in which they advise us that they have scheduled a DX program for each Sunday morning during the month of March. They also add that their program on March 11 from 2 to 3 A.M., E.S.T. will be dedicated to the members of our club. We certainly appreciate this offer LOBU and we know that those of you that still need LOBU will be watching closely for them.

The next important thing which comes to our attention is a card from Earl Roberts bearing the information that he has just received a letter from CP4 saying that they were going to run a DX program on Sunday morning, March 4 from 2:00 to 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. on 1040 kycs, those of you who may be fortunate enough to hear this station and not be able to identify it, will be glad to learn that it was probably CP4 that you heard. You know that CP4 is located in LaPaz, Bolivia. Earl's card also contains the information that he has arranged a DX program for our club over CMJP Moron, Cuba on 1360 kycs for Saturday morning, March 10 from 2:00 to 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. Earl as well as ye editor both express their regrets that we did not receive the CP4 tip sooner in order that we might have notified you of this special well in advance.

Quite a few of the members have sent us additional information on the Mexican that so many of you have heard using the call XEMO. We are informed that this is a new call letter for XEAE and that they have changed their frequency from 980 kycs to 865 kycs using 1500 watts power. Ray Lewis sends us the tip that WOBU are now using the call letters WCHS, while Henry Allen sends us the information that WKBC have changed their call letters to WSGN.

Henry Allen also sends us the following information which he has received from CHRC Quebec; Their frequency has been changed from 930 kycs to 580 kycs. They also speak of running a DX program for us in the near future.

Last week we promised you that we would give you CX26's complete address, hence we feel that we had better list it for you now while we still have lots of space left in this week's Bulletin. We are in receipt of a letter from CKCL Toronto, Ont. in regards to the call letters CFCL. Mr. Rapkin of that station advises us that this was a phantom call letter and that they have abandoned the use of it.

In the eliminators, we find that Ray Lewis eliminated Charles Huber's TGW. This was never listed, as a possible singleton, for it had been deleted, according to Radex, in February 1933. It was apparently reinstated without notice to that effect.

Frank Busted's verification from XEMO indicates that it is the former XEAE, and operates on 865 kycs instead of 855 kycs.

According to the March Radex, KWCR and WIAS are to consolidate, being known as KWCR. This will leave room for KICK who is being moved from Carter Lake to Davenport, and which will be known as WOC. Station WHO-WOC will be known simply as WHO. That will make WOC, at Davenport, on 1370 kycs as a possible singleton.

We will not treat WHO in the same way, as it would be a waste of time, WHO being such an easy catch.

In regard to Art Collins' new singleton, named Tom, by the way, which we mentioned last week, Charles Huber has this to say, "Tell the boys that I will not try to eliminate Art's new singleton, but will leave that up to Reilley and Freas". Better get busy, Pat!

We are in receipt of an airmail letter from CX26, telling us about the proposed DX program, to be dedicated to CDXR. While we were getting it translated, the news was already printed in the Bulletins. They say, in addition to what was in the last Bulletin, that they will have an English announcer. They say, "One part of the program will also be dedicated to the National Radio Club, and we hope that all your members will honor us with their valuable impressions, once they have heard the program referred to."

In listening to XES this morning, we learned something that may help brother members to verify that station. Their address is Box 309, Tampico, and they want ten cents in stamps, no coin please, to verify. They also advise us that they are again broadcasting weekly DX programs every Saturday morning beginning at 2:00 A.M., E.S.T. continuing until 3:30 A.M., they also advise us that these programs will be announced in English and Spanish. These weekly DX's will continue till March 31. KLF

Did any of you hear CP4? Art Foerster and ye editor both heard a station on 1050 kycs last Sunday morning which we have reasons to believe was them, however there was a lot of code interference on them which prevented our identifying them. Do any of you know whether this was CP4 which we heard?

From Bob Rawstron and Floyd Hammond we learn that FQN are willing to schedule a DX program for the members of our club, we are therefore suggesting that good ol' Art Collins get in touch with them immediately regarding such a program.

Leo Folk our Bradford, Ill. member advises us that he and another DXer have arranged for a DX program over WMBD in Peoria, Ill. for March 16 from 6:30 to 7:30 A.M., E.S.T. to be dedicated to the I.D.A. However Mr. Folk has requested that as many of our members listen to this broadcast as possibly can and we feel certain that he will dedicate a number or so to our members. We, here at headquarters, certainly hope to be able to hear this program in order that we may have the pleasure of hearing Mr. Folk on the air.

Again let us call your attention to the Aussies and New Zealanders, they are again starting to put in their appearance, during the past week we have heard 2BL on 855 kycs; 4QG on 760 kycs; 5CK on 635 kycs and 2YA on 570 kycs here in York. We told you last week to try as many mornings as you possibly can during the next month from 4:30 to 6:15 A.M., E.S.T. Don't become disgusted if you don't hear them the first couple of times you try for they may not be coming in on the particular mornings that you are trying for them, but when they do come through we are certain that most of you will be able to hear them for we were greatly surprised how well they do come through when we heard the first one ourselves. Therefore let us urge you once again to keep trying for them for we are reasonably certain that your efforts will be rewarded.

Martin E. Boykin writes us that he thinks he has been hearing PRAK Rio de Janeiro on 1153 kycs as soon as WHAM in Rochester signs off. He adds that he thinks this is the station that Earl Roberts was asking about last week, are any of you able to confirm this information for either Mr. Boykin or Mr. Roberts?

Mr. C. G. Huber once again sends us some very interesting information from the San Diego Chamber of Commerce, in a letter which he recently received from them saying that there are several new radio stations located in Lower California and that at present their information on them is very meager but that they are endeavoring to get this information for Mr. Huber and that just as soon as they get it that they will be glad to write him further on the subject. He also sends us some FRC information which we are now passing along to you. Construction permit granted a new station in Sheridan, Wyo. on 1370 kycs. 100w unlt'd time. WAMC granted modification of CP extending completion date to May 1/34. WHEF has also extended their completion date to June 24/34. WCAZ granted permit to increase their power from 50 to 100w. Denied CP for a new station in Shreveport, La. to operate on 1210 kycs. WSXO has been granted special authority to operate with 500 KW from 6:30 AM to 5 PM till 3/11.
