Heard WHIR for a new one 10/19, also heard many strong cycle tones, one on 910 Kc/s. I listened from 4:08 until 4:30 a.m., E.S.T., no announcements at all. Another probably on 1560 Kc/s., cycle tone and music. Some one signed off with National Anthem on 1450 at 3:50 a.m. On 1590 Kc/s., band music at 3:19, followed by tone, and signed at 3:33. KGRI came through swell the other morning, swell program for the NRC & the NNRC. 1868 verified, 45 reports out yet. 25 new ones heard in October, so far. I have missed out on a lot of new ones, too.

To some of our new members, we suggest that in trying for the above European stations, that the best time to try for them is from 1 to 3 a.m., and from about 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. They are heard from time to time, but do not be discouraged if you do not hear them on your first try, for conditions must be well-nigh perfect to bring them in.

- Note #1 - WJVB. Time has been changed to this, to avoid QRM from WINS.
- Note #2 - VOOM. Time has been changed from Nov. 24, again to avoid QRM from WINS.
- Note #3 - XEWT. Letter sent them Aug. 10, asked for DX Oct. 29, 4-5. Acknowledgement received Oct. 23, too late for publication. Air-Mail rushed to them asking them to make it on Nov. 26 - so it is a bit indefinite as yet.
- Note #4 - VP4RD. Yes - that's right - Two frequencies, and two separate programs on different dates. Two different CPC men arranged this for NNRC. Two dates!
- Note #5 - KGRI. Repeating for New Zealand DX Radio Association, time still indefinite.
- Note #6 - HOX. Has two BCB frequencies - 940 and 1310. This program might possibly be on SW too, but not sure about this.
