Listeners in North America will in the future hear this station on Sunday evenings between 7pm and 7:45 pm EST on the wavelength, H.B.O. 11.402 megs, 26.31 meters. Each program will contain a short musical introduction, in addition to the weekly talk about activities of the League of Nations and the International Labour Office. This transmission, extended for listeners in North America, is one of a series of broadcasts which will be given from Radio-Nations each Sunday and Monday in English, French and Spanish. Reception reports from North America will be welcome by the Information Section, League of Nations, Geneva, Switzerland.

--When the Clocks go Forward--

In France and Belgium, Summer Time will be adopted on the night of March 26th-27th, when the clocks are put forward one hour, and the time coincides with that of Central Europe. In the British Isles the change will not be made before Sunday April 10th.

--New Danish Short-wave Transmitters--

As, according to reports received at Copenhagen, broadcasts destined to the United States of America have been very poorly received so far, the Broadcasting Company has earmarked a portion of the profits accrued in 1937 for the construction of a new and more powerful short-wave station to work on 16.9 m. (17.755 mc/s) and 19.78 m. (16.17 mc/s) These will be equipped with beam aerials.

--More Channels for Radio Colonial--

The new Essarts-le-Roi high-power shortwave transmitter, destined to take the Paris Radio Colonial broadcasts, may be found testing almost daily between G.M.T. 11:30-14:30 (11:30am to 2:30pm EST) and again during the later afternoon and evening hours. The channels which are being tried out are: 16.87 m. (17.78 mc/s) 19.83 m. (15.13 mc/s); 25.33m. (11.845 mc/s); 31.41 m. (9.55 mc/s) and 49.67 m. (6.04 mc/s)

--Proposed Yugoslavian High-power Station--

It is reported from Belgrade that a contract has been placed with a German concern for the supply and erection of a 10-kilowatts short-wave transmitter in the vicinity of Batajnice, with a view to the relay of special broadcast to Yugoslav nationals resident in North and South America. Listeners report that a station giving the call-sign YUA, Belgrade, is already testing on about 49.5 meter.

--And a 50-Kw Station for Austria--

Following a series of tests, the Ravag authorities have decided that the two most favourable channels for their short-wave world broadcast are 25.42 m. (11.8 mc/s) and 49.41 m. (6.072 mc/s) In order that the programmes may be available to their nationals all over the world, it is proposed to build on Mount Bisamberg, close to the site of the present high-power medium-wave transmitter, a 50-kilowatt short-wave transmitter equipped with beam aerials. The work is to be started without delay, and it is hoped that the station may be ready by the end of 1938

--Good Signals from Mozambique--

The broadcast from CR7BH, Lourenco Marques, on 25.6 m. (11. mc/s) are occasionally well received in the British Isles between G.M.T. 17:30-21:00 (5:30pm-9:00pm EST) on weekdays, and on Sundays from G.M.T. 19:00-21:00 (7:00pm-9:00pm EST). Interval signals consists of a single chime and announcements are made in a female voice. You may hear sponsored programmes, including publicity for commodities sold by firms in Bulawayo, Mafeking, Pretoria, Johannesburg and so on, in both Portuguese and English. The programmes are S.B. on 48.88 m. (6.137 mc/s) through CB7AA in the same city.
