IN THE OPINION OF RALPH JOHANNS

OPEN-LETTER VIEWPOINT BY BOARD MEMBER: Let's remain the only Broadcast-ONLY Radio Club! FCC Oct. 1 Quote-'At the present time the country has 2,052 broadcast stations of various types, which are either operating or are on the way. 1176 others have applied to go on the air. This includes FM, Television. 65 FM are on regular schedule and 48 hold regular licences. 6 Television stations are in operation, 30 have conditional grants and 43 are pending. 531 others, A.M. mostly, have rec'd CPs and 328 are still pending.' In July of issue of 'Sylvania' L.L.Ash, Pres. of WBCA (FM, Schenectady) predicts in 2 years FM will replace AM except in rural areas where the Big 50 kilowatts will serve. (I disagree.) Directional antennas are steadily improving. With radio stations it will be survival of the fittest, I'd say. GET ALL YOU CAN NOW! Short-waves are not going to run away -STICK to BCB If you want to go SW or just 'nibble' occasionally, the NNRC and the URDXC will give you all the 'dope' needed and quite a few NRCers are members of those. Also (me, too) for the more books, the more you learn! If you can afford SW you can afford another radio club specializing in SW also, BUT you cannot make a good SW & AM combination radio club that will give you EVERYTHING you will need in one season, nor in 2 or 3. A combination of the 3 clubs would do this, but the possibilities are remote, so why spoil a good thing when you have it? A little SW dope and a few reports don't make an outstanding NRC News, but up-to-date information and reports and members comments make NRC stand out! Let's stay Broadcast!

I suggest that you do it soon as they are making changes in their transmitter that will eliminate the cause of this radiation. WDSU has the same condition and will verify rept of their signals on 1420 Kc/s. according to CE of WSMB. I have a rept out to WDSU on 1420 now. So, he is a real signal and is worth a rept. No go on WXLS. Drew a blank on his freq. all a.m. on his DX. WJOL well recd. Good program and nice strong signal. Easy here. On a.m. of 10/23 nice signal from CKBI at 2 a.m. Is WFNK another all-nighter? Noted him several a.m.s. (No, Doc- he just tested a whole week. -Ed.)
