CKGB Timmins, Ont. 1420 kcs., on April 11 from 3:35 to 4:35 A.M., EsT
and CJKL Kirkland Lake, Ont. 1310 kcs., April 12 from 3:15 to 4:15 A.M.
Bill reports reception has been poor up in
Toronto due to rainstorms but he says he
picked up seven new ones on
the FCC Tests. Fine work, we say, Bill!
Bill says that he pulled in CBR, WRR and
WDEJ on Monday last, for the only good DX-
ing this week. By the looks of today, there may be some more good re-

He also reports that XEDF told
him in the recent verif which
he received from them that they would put on another program for the NRC
on April 17 from 2:00 to 4:00 A.M. E.S.T. He says that they will use
310 kcs., during the course of this broadcast.

JACK McKENNEY, Cleveland, Ohio - Sends us his first NPO report since
joining the club and says that he hopes
he has some news which will be of interest to the members.
He says that to date his list of ver-
ies is 92 and growing almost every day.
Reception conditions here have been erratic but on the whole quite fair.
A lot of noise maybe, but my vertical still brings them in. He says he
uses a 1937 Silvertone 5 tube set. His aerial is a 6 foot copper tube
erected on top of the house. The top is approximately 40 feet high. He
says he has a shielded lead-in fastened to it. He says that this aerial
brings in a lot more distance than his inverted "L" type aerial.
He states that he has just received a
fine verif from CMBY Havana, in which
they tell him that they are now using 500 watts. This card is very mod-
ernistic with blue letters on white. On the back is information in both
Spanish and English languages.

R. DOLPH HUNT, Leucadia, Calif. - Sends us a report for Sunday, March 20th from 4:30 to 6:30 A.M. E.S.T. KHBC, 1400 kcs., Hilo, signing off after their Saturday night Dancing Party at 5 A.M., E.S.T. This was KHBC's 691st day of broadcast. JOAK1 590 kcs., started coming in at 5:15 A.M., not long after this, JOAK2, 870 kcs., was heard and then the 10KW JO's came in one by one. The 150KW power of the two JOAK's brings them in earlier, but that is about all the difference that can be noted between them and the 10KW stations. 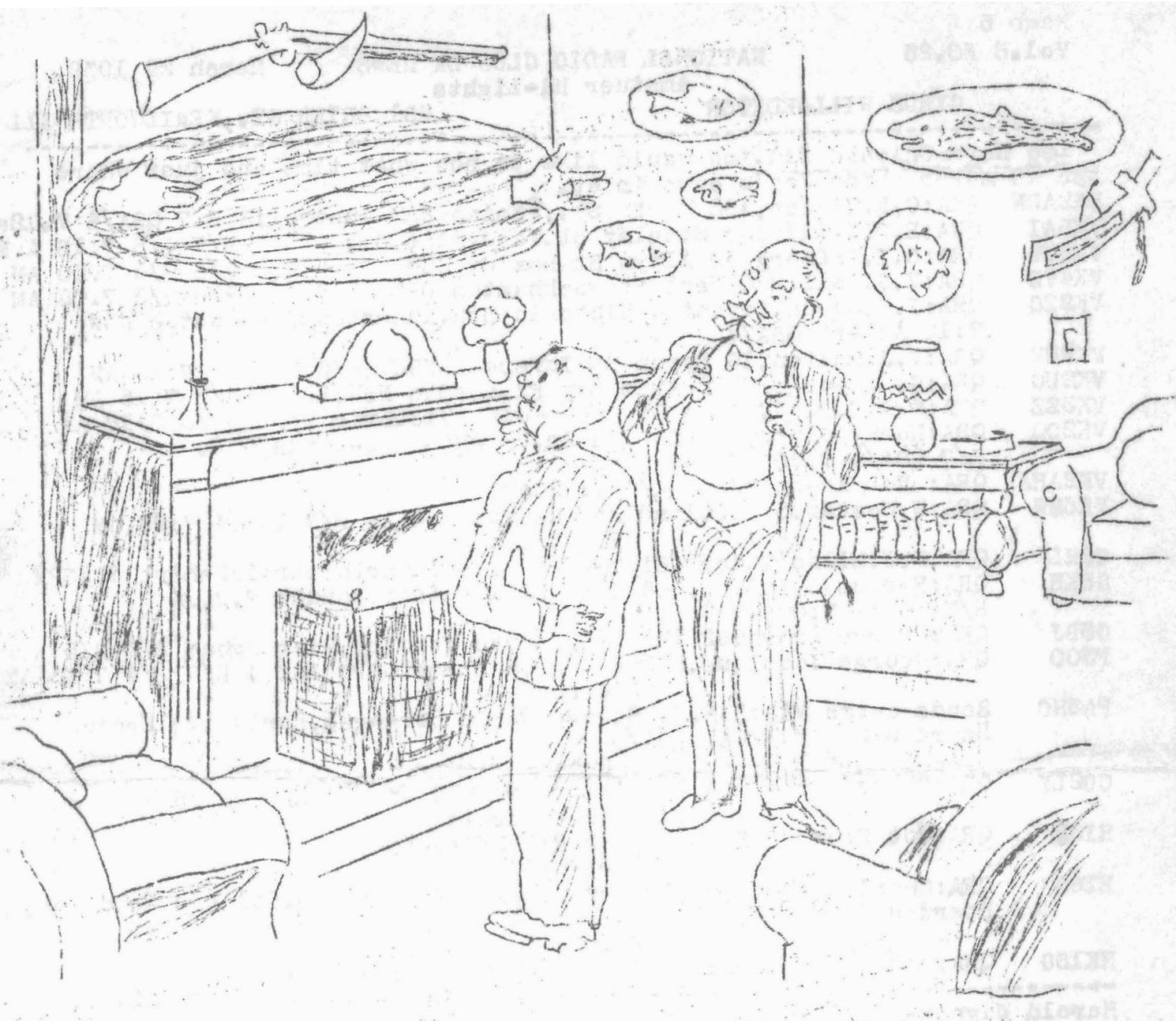
