DXing has been picking up a little here lately, and you can take that literally! It works pretty well, but there is always so much QRN from fluorescent lights that I have to run the radio on battery. CC reported traces of music, but no one had a positive identification. Your editor was out of town and unable to tune for the program.

EL SALVADOR--*--SJ has logged YSS (655) San Salvador on 10/18 at 1915.

NICARAGUA--*--YNN (935) Managua, logged at 2131 on 10/18. (SJ)

BERMUDA--*--ZEM1 (1235) Hamilton, logged nightly at times with S-9 Plus signals. Slogan is "Radio Bermuda". (SJ)

NORTH AMERICA (Cont'd)

SJ reports the following as all-nighters from Mexico: XEMG- (1590), XEDM (1580), XERF (1570), XEXO (1550), XESM (1470), XELZ (1440), XEBS (1410), XEMS (1380), XEQK (1350), XEDA (1290), XEG (1050), and XEW (900). SJ also logged the following Mexicans: XELL (1430) Vera Cruz, at 0315 on 11/1; XECL (990) Mexicali at 0230 on 11/1; and XEAO (910) Mexicali, at 0245 on 11/1.

HAITI-*—This is important, as it gives us news of our third foreign special for this season. On Sunday, November 29th, Station 4VYM (1250) Port-au-Prince, Haiti, will broadcast a special dedicated to the NRC from 0430-0530 EST.
