F.C.C. Okayed for a change in frequency for KMLB Monroe La., from 1200 to 620 Kc., and a power jump from 100 watts night, 250 watts days, to 500 watts unlimited....WGAR Cleveland O. gets a increase in power from 500 w night, to 1kw nights, 5 kw days, okayed by the commish....WRDO Orlando Fla. granted license to cover CP as modified authorizing changes in equipment and increase in day power from 1kw to 5 kw....New daytime station for Fayetteville N.C. to be operate on 1340 kc., with 250 watts, was okayed by the commish....Examiner George H. Hill okayed, the three man partnership, of Huntsville Texas to install a new Radio station on 1500 kc., the new station will cost approximately \$8,000. NATIONAL POST OBSERVER REPORTS

CARL FORESTIERI, Bronx, N. Y. - Reports that he hasn't anything to report in the line of DXing. Carl says that he believes reception conditions will be better in July and August than they are at the present time.. Some fun, eh, Carl? He says of the Canadian specials he had only heard two, CHLT and CJBR, both of whom are already verified. Carl says he has a big number of outstanding reports, that KAMM and WKAT are out since October, XELO and KRBC since November, CMBS, CMCM, CMBL, KRMC and YVIRF out since December and nine out since January and 3 in February.

HARRY HAWKINS, Manchester, N. H. - Reports that on Sun. Mar. 6; YVIRF was on as late as 3 A.M. completely drowning out WJBO. CMBS testing and asking for reports on Mon. Morn the 7th. Who is the Latin that goes on 780 kcs., daily till 2 A.M.

BILL STONE, Toronto, Ont. - Sends us a report on his activities as well as several additional entires for the S&E Contest. Bill says that DXing has picked up lately on the first morning of the FCC's he heard every station up to 5 A.M., E.S.T. except KGKL, and Bill says that's one that he needs. Bill says he hopes that the CPC will be able to arrange a DX from them sometime in the near future.

RANDOLPH HUNT, Leucadia, Calif. - Sends us a nother of his fine reports. Randolph suggests that maybe the reason for the lagging interest in the S&E Contest is due to members waiting for verifications to be received. He says of course it becomes harder and harder to get singletons and eliminators as the Contest goes along. He says he's trying to do his part, having written to about a dozen stations since Feb. 23rd which at that time, or were at the time of writing, still possible singletons. He says the Bulletin of Feb. 22nd showed eleven possible singletons in California and ten California stations held as singletons, he says it would hardly be cricket or not DX at least to write to stations within one's own state, or would it? Along in 1932 I was trying to verify a small powered station in each state and did write to KPFC in Esadena for a verie, it was 50 watts at the time and of course the lowest powered station in California. The other 50 odd stations are un-reported. It's bad enough for me to write to stations in adjoining states, but I have done it.

Mar. 8 - the reception of U.S. Stations was very good, many frequency checks were heard, reported to KICA and KOOS still in hopes of gaining a point or two in the Contest. Japanese stations coming in fine, but it is hard to pick up anything new among the JO's as I have 35 of them verified. JOAK2 sends two more veries, now have four from this station, took over four years to get a specific verie from this one. CMQ has been heard announcing through KFSD and San Diego is only 25 miles from here. Tijuana, Lower Calif. is about 40 miles, sure tough DXing when they are on the air.
