However, this past July we drove back east for a trip and I loaded the old RCA 15 tuber in the car and brought it out here. After a \$65 overhaul job I'm ready to go again (as soon as my log book get here from Fred and Carroll). I have gotten acquainted with Hank Wilkinson and Ted Vasilopoulos via telephone and am glad to have a couple other "fiends" in the area. Without any current listings I have been able to definitely log 280 stations in 35 states, Hawaii and eight foreign countries (VOA, Okinawa, 1180), JOOR (1210), HJCR (1200), OAX4A (854), TIEP (835), over 50 Mexians, and several each in Canada and Cuba. This was all done with a temporary antenna about 70' long and 15' high, an inverted L pointing south. I haven't started verifying yet until I get the report forms and log books in order. DXes report excellent reception WBFD WBRT WBRV KBOI WNRI; fair: KAMO WHOD WAMI. Rough was WBGE with WHLD on top but overriding. Marv Robbins was wrong on his info.  (Iceland). First snow of the winter hit here this week, but within a day it had all gone. Really surprising how mild the DX is here. Deep drifts in the mountains look ominous, though. Some DX this week. A few nights were heard with good reception, although more from Europe than from the States. New stations were heard as follows: 575-RIAS-Berlin, Berliner Rundfunk on Oct. 30; 722-Deutschlandsender-Berlin on the 30th; 1081-BBC on the 2th; 1052-BBC on Oct. 29; 1070 CBA, Maritimes on Oct. 30; also BBC on 1138; 1142-AFN-Bremerhaven with 1 kw. on the 30th; 1196-Deutschlandsender on the 30th; 1215-BBC on Nov. 3; 1363 or thereabouts, Radio France-Paris on the 3rd. Also on the 3rd, KOTA-1380 Rapid City, S.D. and KRGI-1430 Grand Island, Nebr.; 1452-BBC. On the 30th MWDR at 1566; and around 1570-1580 an AFRS station somewhere in Europe whom I still haven't figured out the location of. Other unknown stations I've heard are an AFRS station around 1420 kc/s. whom I believe is running on EST, I've heard them quite a few times and their calls sounded like KALZ. Never heard them good enough to identify but have a long log on them. (How about ACB-20, Canal Zone? ed) On the 3rd I heard loads of U.S. stations who would come in for a while, then fade out. They were all over the dial but I only IDed KOTA and KRGI. Really irked me when I copied a station on 1410 for an hour and never found out who it was. On Oct. 30 I had three CBC stations carrying a Montreal hockey game. One was CEA and the one on 640 must have been CEN although he faded out on me. The other I copied for 1 1/2 hours on 900, in French and I couldn't decipher his calls. Must have been CJBR, I've lost without my Weyrich Log up here. This French Canadian signed off at 11:30 EST on 900 on a Saturday night - any help? EXEL seems to be the most consistent of US stations here. Have heard them at least six or seven nights now. The West Coast is no longer heard here and the East never was, Still getting the Midwest occasionally. A bit of info on AFRS stations: AFN-Frankfurt approximately 865 is APO 757, NY NY, AFN-Stuttgart-1106 is using 100 kw. and APO 154; TFK-1484-Iceland is APO 81, 250 watts. (It'll be a cold day when we get that one, hi -ed.)

On 11/5 KBRC (1430) heard on their DX and on 11/8 KUMA (1370) and KAMO (1390) both heard with strong signals for two more new ones. KUMA really plugged the NRC. Also logged on 11/8 was WAEI (910) on their AN show with good signal for the first station I have logged in Maine. Other new ones were WFMJ (1390) and WEEC (560) both on with "Monitor." Reception poor on 11/7. I didn't think I was able to hear WNRQ on their DX but after comparing notes with my brother I find that I heard one musical selection that they played so this gives me another new state. Now the only states I need are Vermont, Maryland, and Delaware. On 11/8, WAMI (830) heard on their DX and this morning 11/11 WRGS (1370) heard on NRC DX for another new one. The first report was sent on a government POSTAL CARD. It follows: "Following is a report of a very poor and fading signal along with interference as logged here. Please verify. NZ time is used. :Mar.28 9:12pm talking--etc--9:23pm talking (other station had light music)--etc --9:42pm light music, 9:45 announcement, 9:46 pm light music--etc-- 10:06pm music. Please verify this report with your verification QSL card or letter."

Unfortunately, the office girl verified this card without consulting anyone and the engineer was quite irked about it for from what he could determine from the report it wasn't 4YZ and the card did not correspond to what he considered an adequate report.

The second report is on a NRC report form. It is for the same date March 28, 1954. It follows: "From 8:45 to 8:57 you had news. From 8:57 to 9:00 you had a musical interlude (no vocal)"
