Howdy boys. DXing has been somewhat limited here due to a radio that is not too good for DX purposes. Here is what I have logged during the past two weeks. On 10/26 logged KWAK-dx and verie back from Scooter already. A nice QSL was enclosed with the two page letter. 11/1- WIKC (1490) on its r/c came in loud and clear. 11/3 logged the new WRCA in New York at 12 midnight. Their signal came in surprisingly strong, about S-8, I believe. From the time I got here up until now, the local loggings have really been something. I reckon about 12 a night on the average. On 11/7 KALM-dx rolled in with a good signal, and KGFL (1400) was heard on their r/c. WJOP (900) in Ocala, Fla. was ETing for ½ hour at 5:30-6 with 1,000. Thanks to Lefty in "DX Down the Dial" I logged WVOP (970) signing on at 5:56. Also on that same morning I heard WDIX (1150) s/on at 6:03 playing "Dixie," WOIC (1470) signed on at 6:33, announcing power as 1,000 watts. Does anyone know where that station is located? Right now it's 12:50 AM CST on 11/8 and I am hoping to log the ensuing DXes. I have already tried for CPCL-dx, but it's just too far away to be heard. Now to turn on the radio and start DXing. Well, KNWS was not heard, but I did log CKEY (580) at 4:05. PS- I was trying for KABI (580) at the time. That's it for now. Best of DX to y'all. 73s.

Here is my DX report, the first of the new season. I started on Oct. 16 hearing WEBC (1380) from 6:03 - 6:25 a.m. 10/18- Thought I heard part of WAGS (1330) DX show; WLAG (1240) from 4:48 a.m. on f/c; WKMI (1360) on s/on at 4:58 a.m. 10/25- WBEV (1430) with test from 3:10 to 3:30 a.m.; VSRC (1410) from 5:16 to 5:33 a.m., WPDQ (600) 5:53-6 a.m. on RS. 10/30- WTSP (1380) on all night show with interference from KHON. 11/1- CJIB (940) on s/off at 3:04 a.m. playing "The Queen," KWSO (1050) on f/c from 3:20-3:30 a.m.; KGDW (630) new station in Washington with test from 5:23-5:45; WION (1430) test at 4:21 a.m. WSIX (980) s/on at 6. 11/8- WFCT? (960) from 5:37-5:56 a.m. on RS; KMA (930) s/on at 5:58; WDVH (980) on RS from 6:07 - 6:20 a.m. Of these heard I've received veries from WKMI WBEV WTSP and WSIX. That's about all and I hope I have better luck on the NRC DX specials.

Hank Holbrook - 4710 Edgemoor Lane #105 - Bethesda 14, Maryland

DX has been on the up-grade here. Following have been logged and reported so far in November. On the first, KOEL-950 received fairly well on DX program from 3:08 to 3:30 a.m. Few new Cubans reported on the early AM of the 2nd. All were on with ERs. CMJK 1160 with good signals from 1:15 to 2:10 a.m. s/off. This one not new, but still trying for their verification card. CMZ 1560 from 1:15 to 1:42 s/off and a nice one in C.OA 1590 between 1:15 and 1:43 s/off. Rather easy to log this group as they were carrying Batista's speech between 1:15 and 1:40 a.m. On the 3rd was surprised to hear WPXY 1300 giving WFBR a real battle between 3:47 and 4:12 p.m. Later in the evening logged WTIK 1310 between 4:59 and 5:16 o'clock s/off. Heard well but some QRM from WSPD and WLTC. On the 6th two more were added. WORZ 740 between 1:03 and 1:13 s/off. Then from 2:20 to 2:45 the special DX from WKMI 1360 some WKAT QRM. 11/7 a long log, 2:27-2:30 was taken on CW-1 545 in Colonia, Uruguay. Good signals and featured American, French and Spanish music. Report to this one every year. Maybe some day they will verify. Then logged KALM 1290 between 3:30 and 4 on DX. The morning of the 8th real interesting. KOSI 1430 ET 2:45-3:05 a.m.; KNWS 1090 3:04-3:31 on DX, fine signals and show. KYA 1260 on TT with strong signals 3:32-3:45, CJOP 1340 RS 4:01-4:25 with fairly good signals. WCNX 1150 on DX 4:11 to 4:30, and then to make it a perfect morning, Station 2DU 1250 Dubbo, Australia for first TP of season. Fairly good signals, between 4:43 and 5:08 a.m. Two stations added here on the tenth. WSKI 1240 1:34-1:45 on f/c. Good signals. WDXN 540 2:20 to 2:26 s/off on ET. On the 11th two more - WARU 1600 2:10 to 2:30 on ET. Very strong signals. Then CJVI 900 3:33 to 4:05 s/off through heavy static. This morning, Nov. 12, saw two more - WPLY 1420 on ET with tone and strong signals from 2:26 to 2:41 a.m., and then the swell program from WACH 1270 3:00 to 4:00. Few veries drifting in, with letters from KWRF WCAP WCBY WEAG WNIK and most prompt reply from WCNX. And, finally, my reply card from 'Radio Andorra' after several f/ups. QSL log strands at 1,465 stations in 64 countries. DX will slow up a bit as I start a new job Monday. 73s to one and all.

We had a long distance call from DICK COOPER who says he is back to DXing again and that his son Tom will emcee the WLAS DX on December 13. Report to come in soon!

Musings of the MembersCharley Conley - 358 Market Street - Lemoyne, Pennsylvania

Reports out to KALM KNWS and WACH on NRC DXes, all of which were received here with good signals. Reports are going out today (11/15) to KTXJ (rather poor here with XEQK peaking occasionally and spoiling his signal); KTJS who did better with his 250 watts, although both were borken occasionally by HNL which seemed to be prevailing this morning. Had to jump back and forth to get some of each program. WILY, due to his being only 200 miles from here came through fine, yet he was broken at times by KRLD's tone and, during the latter part of his $\frac{1}{2}$ hour by some one else with music. The same holds true for WCON, who, at times during his program boomed in, then would be taken out by WPAM (about 40 miles from here who was f/cing) and I imagine WTIX, though I heard no ID from the latter. All of these, of course, were heard due to the fine work of your CPC. Was especially glad to log WCON, as, due to dumb luck, I reported the old WCON on 550 kc/s. in March of 1950 to find then deleted the following August. Then, any chance of logging the Cornelia station on 1450 was ruined up to last summer when our old friend WOMB stopped 24-hour transmission on 1450. There was no sign of WAVY either on the 14th or 15th. With this exception, I've been able to log every NRC DX to date, and the payoff is that the only one of the lot I had previously veried was WCON, and, from him I have a verification! So goes it! All of which leaves me with no verie signers to send in. Practically no nawthin'! At this location DX reception has not been too good so far this season. Could be due to the unseasonably warm WX, as most nights the noise level is high. Sorry to hear of the passing on of Medley Simmonds' mother and Ron Schiller's father. My sincere sympathy to both.

Ken Meylath - Men's Residence - St. Lawrence University - Canton, N.Y.

Loggings for the past week include the following: On 11/1 the KOFM DX got in here with a very poor signal. I had to ride the volume quite high and contend with prolonged deep fading. 11/4 - WOIC 1470 s/on at 5 with pretty good signal. At 5:28, WLCM 1360 s/on under WEMM at 5:30, tough to make out. Did not try for WKMI-dx as I have heard them many times, including a couple of times since I've been in Canton. I was blazing mad because although I was up, I could not try for the much needed KALM-dx. There was a peculiar power failure on a line leading into the university so that the whole place was blacked out. It began at 7:30 Saturday night and the crews were on the job soon after. They still didn't get it fixed until 5 or so Sunday morning. The batteries are now shot in the Zenith which eliminated any possibility of a try at it that way. Veries for reception here have drifted in from CKSO 790 and WCBY 1240. WCBY sent along some literature along with form letter. It seems as though just about everyone logged it so they must have been swamped with reports. Verie also in for reception at home of WGFS, long overdue. It was out well over 200 days. Until next week then, the best on the good variety of DXes and other tuning to all.

By means of Lefty, Jim O'Brien, Peter Hanson, Don Chaydeayne, Pete Clarius and Ron Schiller's visiting me together, and Hal Williams' having stopped by for a little while the same morning, I enjoyed a "junior size NRC Convention" at my home Nov. 1. A fine time seemed to be had by all, 'talking shop' and swapping rare and attractive veries. Additions to my heard list since 11/9 are: WARU 1600, KOSI 1430, WEIC 1270, WOBS 1360, WNTM 1370, WLCM 1360, WCON 1450 and KTXJ 1350. Only new veries are letters from WAFC WCRE and WIEM. The latter is now a 24-hour a dayer, except Mondays. My DXing was thus: 11/9- WARU ET very loud at 2:30, KOSI strong too at 2:50, and WEIC equally strong at 3. 11/12- WACH's DX well received at 3. 11/14- These Floridians were found to be early Sunday AM s'ons: WNTM @ 6:05 through QRM, but WOBS in the clear 6:30 to 7, and then South Carolina's WLCM came on atop them. 11/15- KTXJ's DX quite strong atop the Mexican @ 3-3:30. PFC Marvin Robbins - US 55-419-560 HQ & HQ Btry, Div. Arty., First Armored Division
Fort Hood, Texas

Got in a pretty good night of DXing a few nights ago. Managed to haul in WHIM-1300 Moultrie, Ga. while waiting for the CHAT special DX to come on 1270. Managed to get CHAT along with KCOK-1270, Tulare, Cal. which was testing during the last part of the CHAT DX. CHAT was practically in the noise level but KCOK put in a terrific signal. Also tried to chase a few "horkers" on 1230 and 1240 but they never identify, just fade in and out. Paid another visit to a rare DX station, KYBS, in Waco. She runs five to ten watts on 640 kc/s. into a long wire antenna. They also use amplifiers on 350 and 650 kc/s. to cover two partly-metal buildings which cannot get the main transmission on 640 kc/s. Actually they announce as being on 630 kc/s but it is very close to 638 kc/s. Do these 10-watters ever get out? I could still hear their carrier and heterodyne on KFI all the way to 20 miles south of Waco. Are readable ten blocks from the edge of Baylor University campus. Mornings around seven to nine a.m. always seem to produce some interesting results. Got KGAR, Garden City, Kans. on 1050 kc/s. up till 9 a.m., no sign of KELT, Electra, Texas, though. Is this station still on? The next morning KFMJ, Tulsa was overriding KGAR at the same time. The same morning I nailed another good skywire station, KGIN, Guyton, Okla. on 1220 kc/s. Finally heard WKWF in Key West, Fla. during the evening, riding in behind KBOR which seems to throw quite a bit of their power in this direction. Once in a while I will try out the car radio to see how it compares with the table model. The other day while on the way to Temple on #190 nailed KTRY-730, Bastrop, La. and there was WLV at 4:30 p.m. down here riding in with road predictions. Couldn't get WGN or WMAQ, Chicago. Also heard WBAM overriding KTRH, Houston, just before signing off with "Dixie." That terrible summer static has let up quite a bit now. It really makes a difference. One other station logged also: KAIM-1290 with very good signal. Am hoping to get home next month on leave. May get in some better DXing. 73 to all.

We will continue to list the name of the country as usual (ALASKA-*-) if it contains an item of actual listening reported by a DXer in the US or Canada. If the country is written like this: (Alaska---) it will mean that the item contains either an overseas report or an official notice. Let me know if this helps dig the actual meat from the reports. Contest is now closed, hope you are all in. Now with the comment that reception is picking up, here goes with the news for this week.

NORTH AMERICA

United States---My old friend WMBX, Boston (1510) is again being heard as early as 2345 GMT. Other stations heard include WMGM and WMBR. (RF)

COSTA RICA-*-TIRS (915) "Radio Athenea", San Jose, is now on the air 24 hours a day according to announcement. Can usually be well heard with good signals between 0200 and 0500. (KG) (Lefty, this is the station you reported last week as unknown-FV)

CUBA-*-CMW (550) Havana, is now the key station of the old RHD-Cadena Azul Network, formerly headed by CMCY (590). The name of the net has been schmagged to "Circuito Nacional Cubana". The initials "CNC" are used frequently. According to their announcements, CMJM is still on 840 Kcs., and no mention is made of CMGF (1240) which some lists show as being in the net. This network covered the Cuban election until 0245 on 11/2. (KG) CMZ (1560) and CMCQ (1460) Havana had an election broadcast until 0142 on 11/2. (KG) CMDL (1150) "Radio Holguin" was on all morning, 11/2 with election returns. (KG) CMDD (1200) Bayamo, has been heard evenings near 1199 Kcs. (KG) There is a new station licensed on 950 Kcs. for Guantanamo, Oriente, with 250 watts and unlimited schedule. Also a new one on 1550 Kcs. for Santiago de Cuba, Oriente, also 250 watts unlimited. (FCC)

MEXICO-*-According to Verie letter, XECK (920) Monterrey, has a monthly FC on the 4th Friday from 0200-0230. (KG) Verie letter from XEY (1360) "Radio Celaya", states that they will broadcast special religious programs on 12/8 and 12/12 starting around 0500. Reports are requested by Sr. Rafael Zamarroni A., Gerente General. Address is Apartado Postal #114. Also enclosed was a picture folder of the station. (KG) Verie letter and QSL card received from XEYJ (670) "La Voz de Teziutlan". (KG)

Argentina---LR1 and LR3 are both audible around 0030 with fairly good signal. (RF)
