Pennsylvania

After a slow start I've finally swung into DXing at my normal pace. Began my season with one report in September, that to KAMO, Rogers, Ark. on 9/14. This has been verified by now. Then one in October on the 9th to WARM (590) Scranton, all-night program. Finally got started on 11/6 with special from WKMI, (1360) Kalamazoo, Mich. already verified, complete with lighter, very nice. Also have verie back from WARM, a card. While getting WKMI on 11/6 I also copied s/off from WBAY (1360) Green Bay, W:05 a.m., and then at 1:10 a.m. a test from KLRS, Mountain Grove Mo. Liked the frequency so well that I tried it again 11/7 at 6:46 a.m. and logged KTEB, Tallulah, La. until 7 when WBAY came on. 11/8 special from KNWS (1090) Waterloo, Ia. well heard 3:03-3:26, then also heard test from WPAB (550) Ponce, P.R. at 3:37 a.m. Next try was 11/15 with late program from KPRO (1440) Riverside, Cal. Then specials from KTJS (1420) Hobart, Okla. from 3:00-3:15; then KTXJ (1350) Jasper, Texas, 3:15-3:30, Both of these were good with KTXJ suffering some from XEQK. Then WILY 3:32-3:53 a.m. bothered by unknown tone. Last WCON (1450) from 4-4:19 badly broken by WPAM (630 miles away) testing. Next try on 11/17 to see what Conelrad sounded like. Heard it off and on, and was able to log XEQR (1030) Mexico City from 3:24 to s/off at 3:30 with WBZ on Conelrad. Also took log on all-night CMK (1190) from 3:37-4. Finally KVED (1150) McAlester, Okla. was testing from 4:05-4:18 with tone. On 11/19 logged test from WPTX (920) Lexington Park, Md. from 2:36-2:52 a.m., severe QRM here. Then my first TA of the year was Lisnagarvey (BBC North Ireland Regional) on 1151 kc/s. from 3:02-3:17 a.m., bothered some by tone on 1150. Latest try was 11/21 which netted me reports to WMPS (680) Memphis, on all-night show, good from 4:56 to 5:16 a.m. Just time and space enough to congratulate everyone connected with the bulletin on a swell job (not including myself) and a further note that the lighter from WKMI deserves a thank-you note from us to them.

On returning 11/13 from an all too short visit to Bernie Duffy on Staten Island and John Tweedie in Oakhurst, N.J. I found two letter veries - XED (1030) typed in Spanish and a nice letter and descriptive folders of the Shenendoah Valley Caverns from Phil Potter verifying WSIG (790). He even returned my postage. Thanks, Phil. 11/17, WEIC 1270 letter, 11/18 WKMI (1360) letter, program schedule and a souvenir cigarette lighter, very nice, hi. Veries now total 1,369. They sure are slow coming in. Here are the loggings: 11/14- Too tired after my trip so off to bed. 11/15 first short out of the box. WARU (1600) Peru, Ind. ETing, S-7 signal 1:00-3:00. Called them on the phone. I hope Len Kruse and Bob Gorsuch were listening, as I had a selection dedicated to them at 1:58, "Beautiful Lady in Blue." WCON (1450) Cornelia, Ga. testing 2:09-2:20, then at four o'clock they came on for DX show but WPAM was giving them a very sad time. So at 4:15 I tuned 1350 for WAVY but no sig. of them and the frequency was wide open here. KTXJ (1350) Jasper, Texas only S-2 but easily readable. I left at 3:15 to get KTJS (1420), poor S-2, very difficult WILY (1080) strong S-7 signal for full $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, my 11th Pennsylvania station. 11/16 - WNAV (1430) on for NNRC but not needed. WCHF (1150) Chippewa Falls, Wis. M/E 3:00-3:15 badly QRM'd but readable. WJPS (1330) DX for NNRC, CMCB-QRM of course. WBBA (1580) Pittsfield, Ill. ET with transcribed National Guard show 3:30-3:45, S-4 but noisy. KUDU (1590) Ventura-Oxnard, Cal. strong on top with news and WX reports 4:00-4:05, then music to 4:20, appeared to be on RS. WIKE (1490) and WIVN (1340) did not show here for NNRC but not needed anyway. 11/17- WBBA (1580) again ETing at 1:15. If WKDK (1240) was on 4:30-5:00 I could not hear them as I had to go in to work split time at 2 a.m. and the scheduled NNRC DXes for the 19th, 20th and 21st I could not hear as I worked till 6 a.m. I will also miss those DX programs scheduled for 11/22, 23. Every station that I can't listen to will get a thank-you card as has been my custom for the last three seasons. 11/21- Getting home from work at 3:25 a.m. I tuned for CKCH (970) Hull, P.Q. I got them but WEBR was testing, WVOP was on and some other unidentified station. If I get a verie for this poor report I'll be more than lucky. Till next week, 73.

Last 30 minutes clear of WRIC; a Dixie Network station. 11/15- All DXes heard out only WILY 1080 needed and it was coming in 100%. Also added KUTI 900 3:28 f/c-M for a fine DX catch. At 4:55 think I had KSIL 1340 on f/c TT so sent a tentative report to them. 11/17- Finally got around to reporting XEWA 540. Reporting from the country for the first time, We arrived here just past midnight Tuesday morning 11/9 and van got here at 11 a.m., after a couple of hectic days of packing and unpacking. We are now getting settled here. The radio was set up and in operation Tuesday evening, but just with a temporary sky wire, about 25' of wire strung around the walls of a second floor room. House sets at the head of a valley and hills are higher on all sides except the east than the house is. Seems like a fine DX location. Time has not allowed a real check yet. Practically no man-made static at all and even with this indoor wire, we get better results than we had at Williamsville. I keep looking at the typical high farm barn about 300' away and wonder how it will work when I get a wire out to the top of it. Hoped to make Ken's fine DX from KNWS the final catch from 23 Howard Avenue, but nature ruled otherwise. Just too doggone tired from packing; I overslept and woke up six minutes past scheduled end of test. Alarm got turned off in sleep. Since last report the DX has been KOEL, very weak on DX; WAFC, 900 on 11/3 f/c, WNTM, 1370, in clear Sundays at 6 a.m. s/son tip; KAIM, 1290, very good on DX; WMMN, 1330, easy on RS Sundays at 5:30, and WRCD, 1430 coming in as late as 7:45, also on Sunday. First DX out here, KOSI, 1430 ET to 3:10 on 11/11. Said opening on 11/17. WWBG, 730, ET-TT on 11/11; WACH, 1270 like a local on DX and WSRC copied with difficulty through WING on RS 5 a.m. s/on. Veries, letters from WDVH WGTW WOPA WRCA, and the first one to arrive here, WAFC.73

While battling the mess on 1340 at 3:40 was KIJV Huron, S.D. with f/c and to wrap up the morning, KUDU 1590, Ventura, Cal. from 4-5 a.m. s/off. Two veries in from WCRE Cheraw, S.C. and KERB, Kermit, Texas from f/up, both letters. Goofed the KJJS Hobart, Okla. DX, and one of the few Okie stations I need, hi. 73s to all.

Well, I guess that I owe another report just to let people know that I'm alive and still manage to do a little bit of DXing every now and then in between studying. On Nov. 15 WARU 1600 in Peru, Ind. was testing until 3. WPLY 1420 in Plymouth, Wis. testing at 1:45. And my best to date, at 1:45 until 4 with a QSA 4 signal on 880 kc/s.
