Not only that, but you may ruin the chance of any other DXer's ever getting a verification from that station too. Surely none of you would want to be caught writing such a letter, for immediately all your fellow DXers would remember you as the one who spoiled their chances of getting a much-coveted verification! And besides, it is plain, simple, common decency to be courteous to everyone, no matter what the conditions may be. Anyone who does not abide by this rule is not welcome anywhere.
