We have been asked what policy we intend to follow this season with reference to putting out Bulletins and we are taking this opportunity to notify you that the last of the weekly Bulletins will come to you on April 24, then there will not be another Bulletin till June 1 and monthly thereafter until either the last Wednesday in August or the first Wednesday in September at which time we will again resume our regular weekly schedule.

We received word from our Vice-President, Joe Becker last week after the Bulletin was in the mail that station WPAK 1210 kycs. Thomasville, Ga. would present a DX program for our members this past Sunday morning from 2:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. We hope that some of our members had the good fortune of hearing this program, for they certainly did give our club a lot of fine publicity.

We want to take this opportunity to welcome Mr. William H. Stone, Bathurst St., Toronto, Ontario as a new member in our club. We hope that he will find his membership very beneficial in his DX activities.

We want to especially urge all of the NRC members who are regular listeners to the WORK DX Club broadcasts, of which ye editor has charge, to be sure to listen in on this coming Friday evening at which time ye editor is going to have as his guest speaker, Arthur H. Brackbill, who is well known among the DXers in the East. Mr. Brackbill will speak on that subject which we are so much interested in at present, "Inter-Club Co-Operation and Eliminating Clashing DX programs." Ye editor has seen a copy of the speech and knows that it will be of very keen interest to all of our members. So please won't all of you listen in and send us your reports on this broadcast down at the York Broadcasting Co. We certainly will appreciate your co-operation in listening to this program and sending in your reports.

That "Mystery DX" program took place after all this past Sunday morning. We regret that we were unable to notify you in advance that it was to go through, but we trust that some of our members heard the program for it was partially dedicated to our club. The one who had charge of it has notified us that verifications will be forthcoming to those sending in reports within the next month or six weeks.

We hope that all of you had the pleasure of hearing the DX program from HHK this past Sunday morning. We certainly were surprised to hear them coming in so strong, however in spite of this we found it very hard to obtain material for verification, as the announcements were made in French for about half of the program and while the others were in English, the titles were French and it was very difficult to catch.

Through the CDMR we learn that the call letters for the new station at Lake Charles, La. are to be KPLC. While on the subject of this station, we might mention that in a letter from Floyd Smith, one of the CPCers for our club, we learn that this station will be ready to take the air about April 1. He tells us that an all night DX program will

celebrate the opening of the station, and that a portion of it will be dedicated to the members of our club. Floyd says he hopes to have more news about this program by the time we release next week's Bulletin. So, keep your eyes open for additional information at that time.

We want to take this opportunity to thank the Crosley Radio Corp., for the mighty fine program they put on over station W8XO this past Sunday morning, for the IDA, CDMR and NRC. This program was a real treat and we hope that all of our members had the pleasure of hearing it. We were not certain whether they would use the 50 KW station or the 500 KW transmitter and you can imagine how delightfully we were surprised when we found them using the 500 KW transmitter for this program. We hope that all of our members that heard this program sent them a card or letter of thanks even if they already had verified this station.

We want to also begin to make plans for our Get-Together this Spring. Those of you that attended last year's meeting all had a lot of fun and met some new friends and we're sure that most of you will want to come in again for this year's meeting. What we want now are some suggestions for a date that will suit the majority of you to attend this meeting. We want to surpass last year's meeting in size and entertainment, so, let's hear from you, in the meanwhile we shall begin planning so that we will all have a good time when it does take place. We feel however that this meeting ought to take place in June, as this seems to be the most suitable month for a meeting of that kind.
