With very few DX or test programs, along with a great deal of static, our hobby was not at all profitable the past week for the log book. 2/5 logged KTMS during s/off as a new station at 2:03 Hrd KTRI testing after 2am; WTMV on daily until 3:05am; 2/7 WMGA testing at 3:55am; WBOC test 4-4:18 good signal; I noticed in our bulletins that a number of members logged CJVI, but I still have hopes. Quite surprised the past several mid-mornings to hear WGIL with regular programs never logged other than FCC checks. Leo Born, c.e. of KGLO has asked me to tell fellow DXers to send reports on their stations signal during regular broadcast hours, 6am to 3:30am EST (this will be from 6-3:30 EWT as the FCC has advanced all time 1 hour-Ray) Both KEVR and KFIO are now on the air regularly. Is any of the following on the air? WIAC (hrd testing 2/5)-WLAN-WLAG-WMAW-WDEF. Veries past week from CBY signed H.G. Walker, mgr. A very nice colored picture card of "Coco Palms" from WNEL; others WOMI-KFEL. Received booklet from WCAL with pictures and info on Station.

BOB BROWN-GOSHEN IND. I had a swell visit from Jim Weaver yesterday. Our visit was cut short because he had to get back by 7:30pm. The only split freq station logged before then was XECA. After Jim left I hrd TIEP and YV5RQ. TAs were hot again this am and hrd them on, 643-658-677-791-758-767-841-859-868-877-886-904-913-922-932-941-959-968-986-995-1004-1022-1031-1040-1077-1086-1095-1104-1195-1204-1213-1222-1267-1294-1312-1357-1366-1384-1393-1474-574; The BBC station on 1149 was causing a hetrodyne note on the 1150 channel. These Scott receivers are really selective even tho they dont have a Xtal filter. Mine is 3 yrs & 6 mos and last night I copied 5 stations from 950 to 960 inclusive at 1:10am EST They were KFEL on 950, a sta believed to be a Mex on 956, PP on 959 and CFAC & KROW on 960. The surprise signals were Scottens about R5-6 at 1:55, even tho WPTF and WMAQ were blasting in with perfect signals. PP thru and around KROWs R9 sig. The readable sig on 1022 ?? The Frankfurt 1195 station R5-6 sig and carriers on channels occupied by weak stations No sooner said than done on WIAC, they were hrd testing from 2-2:13am with better than R9 sig (not as good as WNEL), I am going to send out a few poor reports. I try to make all of them good reports usually but I'd like to have some veries coming my way while I'm away shooting Japs & Germans. The poor reports will go to 2KO-2MO-4AK-TI5JJM-2SM-3GL-LR6-XECD-HJEE and TIBAS. In other words anything that I get 3 announcements or musical selections on will get a report. I would appreciate XELAS address, have plenty of a report for them 42 separate time entries, almost a solid hour & 20 min. Only verie, a standout is from YV4RA after 4 mo wait. So Bordeaux is in France after all-Hi.
