Once again we want to take this opportunity to bring up the subject of that marvelous broadcast that KDKA and Joe Stokes are putting on for your benefit, we note that the number of cards being received are less than they had been for awhile, however the good old NRC still leads and we want to take this opportunity to urge those of you who are not taking advantage of this opportunity to hear the finest DX program on the air to do so for we are certain that after you have heard one of these fine broadcasts that you will not want to miss another. Howard tells us that he heard this information over one of his local radio stations. We received a very fine letter from Luther Grim our Red Lion member who is now visiting on the Pacific Coast with several of his DX friends. Luther says we are to tell all of his friends that he arrived out on the coast OK and that he hopes to do some good work for NRC while he is out

on the West Coast. We certainly hope that you will be able to persuade some of those West Coasters to run some DXes next season, Luther.

From good ol' C.G. Huber our Advisory Chairman we have received the following FRC news which we hope will be of interest to you. The Capital City Broadcasting Co., has been granted application for a new station at Lansing, Mich. to operate on 1210 kycs unlimited time; KGIR has been granted application for modification of license changing frequency from 1360 kycs to 1340 kycs; KFPY in Spokane has been granted modification of license to change frequency from 1340 kycs to 890 kycs; Mr. H. H. Felte was denied his application for a new station on 1310 kycs at Meriden, Minn. Application of Herman Rader was denied for a new station in Lansing, Mich. to operate on 1210 kycs. also the application of State Journal was denied for a new station in Lansing, Mich. to operate on 1210 kycs.

We wish to take this opportunity to call your attention to a change of address by Mr. Keith L. Freas our Chairman of Qualifications. He has moved to 171 Somerton Ave., Kenmore, N. Y. We are in receipt of a fine letter from Albert James Cabral who expects to become a member of the NRC next year, in which he gives us some information which we are passing on to you. He says that the Europeans are still coming in, although he says he no longer hears Poste Parisien which was such an outstanding catch for us all winter. He says that the French station on 895 kycs is coming in with fine volume. He also says that CT1GL in Lisbon on 1031 comes in fine, advises that our members try for them early in the evening, he says to try for CFNB and you may hear them from time to time as CT1GL drowns out CFNB.

This past week we here at headquarters have been able to hear the Aussies just a little bit better than they had been, we would therefore suggest that you keep right on trying for them as it may be that they are going to start coming in better. Let's hope so for they certainly haven't come in here at headquarters anything like they were last fall yet. Watch 855 kycs; 760 kycs; 635 kycs; 720 kycs; 610 kycs; 570 kycs and 560 kycs. The best time to try for them is from 4:30 to 6:15 A.M., E.S.T.

We wish to announce at this time that the contest which we had announced soon after the season opened this year relative to the member who verified the most of our special programs through this season, to receive a free year's membership, will come to a close May 1, 1934. All persons interested in winning this membership should have their verifications on our special programs throughout this season in Mr. Keith L. Freas' hands by that time.
