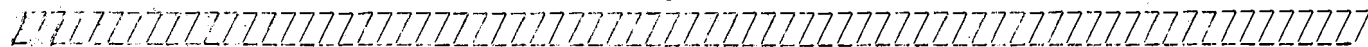

NOTICE:- On that Mystery Program that was suppose to be Broadcasted April 21 1940, I am sorry to say this program was cancelled, this due to Weather conditions. When HQ was first notified about this DX program they had the time Set for 12:00-1:30 A.M. and at this time a powerfull USA station is on this frequency, so we asked for a change of time, from 3:00-4:00 AM, this would have given us a clear frequency, this week I had a letter from this station, they think it would be rather late for DX program, and that weather conditions would be against us. So arrangements have been made for a early Fall dedication for the NRC. Several of you members wrote into HQ asking who this station was, well thats our secret, we have had a hard time in getting this country to DX for us and feel that we will not release this program untill the last minute, in this way we will not have other Clubs, bothering this stations for dedications. This will be a new VIC as here is one country that has never been heard or DX'ed.

Dick you mention about some criticism concerning certain DX programs arranged by other clubs in the last bulletin, OM you have belong to the NRC for a long time and never have known HQ to critize any club or CPC Committee, as we know that mistakes can be made, on both sides the Station might forget to go on as schedule, mistake in the printing the dates ect. But there are certain mistakes that are unexcusable, as you know the NRC Policy is to mail Bulletin's to all stations that we publish DX tips for if its for our club or some other club, well this year we have had several stations write into the NRC HQ saying they were not DX'ing as we had then listed, one station we listed on five different Dates, and this one wrote a very sarcastic letter to the NRC for publishing that they were on these dates, as they had no intentions of DX'ing. Now OM to clear this matter up, the CPC man you were speaking of wrote a very sarcastic letter into the NRC HQ, this past week, critizing us for mailing bulletins to these stations. When mailing these bulletins we thought we was doing DXing some good in showing the Station that they were getting real publicity, but we find we made a mistake, according to a certain CPC man. We have been trying to build up the DX game not tear it down, but from the looks of it, we didnt help it any. I dont know how you members feel about this, but I am sure this matter will be taken up with the Board after Election, and the Board will have the letters, names, ect. As I have explained it to you members time and time again all I have to go by here at HQ is the mail I receive, if a CPC man writes and tell me a certain program is arranged I print it, if another Radio Club sends in their list I print then, I mail each station a bulletin. QUOTE FROM JOES LETTER TO HQ:- Dear H.M.G. and all the NRCers: It has been great to be associated with all of you in the NRC and I have enjoyed the bulletin and the friendly items of interest. Now it comes to me that I must spend more time in constructive work for peace. I am giving up DXing. I must say that I am very reluctant to do so but I can see that I waste too much time in this fine hobby and so in order to be able to serve better as a Christian Pacifist I am going to stop DXing. Please discontinue my bulletins except that I would be glad to receive the copies giving contest news on the BCB contest. I shall continue to stay in the contest and hope that veries now out will bring me up with the leaders. I shall submit my reports to Pat as usual but I shall send very few reports out.

Friends it rends me greatly to write this letter and you have no idea what a sacrifice it seems that I am making. I am a great enthusiast for DXing and I have had more pleasure at my radio than I can tell you. But now I feel I can not DX just a little for the mania gets me and I can not stop. At present I have about 632 BCB veries from 29 countries. As I receive further veries from new countries I will send in my VIC on BCB as I would like to get up with the leaders there too but I do not dare have you send the bulletins as they stir me to action every time.

Befor I give up DXing all together I am going to send out a few reports on 20 meter catches of late. I have 17 KA reports 11 PK reports, 5 XU reports and finally J2NF heard recently for my first J on 20.

Incidentally my 23 tube Scott is for sale if you know of anyone who would like to buy it. I think I need make no remarks as to its DX ability. My reports of this past winter should be ample proof of its ability. I only want \$75.00 for the machine and cabinet.

The balance due me on bulletins not delivered may be retained untill I decide who should receive the bulletins in my place. I think I still have quite a few more coming. You might let me know how many.

"The printing of their cards is held up due to present conditions, but as soon as they are received by the station they shall be sent out to all that reported. Reports are appreciated and Radio Club Mosambique, Caixa Postal 594, Lorenzo Marques, Portuguese East Africa, is the correct QRA. They are on the 31 meter band from 2-4 PM EST daily except Sunday and on the 19 meter band (No freq given) from 7-8 AM EST beamed on North America.

A special program on the first of each month from 7-8:15 AM EST can be heard over YUG 15.240 Belgrade, Yugoslavia and DAP 11.855 & DXC 11.290 at Berlin Germany. (Grant Batson) Is this AM or PM grant. You failed to specify.
