REGARDING THE NRC DX CONTEST.

The District of Columbia, Northwest Territories and Yukon Territory are all eligible
 as areas in the contest.

A Special NRC DX counts for five (5) bonus points. If it is the first station you
 verify in its particular area, it counts one (1) point for being the first in the
 area, plus five (5) because it was an NRC special. If it is the second station you
 verify in the area, it counts three (3) points for being that, and five (5) more be-
 cause it is an NRC DX. If it is neither first nor second station in an area, then
 it counts a straight five (5) points.

We will publish the prize list as soon as it is received, also a rule change as soon
 as the official results of the Board of Directors' action is published.

MEMORIES

We wonder if any of you would remember the New York Radio scene in 1922, when there were these stations in New York: WOR, WWZ, the Wanamaker's Dep't Store outlet; WRAY (later WRAF and now WRBC) operated by A. T. & T., WJZ, owned by Westinghouse, WBS, Newark, operated by D. W. May & Co. who manufactured batteries; WHN (now WJGM), Ridgewood, N. J., WRW, Tarrytown, N. Y. an experimental outfit; WBAW owned by the Wireless Telephone Corp., Paterson, N. J., WAAT Jersey City and WAAM Newark, operated by I. R. Neilson, Newark, manufacturers of generators and motors. ALL operated on 360 meters and at the same time! With the prevalent static too, this was quite a cacophony! At that time Lloyd's of London issued "static insurance" to American radio stations!

Croton DX Club - 46 Morningside Drive - Croton-on-Hudson, New York
 Stations received here during the last week were: 10/27, WPTS ETing at 4:30. 250 watts - will verify all DX reports. WWSO (1210) RS. Oct. 28 - KOMO (610) "crushing" WGY at 6:25 (RS); WKTG (730) s/on at 6:30; WENX and WADE both on 1210 kc/s. Here is my running DX report: 10/25, heard WRAX, 1360 for a new one but lots of QRM at 6 p.m. but did send report anyway. Heard WWSW, 970, for a new one at 11 p.m. Heard KCRG, 1600, fighting the QRM for a new one. Couldn't hear WJAB on their special 10/26 but got adjacent WRRR, 1330, Rockford, Ill. on with tone signal for a new one. Sent thank-you note anyway. 10/27 - Received verie from WAIT, 820. Heard and reported KYW and CMCK 1050 taking turns covering one another up. Heard KRFT and WADC 1350, for two new ones. 10/29 - Heard WKAI, 1360, for another new one. 10/31, received verie from WQXR, 1560, 11/1 - Couldn't hear CHRC due to WGRD's covering up 1410 but it was a new one anyway! I'm not trying to be a dictator, but I like to get as much into an evening as I can, and my time is not such that I can give more than one evening a week to this job. Thanks to all of you for continued support, and now for the week in DX, internationally speaking.

NORTH AMERICA

HAITI-*--From another source we learn that the call of the 1080 Kc. station is 4VA, not 4VC. 4VB and 4VC are short wave calls. Schedule is 0630-2300, and address is P. O. box 1143, Port-au-Prince. (RAM) Station 4VP with 150 watts is located at Petionville. Called "Radio Petionville" and owner is Petionville Broadcasting System. (RAM)

CUBA-*--GMAN, Pinar del Rio, is believed to be the Cuban QRMing WHAS at 2300 on 10/30. Closer and stronger than GMJM. This on 840 Kc. (RHM) KB has been hearing Cubans with the following listed: CMQ (630), CMHQ (640), CMCU (660), CMCF (910), CMJL (920), CMBQ (1010), CMCX (1060), CMHA (1280), and CMCB (1330). Suppose you have all noted CMW (550) with a 24 hour schedule giving the correct time every minute. Also does it on short wave over QOCW. (FV)

BERMUDA-*--KB reports good reception of ZBM-1 (1235).

MEXICO-*--KB reports reception of XEW (900), XEQ (940), and XEG (1050), and adds his first reception of XERP (1190).

CANADA-*--KB notes reception of CJON (930), CBA (1070), and CBE (1550).

UNITED STATES-*--Both KM and KB report a number of US stations. KM's are in his "Overseas report", and KB's follow: WOWO, WQAI, and KSL in London 10/14; and in York 10/31-11/1 WCBS (880), WINS (1010), WRGH (1050), WBAL (1090), WNEW (1130), WMIE (1140), WWVA (1170), WOWO (1190), WKAT (1360), WOKO (1460), WTOP (1500), WMEX (1510), WPTR (1540), WBSC (1550), and WQXR (1560).

GUATEMALA-*--TGW veric card and schedule received via air mail (JA)

PANAMA-*--Looks as if we were not all among the unlucky ones on the HOG DX. JA reports a veric letter back in 5 days after sending report. Says only heard several musical selections, after being covered by low-pitched hotrod for first 45 minutes of program. It all goes to prove that you have to stick with those tough DX programs right down to the bitter end. I have some verics that were earned that way.

SOUTH AMERICA

BOLIVIA-*--KB reports reception of CP4 (1020) at 0110 GMT on 10/31 for his first logging, although KB says the station has not been heard in England for many years.

VENEZUELA-*--KB reports YVMF (1120). RHM wants to correct an error in his last week's report. It was 2245 EST that he heard YVKS (750), so would have been 2315 Venezuela time, erasing any doubt as to whether YVKS was on at this hour. JA reports logging and reporting YVMF (1120) on 10/22 from 1830-1900.

URUGUAY-*--From KB news of his hearing CX6 (650) and CX14 (810).

ARGENTINA-*--Also from KB loggings of: LMG (680), LRI (1070), LR3 (950), LT2 (1230), and LS11 (1270).

CHILE-*--KB continues to hear CB114 (1140) quite regularly.

BRAZIL-*--KB reports that as usual many Brazilians are being heard including PRF4 (940), PRB9 (1000), PNE9 (1200), and PROC (1360).

COLOMBIA-*--HJKA (673) "Radio Nacional en Bogota" noted quite often evenings usually with classical music. (JA) Airmail verie card received from HJCZ back in 7 days for reception on 10/19 0200-0300. Signal was so strong, thought it was WOR at first. (JA) HJEL (1210) Cali, is apparently the Latin American fighting with WCAU on 11/5 from 2300-2330. At 2330 noted words "Nacional de Colombia" very clear followed by an anthem, apparently the closedown of the transmission. Not positive, but sending a report. (RHM) Your editor finally got a log on another Latin, taking a log on HJCN (1095) Bogota, logged on 11/6 from 0401 until I lost him at about 0440. (FV)

EUROPE

PORTUGAL-*--Lisbon (665) noted quite regularly to 1950 sign-off. (JA) Logged CSE-2 (1034) on 10/29 from 1845-2000 sign-off. (JA) Duggone it, now I can keep on claiming that I live too far inland to get TA reception. John is a couple hundred miles further inland than I am. Shucks-FV.

GERMANY-*--BBC (1295) is the most dependable European signal here (JA) NWDR logged on 1586 Kcs. on 10/30 from 0100 on with fairly good signal. (JA) Nurnburg (1602) also logged 10/30 about 0100. (JA) AFN Stuttgart (1106) logged with recorded music and news to 1905 sign-off on 10/13. Very unusual for early evening reception here. (JA)

CZECHOSLOVAKIA-*--Noted Melnik (1286) on 10/15 at 0000-0015 with news commentary in Slavic language. (JA)

BELGIUM-*--Brussels (926) noted with news at 0100 on 10/15.

FRANCE-*--Logged Toulouse (944) and Paris (863) on 10/12 from 0030 sign-on. Also Rennes (674) and Lille (1376) around 0100 on 10/15. (JA)

NORTHERN IRELAND-*--Logged the group on 1151 Kcs. with news at 0200 on 10/15 with S-9 signal. (JA)

HOLLAND-*--Logged the group on 1594 Kcs. with news at 0100 10/30. (JA)

AFRICA

FRENCH WEST AFRICA-*--"Radio Cotonou" at Cotonou, Dahomey, is using 1484 Kcs. with 1000 watts. Schedule is 0145-0200, and 1225-1330 (Saturday to 1400). (RAM)

ECUADOR*-Forgot to note under South America JA's note that he also logged HCJB on the NRC DX on 11/2. Said readable only occasionally due to high noise level and static. Did hear station identification several times.

MYSTERY

We seem to be loaded with mysteries this week so here goes, first with JA who reports an English speaking station on 1285 Kcs. that he thought identified as "Radio Trinidad". They were on from 2045-2145 on 10/1, but "Radio Trinidad" refused on the grounds that they were not using that frequency. Who was it? (How about ZIK-2, Belize, British Honduras? They haven't reported as being on yet, but are supposed to come on 1280 Kcs. soon-FV) JA also reports unknown Latins on 1002, 1020, and 1195, also 777. Says he had an unknown on 1133 with polka music 2345-2400 on 10/14 definitely not Latin American. Also one on 845 from 2300-2400 same date. Thinks might be European. (Would say 845 was definitely Rome and 1133 probably Zagreb, Yugoslavia-FV)

RM passes on the information from Ev Roberts that there is a mystery on 1198 Kcs., a French speaker. He believes it to be Radio Dakar, however our information in the 10/31 DIGEST shows Dakar to be on 1435 and 1538 Kcs.-FV.

RHM has a couple for us, one a Latin American QRMing WBEM on 10/31 around 2300. He has no idea, but thought he heard "Salvador" mentioned. (Weyrich lists YSF-1 on there, but only 115 watts-FV) RHM has another one QRMing WRAM on 1180 Kcs. This one is English speaking and not identified. Any help here? (Weyrich lists a 5 Kw. Radio Jamaica station at Montego Bay on here as proposed. It could possibly be on and be your station-FV)

And lastly, KB adds an unknown on 665 in Spanish at 2015 EST. Any help. Doesn't seem to be anything in my reference file to indicate who this one might be. 655 Kcs. is YSS and 675 Kcs. is NJKA, but no Latin listed on 665. Unless it is CMCU or XEBZ drifting.

On these mystery stations, fellows, if you can give definite help, please drop a postal card directly to the member who wants the help. Also sent one to your editor so that the information can be passed on to everyone at the first opportunity. Hope you are all in the FOREIGN contest. I get them from a local stamp dealer. They rarely cost more than an IRC and have usually brought results. They would probably work better in the first place, but I hate to bother the dealer with my requests which are quite definitely not in the stamp collecting line. This might be a hint to some of you who are having some trouble getting the verics back.
