To SHORT WAVE MEMBERS send your future reports to Fred Van Voorhees North Country Road; Miller Place, New York. Miller Place is the name of the town and is in New York State. Please send a report no matter how small it is. That is your section and it is up to you to keep it filled. Fred cant manufacture reports by himself so do your part of it.

This is the final arrangements regarding the ELECTION of OFFICERS for the coming season. All members who are starting their 2nd year as a NRC member or those who have more that 2 years membership and have their dues paid for the coming season will be eligible for election. The list of eligible members will appear in the July 19th issue and a card on which to elect 10 will be included. Cards must be filled out with the 10 members names whom you are voting for and returned to HQ not later than August 4th. AL BARTHOLOMEW-BRADFORD N.Y. Received verie from 2YH on the 21st and a very nice card very specific etc, makes my 8th New Zealand verie and hope 4YZ-2HD & 4SB reply some day, also veries from WCED-WITH-WBTA. Best verie is a letter from HC2AJ back on the 13th, makes a new country #34 also the 218th verie from over 2000 miles. Still have 8 out for the season.

JOE LIPPENCOTT-E VASSALBORO ME. Despite my many activities and interests I am still a DXer. I no longer DX as I used to and my set is not anything extra as to DX but I may as well use up the membership I have in the NRC I have verified about 48 bcb stations since last fall. Also verified CP38 although I reported to CP3. Surely wish the SA's etc would verify the station reported. I may try CP3 again. I have been hearing HJAN on 1190 just as well as when WOI was on him. There is a spick on 1200 that I often hear but cant get identity. Radex lists TIRCC on 1200, has anyone heard the call? YV1RF comes in well on 1120 quite often about 8PM EST. Have heard spick on 1060 also. Heard a few TP's a while ago but my sky wire is North and South so TP's are very weak here. 73s & all the best to NRCers. A note from Leo Herz stating that the World Wide Dial Club will have a Special get to gether on June 28th with Bowling and Dinner afterwards We will meet at 7:30 PM Chicago Time at 79th and South Chicago Ave., Will bowl at Turner's at that address and everybody will be very wel- come so all you DXers in or near Chicago try to attend. On May 17th 1941 four Chicago members of the World Wide Dial Club motored to Milwaukee to visit the members of the Beer City chapter of the Milwaukee Allwave Radio Club. Those in the party were, Charles Trezise Gail Beyer, Jerry Jansen and Leo Herz.

They arrived in Milwaukee at 4:30 PM and went to the home of Warren Stark where they meet Horst (Heinie) Krumrei and Fred (Fritz) Borchardt. After a short gad fest we went to the home of Fritz Borchardt to look over his veries and listening post. Fritz uses a set currently popular with DXers, a Halicrafter Sky Champ. While there we were shown the Pigeons that Fritz's father raises. From there we went to the home of Heinie Krumrei where Leo became involved in a very interesting conversation with Heinie's mother in German. The Chicago boys along with Fritz and Heinie went to supper at which Leo tried to make the waitress but all in vain. (Wonder if he thinks he is a second Siringer?) Later we went to Charles Mouzies home where we meet Bob Hetzel and arrangements were made for bowling. Enroute to the alleys we visited Alvin Olsen where the beer drinking started and then to the bowling alleys where the Beer City boys took the Chicago lads 2 to 1. A DECADE OF DXING by LEO HERZ

June 21 1941

Back in 1931 when I bought my first radio we had the Chicago Daily News DX Club on the air over WMAQ and thats how I got interested in DX. At first I did not send for veries or hardly any. My first set was a 7 tube set of unknown make which was replaced on Xmas 1933 by a 4 tube Echophone 6 tube consol an all wave set. Up to that time I had only DX-ed on the broadcast band and had a heard log of 325 with 87 veries. I started to DX on short wave and to this date I have a log on short wave all verifiedcas on short wave I count only verified stations, 658 with a VIC of 90 and a VAC of 17. Some of my more outstanding veries are, VR4QD-Salmon Island; VS2AK-Malaya; TFJ-Iceland; LXLAJ-Luxemburg; SM5SV-Sweden; VK9XX-British New Guinea; OQ5AB-Congo. In 1939 I bought a Howard which was a lemon and it was in 1940 replaced by a Halicrafter Sky Champion which is my best set. Last fall at the NRC convention I decided to DX again on the BCB which I do enjoy very much. My log is 253 with 240 verified, VIS 48 and VIC 5. I wont list any of my veries as you all know them from my reports in the bulletin. As for DX Clubs, I have belonged to many and my first club was the NNRC, then the GCDX and the CSWRC, the last two are out of existance. I belong at present to the National Radio Club-International DXers Alliance-International Short Wave Club-World Dial Club-World DX Alliance and the Grand National Short Wave Listeners Club. I have held many offices since I belonged to DX Clubs. I was Short Wave CPC man and was a Short Wave editor but at present am only active in my favorite club, The National Radio Club and hope to serve it many more years to come. For the past 2 years have been a Director on the NRC and last season was honored by being named a Vice President. Next season I will try to do some BCB CPC work. It is my Sincere hope that all you members will support the NRC the same as you have in the past and to give it a position it deserves. I made many real friendships with thosegrand fellows that belong to the NRC. To Pop Edge, Joe Becker and the othersofficers and directors deserve the credit for bringing the club to its high position.
