The object would be that a group of stations in different cities carrying the same program on the same vave-leggth at the same time. It is not yet known what the attitude of the FCC will be in regards to this idea of a complete network by synchronization. The advantage of such a system to a chain would be that the listeners would not find different programs overlapping each other at certain spots in the dial. There would be no repetitions, boring, local "spot advertising" announcements. The outcome of such a network would be awaited with interest, since it might be the fore-runner of all networks doing likewise with their stations.
