The first two DX programs of the season, arranged by the NRC CPC staff, came through with "flying colors," and both as new additions in my DX log. Station KALI, Pasadena Calif., on 11/6; and then on 11/12, KTW, Seattle, Wash., were the two. I hope the next two scheduled for the NRC, namely KTFI and WTWN, come in as well. On 11/8, O. E. Robinson, President of WVMI, had an enjoyable DX Test, and mentioned the possibility of a monthly DX Tip program over his station, if the response was great enough. The first portion of WVMI's test had QRM from WKBN, Youngstown, Ohio, with Election Returns. And, speaking of returns, it was a great morning for the DXers, for there were literally hundreds of stations on long after their usual sign-off time. Outside the EST zone, DXers are few and far apart and the opportunity, time and expense involved in a get-together almost prohibitive. In closing, a word about "What the Call Letters Mean." In some cases, they are only slogans adopted to fit the call; in others, the owner's name, and in quite a few cases the calls reflect a licensee long since gone, but the origin proves interesting to trace. In all instances, however, the source of information is either the station or the Federal Communications Commission.

Just returned from the North. At present we are located in the capital of North Korea. Received the first mail today since October 18th. Sure was glad to hear from the wife and above all, received the September 23 issue of "DX News." Also by now, DX Contests should be in, though I don't know what it is. Just my luck to return to the States and not be in the contest. I am using the radio antennas of the Pyongyang Radio. Their frequency was 915 kc/s., power, 35,000 watts. It is situated on the hill overlooking the city. DX is good. On Nov. 1 and 2, logged the following. The first time is Korean, second is U.S. E.S.T. WEDR, 1220 kc/s., Birmingham, Ala. at 11:45 p.m. KST, 9:45 a.m. EST, Nov. 1 (First U.S. Station heard). KOA, Denver, Col. 12:15 a.m. KST, Nov. 2, 10:15 a.m., EST Nov. 1. KFI, 640, Los Angeles, Cal., 12:30 a.m. Nov. 2, 10:30 a.m. EST Nov. 1. KBW, 1525 kc/s. (???) playing U.S. Music with commercials, very faint at 7:00 p.m., KST, Nov. 2, 5:00 a.m. EST, Nov. 2. DZH-8, 1430 kc/s., Manila, P.I. at 8:00 p.m., KST, Nov. 2, 6:00 a.m. EST, Nov. 2. Far East stations heard here are: Kyushu, AFRS - 690 kc/s. s/off at 6:00 a.m., KST, 4:00 p.m. EST, s/off 3:00 a.m., KST, 1:00 p.m., EST. WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK

The stencils, pages 1, 8, 9, 10 were mailed at 8:00 a.m. Thursday. Saturday a card came to 438 saying the letter was found at G.P.O. N.Y.C. with no postage. I had put a California Centennial 3¢ stamp on it, too. So I had to remit 6¢ to G.P.O. N.Y.C. to have the letter move on. They couldn't get it till Monday, so that meant a delay of 4 days. From now on, the stencils will go out with no return address on the envelope, you can bet on that. Here is a letter sent to the N.Y.C. Postmaster by Ye Ed.

Dear Mr. Goldman,

11/11/50

"This morning, I recieved in my mail box your card (Form 3540-A) telling me that a letter bearing my return card was extracted from the mails at G.P.O. with no postage there-to affixed. It requested I send 6¢ in postage in order to have the letter sent on its way. It was intended for ... (Wagner's address).

"This letter contained four (4) typed stencils which were in a most decided hurry to get to Mr. Wagner. Your holding this letter back for no less than four (4) days has inconvenienced Mr. Wagner and me, and has annoyed 150 members of our club. I type these stencils here in Brooklyn and mail them to our Executive Secretary, Mr. Wagner, at the above address. He is supposed to get them on Friday, and to mail out the printed pages on Saturday morning. Now this letter with the stencils was withdrawn from the mails on Thursday, Nov. 9 at G.P.O. I did not receive the notice card until Nov. 11. That means it will be until Monday, Nov. 13 before your office (Room 4508) gets this postage, holding this important letter up for ~~four~~ (4) days.

"Now I work in a Post Office station - Federal Reserve Station, New York 45. I know for a fact that we receive a considerable amount of mail there, and almost every day we receive one or more letters with no postage on them, ~~and since every day we receive one or more~~ with a postage due charge. Return addresses are on them, and they are still sent through in an efficient manner with the postage plus fine being payed by the addressees. Why then was this not done in this case? After all, with the specification of what train I wanted it to go out on, your men should have been able to figure it was important and in a hurry. I don't see why such tactics were used in my case. I realize that the Post Office these days is nothing like it used to be when we got good service, and this stupid rule on holding up an important letter is one which should be stricken from the books. Every letter is important and is in a hurry- and it is up to you and the men under you to see that every one is delivered with dispatch and celerity, and not held up like mine was.

"It would seem to me that since it had already been postmarked Church Street P.O. your men could have seen that there had been a stamp on it, and it had come off! I fail to see why I should have to pay the original 3¢, plus 6¢ you request, plus 3¢ for this letter, or a total of 12¢ to have one letter delivered! Suppose the stamp you put on comes off somewhere! I'd have to send more stamps, I suppose. That's quite a way to try to balance the budget, I'd say. But I guess we'll just have to get used to the poor service we now get. As usual, the public suffers from the bungling of Federal employees. Had I not have had my return address on that letter, you would have had to have sent it to North Girard, Pa! Is this the price I have to pay because I follow the rules and include my return address? You may be assured from now on that on these letters to Mr. Wagner in North Girard that I WILL NOT PUT MY RETURN ADDRESS ON THE ENVELOPE, simply because of the chance that the stamp might come off and the letter again be delayed! It would seem to me to be the fault of the Post Office whose mail tube caused the stamp to come off. I know that the glue on the back of some of the commemorative issues is very poor. For one, the Boy Scout stamp was very difficult to get to adhere to the envelope. I often had to use other glue to stick it on. Why??? Because of the Federal order cutting down the mail service, it has suffered much. I don't see why you then go out of your way to make it even poorer by this horrible example of bungling and delay. Inefficiency like this is truly amazing!

"May I suggest a way to cut down expenses? Get rid of the clucks who handle mail in this careless, hap-hazard fashion and get men who care something for their job and the public, whom they are supposed to serve.

"A copy of this letter is being sent to the Postmaster General, Washington, D.C. I hope to hear from both offices in this matter."

The dots indicate omissions from this letter. I explain 4 ways postage due is handled:
 1- Like this. 2-Sent through & collected on other end. 3-Letter returned to sender.
 4-A card is sent to addressee to remit postage. We simply can't see why one matter, is handled in no less than 4 different ways! If the reply is printable, we'll print
