The 1946-1947 DX season is just about over, and a good season it was for anyone who spent any time at the dials. Since my last report, several new ones added to my DX log. On 3/11, WDMG with ET 3:28-3:34, on 3/15 KCBC heard with reg. sked. programs. KXOL heard with ET on 3/16, 3:33-3:42, and on 3/17 KRDO heard with ET 3:19-3:58. The new WILS hrd on Sun., 3/23 from 8:00 to 8:25 A.M. with reg. programs, for a new one. Then the best day of the month, for a total of new ones logged was the 30th, with 5 new ones logged. KVET, hrd with DX program 3:00-3:30 a.m., both KCBDm Lubbock, Texas, and KATL, Houston, Texas, hrd with ET, both at same time on 1590, 3:15 - 3:55 a.m., easily copied at the same time, on 1590. WTUX, new Wilmington, Del., station on 2290 hrd with ET 3:55-4:15, & finally KOPO with f/c 4:30-4:45 a.m., newest veries received were letters from KOSA KENO KVLV WWGS KGRH on DX KXRJ KAVL KPIP, and cards from KGBA WILS WCKB CKVL CHAT, the last 3 on DXes. I got the following information from Mr. Norton, Editor of URDXC of Calif., that WSLI was still on 1450 and had not gone to 930 when I sent in my report, & several of these stations I had sent in a report, no verie. One especially I heard here in Daylight or early evening send in 1/2-hour report on this one, no verie. So these delinquents came back in just a few days. I now have 750 & only a few reports cut & these are new ones or some old ones that I picked out on Ray's test, and it is nearly, or about 75%, correct. I only need about 5 more to complete Illinois & some of these are new ones. I heard 2 more stations in Wisconsin and need about 3 more to complete that state.

George B. Holland, Jr. - Ithaca, N. Y.

First "Musings" from new member Holland. Have just returned to DXing after an 8-year layoff. Using an HQ-129-X with a 10' fish-pole in a bad reception area. CJAD KJBS TIGPH TIEP TIGMP (selectivity on the '129' is not bad) XEQ TIPG WDMG HI3T (WHO took a powder) WIBG WRNY CHUM WLAQ WHVL KEJU VWDC WKYV KWBR WLOR KRDO (in the middle of Ithaca's 1st thunderstorm for 1947) VKST XEJP XESM WPRA WLBR WWBZ WNEL WREC XEOW WMP5 CMCQ WARM. A little more on WYBR. It's the Cornell Radio Guild station, "Voice of the Big Red." They rarely mention Ithaca, but always announce as above. They're on 640 Kc/s from 7 a.m. to midnight daily except Sundays when they're silent. Their power must be under 10 watts & they transmit into the wire system of the University, but do leak out all over the city. They tell me they've had reports from Cortland (20 miles) and Elmira (35 miles). Come on, you N.Y. DXers, what can you do about this one? I regret to see various DXers signing off for the summer. Despite the decrease of radio efficiency in the summer months, DXing is certainly not a lost cause. I remember pulling in KWYB & KQRS, both Wyoming 250's in July at R-9 on a Hallicrafter S-20. Leo Herz - Chicago, Ill.

My veries stand now at 470 veries in, 15 reports out, a nice gain this year. Could not DX every AM as my work in the factory is heavy, also 1st part of DX season my DX den was too close to an automatic stoker.
