About time for another Musings report, so here tiz, as Smitty says. 11/6- KSPR-1470 RS and s/off for 41st state heard, WGTC-1590 TT with RMA, Riverhead, KCOG-1400 f/c, first 100-watter, KWIZ-1480 RS, KOSI-1430 ET, WKMK-1360 FB DX, WMGA-1400 f/c as listed. Also heard, but not reported, were KHSL-1290 and KSIX-1230, both on RS 11/7 brought in WBBQ-1320 RS, a new 24-hour baby (rats!); WRAD-1340 TT, and WKNK-1500 RS. Didn't get KALM. I woke up OK when the alarm went off, but while lying there trying to get completely awake, fell asleep again and woke up 25 minutes after s/off, darnit. On 11/8, I got the swell DX from KNWS-1090, with Craig and Kent the last ten minutes - a very enjoyable program.
