JIM WEDENBER-DYERSVILLE IA Have been DXing on the more easy stations and have a list of veries here to make you all jealous for this time of year. Letters from WDBO-WKZO-KFEG-WSMB-WJR-WJAX-KJR-WSUN-KAND-KSKY-CKBI-WHIP-WMAIN-CFAC-WSM-WSKB with newspaper clipping from local paper. Cards from KFH-HILA-HI9B-KHC-WDAY-KMBC-WOW-KFAC-KJBS-KMA-WCCO-WBAP-WGES-WROK-TGZ-WRB-WCAE and dandies from XEMO-KFUN-KPHO-KRHD-KMJ. A booklet but no verie from WBEW (will get in touch with them Jim and maybe your verie will be there before your bulletin-Ray) and CKBI after follow up with novelty hunting license. XEMO-CFAC-WMAIN after follow ups, CFAC gave reason as not having any cards and WMAIN said most stations dont verify during the war which I heartly disagree. KFUN will test 5/23rd from 3:15 AM on, logged some dandies during freq chg. on 5/6 WPAB-WBIR-KHMO-WATW-WSKB-WASK at 3AM with election returns and WGBG s/on 6AM and on 5/8 KWYO-KGFL-KEUB-WHBY-WOMI-WCAT-KWJB-WSOY-WMRC-WSYK-WIZE; 5/9 KPAC-WJSP-WSLI-KVOL new ones hrd. Reports to the underlined and also WSM-WBRM-XMCK-WBTH-XOMA-KFJZ-KRNT-KSO-KYSM-HCZAK-XEFT-KFGQ now on 1260 kcs with 250 watts daytime & nrd with R5 signal. Disapointed when VOD3 sent report back account of inadequate info but sent sked. Letter sent Jan 13th KELO R9 here on 800 kcs and Cubans well hrd. BOB BROWN-GOSHEN IND. Just finished my last reports out for the season and will now concentrate on followups. Im sure WJMA and WMSL will get the first 2. Veries in from WBIG-KSLM 2 years ago KSLM verified on plain paper didnt have letterhead, so they got another report, this verie was a FB card printed on yellow with black, I would rather have the card. Still have 91 reports out-- I never thought veries could be so slow coming in. Over 20 of the rpts are to Spicks that I probably shouldnt have wasted the postage on. (OK bob-T,anks for renewal-Ray)

FRANK CORYELL-CLEVELAND HEIGHTS O. No report for quite some time so here is my DX activities since Mar 9th. Ive got my hearts desire (returning to DXing anyway-Hi) that was lagging at times. - 3390 YV5RK "Radio Mar-ay", Apartado 63, Maracay, Venezuela, verified with yellow and red card. (Roger Legge, Binghamton, N.Y.)
- 5970 HC14KA Quito, Ecuador, call not used by HC14KA. (Legge)
- 6005 HP5K Colon, Panama, Apartado 33, is heard excellently at 1015PM with English news. They verify with green card having huge red call and blue print accompanied by a travel book. (Jim Wedewer, Dyersville, Iowa)
- 6090 CBPW Montreal, Quebec, Can. Verified promptly with large card. "CANADA CALLING", a fine verie. (Grant Patson-Westfield NY)
- 6190 HILA Santiago de los Caballeros, Dom. Rep., heard till 1040PM nightly, verified with red white and blue card showing their flag and huge red call. They use 300 watts and boast reports from India and Europe. Slogan: La Voz del Yaque". (Wedewer)
- 6390 HI9D Santiago, Dom. Rep., verified with nice foto card in 2 months. They use 200 watts. Slogan: broadcasting hotel Mercedes. (Wedewer)
- 7063 "Radio Antigua", Antigua, D.R.I., verified by letter from H.A. Donald, Deputy Officer. Exed: 6-6.15PM in English, Sunday 4-4:30PM in French, 4.30-4:45PM in English. (Legge)
- 7200 ??. "Radio Lebunk", announces as they come on that it is 830 PM Cal, when it is actually 830 EDT, should be 730 if it is EDT. This would indicate that the station is not in the USA, or they would know their times better. (Stanwood H. Morris-Bradford, Massachusetts.)
- 7220 VLQ 4 Sydney, Australia, no longer being used in parallel with VLG2 for 7:30AM program. Announced over VLG2. (Ted Hamberger-Shaker Heights, Ohio)
- 7240 DJJ Berlin, Germany, on North American transmission and DJI on S. Amer. trans. Both stations are much weaker of late, indicating poor conditions on 40 mtrs. (Fred Boichedt-Milwaukee, Wisc, Charlie Mousis, also Milwaukee)
- 7250 PCJL Willemstad, Curacao, now on this new freq. heard well evenings till 1020PM. (Legge)
- 8600 YNHD Managua, Nicaragua, is reported in the URDAC bulletin as a non-verifying station. Has anyone received a verie from them recently? (URDAC)
- 8760 COB4 Havana, Cuba, a new station relaying W4CQ and heard very well evenings. (Legge)
- 9125 HAT4 Budapest, Hungary, heard irregularly with fb signals till 11PM. English news at 920PM. (Wedewer-Hamberger)
- 9360 COJC Havana, Cuba, announces in English and Spanish. Slogan is "El Progreso", Q R A: Apartado 132. (Hamberger)
- 9500 KGB I San Francisco, California, is using this frequency in parallel with 7.25 mcs. (Mousis) / (Legge)
- 9503 Bratislava, Slovakia, heard well 7-8PM on Mon-Wed-Fri-Sat.
- 9525 Unidentified station heard Sunday at 940AM with church service. Language believed to be Afrikuans, so may be ZAG, Pretoria, South Africa. (Legge)
- 9535 HBR4 Berne, Switzerland, broadcasts every night except Saturday one hour earlier, 845-1015PM due to Swiss Summer Time. This was effective Monday, May 4th. (Patson)

- 9580 G3C London, England, Tuesday and Friday program at 930PM is "At Your Request" by Bob Deatty (Datson-BBC)
- 9610 DAB Berlin, Germany, heard with program to Orient just after midnight. German time signal at 1215AM. (Mouzis-Dorchedt)
- 9670 WRCA New York (Sound Brook, NJ) heard testing mornings until 825AM at which time they switch over to a different antenna. Verc is red and white with picture of NBC flag. WMBI card is blue and white. No return postage necessary. Also sent program on International Service. (Mouzis-Datson)
- 9675 ... Unidentified Asiatic heard well around 7-8AM. (Legge)
- 9705..... "Radio Martinique", Fort de France, Martinique, now heard coming on air at 630PM with fair signal. (Wedgewer)
- 9740 TI4NRH Heredia, Costa Rica well heard 8-9AM. (Legge)
- CSW7 Lisbon, Portugal, heard evenings R6, clock striking 3AM at 9PM. Uses slogan "Emissora Nacional". (Bomberberger)
- 9840 VIS Sydney, Australia, heard R9 at 8-815AM with news relays to NBC-CBS. (Legge)
- 10042 D2B Podesbrady, Bohemia, heard 330PM-415PM or later. German time signal at 4 PM. The program all in German and identified as the German SW broadcasting Corp. (Dorchedt)
- 10135 HH3W Port-au-Prince, Haiti, heard announcing in English at 830PM with R7-8 signals. (Bomberberger)
- 10170 Unidentified Oriental station audible between 845AM and 900AM. Interval signal is sounding of native ~~aximes~~ drums male announcer only. Very weak signal here. (Mouzis)
- 10350 PLS? Japan station believed to be PLS now under Jap control. Heard here weakly from 730-830AM with Oriental Program. /s male and female announcers. Best 730-8AM. (Dorchedt-Mouzi)
- 10470 R--- Moscow, USSR, heard way both at 9AM relaying meeting of Soviet women participating in the war, and translation into Turkish. (Legge)
- 11350 Under-cover station heard 230-240PM in Serbo-Croat. (Legge)
- 11700 HP5A Panama City, Panama, heard till 1230AM (Still on at this/t time). Has English news at 930, 1020, and 1100PM. (Dorchedt)
- 11715 Station in Milan, heard mornings from 8-9 AM occasionally. English news at 830AM. Woman announcer throughout. First audible about 805AM with peak at 830AM. (Dorchedt)
- 11720 "Radio Congo Belge", Leopoldville, Belgian Congo, heard well 3-345PM in parallel with and stronger than the ~~same~~ other "Radio Congo Belge" stations on 10140-11730-15175 Kc from 4-430PM relays NBC French program. Is believed to be the new xmr that was on 17780 Kcs for a while. (Legge)
- 11730 ... Panama City, Panama, heard mornings 925-1000AM. ~~English~~ English news 935pm evenings. Heard till 11PM. (Dorchedt)
- 11785 Under-cover station heard daily 3-315PM in Serbo-Croat. (Legge)
- 11830 R--- Moscow, USSR, heard way both, at 9AM relaying Soviet women's meeting. (Legge)
