WRCA-630 was testing one Monday morning, announcing as "located in Port Washington, N.Y." The paper says "Space is rapidly running out for new AM Radio Stations. At the end of July, 3,095 AM stations were on the air, and 3,250 were authorized." The 412-foot TV tower of WREU-TV has been torn down. I reported it as "200 feet" earlier, my error. A 100-foot FM tower also went, as the Hawley Broadcasting Co. ceased TV and FM operations. The big TV tower, erected in 1955, goes to a southern station. The FM tower, of 1947, goes out to western Pennsylvania. 73s.

I wanted to buy another telescopic pole like the one I have on the west end but have no way of guying it down properly. I sincerely hope that we have more entries from the West Coast in the Foreign DX Contest this season than last. I'd like to see Leonard Lockwood (with his new English receiver), Fred Barene and Don Reynolds (the Northerner) team up with Roy Hillar and give the "Southern California Clan" a bit of competition. How about it? For those DXers who worry about additional antennas so that they can have more directional effect, let me tell you of my experiences at this location. For four years I've had the same length of antenna running in the same direction; that is, East by West. I have raised the height several times but everything else remained the same. The lead-in is off West end and not quite straight down. I've been able to verify over 40 Asians - about 12 Aussies and Zedders - a few Alaskans - 15 or so South Americans and quite a few low powered Caribbean Sea Area stations. My conclusion is: #1, put up one good antenna. #2- Connect with a good lead-in right to the set, and, #3, tune and listen patiently with the best of the radio logs that are available to everyone. For you fellows who need or want an Alaskan station, why not try for KBYR, 1270 kc/s., Anchorage on Sunday mornings? I know he runs to at least 2:00 a.m. PST. They have a "Western" or "Country" style program from 12:30 to 2:00 a.m., BST. They give the correct time on this program about every 20 minutes. I like the suggestion of 20 lines to a member. This is impossible unless you follow these instructions, and I know that you want your material to be used, so please remember and use the instructions as given. Before getting into the DX of the week, let me make comments on two items which have come in the mail. In the last issue I mentioned the Vane Jones Log of AM-FM-TV stations and said that I had not seen one. Mr. Jones has read this and has been kind enough to send me a copy. I have gone over it very carefully and am quite pleased to report that it is well worth the 50¢ asked. FM and TV stations are listed by states and provinces. AM stations are listed by states and provinces, by frequency, and by call letters. The listing appears to be accurate and provides the cross-references so necessary to our hobby. Stations from U. S., Canada, Cuba, and Mexico are listed as well as other WARBA countries. It is in a handy pocket form, and contains no extra material. My only criticism is that the Alphabetical listing by call letters does not contain the frequency, thus requiring a double check, first to the geographical location, then to the frequency. Mr. Jones proposes to issue this log 4 times a year and sells a year's subscription for \$2.00 or 50¢ per copy. A two-year subscription is also available at \$3.00. The MEDIUM WAVE CIRCLE of England will issue again this year MEDIUM WAVE NEWS, containing information about medium wave DX around the world.
