THE CPC CORNER

Here's a few lines to advise our members of the activities of our Courtesy Programs Committee. We've made a few changes and a lot of plans for the coming year and hope it will be the best in the history of the club so far as special DX programs are concerned. Already we have two specials lined up. Through the efforts of CPCman Ernie Cooper (The Flat-bush Flash) we will hear WAGE 620 kcs Syracuse, N.Y., on Saturday, Oct 4th from 3 to 4 AM EST. The second one is WOCB 1240 kc West Yarmouth, Mass., who will DX for us on Monday Oct. 6th from 3-5 AM EST. We're trying to get WEDC to stand by for part of this program. In addition WJMA and WLAG have indicated they will DX in October. Considering that we've contacted only six or eight stations, this indicates a good success at CPCing for the coming season. Senor Steve Mann has already sent thirty or so requests for programs to stations in Latin America and plans to contact several hundred. We plan to ask all the newer USA stations for DX programs and all those needed by a majority of our members that cannot be heard on regular schedule of frequency checks. If space permits, we shall keep you informed of all CPC doings, what stations we contact, what the stations tell us, and let you know which CPCman arranges the programs. We can use three or four more CPCers. Let us know if you are interested in doing this work. May we request that our members DO NOT ask for special programs from any stations without contacting the CPC CHAIRMAN. Last year we had several persons writing to WNOE and WEDC asking them to stand by, and this year we want to run things on a good business basis so this will be taken care of in a more orderly manner. Every effort will be made to have clear channels for our DX programs if you have a particular station or stations you want on or have and leads that will enable us to get DX programs from any station, drop a card to DICK COOPER, 956 ORR AVE., KITTANNING, PENN., the CPC CHAIRMAN. Be sure to report all NRC specials in the 1941-1942 season.

To clear up about writing to WNOE and WEDC last season, the above is not to criticize any one as I asked several to do this because we did not get a late start and every program helped. This year we are on time-Ray.
