Of all the stations there so if anyone needs any of these nine stations, please let me know and I'll pass the news on. A visit to KCYL, Lampasas, proved very interesting today. They are very happy with the results of the DX and want to put another such program on the air next season. I counsed 35 reports in their files. all of these were answered - the carbon of the answer was with each report. So if you wrote KCYL and got no answer, let me know and I'll forward them on to the CE. Only one report had to be turned down, but several forgot to enclose return postage. The states and countries stack up as follows: New Zealand 2, Ontario 2, California 2, Oregon 1, Washington 1, Colorado 1, Oklahoma 2, Nebraska 2, Iowa 2, Illinois 5, New York 5, Vermont 1, New Jersey 2, New Mexico 1, Arkansas 1, Tennessee 1, Pennsylvania 1, Ohio 1, Wisconsin 1, Connecticut 1. The KCYL RS is from 6:00-10:00 CST (7 a.m. - 6 p.m. Sundays) and their f/c is done during RS by Southwest Frequency Measurement of Austin, Texas. CE is Joe F. Morgan. KCYL (formerly KHIT) uses one 150' guyed uniform cross-section vertical radiator located one mile NW of Lampasas on Highway 190. Will be leaving with the division chorus this next Wednesday morning for New York City. It will be a three-day "vacation", I hope. We are appearing on Arlene Francis' "Soldier Parade" on March 17th over ABC-TV. Looking forward to seeing several of the local DXers. Looks like June is the big month here and only three away now. Have the whole "big civilian summer" ahead to look forward to. That's about it for now. 73.

Really feel like a "cad" not getting a report in this season but the DXing season and my busy season just don't seem to jibe. Been busy in February getting caught up and just getting my head above water in March. However this is not to say I haven't enjoyed the bulletin and the fine work of Lefty, McKenzie and the Croton bunch and the CPC gang, plus the f/c list and "DX Down the Dial," Verie Signers list and numerous other NRC exclusives which have made this season a very enjoyable one to me. In February and March condx and DXes didn't seem to get together and most of the specials other than the easier ones seemed to get stranded by the way-side. Lefty I have to agree with you about the weird abbreviations - can't figure them out. But note with interest that you had similar WX condx here on March 7 DXes. KOGA heard OK but WAPX unreadable, very bad static plus warm WX sure made me know summer was getting near. KBAR last hold out from last season was verified through Verie-Signers list.
