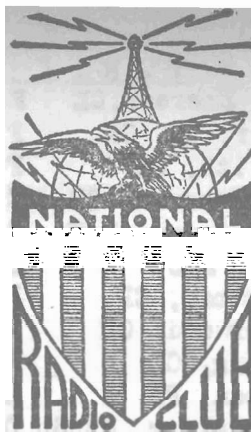

Well, DXing is picking up somewhat. Put up a 150' antenna between a palm tree in our back yard and a pine tree in the next (empty) lot. I had to make it quite loose as it is quite windy. Sometimes it sags to the ground. Nevertheless, it has helped considerably. Reports out: 9/28, KVOB RS. 10/2- "Radio Jamaica" on 1180 RS. 10/6- WLCO-1240 f/c. 10/8- KGBM-1140, WHB-710, KGPB-690, WEAR-1230, WINN-1240, KPOP-1020, KFWB-920, WJWV-580 all on RS. 10/11- CMW-550, WRBL-1420 RS. 10/15- WJCM-1320 f/c, WROD-1320 f/c (both Florida stations f/cing at the same time, same channel), KWYO-1410 third Monday f/c (my first Wyoming report), WOWL-1240 on f/c between 3:15 and 3:30. (WJCM, WROD on between 2-2:15). A KOLD-1240 ID was heard between 3-3:15 (as listed in f/c book) but they were playing records, and I couldn't identify any of them. California reception has been excellent, and I am looking forward to when the static starts disappearing. If KGBM and KWYO verify, I will still need Nevada. KENO-1460 is the best bet, but they said my first report was wrong, and didn't reply to my second (which was quite detailed* or the f/up to it. As for frequencies, I still need 370, 720, 850, and 1120 (WMAQ, WGN, KOA and KMOX will do the trick). I have 13 veries on 1450, 11 on 1300, ten each on 1340, 1490; Florida leads with 42, North Carolina next with 32, California next with 23, Texas with 21. Total, 460 veries, averaging about 100 a year since joining NRC in '52. I now have the Tuesday 1a.m. to 3 a.m. AN on WQAM Miami, so if you want a verification, send it to me (I'll be glad to verify any night!) All Todd Storz stations (WQAM WTIK WJGY WHB KOWH) play nothing but the top 40 tunes plus ten extras, and all are, as far as I know, 24 hours a day, seven days a week (except daytime KOWH). WLOX often readable right through local WAHR on AN. 73s.

(daytime station) and KDAY, 1580 kc/s., Santa Monica, Cal. (another daytime stations) for DXes in about five weeks or so. Hope everything goes OK. The boys down in New Zealand did rather well on this one. Well, I'll catch up on DXing on my vacation beginning October 19th. I predict that DON REYNOLDS will win the Foreign DX Contest on the West Coast as well as nation-wide. A year's free membership to the man that beats him. (Thank you for that fine offer, Hank. DX has been swell here so far during October. The Japs have been extremely good many mornings. Sometimes they even overpower domestic stations to get through. Since last report, the following DX has been heard here: 10/1, the following Japs all heard will between 4:15 and 5 a.m.: JOBB (830), JOKR (950), JOQR (1130), JOJK (1170), JOOR (1210), JOLF (1310), JOJB (1370), JOKD (1390). On Thursday, 10/4 I found an S 8-9 signal from CMCQ on 890 at 11 p.m. Sunday AM 10/7 was very good with HJKL (600) on AN apparently announcing as "Emisora de Colombia." they were S-7 at 4:30. I got a nice log on JOQB (1030) who was S-7 at 5:10. VOA (1180) Okinawa was S-9 at 6:00. A new domestic, KTFY (1300) at 6:05. Station on 1435 kc/s. using Dutch and Spanish apparently was PJA-5 at 6:10. TISA (835) "La Voz del Tropic" was S-7 at 7:25. JOBB (830) and JOJK (850) were both S-8 at 8:00 and in between, on 840 kc/s., I got a nice log on HLKY "The Christian Broadcasting Station" in Seoul, Korea, who was S 6-7 from 8:20 to 8:45. About this same time, HLKB (800) in Pusan was coming in S-6. This one was my last season's prize perie. On Monday 10/8 I heard WQAM (560) CMKV (300), KSAL (1150), KOPR (550), WKOW and EIBC (both 1070) for new domestics plus another fine bunch of TPs. They seemed to be best in the later part of the morning. Pusan (800) again heard at 5:20, JOLB (870) S-6 at 5:25. A new 1 kw. Jap on 940 was S-6 at 5:30. JONR (1010) good at 6. VOA (1140) Philippines S-7 behind K900 at 6:45. JOBR (1100) with 3 kw. was S-7 at 7:15 for a new one. JOBK (670) S-7 at 8:10. The Oriental on 660 seems to be HED22 in Taipei, Formosa, but ID is not yet sure. Forgot KMTH (900) on Midway Island was S-7 at 5:01 s/off. Many reports out with veries back from KOMA KGA CMQ CBK XEBX KOB KVOO and WTAW who said I was the most distant report every received on RS. 70 and good DX to all. KOPY (1550) formerly KACE and KEAR in San Francisco now using "Koby" call.

Veries back are WMOR and WLOK. 10/16- CKOM, 1420, swell at 1:25. KDON, 1450, atop KENO at 1:30. WVCH, 740, test at 1:50. CBU, 690, fighting XEAC at 2:00. (Nuts, I thought I had KVNA change of call). 10/17- KEMA, 1580, f/c at 1:32. KGHM, 1470, f/c at 1:48 for a new one. TT on 1470 for several days but no voice heard as yet. WSBT, 960, TT at 2:39. KPOA, 630, good after KOH off at 3:08. Unknown TT behind XEG, 1050, at 3:11, no voice. 10/18- Well I guess WAKR, 1590 is AN now. CBK, 540, at 1:57. CKCK, 620, at 2:01. Unknown Canadian on 740, giving CBC news at 2:03 but WVCH came on with test. Hope this is CBXA and I'll be fishing for it later on. KIEM and KWIZ, 1480, fighting at 2:45. 8/19- WHLM, 550, test at 1:39. Tone atop WGT/ KCMO at 810 at 1:54. Heard a mystery one at 1:57 to 2:03 when I lost them, I'd say about 815 kc/s. At 2:03 they said, "This is the BBC News, broadcast on a frequency of 369.1 meters," then they faded out completely. WBRB, 1430, ET at 2:32 for a new call. Also heard one on 1430 after KLO and KAHM went off at 3:00. Sounded like KBRF call but KTUL AN gave them a tussle. 10/20- WCHB, 1440, f/c at 2:08. WJTN, 1240, AN for Gold Star Market opening. KDLM, 1360, f/c at 3:05. WONE, 980, AN selling marathon. Today, DX wasn't as good as it has been for several mornings. 10/21- WKDL, 1600, off 1:54. WCHB, 1440, ET at 2:25.

PUERTO RICO--*First foreign verie of the season is in for EC, and it is WABA (850) for reception of September f/c.

BERMUDA--*PT reports that he was in Bermuda on 8/23-9/1 and visited Bermuda Broadcasting Co. ZBM2 on 1340 puts out very poor signal while ZBM-1 is having trouble covering the island, and they get a nice squeal off of being between 1230-1240. May return to 1230 with more power if they can get by with it.

CUBA--*CINW (550) reported 10/11 between 2214 and 2246 with Guy Lombardo music. The 1420 one appears never to be silent. Forgot about CINW (810) DX, so shall wait to see if they verify for others, and try to report them on RS. Spanish report forms will be nice. Condensed Minutes of Board Meeting

The 1956 Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors of the NRC was held Sat. Sept. 1, 1956 at Harrisburg, Pa. Those Directors present were Edge, Reilley, Kruse, Cooper, VanVoorhees, Williams, Holbrook, Ward and Gorsuch. In his absence Director Maguire requested that Reilley act as his proxy. Len Kruse acted as Secretary and recorded the minutes of the meeting.

The financial report for the quarter ending Sept. 1, 1956 was given by Exec. Sec'y. Wagner. This report indicated the club to be in a healthy financial condition. An inventory of supplies on hand was read to the Board. Sec'y Wagner reported the membership stands at its highest level in recent years.

A report from Leo Shelly, who operates the Clubs stamp exchange, submitted a fine report and the Board wishes to direct the attention of the membership to this very worthwhile service available to them.

A bulletin analysis was presented by Sec'y Wagner. His views were also given concerning the much used mimeo machine used to print DX News. The Board was unanimous in its thought that Sec'y Wagner should use his own good judgement concerning the repair of this machine-and proceed as he sees fit in this regard.

The Board thought it would be a fine gesture to direct a letter to each of the four Harrisburg radio stations who so graciously received the NRCers while at the convention. Director VanVoorhees agreed to write such.

Pres. Edge and V.P. Reilley made brief comments at this point in the proceedings. Hank Ward commented on the 1955-56 Domestic Contest, and VanVoorhees on the 1955-56 Foreign contest. Kruse presented the report of CPC activity.

A discussion of the Spanish Report Form followed. It was decided that in one of the forthcoming issues of DX News a statement that the club was contemplating printing them, and having them available at cost to the members, be published. All interested members would be asked about how many they would order if and when available at about 2¢ each.

The "Country list" approved by board action a few months ago was discussed and it was felt that for the Supremacy Listing it had value for the club, and C.M. Stanbury will be requested to prepare the original draft of same. This draft to be studied and approved by a committee composed of VanVoorhees as Chairman, Henry Wilkinson and Hank Holbrook. This in turn to be approved by the Board as a whole. Future changes in the list to be initiated by this committee of four-either on their own initiation or at the request of a member at large.

Sid Rosenbaum was reappointed to serve as Chairman of the CPC for the 1956-57 season. Two proposals for domestic DX contests were received. After lengthy discussion the proposal of Edge was accepted as the best for the Club. This received unanimous Board approval as did the appointment of Ward to serve as the contest manager. The Foreign Contest was approved and also the appointment of Anderson as its manager.

C.M. Stanbury II will continue as editor of "DX Down the Dial" column, while Francis Nittler offered to continue to compile the Frequency-check list. The Veri-Signer list of Editor Cooper was voted to be resumed immediately as a weekly feature on page 2 of DX News.

Ponca City, Okla. was unanimously accepted as the site of the 1957 NRC Convention-and it is the belief of the Board that this location will prove to be an excellent choice. Several invitations were received for conventions in 1958 & 1959 but these were placed on file for action, one year hence.

The Board meeting was closed with a vote of sincere appreciation to hosts Conley and VanVoorhees for their excellent arrangements at this years convention.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 2:15 am after 4½ hours of productive deliberations.

STATEMENT OF POLICY FROM BOARD OF DIRECTORS
NATIONAL RADIO CLUB

In recent weeks it has been brought to the attention of this group that certain members have been guilty of violation of the Club's rules and by-laws. This is regarding the failure to enclose return postage with DX reports requesting verification. It is clearly stated in our by-laws that return postage must be enclosed.

We have heard much of late concerning the use of tentative reports and we believe that this sort of report has a definite place in our hobby-- however, it can be used in the wrong way-- and we feel that those who may be writing such a report knows at that time whether or not he may be perhaps stretching the facts being claimed. We feel that there should be some concrete fact or evidence in hand to warrant the sending of such a tentative report. A tentative report sent without any basis of fact might damage the reputation of the National Radio Club, and the DX hobby.

Furthermore any correspondence from a member to a radio station should at all times be of a friendly nature and never criticize station personnel. Here we are concerned with correspondence such as that received several months back by KWCR wherein they were rudely criticized because a letter in reply to a verification request did not specifically mention "reception verified." This sort of thing hurts the National Radio Club and the DX hobby.

Therefore, we, the Board of Directors, elected to office by the members of the National Radio Club, to steer and direct the activity of the club, wish to advise all members that we intend:---

1. To safeguard the reputation of the National Radio Club.
2. To retain the kind feeling of radio stations and station personnel upon which our hobby depends.
3. To exercise the power given this Board by the rules and by-laws, wherein we can enforce expulsion from the club membership anyone guilty of anything which damages the club's reputation, namely;
 - a. Failure to enclose postage with verification requests.
 - b. Flagrant misuse of tentative reports.
 - c. Directing unsavory correspondence to any radio station.

All members please be so advised.
