Dear Members:

No DXing done here since 4/6 - still working nights except on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Veries received here are: WTOD KALT KIWN WATS KCIM WATG WMOD WLWL CKBI, and the following on follow-ups: WJRI WCTA KWBE WNBS. Sent follow-ups tonight to WJAC WREC KVSO and WBRE. Been really busy around the house for several weeks and really took a vacation away from the dials. WHP, now on 580 kc/s. is really beaming in here. Have a Zenith table model radio in the kitchen and it works like a top. I've been hearing throughout the day WSWA, 550 kc/s., in Harrisonburg, Va. on a fairly good signal with no sign of WGR till early evening. What spare time I have is taken up looking at TV. Was active on TV DX however, because of the rare reception received. On May 30th I bagged WDSU-TV during the afternoon on Channel 6, giving WFIL-TV a hard time. Used the tenna-rotor and had a swell signal, both voice and picture. Logged them over an hour. Went over to Channel 2 and behold, there was KPRC-TV with a remarkable signal tops for over 2 hours. (Written from Sendai, Japan) Well, since work is at a standstill and time is heavy, just a few lines from this so-called exotic land. But not like the good old U.S.A. you can believe it. (Homesick, especially for the DXing.) Our company was relieved from 9th Corps in Korea and is now the New Signal Company for 16th Corps which comprises the 40th and 45th N.G. Divisions. So as Corps Communications Chief, I've got work - at times. But DX is better here than in Korea - mostly because of the steady power. Have a new Zenith Trans-Oceanic (\$87.00) with battery. So far have 106 veries from DXing in Korea and Japan - Philippines (7), Australia (16), New Zealand (4), Okinawa (1), Korea (2), Japan (17), Hawaii (4), Alaska (2), Burma (1), India (1), Java (Indonesia) (1), Singapore (1), Hongkong (1), and Canada (1) with U.S.A. (47). Cal. (10), Nev. (2), Wash. (2), Ore. (2), Tex. (2 - WFAA, KRLD), Ala. (WBRC) Wisc. (WIMJ), Iowa (WHO), Minn. (KSTP), Ind. (WIBC), Ohio (WILW), N.Y. (WKBW), Ariz. (2), Utah (2), Colo. (1), Kans. (1), Okla. (2), Fla. (1), Mont. (1), Mo. (3), N.C. (1), Va. (1), and Mich. (3), Idaho (3). Have 31 reports out to U.S.A. alone. So you see, it doesn't take the "Voice of America" to get over here. Here in Sendai the strongest U.S. is generally WILW. So false about run out of things here except next year I'm in the contest because I still love the DX better than - well, all right - women! (a discrepancy as July 8th is Sunday). KAPA, 1340 kc/s., f/c 3rd Monday every other month at 5:00 a.m. Next f/c July 16th. Will remain on this time until time changes to Standard Time. F/c will then be at 4:00 a.m. EST. KRSN, 1490 kc/s., f/c last Monday of each month. Next f/c June 26, 1951 at 2:10 a.m. EST (a discrepancy as June 26th is a Tuesday.) KRXG, 1230 kc/s., "Our frequency checks are made locally during regular operation. Our frequency is compared with WWV usually during the day. A Portland???? station is on 24 hours so we must do it this way." Signed by Howard Chapman. KGEK, 1230 kc/s. "We dont have our frequency checked. We have our own service." Signed by E. E. More on this later in fall. KTMS Santa Barbara, Cal., 1250-1000-ABC & now the change "The American Broadcasting Paramount Productions Inc." When I refer to ABC I mean this last statement. This is in the hope that if some one sees it and stamp still there he will know no reply has been sent, and get one away.
