During these hours KLOU will operate with its usual phasing on a 2 element directional antenna system. No special systems or dispensations will be used at any time during this broadcast period. We will maintain our usual regional pattern with major lobes East-West-and South and a small minor lobe North. Our minimum radiation at 328 32.50 156 and 124 degrees true.

Your fine co-operation in the past has been of great help and interest to us and we thank you. We will be greatly appreciative of any information that you might give that would be of interest or help to this station's engineering department. It would be a favor to us if you would give this as much publicity as possible.

We wish to state THAT THIS WILL NOT BE A SPECIAL DX PROGRAM, but a continuous transmission as a public service of this station in order to bring its listening audience the complete tabulations as they occur in the Louisiana Second Democratic Primary. Sincerely yours B C Segrest, CE.

- KXOL - FORT WORTH, TEXAS Another rarely heard station among DXers honors us by dedicating this test program to our two clubs. This was an unsolicited program, and while we realize that at this time 1350 Kc/s. will not be open for all of us, we do want to help KXOL on this special test. We thank Mr. John Crocco, Chief Engineer, for thinking of us. Arranged by the NNRC.
- WBMD - Baltimore, Maryland. Here's a brand-new one for us to go after, and it is this "sunshine" station in the city of Baltimore. KXL will be on, we believe, but most of us should hear WBMD's kilowatt, due to KXL's directional array shooting noise at the east. We thank Mr. Russell Morgan, Chief Engineer for this show, which will be a test program. Arranged by Len Kruse.

Was going to ask KFAR to repeat their 1944 DX for us, but see they DX on Feb. 1, so will replace them with some-one else in North America on this round-the-world DX Test. See Duggan on the move, so keep us all posted Duggan, through the bulletins as to your where-about's and what's what in that part of the world. WMHL 1/21 on all night asking for DX reports, and if get enough, they will be on 24 hours schedule, 1:00 - 6:00 a.m. I had a report for them, and when they said this, I tore it up, hi! (Good - hi -ED.) WFB (1320) WHAW (1450), finishing tests already. Both WFB here. Air-Mail just arrived 1/22, confirming fully the Mongolian DX and key-station will be KNPA, 10,000 watts - 8&D Kc/s., and the time is Sunday, February 29, 5:00-6:30 p.m., Lanzhou Local Time. Musings of the MembersKermit Geary - Walmersport, Pa.

Veries have hit a new high with 21 new ones received here this week, including two swell foreigners and one more from Hawaii and Puerto Rico. They arrived from the following stations: HCBT KFPK KIPA WIFA KAWT KORG KCRS KVEA KIKL KFBX KSTB KWSL KALK WALD ~~WALD~~ WDIG WHCC WJJI WJVA WSCR WSKY WLFJ, HCBT "Radio Bolivar" "La Voz de la Libertad" sent a very nice airmail letter verifying my reception on New Year's morning from 4:15 to 4:35 a.m. They are located in Quito, Ecuador, and operate on a frequency of 1160 kilocycles. Also enclosed was a portion of a page from "El Comercio", Quito's leading newspaper (so they state), on which my entire letter is reprinted word-for-word. The headline reads: "Radio Bolivar, la Voz de la Libertad, is heard in United States." I was their first reporter, and I'm certainly pleased to add this one to my collection. A swell 2-page letter with 2 photographs was received from XEPK, Pachuca, Mexico, to give me a new Mexican State, Hidalgo. They operate on 1180 Kc/s, with 1,000 watts power, and sign off nightly at 11:00 p.m. They were verified on a special pre-Christmas dance program. Another verie worthy of note was the one from KCRS. It seems that I heard the last broadcast from their 250-watt transmitter on 1230 Kc/s, when they were checking frequency with Kansas City on Jan. 8, from 3:00 to 3:10 a.m. They were temporarily using a horizontal $\frac{1}{2}$ -wave antenna suspended only about 15 feet off the ground at the highest point. Milton E. Sparks, C.E., was amazed to learn that I was able to hear them at all, and says, "It must have been an Act of Providence that you received us just a few hours before we began program tests with our new 5-kw. transmitter on 530 Kc/s." So, KCRS is now operating on 550 Kc/s. As a matter of fact, KTLK was inaudible on their f/c scheduled for 5 minutes later. I still believe that the old horizontal flat-top antenna was the best for putting out a good sky-wave, and accounts for the way the 5- and 10-watters used to get out years back. These new-fangled vertical antennas tend to suppress the sky-wave and concentrate the signals in the immediate service area. WSKY gave me a nice verification of their 100-watt transmitter, and state they are now using 250 watts. Madison, Iowa, 1350 Kc/s., on ET from 2:37 to 2:58 a.m., KICU at sign-off from 3:00 to 3:03 a.m. WHOO testing from 3:16 to 3:28 a.m., and WNYB, Kenmore, N.Y. 1080 Kc/s. on ET from 4:50 to 5:03 a.m., 1/24 - WMLD on reg sked from 1:30 to 2:02 a.m. KXAR, on f/c from 2:22 to 2:45 a.m., and WPAQ, Mount Airy, N.C. 740 Kc/s., on ET from 3:10 to 3:27 a.m. 1/25 - KPHU on test from 2:50 to 2:56 a.m., and WCRB, Waltham, Mass., on ET from 3:05 to 3:21 a.m. I just noticed I missed WLAD's DX this morning due to its not being listed in the Jan. 24 bulletin, and I wanted to hear him quite badly, shucks! 1/26 - Wali, it looks like I missed out on WGRD also, because the same bulletin shows the program for the 25th instead of the 26th, never thought of trying for him on the 25th because I thought that apparently the date had been changed.
