On Saturday evening 11/24 I wrote 19 thankyou cards to stations DXing for the NRC that were not heard or heard and previously verified. To date, every station DXing for the NRC and/or the NNRC has been sent a report or a thankyou card. 11/25- After rather a hectic Sunday I took our son (home from Greece) to a Service Men's Special train out of New Haven at 3:30 a.m. and had to miss the needed DX Specials from KEVL/KLETT/KDAY for the NRC and also the needed WLBH for the NNRC. I reached home at 4:15 and tried for the needed WVKH-950 but no luck. WFAS-1230, CFRC-1490, CFDA-1380 were not needed and WFAS was well heard with a very interesting DX and CFRC was also fairly well heard through the QRM. CFDA was not heard. Another Monday AM with nothing new heard. Eight more thankyou cards to send out today. 11/27- WHEN-1420 was well heard on their DX with plenty of good clear IDs. They were heard until 4:25 when I tuned 860 for WAMO and I found that they had taken the air 15 minutes earlier than listed in "DX NEWS" but they were logged fairly well through the terrific competition from CMBL. Two good DXes this AM. That was the last DX session for eight days as I am now on the 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. shift and will have to miss the DXes lined up for 12/3-5 and all are needed except CJOC-1220. I will take my Zenith "Royal 890" seven transistor portable down to the plant and I may be able to sneak in enough time to log one or two, if our 23,000 watt testing equipment is not in operation. WEND and CKNX are quite possible to log but as CKNR is on a Tuesday AM with the night supervisor working until 4:30 a.m. I may not even get an opportunity to try for them. I almost forgot about KMUL-1380. I certainly need them and may have luck here also, here's hoping. Results in next "DX NEWS." Now for the DX Mailbag. 11/26, no "DX NEWS" and nil on the veries and ditto on 11/27 but on 11/2 the "DX NEWS" did arrive. I knew that those snow "flurries" in Pennsylvania and western New York must have delayed them. Also a letter from WHBG 1360 and the CE states that WHGB signs on DAILY at 5:30 a.m. (Lefty take note) but he did NOT send me a verie as I listed his call letters incorrectly. I got out the copy of my report and sure enough I listed them as WHGB instead of WHBG although I entered them in my log correctly. I certainly have enough reason to know that WHGB is in Harrisburg, Pa. as they have been a real hollout since August 17, 1949. 73 and 30.

Thankyou cards to stations broadcasting Specials not heard are out-numbering reports two to one. It is a shame, because Bill Stone and several others must have spent numerous hours in arranging them. November 12th, I heard WZOB on 1250 at 3:18, ET. WTAM on 970 at 3:44 under WWSW. At 3:52 WITA signed on 1140, although their verification says that they never leave the air. There was no sign of CKBI CKCL or CFOS. WAKN on 990 was fairly good until 4:14 s/off. November 19th was a washout. CKLY were not on the air and CKSB WAMW and CHSJ just didn't show up here. November 25th brought WPGC at 3:11 on 1580. CFRC and WFAS were heard very weakly. CFDA was not on, and the Specials from Louisiana and Mississippi could not be dragged through the interference probably caused by the Northern Lights. However, I am looking forward to a big month in December, with most of the programs scheduled which I badly need. I phoned you from Idlewild Airport October 26th, but didn't find you at home, and I didn't get my dime back. "DX NEWS" is still most enjoyable, even if my results were somewhat disappointing. The log is now at 1,721 heard and 1,566 verified.

Well! Here it is December 1 and DX should be improving! Or is it? I truthfully believe that DX reached its peak in October and that was the best time for DXing this year. I would like to have some opinions on this statement! Any volunteers? Before I list my new loggings, there are some tips to DXers. Robert H, your Cuban on 590 would most likely be CMW and 690 would probably be CMBC. J.W.R., the station you heard at 3:00 under XEG might have been WMGM, New York, which s/off at 3:00 and s/on at 5:00. Both times with the National Anthem. Harold E.S., the unID Florida station on 900 most likely was WMOP, Ocala, with 1000 watts as "W.R.L." lists WMOP as only 900 station in Florida. A report of my DXing this season, best day, 10/30 when six new stations were logged: WTUX (1290), WDOV (1410), WHIM (1110), WMNA (730), WIBC (1070), WKNE (1290), a total of 43 logged in October as compared to 23 in November when DX is supposed to be better than in October. New DX: WHP (530) logged at 8:05 a.m. and WEST (1400) logged at 9 p.m. Can someone tell me where I can get a daily or weekly report of sunspot activity and wave propagation? Anyone? Total now is 212 logged and only 103 veried. I'm too lazy to write out reports, hi! 73s, DX and good health to all.

Joe Brauner - P. O. Box 22 - Valier, Pennsylvania

The November 24th issue of "DX NEWS" is surely a newsy one. Didn't expect to get it only one day late, Hal. Not much snow here, two inches at the most. 11/19 was the big day of the season here to date - five new ones. KSUL 1310 on f/c, KORS 1140 on DX, stayed out in front of WITA here, CJET on DX, very good for welcome new catch, and two on RS, WZKY 1580 shortly after 6 a.m., badly jammed by WAMY, and WWKY who takes over on 1580 after 6:30. 11/24 added WJBD, 1350, on ET, much stronger than WADC. KDAY-dx very poorly heard, only final 15 minutes audible and then barely so. WDDT easily copied on 900 after WLBS s/off at 6:45 p.m. WDDT off at 6:00 p.m., on 11/26. Right after that stumbled onto a call change in Oklahoma, Blackwell, on 1580 has new owners and apparently the call is KLTR, formerly KBWL. Later in the evening, 9:30, HJKA, 685, was heard with a clear signal. And on 11/28, KVNA, 690, was heard concluding RS at 3 a.m. Quite a few veries this time, two page one from KRIV on f/up of last February test, KLEN-dx, KLLA who says mine first DX report, WTOW-dx, KOBY, WTAM-dx, KWYN WCKR WEMJ WNKY WITA, card from WEMB. Also letter from CKLY saying not on due to technical troubles, but want to try at a later date. Again DXes faired none too well here. CFOB not heard, CJBR copied with difficulty, neither new here, but badly wanted CJON also failed to show a carrier. KEVL not heard, KDAY very weak, WBKH no trace, WFAS and CFRC lost in QRM here. No trace of anything on 1380 during CFDA period, although KCBC AN was weakly heard on 1390 during thistime. WHBN and WAMO, both strongly heard semi-locals, logged on RS here. The odd fading, often very deep and sudden, has also been noticed here: 73.

As promised, I have been doing a lot of DXing lately before the regular AN shift begins on WQAM December 1. On 11/23: KOA-850 RS 1:22-1:40; WEDA-1240 RS 1:45-2 s/off; KYW-1100 RS from 2-2:30; KMOX-1120 RS 2:30-3; WAKE-1340 RS 3-3:30. On 11/27- KJAR-620 RS 1:41-2; W000-1310 DeLand ET 1:43-2:03. And then came three on 540, WDXN ET 2-2:12; KFMB RS 2:11-3:06, with some QRM from WGTO Haines City, 10 kw. which was ETing with tone, also needed. Scooter's KWAK sounded like it was Kwaking on 1240; WHBN-1420 good on DX; WSAW-1470 on RS 4-4:30. WAKN noted ETing on 990 at 4 a.m., not needed. Next, AHD-780 RS 4:30-5 (they're two hours ahead) and WENC-1220 ETing between 5-5:10. Licked the stamps and envelopes and sacked. That night, still 11/27, WRGA-1430 RS 6:50-7:02; WHIL-1580 and KLOU-1580 both needed, RS, 7-7:45. KRLD-1080 RS 10:30-11; WRUF-850 RS 11-11:45; KARK-920 RS 11:45-12 s/off, not 1:00 as in Weyrich. 11/28: WDLF-590 RS 12:30-12:50 with Christmas music already; KRRV-910 caught signing off at 1:00; WTBC-500 RS 1:31-2:00, no sign of WOW or anything else except XEPH; WGEA-1150 f/c as per list 1:30-1:45; KGGM-610 RS 1:50-2; KVMA-630 said r/c, 2:05-2:20; KABC-790 RS 2:21-2:45; WGOV-950 ET 2:50-3 right through powerhouse WINZ; CKCK-620 RS 2:55-3:10; and KCBS-740 RS 3:25-3:40. This afternoon and tonight, still 11/28, WBAM-740 RS 5:27-5:45; WDAE-1250 RS 9:30-10:30; and thought I might as well try for a couple of Cubans, CMCY-550 with Four Aces 10:35-10:50, and CMQ-630, etc. with spots and music, 10:48-11:05. The night of 11/27, morning of 11/28 was quite the oddest. The Cubans were off the air in most part, excepting 360, 1190, 1330; 690's carrier was on for a while. They were on again by 1 a.m. (the ANs). Also, never had a trace of KGGM before, or KARK. WAKN-990 testing again 11/28 at 4 a.m., as was W000-1310 at 1:00. Twentynine reports in two days - a record for me! Be nice to get some of them back verified for a change - still running 50%. Foo! 73s.

Time out for a bit of a report before Navy tornadoes the Army. A few verifs in, WSHE KDJI WRCS WTAM KLEN WHBG XEOR CFOB WNAU. Very busy here with DX but not at the dials. The new Weyrich Log arrived so all stations must be transferred into it and the new f/c list must be checked off and my Secretary just quit! Thanks to Leo Shelly for the excellent supply of stamps.. Also to Hank for the tip card and the DX from HJAL which was good here and very welcome. 11/26- WPGC-1580 on ET at 3 a.m. KEVL didn't get through WAKR, KLEFT came on late and were good 4:00-4:30. KDAY had nothing to spare here with KLOU putting in some tone signal spots. Nothing heard of WBKH and CFDA, only a short try, however. 11/27- WHBN good and enjoyable program. WBRB-1430 on ET past 4:30; WSTN-1420 on a f/c at 4:30, WAMO weaker than expected here, were topped by CMBL. Time is flying, one of the stations was wishing a Merry Christmas already. Maybe some ANs will get off after Christmas, I hope. 73s.

Greetings. DX by date since last report: 11/16- KWFT-620 Wichita Falls, Texas logged with difficulty from 7:40-7:50 a.m. s/on of KNGS, Hanford, Cal., the latter s/on in English, but programming in Spanish. 11/17- KDAN-790, Eureka, Cal. logged 7:30-8:00 p.m. s/off topping all on 790. 11/19- KVCL's DX on 1270 for NNRC only DX program heard this AM. KKKD blocked up 1150 and try for CHSJ's DX, and of course KTW fixed up 1250 for CKSB's DX but good. Also taped 910, but heard only AN KOLO on 920, no sign of CKLY's DX. I understand KORC's DX for NNRC on 1140 was heard in Seattle, but I didn't try for it. 11/23- CFOB's DX on 800 heard briefly after CKOK s/off at 4 a.m. I believe someone else tested from 4:27 a.m. on, but couldn't ID. 11/24- Cross my fingers, I think I had CJON! Won't say more, but do have hopes that a "tentative" report to this DX on 930 from far away Newfoundland will verify! 11/26- KLFT's DX on 1600 plugged from 4 to 4:26 a.m. with good signal for 500 watts at 2,000 miles plus on a five tube radio. OPERATION PIONEER

Hank Holbrook, Bethesda, Md. reports his first LONG WAVE verification. It is from TUK (194) an aeronautical beacon at Nantucket, Mass. This station operates continually and can be heard any time of the day at Bethesda. It uses a broadcast type steel tower with a power of 7000 watts.

Anthony Lagattuta reports that beacon NSC (532) Floyd Bennet Field, Brooklyn, N.Y. is heard regularly on most ECB in the New York City area. They have 50 watts or less.

Hank Holbrook reports that most marine beacons operate in groups of three alternately using the same frequency. This makes it possible for the DXer to log more stations on the same frequency. On the other hand, distant reception of aeronautical beacons is very difficult as most operate continually thus blocking their frequencies. Hank reports logging the following aeronautical beacons.

- 242 HAR Harrisburg, Pa. heard both day and night. In addition to operating as a beacon, this station gives the weather and announcements for aircraft with voice.
- 263 PHL Philadelphia, Pa. same as HAR.
- 275 TPP Tappenhannock, Va. heard well during the evening hours. Operates as a beacon only.
- 404 NTU Fentress, Va. same as TPP.
- 512 BED Bedford, Mass heard well during the hours of darkness.

HOW THEY WERE HEARD

- CJRL No trace in East.
- WAMW Poor to fair throughout the East.
- CKSB Poor at Mendota, Illinois and hrd weakly during last few minutes at Crystal Beach. Generally not heard in Pennsylvania.
- CHSJ Barely readable at Valier, Pa. and too weak to log at Lemoyne, Pa. Poor at Crystal Beach.
- CJET Good in East and Illinois.

Be sure to list those DXes which you try for and do not hear. ☒ They are just as important to these listings as the ones you do hear. And another blank spot. How are these DXes from the Maritime provinces of Canada getting into the Midwest? Is there actually a skip working or is it, as your editor suspects, just plane lousy conditions.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC*-Heard H13A on 1125 Kcs. the first time I tried and he was S-7 to S-9 on 12/1, perfect reception much of the time, best before 1830. (JB)

SOUTH AMERICA

COLOMBIA*-The HJAL DX an easy S-9 for a welcome logging. Report has been sent. (JB) The Colombian on 820 Kcs. is WJED Cali, as WJEO is on 1330 Kcs. and is in Cartago. (JH) (I know this, sorry for error-FV)

VENEZUELA*-EH says he is wondering aloud and that he is certain that the Venezuelan on 650 Kcs. is YVQO, Puerto La Cruz, not YVIL. He says YVIL never moved from 590 Kcs. (Someone reported it, and my log shows the move, but forget where I got the info-EV)

SWEDEN*-Radio Sweden broadcasts an English program at 2400 daily over Morby (1178) fine signal here. (RF)

POLAND*-Here is the winter schedule of "Radio Warsaw" on 737 Kc. English programs only: 0130-0200, 1700-1730 except Friday. Concerts are broadcast from 0230-0500, 0900-0930, 0950-1030, and 1700-1800, the latter Friday only. (WRH)

SPAIN*-Red de Emisoras del Movimiento (Falange Espanola) is operating from the key LW station EBE14 "La Voz de Madrid" on 1223 Kcs. Has 20 kw., and keys 60 low powered medium wave stations in Spain. (WRH)

AFRICA

WANGLER*-IBRA Radio now broadcasts an English program from "Radio Africa" on 935 Kcs. on Thursdays at 2130 and on Sundays at 2145-2200. Reports are requested by Ibra Radio. Reception is extremely good here although some QRM from AFN Berlin. (RF)
