Not too much time spent on DX due to final exams at U of F. Get this on the front page - WGGG will DX on 2.8 on 1230 from 3:30 to 4:00 and from 4:05 to 4:30. From 4:00 to 4:05 WGGG will test on 1240, consrad frequency with 250 watts and tons. Please report on both. Can anybody give me some help on this? Where where is an announcer named Ed Laux (pronounced Locke?) You New Yorkers will probably remember him doing the announcing at WPAT a year or so ago when they were all-night. You remember that Ted Saling recently noted that a few years ago BBC-881kc. was a regular signal there in Oregon during the winter months; I have been further informed that a Calif. NRCer verified AFN-Normandy, France, back about '45; Norm Maguire reports that back in the early '40s TA reception was frequent in Albuquerque with Europeans and even a couple high-powered Africans being heard, but account of the war couldn't report. Norm says he has recently heard what he thought might be TAs on about 1090 and 1122kc/s, but nothing positive. Although straying a bit from the "Far West", I might further add that Mike Ferguson in Texas has just logged 5 Europeans in a week, as well as such swell L/As as LRA2, LW7, etc. Then, add what I now believe to be the verified report of 40kw. Oldenburg-- mix well, and see what we've got! I would be very interested to know of the experiences and verifications of others in this field of "TA" DX in the FAR WEST! Let's hear about it!

MEXICO-\*--Report sent to XEX (730) heard 1/1 at 0530 AM with U. S. Danco music. (JH)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC-\*--HIST, "La Voz Dominicana, Ciudad Trujillo", (620) came through at S-8 on 12/26 around 0200 GMT. (UK)

PUERTO RICO-\*--WAPA (630) and WKAQ (530) were both heard on 12/26. WKAQ was S-8 at 0200 GMT. (UK) JH has also logged WABA (1240) from 0215-0230, but too much QRM for a report. This on 1/20. Copied WIAC (740) with time checks every minute from 0447-0500, easy to log on 1/25. (FV)

URUGUAY-\*--CX32 (1170) Montevideo, has been heard through WWVA QRM 2/26 at 0045 GMT. (UK)

## EUROPE

FINLAND-\*--UK sends a list of Finnish stations, but after checking, we find it to be the same list he sent and we used in the 1/2 DX NEWS.

SPAIN-\*--EAJ-15 (1124) Barcelona, has been logged at 2215 GMT. (UK) JA reports a powerful new "Radio Nacional de Espana" transmitter now on 184 Kcs. Heard on 1/15 from 1722-1821 when TVI took over. Musical selections were played and an identification by man after each selection



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mentioning R.N.E. and 584 Kcs., but no city, then followed by informal chat by man and woman, as though it were a dedicatory program. Possibly a new frequency for Madrid.

FRANCE\*-Toulouse (944) and Lille (1376) logged on 1/13 through 1/16 with good signals. Also Bordeaux (1205). (MF) Nice (1554) was logged from 0145-0205 on 1/14. (JA) RA reports a veric from Nancy signed by Le Directeur Regional.

SOVIET RUSSIA\*-Uta, Bashkirian, A. S. S. R., was heard at S-8 on 12/26 when closing at 0300 GMT on 692 Kcs. (UK)

LUXEMBOURG\*-Radio Luxembourg (1439) with strong heterodyne and weak voice on 1/14 and 1/15. (MF)

BELGIUM\*-Signal on 926, evidently Brussels, logged but need more for report. (MF) Airmail letter back verifying Brussels III (1124) in 11 days signed by "DXers Friend, H. Swaenpoel". (RA)

## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE NATIONAL RADIO CLUB

**ARTICLE 1, NAME-PURPOSE-LOCATION** The name of this organization shall be the National Radio Club, hereinafter referred to as the "NRC". The purpose of the NRC shall be to promote the hobby of DXing on the Broadcast Band, (535-1605 Kcs) and the "TV" Channels. Headquarters of the NRC shall be located at 325 Shirley Ave., Buffalo 15, N.Y.

**ARTICLE 2, MEMBERSHIP** Anyone interested in the hobby of DXing, and not previously dismissed from the NRC, shall be eligible.

**ARTICLE 3, DUES** Membership dues in the NRC, currently \$3.00 per year, shall be sent to the Executive Secretary when due. The Executive Secretary can, with approval of the Board of Directors, raise or lower dues as necessary. All Officers and Members shall be required to pay annual dues, there being no honorary memberships in the NRC. All members in good standing are entitled to receive the NRC publication "DX NEWS" and all other NRC benefits. A member whose dues are not paid when due is no longer a member in good standing and is no longer entitled to receive "DX NEWS", participate in NRC elections, or receive other NRC benefits.

**ARTICLE 4, PUBLICATION** The Official publication of the NRC shall be known as "DX NEWS". It shall be issued 34 times each year, except in cases of emergency. With permission of the Board of Directors the number of issues may be changed. "DX NEWS" will normally be published weekly beginning with the First Saturday in October, up to and including the Last Saturday in March, twice in April and September, once each in May-June-July and August.

**ARTICLE 5 DIRECTORS & OFFICERS SECTION A** The governing body of the NRC shall be known as the Board of Directors and shall consist of eleven (11) members, Ten (10) members of which are to be elected in the annual election in April by the membership at large. The TEN (10) members receiving the highest vote shall constitute the Elected Board. The Executive Secretary shall be the Eleventh (11) member. In case of a vacancy on the Board, the member next highest in the total votes shall be named to fill the vacancy. In event of a tie vote in this runner-up position, the tied member with the greatest consecutive membership seniority shall be elected. To be eligible for election to the Board of Directors, a member must be in his/her second (2) consecutive year as a member in good standing and must reside in the continental United States or Canada. Any member not wishing to run for election may request that his/her name be omitted from the Official Ballot by notifying the Executive Secretary, in writing, by March 20th, each year. The Executive Secretary issues the Official Ballots. The Executive Secretary may ask for volunteers to count the ballots. The Executive Secretary shall in turn poll the newly Elected Board for their choice of a Chairman. The New Chairman shall be so notified. He will then poll his Board for their Choice of the remaining Officers to be elected. The Executive Secretary shall keep all ballots until after the annual convention date, then he may destroy them.

**SECTION B** The following Officers shall be elected by the newly elected Board of Directors; President; Vice President; Chairman of the Board Vice Chairmen of the Board, all of whom must be members of the Elected Board of Directors. The Board names the Executive Secretary; Editors; Courtesy Programs Committee Chairman when necessary, due to vacancies etc. The Board names all other Committees that may be deemed necessary. The election of the above Officers shall take place as soon as possible by the newly elected Board. In event of a vacancy in the Office of President, the Vice President shall succeed. The Vice Chairman shall succeed to the Office of Chairman in event of a vacancy there. Vacancies caused by such action shall be filled by election of a new Vice President or Vice Chairman from among the Board members as soon as possible, this vote to include the vote of the newly added Board Member.

**SECTION B** continued. The term of office for Board of Directors shall be ONE (1) year beginning with the day before Labor Day and terminate on the day before Labor Day the following year.

**ARTICLE 6** DUTIES of the BOARD of DIRECTORS & OFFICERS. **SECTION A.** It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors, through the Board Chairman, to administer the affairs and promote and protect the interests of the NRC to the best of its ability. Any action taken by the Board must be by a majority vote of the entire Eleven (11) members, except for By-Law amendments or additions, or any item dealing with a reprimand or dismissal of any NRC Officer or Member, which shall require a Two-Thirds (2/3) majority vote. For this purpose Seven (7) votes shall be deemed the required majority. It shall be mandatory for each and every Board Member to vote (Unless prevented by Article 8) on all questions or propositions submitted by the Board Chairman, or Acting Chairman, unless physically unable to do so within Fifteen (15) days.

**SECTION B** PRESIDENT The President shall represent the NRC in an Official capacity in all matters so long as any action he may take is in agreement with the Board of Directors.

**SECTION C** VICE-PRESIDENT The Vice President shall have no authority other than that of any regular Board Member.

**SECTION D** BOARD CHAIRMAN The Board Chairman is responsible for the proper execution of all NRC affairs. He shall have the power to appoint any committees or call upon any member to assist him, subject to approval of the Board. He shall, as often as necessary, send a release to all Board Members on matters requiring Official Action. In cases of an emergency a release shall be sent at once. He shall, at intervals, have published in "DX NEWS" all business conducted by the Board, listing each item, with members voting record, separately. He shall not submit any item to the Board that would require the spending of NRC funds, without first obtaining a financial report, and future commitments if any, from the Executive Secretary. The Board shall be guided by that report. He shall send a condensed Financial statement to all Board members, once every Three (3) months. All Official communications from the Chairman to Board members shall be marked "OFFICIAL BUSINESS". All such communications shall be held strictly confidential.

**SECTION E** VICE CHAIRMAN The Vice Chairman shall have no authority other than that of any Board Member, except to act as the Board Chairman in cases of necessity.

**SECTION F** EXECUTIVE SECRETARY The Executive Secretary shall perform the duties of Publisher-Secretary-Treasurer and shall not be eligible to hold any other NRC Office. By virtue of his Office he is a member of the Board with full voting powers in all NRC matters. He shall be responsible for the following; Collect all dues; Issue membership cards; Keep an up to date membership file; Keep a complete Financial record of all monies received and spent; He shall be responsible for the publishing of "DX NEWS" and the purchasing of all supplies required for this purpose and other NRC business. He shall purchase and sell authorized NRC stationery. He shall publish complete results of the annual elections. He shall once every Three (3) months send a condensed financial statement to the Board Chairman. With consent of the Board he may select some member to assist him.

**SECTION G** EDITOR'S The Editors shall be responsible for the cutting of the stencils comprising "DX NEWS", other than "BOARD NEWS to MEMBERS". They shall see that the stencils are sent to the publisher. They shall use their discretion in selection material for publication, that is, they have the power to exclude from publication any members report, or portion thereof, which they believe would not be in the best

**SECTION G EDITORS** continued interests of the NRC. They have the power to exclude from publication any members report which are not in accordance with the requests of the different Editors. Any problems arising from this article will be delt with through the Board Chairman. Because of their duties, Editors shall not be eligible to hold any other Office, except that of Board Member.

**SECTION H COURTESY PROGRAMS COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN** The "CPC" Chairman shall be responsible for arranging special DX programs for the NRC and shall work together with the Board and Editors for the best interests of the NRC. The "CPC" Chairman, because of the amount of work involved, shall not be eligible for Board Chairman, but may be a Board Member. He shall appoint as many members to his committee as necessary to carry out the work of the "CPC" properly. The "CPC" also acts as a publicity committee and in as many ways as possible, shall promote the interests of the NRC and DX hobby. The "CPC" shall be responsible for the preparation of material to be read on DX programs dedicated to the NRC along with write ups etc., in any Hobby magazine or publication.

**ARTICLE 7 COMPLAINTS and ACCUSATIONS** Any Officer or Member having a complaint or accusation against any other Officer or Member regarding violations of NRC By-Laws and who desires official action, must make his/her complaint in writing, signed in ink, to the Board Chairman, who will immediately inform the accused and ask for a reply. Upon receipt of that reply, the Board Chairman will send copies of both the complaint and reply to the Board Members for action. In such cases both the complainant and the accused will refrain from corresponding with each other until action has been taken by the Board and a verdict has been rendered. Both the complainant and the accused shall abide by the Board's decision. All correspondence from one Officer, or Member, to another Officer or Member, which does not bear the heading "Official Business" shall be considered personal correspondence regardless of whether or not it is written or typed on NRC stationery. The Board shall have no power to settle any dispute arising from such correspondence unless it contains something in violation to the NRC By-Laws.

**ARTICLE 8 REPRIMANDS AND/OR DISMISSALS** Any Officer or Member of the NRC found guilty of conduct detrimental to the best interests of the NRC, or violation of any NRC By-Law/Laws by a Two-Thirds (2/3) majority of the Board of Directors shall, if the Board finds it to be a Minor offense, be reprimanded by the Board Chairman. If the offense is judged to be a Major one, he/her shall be dismissed from the NRC. Any Member so dismissed shall not be eligible for re-admission to the NRC. In case an Officer or Board Member is accused of misconduct, he-she shall not be allowed to vote on the matter. Any Officer may be removed from Office and still retain his NRC membership, if the Board so decides.

**ARTICLE 10 CONTESTS** All NRC Contests, Contest Managers, and Contest Rules must be approved by the Board of Directors. Said Rules must be published in "DX NEWS".

**ARTICLE 11 RETURN POSTAGE** Every Member using NRC Report Forms or NRC Letterheads, or mentioning that he/she is an NRC member, shall be required to enclose return postage when sending a reception report to any station and requesting verification, unless said station specifically states that return postage is not required.

**ARTICLE 12 BY-LAW AMENDMENTS and ADDITIONS** Any Officer or Member may submit items, proposing amendments or additions to the By-Laws, for action by the Board of Directors. Such items must be submitted to the Board Chairman in writing, signed in ink. It shall be mandatory for the Board Chairman to disregard all items not so submitted. Items shall be restricted to the aims and purposes of the NRC. All others shall be passed by with a letter of explanation from the Board Chairman to the Member submitting said item. If the Member is not satisfied with the Board Chairman's explanation, he may insist that the matter be brought before the Board for a vote. The Board Chairman only has the authority to submit questions to the Board for a vote, unless unable to do so. In such cases, it becomes the duty of the Vice Chairman to do so.

**SECTION B BY-LAWS** A complete copy of these By-Laws, and any and all additions or amendments thereto shall be Officially kept by the President, Board Chairman, and Executive Secretary in a suitable folder or binder supplied by the NRC. At the end of their term of office, said Officers shall deliver same to their successors. Before any subsequent publication of By-Laws is made, it shall be the duty of these three (3) Officers to compare their copies so that no errors or omissions shall occur in the publication.

**ARTICLE 13 CONVENTIONS** The annual convention of the NRC shall be held at NRC Headquarters, on the Saturday and Sunday preceeding Labor Day, and Labor Day, unless otherwise voted by the Board of Directors.

**ARTICLE 14 DIRECTORS MEETING** A Board of Directors meeting may or may not be held at the annual convention, depending on the number of Directors that are present.

**ARTICLE 15 PLEDGE** All Officers and Members pledge themselves to uphold these By-Laws to the best of their ability.

**NOTE** It is suggested that every Officer and Member keep these By-Laws and all changes and additions hereto in a convenient place for future reference because it is hoped that this set of Laws will continue to be in effect for a long time.

This set of By-Laws was approved by the entire 11 Board Members-NRC, and are effective as of February 1 1954
