Finally from JE, logged KIG (1050) with English religious program at 0700 on Sunday. AT reports his 150th Mexican verie in from MEFK (880) Gaymas, air mail, signed by Sr. a. Your editor copied this one for another try from 0341-0400 also on 2/12. Ly previous reports have been unanswered. IRD also asks who the Colombian on 1190 Kes. was, heard on 2/12 from 0400-0430. (Can't help, as I left my book at home-FV) MJW logged one on 839-840 Kes. from 2143-2305 on 2/11 playing American recordings from 2143-2200. with man and woman speaking alternately from 2200-8235, and then a running account of a basketball game from 2235-2305.
