First, a 3" reel of tape contains 150° of standard tape good for about  $7\frac{1}{2}$  minutes on each track at  $3\frac{3}{2}$  inches per second speed; the largest reel, 7" that most home recorders will accommodate contains 1200 or about an hour on each track; theenew long playing type which I use extensively adds 50% to recording. There is also a new } mil "Plus 100" tape that doubles recording time, but it's very sensitive and requires very careful handling. Most home recorders are dual track, but I can't automatically switch recording tracks, so can only use one track in DXing by tape. Finally, you needn't go \$200 for a home recorder, half of that will buy a pretty good rig!
