Well after a long enforced silence I now have a little time to spare so I will send you a letter to let you know that I am still kicking. First off, the reason that I have not been able to write before is that I just haven't had the time. We were working from about 3 AM until 9 or 10 PM and as you can see from those hours it doesn't leave much time to do anything else. You can inform Fred Van Voorhees that I have 9 pages of hand-written stations in this area for him if I can ever find the time to straighten them out so that he will be able to make head or tail to them. Right now I am not sure that even I will be able to make them out. They are all stations I have heard myself and with the aid of a little Korean kid that we use as a houseboy, I have been able to get this foreign language translated so that I could understand what stations are what. All Korean AFRS stations run 24 hours every day in the week so if they are coming through they should be able to be taken at any time. Far East is being heard in the States. LK reports that CMBQ (1010) Havana, a 24 hour station was asking for reports of reception in English at 0330 on 10/25. HH reports that on 10/24 several Cuban stations were on during the early morning with hurricane warnings. UNION RADIO stations were heard with same program: CMCF (910), CMHD (890), CMJB (880), and CMHB (780). Also heard RHC CMHI (570), CMCY (590), and CMJN (960).

(RHM) HT reports a verie from XECB (1450) San Luis Rio Colorado, via air mail signed by Aida R. Paulin, Mgr. Letter is in English and is Hank's 101st Mexican verie. LK reports hearing XEDF (960) with frequency check 0330-0400 the 3rd Tuesday now using its increased power of 5 Kw. LK also heard XEAW (1280) Monterrey, N. L. testing on 10/22 0339-0400 with QRM from KFOX.

GUATEMALA--*TGN (1180) plans to move to either 540 or 580 Kcs. in the near future. (RM) CMS asks if anyone knows when the elections take place in this country. He says he gathered from TGW that it was quite soon. If anyone knows please pass on the information.

(RM) (Ray, all of our information here indicates that 1440 is the correct frequency-FV) CMS advises that he has listened several Sunday mornings without again hearing PRB6 (1200), so apparently the program he recently reported was not a regular one.

COLOMBIA--*HH reports a station every morning lately on 1095 Kcs. Uses same time as USA and often mentions Colombia. He thinks it is HJCN, Bogota. CMS reports logging HJCN (1099) on 10/13 at 2300. RA advises that he thinks HJAF, Cartagena, is back on 1245 kcs.

(RH) RA also has logged Rome I, and reports him signing off at 1800. However, he thinks the transmitter remains off a few seconds and then back on. RA also reports Milan I (899) and Bologna I (1115) with good signals to 1800 sign-off.

PORTUGAL--*CMS reports logging CSB2 (1034) Paredo on 10/13 at 1900. Nice to know he is getting so far west. HH hears him most evenings best between 1715 and 1800. HH has also reported to Lisbon I (219), but hard to get due to WGN QRM. Lisbon II (665) much better and one of the strongest on the band. At times heard without crystal. Best from 1715-1800.

SPAIN--*HH reports Madrid (737) continues to come in well in early evening. This is a good strong signal, but badly qrm'd by CBL at times.

LUXEMBOURG--*PT reports a verie in from his European listening, but the signature is not readable.

HOLLAND--*PT has his verie from Hilversum I, also from his listening while on his European trip.

So far our European reception is all afternoon. Any morning?

AFRICA

FRENCH MOROCCO--HH reports station on 1043 Kcs. occasionally heard during the early evening. FBIS shows this to be synchronized transmitters at Casablanca 1 Kw., Marrakech power unknown, Oujda power unknown, and Rabat II 20 Kw.

EGYPT--(Suez Canal Zone) FBS, Fayid (1420) is now running 7500 watts, having replaced the old 350 watt transmitter. Schedule is 2230-0030, 0530-1600, Sunday 0000-1600. QRA: The Chief Technical Officer, HQ, FBS, GHQ, MELF17. (RM)

KENYA--FBS, East Africa command operates a station at Nairobi on 1420 Kcs. Schedule 2200-0000, 0430-1500, Sunday 2300-1500. (RM)

OCEANIA

AUSTRALIA--RM reports that Sunday, October 19, was the best AM for TP reception so far. On 1430 Kcs. both 2WL and 6CI were coming in simultaneously with very strong signals 0530-0600. CMS also reports 2WL on 10/13 at 0500 with strongest Australian signal he has ever heard. Back to 6CI, the 6th district down there is our most distant DX possible, about 11,500 miles from the East Coast. RM also reports on 10/19 4IP (1440), 2KO (1410), 4AK (1220), 2QN (1520), unidentified on 1370 and 1450. (1370 could be either 2LT or 5SE, both with 500 w., 2LT is Macquarie Network, and 5SE is Major Network-FV) (1450 could be 2MG or 7DY, neither one is ABC.-FV) CMS also reports 4IP (1440) in Ipswich on 10/10 at 0445. He reports 3GI (840) Sale, logged on 10/12 at 0545. HH advises that he has now gotten a good log on 2BL (740) Sydney, 10/18 0441-0500. He agrees that 2WL (1430) is the most consistent station, and he is also hearing the one on 1370, but has not been successful in identifying it.

NEW ZEALAND--4YA (780) Dunedin, noted with good signal at intervals for half hour before sign-off at 0530. YL announcer was very hard to hear. (RHM) (Roy, Jack Fox confirms your 0530 sign-off time.)

HAWAII--KILA (850) verified report of 10/19. KOA is off Sunday morning so KILA can be logged. KMVI (550) seems to override KOY quite frequently shortly before sign-off at 0400. (RHM)

JAPAN--Logged were JOCK (730), JOQC (810), JOBB (830), JOAB (950) with UN program, JONR (1010) testing, JOAR (1090) at sign-off, JOKR (1130) with English news, JOBR (1140), JOBB (1160), JOOR (1210) Osaka, JOHR (1230) Sapporo, JOFR (1290) Fukuoka, mixed with DYRI, JOQR (1310), JOHC (1350), JOCR (1490), AFRS Osaka (1390), AFRS (1430), AFRS Kyushu (1450), AFRS (690).
