I'm sure glad I was able to attend too as the Convention was a heck of a lot of fun and I'm sure a good time was had by all. Sure glad to meet old friends and also to see some new ones. The Convention was very well planned and everyone had a roaring good time. DX activity here has not been too much lately, but I've been concentrating on f/up letters to my delinquents. The new station in Philadelphia, WFLN-900, is expected to go on the air early next year, perhaps in January. They will be daytime only and broadcast from the transmitter at 56th and Passyunk in South Philadelphia, near the airport. They will carry the same programs as WFLN-FM, which has been on for some time now, in North Philadelphia at 3200 Ridge Avenue. On Columbus Day I was down there and spoke to the engineer on the phone, getting this information. I'll see what I can find out about three other new stations coming up soon in this area; Columbia, Levittown and Elizabethtown, Pa. A new TV station is WVUE, down in Wilmington. No DX here. 10/27, return to EST in this city. For those interested, I DX with an S38D receiver bought in 1954, using simply a 15' indoor wire antenna included with the set. Daytime and evening reception is poor, as TV squeals cover the band until 2 a.m. since I am right downtown in the midst of it. After two it is clear, until around 7 a.m. The range is limited to East of the Mississippi mostly, but that gives one plenty of targets. Best reception comes from the South Atlantic states, from Virginia to Georgia. They come in fine on test programs. Previous set was an S38, 1946 model, with 12' vertical rod. 73s.

ON SEPTEMBER 1ST, I ASSUMED MY POST AS CHAIRMAN OF THE NRC BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND WOULD FIRST LIKE TO THANK ALL OF YOU WHO VOTED ME TO SERVE ON THE BOARD; AND SECONDLY TO THANK THE BOARD MEMBERS WHO CHOSE ME TO SERVE AS CHAIRMAN---AND I PROMISE TO SERVE IN THAT CAPACITY IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE NRC AND ALL ITS MEMBERSHIP.

A GREAT AMOUNT OF BUSINESS WAS TRANSACTED AT THIS YEAR'S CONVENTION AND WAS SENT OUT FOR BALLOTING BY ALL MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. THE RESULTS AND CONSENSUS OF OPINION ON MANY MATTERS ARE TABULATED AND FOLLOWING IS A RESUME OF THE NRC BUSINESS TRANSACTED WHICH IS OF PERTINENT INTEREST TO ALL:

1. THERE WAS UNANIMOUS APPROVAL THAT PROXY VOTING BE DISCONTINUED AT NRC BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETINGS. THIS PROCEDURE WAS FOLLOWED THIS YEAR. IT IS MY SUGGESTION THAT THIS DECISION BE INCORPORATED INTO OUR BY-LAWS AT THE 1958 CONVENTION.
2. I HAVE RECEIVED WORD FROM HAL WAGNER, EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, THAT A SPANISH REPORT FORM HAS BEEN SELECTED AND WILL BE AVAILABLE TO THE MEMBERSHIP IN A FEW WEEKS. FURTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS ON THIS MATTER WILL NO DOUBT APPEAR IN DX NEWS FROM WAGNER.
3. NORM MAGUIRE IS PUTTING THE FINISHING TOUCHES ON THE CODE OF DX ETHICS BOOKLET AND I HAVE ASKED NORM TO HAVE IT READY ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 15TH, IF AT ALL POSSIBLE, SO WE CAN EXPECT SOMETHING ON THAT SHORTLY -- AND I AM SURE THERE WILL BE MUCH INFORMATION IN IT FOR THE NEOPHYTE DXER AS WELL AS THE OLDER DXERS.
4. THE COUNTRY LIST WAS NOT APPROVED - AND A NEW MOTION WILL SHORTLY BE ISSUED TO THE BOARD MEMBERS FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION OF THIS MATTER.
5. STAMP EXCHANGE BUREAU UNDER LEO SHELLEY'S GUIDANCE WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED TO CONTINUE. IF YOU DESIRE CANADIAN, CUBAN OR MEXICAN POSTAGE FOR USE IN REPORTING, CONTACT LEO.
6. CPC CHAIRMAN - FRANCIS NITTLER OF DENVER, COLORADO WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED TO SERVE AS CHAIRMAN OF OUR BLE CPC TO REPLACE SID ROSENBAUM WHO HAD TO RESIGN THE POST DUE TO HEAVY SCHEDULE OF OTHER PERSONAL BUSINESS. I KNOW YOU ALL JOIN ME IN THANKING SID FOR HIS PAST EFFORTS AND TO WISH FRANCIS WELL AS HE TAKES OVER THE HELM OF THE CPC.
7. DOMESTIC DX CONTEST - UNANIMOUSLY VOTED THAT NO CONTEST BE HELD THIS YEAR IN THE DOMESTIC DX FIELD.
8. FOREIGN DX CONTEST - APPROVED BY 10 TO 1 VOTE. E. R. COOPER VOTING NO ON THE OPINION THAT IF THERE BE NO DOMESTIC DX CONTEST THERE SHOULD BE NO FOREIGN DX CONTEST.
9. THE FOLLOWING BY-LAW CHANGE WAS APPROVED BY A 9 TO 2 VOTE. E. R. COOPER AND F. VAN VOORHEES VOTING NO. ARTICLE 11 OF THE NRC BY-LAWS HAS BEEN CHANGED TO READ: RETURN POSTAGE EVERY MEMBER SHALL BE REQUIRED TO ENCLOSE SUFFICIENT RETURN POSTAGE OR ITS EQUIVALENT WHEN SENDING A RECEPTION REPORT TO ANY STATION AND REQUESTING VERIFICATION, UNLESS SAID STATION SPECIFICALLY STATES THAT RETURN POSTAGE IS NOT REQUIRED.
10. UNANIMOUS APPROVAL OF E. R. COOPER AND F. VAN VOORHEES TO CONTINUE AS EDITORS OF THEIR RESPECTIVE COLUMNS IN DX NEWS.

11. DX DOWN THE DIAL. A MOTION, MADE AND SECONDED, TO DELETE DX DOWN THE DIAL WAS DEFEATED RECEIVING ONLY FOUR UNQUALIFIED YES VOTES BY R. EDGE, P. REILLEY, H. WILLIAMS AND L. KRUSE. REMAINDER OF BOARD MEMBERS HAD QUALIFIED REMARKS TO MAKE WITH THE CONSENSUS OF OPINION FAVORING DELETION OF ALL MATERIAL NOT PERTINENT TO DX DOWN THE DIAL AS ORIGINALLY INTENDED. H. HOLBROOK AND S. STANBURY FAVORED CONTINUANCE OF SUCH FEATURES AS UTILITIES UNLIMITED. AS BOARD CHAIRMAN, AND ACTING UPON THE CONSENSUS OF OPINION, I ADVISED STAN TO DELETE ALL MATERIAL, SUCH AS UTILITIES UNLIMITED, NOT PERTINENT TO DX DOWN THE DIAL AS ORIGINALLY INTENDED. I REQUESTED H. WAGNER TO PRINT DDD AFTER USUAL PAGE 1, 2 OR 3 INFORMATION AND TO PRECEDE MUSINGS OF THE MEMBERS AND ASK E. R. COOPER TO PLUG IMPORTANCE OF DDD. I REGRET THAT CONTROVERSY HAS ARISEN OVER THIS MATTER AMONG BOARD MEMBERS, BUT BELIEVE THE STATEMENT BY R. EDGE, APPROVED BY ME AS BOARD CHAIRMAN, WILL CLARIFY THIS MATTER TO THE MEMBERSHIP AND I'LL NOT ADD ANYTHING FURTHER IN THIS RESUME OTHER THAN THE ABOVE PERTINENT TO THIS POINT OF BUSINESS.

12. BY A 10 TO 1 VOTE, E. R. COOPER VOTING NO BY A QUALIFIED STATEMENT, IT WAS APPROVED TO DELETE ANY DEROGATORY WORDS FROM MEMBERS REPORTS. YOUR EDITORS NOW HAVE THIS POWER, AS THEY DID IN THE PAST, BUT SPECIFIC WORDS SUCH AS PESTS, SPICS, ETC. WERE CITED AND SO, WE ASK YOU NOT TO USE ANY LANGUAGE, EVEN THOUGH AN ACCEPTED DX SLANG EXPRESSION, TO DESCRIBE RACES OR STATION SITUATIONS. ON THE THOUGHT THAT OUR NRC DX NEWS GOES BEYOND THE REACHES OF THE MEMBERSHIP, IT WAS FELT THAT THIS QUESTION OF DEROGATORY WORDS SHOULD BE FORCEFULLY DRIVEN HOME TO DELETE ANY QUESTIONABLE PHRASES OR WORDS FROM ANY MEMBERS REPORT WHERE THEY MIGHT OCCUR.

13. ON THE BASIS OF A SUGGESTION BY NRCER RALEIGH BISS OF PALM SPRINGS, CAL., IT WAS APPROVED BY A 10 TO 1 VOTE, E. R. COOPER VOTING NO, TO INVESTIGATE THE PRINTING OF A SPECIAL RELEASE EXPLAINING OUR CLUB, HOBBY, AND OUR VERIFICATION WISHES TO BE SENT BY MEMBERS DESIRING TO DO SO, TO ALL STATIONS REPORTED WITH THE EXCEPTION OF STATICNS CONDUCTING COURTESY PROGRAMS FOR THE NRC. THIS RELEASE WILL BE PRINTED ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF NRC LETTERHEADS AND REPORT FORMS ON A TRIAL BASIS FOR ONE YEAR. IN ADDITION, A QUANTITY WILL BE RUN ON BLANK PAPER FOR USE BY MEMBERS USING THEIR OWN REPORT FORMS. THEY WILL BE AVAILABLE SHORTLY ON A COST BASIS FOR THOSE DESIRING THEM. WATCH THE PAGES OF DX NEWS FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.

14. R. BISS ALSO SUGGESTED USE OF SPECIAL NRC SEALS TO DRESS UP ENVELOPES AND/OR REPORT FORMS AND TO PUBLICIZE THE NRC. COST AND AVAILABILITY OF THESE SEALS IS NOW BEING EXPLORED AND YOU ALL WILL BE ADVISED OF THE DISPOSITION OF THIS MATTER WHEN THE FACTS ARE IN. E. R. COOPER VOTED NO ON THE QUESTION OF USE OF THESE SEALS.

15. FINDLAY, OHIO WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED AS THE SITE OF THE 1958 NRC CONVENTION WITH NRCER ELBERT TEWELL AND HIS WIFE HOSTING THE CONVENTION. I BELIEVE THIS IS A SPLENDID LOCATION FOR OUR 1958 CONVENTION AND FORESEE THE LARGEST TURNOUT YET FOR A NRC CONVENTION. THE TEWELL'S WILL NO DOUBT HAVE MORE ON THIS AT AN EARLY DATE---BUT, PLAN NOW TO SET THAT VACATION OR WEEKEND FOR FINDLAY, OHIO IN 1958!

16. A VOTE OF THANKS TO BOB GORSUCH WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED FOR HIS PAST EFFORTS AS CHAIRMAN OF THE NRC BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

THAT IS ABOUT THE SIZE OF IT, NRCERS---AND THE FOREGOING IS RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR YOUR INFORMATION. REMEMBER, WE ARE YOUR BOARD, ELECTED TO SERVE YOU AND YOUR HOBBY BY YOU, THE NRC MEMBERSHIP. A Statement from your Club President - For Members Only - 11/2/57.

As your Club President, I believe I am within my rights as such to correct a statement that appeared atop Page 3-DX Down the Dial in the October 19 1957 issue relating to the deletion of what was known as Utilities Unlimited.

Article 1 of our By-Laws state in part "The purpose of the NRC shall be to promote the hobby of DXing on the Broadcast Band, (535-1605 kcs). The wording including T-V was abolished by a majority of the Board very soon after the 1955 NRC Convention which eliminated all other frequencies other than 535-1605 kcs.

Operation Pioneer later known as Utilities Unlimited first appeared in the Sept 22 1956 issue. In the Dec 1 1956 issue our Executive Secretary inserted an item that if this part of the frequencies etc was to be part of the bulletin that anyone interested should submit it to the Board Chairman to be voted upon by the Board of Directors. This has never been done by any one, so this section of radio frequencies was never an official part of the Club. It was also in violation of Article 1 of our By-Laws. However nothing was ever done by any Board Member until the Board Meeting at the 1957 NRC Convention when this was brought to the attention of the Chairman of the Board and other Board Members present by another member of the Board. The resolution presented was to eliminate the entire section of DX Down the Dial but when a final vote was taken after the convention it was defeated by 4 Yes votes and the remainder of votes were qualified in varied tones of expression (in short) not to scuttle the entire structure of DX Down the Dial but favored deleting everything else not contained in DX Down the Dial as it was originally intended. This was also the sentiment of a few members who sat in at the discussion at the convention. However it was pointed out to the Board Chairman by another Board Member that so long as Utilities Unlimited was never submitted to the Board for approval it did not need any Board vote to be eliminated as it was always in violation of Article 1 of the NRC By-Laws.

Your President took time out and re-checked the number of reporters and the number of times each of them reported to Utilities Unlimited and here are the results. From the September 22 1956 issue up to and including the October 19 1957 issue there have been a total of 11 reporters who reported as such. 1 member reported 20 times, another 9 times, another 5 times, another 3, another 2 and the remaining 6 only 1 time each, this in over a year. To your President, 11 members and only 3 of them you could call regular reporters and thats stretching it as 1 reported 5 times in 37 issues of DX News. Knowing the total number of members we have, 11 is a very minute minority and if after a full years test and only having the above number of members reporting along with it being in violation of our By-Laws the deletion of Utilities Unlimited was naturally justified Especially knowing that the Editor nor any one of its reporters bothered to contact your Board Chairman to have Utilities Unlimited presented to the Board of Directors for their approval or rejection. With this information it was the duty of your Board Chairman to notify the Editor of DX Down the Dial to delete Utilities Unlimited and all other material not pertaining directly to the original intent of DX Down the Dial in favor of working towards a bigger and better column through the potential support of the NRC membership so that DX Down the Dial will once again be the source of sure fire "hot" BCB DX tips. To your Club President this does certainly not constitute heavy pressure, spear headed by one individual, but the DUTY of ANY NRC Board Chairman in keeping with the By-Laws of the NRC.

The Board Chairman has approved the above.
