----- THIS IS A COPY OF OUR LETTER TO "THANK-YOU" STATIONS -----

Gentlemen,

"I am writing you in behalf of the members of the National Radio Club and the large number of radio fans throughout this country and Canada. Since yours is a new station, we feel it might be of benefit to the station if you are familiarized with the Radio Hobby known as "DX."

"The term "DX" means distance. Our hobby is the listening for distant and other radio stations on the broadcast band, that is broadcasting on any frequency from 540 Kc/s. to and including 1600 Kc/s. DX began way back in the early 20s, when radio was in its infancy. Nearly anyone who owned a radio or crystal set in those days was a DXer. The hobby continued successfully through the years, until today it is a well organized hobby with National Clubs, Conventions, Specific Rules, Contests, etc.

"The basis of the entire hobby is the "Verification/" This is a material proof of a DXers reception. We collect them just as a Philatelist collects stamps. The verification is of course, issued by the station. For example, when a DXer hears a station, he takes notes of what he has heard with the time and date. Submits it with return postage to the station. If the material submitted compares with the station's log, then a confirmation is sent. Most DXers today appreciate a verification on one of the station's letter-heads, because they can be filed easier along with looking neat.

"We have found many new stations such as yours are unfamiliar with the verification and often answer our reports with a "Thank You" and neglect to actually confirm reception. All DXers like their verification to state that their report was "Correct" or "Confirms" with the station's log. If the report is not correct, then he appreciates if the station will drop him a line to that effect, using his return postage.

"Unfortunately, we find a station every so often receives a DX report containing very little information to compare with their log, also no return postage and demands verification. We would appreciate it very much if stations would notify this club when this occurs, including the name address of the offending party. We are doing our level best to eliminate this type of DXer from our fraternity.

"However our aim is not just to receive verifications. We hope, by including information, regarding signal strength, quality, interference, weather conditions, etc., to actually aid the station in determining its quality and coverage. Most stations have informed us this information is valuable to them. During winter months when DX is at its best, many stations which cannot be heard during their regular broadcast hours have special tests or DX programs in the early morning hours to enable DXers the country over to hear and report reception of their station. I

"I hope I have made the workings of our hobby completely clear to you. Your co-opera-

(letter, con'd) tion in this matter will be greatly appreciated. If there are any questions still in your mind, please feel free to write, either the club or myself.
